LIBERTY OPENS CONFERENCE SEMIFINALS AGAINST WASHINGTON

The New York Liberty will open the 2015 WNBA Playoffs Eastern Conference Semifinals against the Washington Mystics on Friday, Sept. 18, at Madison Square Garden at 7 p.m. The game will be broadcast on MSG Network and NBTV. New York finished the regular season with the best record in the WNBA at 23-11 overall, and will have home court advantage in the best-of-three series with the Mystics, which finished fourth in the East with an 18-16 mark. However, Washington took 3-of-4 from the Liberty during the regular season, most recently winning 82-55 on Sept. 11, but that game came after the Liberty had clinched the best overall record.

LIBERTY PLAYOFF BITES

- The Liberty is making its 13th appearance in the WNBA Playoffs and its first since 2012.
- New York's all-time playoff record is 23-37.
- Friday night's game will be the first WNBA Playoffs contest at Madison Square Garden since Sept. 5, 2010.
- New York enters the postseason with home court throughout the playoffs for the first time in its history. The Liberty posted the best record in the Eastern Conference for the first time since 2002.
- The Liberty's 23 wins set a new franchise regular season record.
- New York is 4-1 all-time against the Mystics in the postseason, but has not played Washington since 2002.

Bill Laimbeer, a WNBA Coach of the Year and three-time WNBA Champion, enters his third season as head coach of the New York Liberty.

Laimbeer previously spent eight seasons from 2002-09 as general manager and head coach of the Detroit Shock (now Tulsa Shock), where he earned WNBA Coach of the Year honors in his first full season as head coach (2003). He took over a team that finished 9-23 in the previous year and led them to a league-best 25 wins the following season. The 16-win improvement was the largest in WNBA history. Laimbeer led the Shock to a 137-93 (.596) overall record, including six-straight playoff appearances as the squad won the WNBA Championship in 2003, 2006 and 2008.

As general manager of the Shock, Laimbeer made several key moves during his tenure that were integral in Detroit capturing three WNBA Championships, which still stand as second most in league history. In his first full season, Laimbeer drafted former All-Star and 2003 Rookie of the Year Cheryl Ford. He also acquired the Finals MVP that year Ruth Riley in the WNBA dispersal draft.

Prior to returning to the WNBA, Laimbeer spent two seasons as an assistant in the NBA with the Minnesota Timberwolves (2009-2011).

A 14-year NBA veteran, Laimbeer was a four-time All-Star for the Detroit Pistons. As a member of the famed "Bad Boys," Laimbeer totaled 13,790 points and 10,400 rebounds in his career, becoming just the 19th player in NBA history to eclipse 10,000 in both categories. A key member of back-to-back NBA Championships in 1989 and 1990, he had his jersey No. 40 retired by the franchise in 1995. Laimbeer played college ball at Notre Dame from 1975-79, graduating with a degree in economics in 1979.

Laimbeer and his wife Chris are parents to their son Eric and daughter Keri.

- Played collegiately at Notre Dame from 1975-79.

MORE LIBERTY PLAYOFF NOTES

- The Liberty is 16-10 all-time in WNBA Playoffs home games, and this will be the first postseason game at Madison Square Garden since 2010.
- New York is 7-5 all-time in its first game of the postseason.
- New York is 9-13 all-time in its first game of a WNBA Playoff series.
- The Liberty has won both playoff series with the Mystics, taking a 2-0 win in the Eastern Conference Semifinals in 2000 and a 2-1 win in the Eastern Conference Finals in 2002.
- New York has won the Eastern Conference Title three times (1999, 2000, 2002) and been to the WNBA Finals four times (1997, 1999, 2000, 2002).

BIG TIME EXPERIENCE

There are several Liberty players that have extensive playoff experience, and four have won a WNBA Championship. Swin Cash has played in 49-career postseason games and won three WNBA Championships, two with Detroit (2003 & 2006) and one with Seattle (2010). Tanisha Wright was teammates with Cash during the Seattle Storm's 2010 championship season. Candice Wiggins captured a title as a member of the Minnesota Lynx in 2011, and Sugar Rodgers was on the Lynx 2013 championship squad. Head Coach Bill Laimbeer has won three WNBA Championships, all three as the head coach of the Detroit Shock (2003, 2006, 2008).

Additionally, Essence Carson has been to the playoffs with the Liberty in 2008, 2010, 2011 and 2012. Epiphanny Prince helped Chicago reach the WNBA Finals last season, and also played in the postseason in 2013. Tina Charles made back-to-back playoff appearances in Connecticut (2011, 2012), and Avery Warley-Talbert was also a member of the Sky's 2013 playoff team.

FIRST MEETING OF THE SEASON WITH WASHINGTON?

Washington won the regular season series with New York 3-1, and the Mystics' defense has been stout, holding the Liberty to just 63.8 ppg. However, the argument can be made the teams have not faced one another as New York is currently constituted. The first two meetings came in early June, when the Liberty was without Epiphanny Prince. The July 9 meeting was the first Prince played for New York, but she came off the bench in a game the Liberty won in overtime. Last week, Washington controlled the action, but two days prior, New York had clinched home court advantage and Charles and Prince combined to play just 29 minutes.

#BURNBRIGHT LACE UP FOR THE LIBERTY

As the only women's professional sports team in NYC, the Liberty has ignited a movement that is bigger than basketball, and we hope it inspires the next generation of women and girls to stand tall and #BurnBright in everything they do. Some members of the Liberty will be wearing custom sea foam and orange laces for the playoffs to support the movement, and in arena, New York will be debuting a #BurnBright commercial directed by Spike Lee, empowering girls to chase their dreams.

ESSENCE CARSON WINS WNBA COMMUNITY ASSIST AWARD PRESENTED BY STATE FARM

Essence Carson of the New York Liberty has been awarded the June WNBA Cares Community Assist Award presented by State Farm for her charitable efforts and contributions throughout the tri-state area. In recognition of Carson's efforts, the WNBA and State Farm will donate \$7,500 to a charity of her choice. Carson met with contestants from the Garden of Dreams Foundation's youth talent show at Radio City Music Hall. As part of WNBA Cares Week, she led a youth basketball clinic in her hometown of Paterson, N.J. In addition, Carson visited pediatric patients at Hospital for Special Surgery, where she had undergone ACL surgery in 2013. She spent time in the hospital's Lerner Children's Pavilion, playing games, taking photos and signing autographs.



TINA CHARLES DONATING HALF OF 2015 WNBA SALARY TO HOPEY'S HEART FOUNDATION

Liberty center Tina Charles announced she will donate half of her 2015 salary to the Hopey's Heart Foundation. She's dedicated to placing a minimum of 100 automatic external defibrillators (AED) throughout the United States each year. Nearly 390,000 out-of-hospital sudden cardiac arrests (SCA) occur annually. Having an automatic external defibrillator (AED) close by can mean the difference between life and death for a victim of SCA. Hopey's Heart Foundation is committed to improving the health of student and amateur athletes by providing health education, CPR training and lifesaving AEDs in schools, community and recreational centers. To date, Hopey's Heart has placed 142 AED's.



LIBERTY SEASON HEADLINES

- New York will enter the WNBA Playoffs as the top overall seed for the first time in franchise history.
- New York currently sits at 23-11 overall, posting the most regular season wins in franchise history, passing the previous mark of 22.
- The Liberty needed just 22 games to surpass its win total (15) from a year ago.
- The Liberty posted a five-game winning streak during the month of July, its longest stretch of consecutive wins since 2010.
- The 2010 season was also the last time New York won three-straight games on the road.
- New York swept the season series with Phoenix for the first time since 2012, both games from Los Angeles for the first time since 2010, and went 2-0 against Minnesota for the first time since 2007.
- The Liberty is 10-2 against the Western Conference this season.
- New York is 12-5 at Madison Square Garden and owns the league's best road record at 11-6.

TINA CHARLES 3K - 2K

With her 12th double-double of the season to the tune of 16 points and 13 rebounds in a win over Connecticut on Sept. 9, Tina Charles also eclipsed 2,000-career rebounds, becoming just the 18th player in WNBA history to do so. Earlier this season, she passed 3,000 points. Over just six WNBA seasons, Charles already ranks as one of the most prolific rebounders in league history, with her career-average of 10.2 rebounds per game ranking first all-time. This year, she is averaged 8.5 rebounds per game, which was second-best in the WNBA.

NEW YORK SIGNS GUARD ERICA WHEELER FOR THE REST OF THE SEASON

The New York Liberty signed guard Erica Wheeler to a rest of season contract on September 7. New York used the roster hardship provision to add Wheeler, after rookie point guard Brittany Boyd underwent surgery to repair a fractured wrist. Wheeler is in her first year in the league, after graduating from Rutgers University in 2013. During the 2015 preseason, she signed a Training Camp contract with the Atlanta Dream, and appeared in 17 games averaging 4.5 points and 1.5 assists per game. A former Rutgers University standout, Wheeler scored 1,027-career points for the Scarlet Knights, and graduated ranked third in program history in 3-point field goals with 157.

EPIPHANNY PRINCE NAMED EASTERN CONFERENCE PLAYER OF THE MONTH FOR AUGUST

Epiphanny Prince was named the WNBA Eastern Conference Player of the Month for the first time in her career on Sept. 3. For the Liberty, it has repeat Player of the Month winners after Tina Charles received the honor for the month of July. The two-time All-Star helped guide the Liberty to a league-best 8-2 record for the month. She paced all Eastern Conference players in steals (2.6 spg) in August, tied for second in assists (4.2 apg), and ranked fifth in scoring (17.8 ppg). She also finished fourth in field goal percentage (.527, 68-of-129) and free throw shooting (.939, 31-of-33). Prince scored 15 points or more in seven of 10 games for the month, including three consecutive outings with at least 22 points. She tallied a season-high 30 points and added five assists in a 77-63 victory at the Chicago Sky on Aug. 7.

BRITTANY BOYD UNDERGOES WRIST SURGERY

New York Liberty rookie guard Brittany Boyd successfully underwent surgery on her left wrist. The procedure, which was performed by Dr. Richard Hotchkiss at Hospital for Special Surgery, repaired a fracture which she suffered during the third quarter of the Liberty's game against the Chicago Sky on September 3. Expected recovery time is 5-6 weeks.

PROTECTING A LEAD

The Liberty has been expert at protecting almost any lead this season. If New York has taken a eight-point lead over any opponent at any point in the game, it has gone on to win every time. The Liberty's largest blown lead of the year is just seven points, which came against Indiana on Sept. 13. Additionally, New York has lost just once when taking a lead into the fourth quarter, 19-1, with the only setback being that same regular season finale at Indiana.

NEED FOR PROTECTING THE ROCK

Taking care of the basketball is critical for every team, but the Liberty has proven wins and losses can often hinge on the turnover battle. New York is 12-2 this season when it commits fewer turnovers and is 13-3 when it scores more points off turnovers. The Liberty ranks just 10th in the league in turnovers, averaging 14.6 per game, due in large part to its tough start to the year. Through the first eight games of the season, New York turned the ball over 18.5 times per game, posting a 4-4 record during that stretch. Since then, the Liberty is turning the ball over just 13.4 times per game, and is 19-7.

MAKING A CASE FOR ROOKIE OF THE YEAR

Kiah Stokes is having one of the most impressive rookie seasons in the WNBA and is making a solid case for being considered the league's Rookie of the Year. In terms of total all-around impact and overall team success, it is tough to argue any first year player is more critical to team success than Stokes, who leads all rookies in blocks and rebounds per game and field goal percentage. With Stokes helping anchor the interior, the Liberty lead the league in points against and defensive field goal percentage, and is the toughest team to score against in the paint.

SWEET AS SUGAR

Guard Sugar Rodgers came off the bench to lead the New York Liberty to a come-from-behind 80-75 overtime victory over the Atlanta Dream on September 1 at Madison Square Garden, tying a career-high of 23 points while nailing a personal best five 3-pointers in the win. For Rodgers, it was the first game scoring in double figures since she netted 10 points in a win at Phoenix back on July 18. She started six games earlier in the year while Epiphanny Prince missed time to compete internationally, scoring in double figures in every start, but had eclipsed 10-points just twice since the second week of July. She currently ranks 39th in the WNBA in scoring, averaging 8.1 ppg.

KIAH STOKES NAMED WNBA ROOKIE OF THE MONTH

Kiah Stokes of the New York Liberty was named the WNBA Rookie of the Month presented by Samsung for games played in August. Stokes led all rookies in rebounds (8.3 rpg), field goal percentage (.564, 31-for-55), and blocks (1.5 bpg) for the month. She also placed second in minutes per game (27.8 mpg), third in free throw percentage (.833, 10-for-12), and fifth in points (7.2 ppg). Stokes ranked fourth among all WNBA players in rebounds and field goal percentage while tying for fifth in blocks. She collected 10 or more rebounds in five of her 10 games played in August.

EPIPHANNY PRINCE NAMED PLAYER OF THE WEEK A SECOND TIME

Guard Epiphanny Prince was named the Eastern Conference Player of the Week for the second time this season and the fourth of her career on Aug. 31; she previously received the honor two weeks prior on Aug. 17. Prince, who helped New York post a 2-0 record for the week, led the Eastern Conference in scoring (20.0 ppg), was tied for second in steals (2.0 spg), ranked fifth in field goal percentage (.586 on 17-of-29 shooting), and tied for seventh in assists (3.0 apg). She scored 22 points in a win over Minnesota and followed that up with 18 points in a win at Connecticut the next night.

SEASON-HIGH FIELD GOAL PERCENTAGE AGAINST THE SUN

The Liberty shot a season-best 55.9 percent from the field in its 80-66 win at Connecticut on August 29, combining to shoot 33-of-59 as a team. It is the fourth time this season New York has shot higher than 50 percent from the field and the Liberty is 4-0 in those games. All four of those occurrences came over an eight-game stretch from August 11-29.

TANISHA WRIGHT DISHING THE ROCK

Tanisha Wright recorded a New York Liberty individual season-high nine assists in its 90-78 win at Connecticut on August 14. She leads New York and ranks 9th in the WNBA this season, averaging 3.5 assists per game and is one of the best all-time at distributing the basketball, ranking 14th in league history with 1,127-career assists.

LENDING A HAND

Distributing the basketball has proven to be a key to New York's success this season. The Liberty average 16.7 assists per game, which ranks fifth in the league, and in its wins the team is averaging more than three more assists per game. In 23 victories, New York is averaging 17.8 assists per game, compared to just 14.5 in its eight losses. For the year, the Liberty has recorded an assist on 60.5 percent of its made baskets. Tanisha Wright (3.5) lead New York in assists.

LIBERTY LIMITING FIELD GOAL PERCENTAGE

- The Liberty ranks 1st in the league in opponent field goal percentage, limiting teams to 39.3 percent, and first allowing 71.1 ppg.
- New York has held 19 opponents under 40.0 percent shooting, the league average for field-goal percentage is .425.
- In its 73-64 win at Atlanta on June 21, the Liberty held the Dream to just 29.7 percent shooting, on 19-for-64 from the field.

- The Liberty had not held an opponent to under 30-percent on the road since June 1, 2007, when it held Minnesota to .274 (20-for-73) from the field in a 70-60 victory.
- New York has held four teams under 30 percent from the field, doing so three times on the road, most recently limiting San Antonio to just 27.0 shooting on August 19.
- San Antonio posted the lowest field goal percentage for a NY foe since 2012, when Phoenix shot just 17-of 69 (.246).
- New York held the Stars to just 45 points in its win on August 19, which matches the fewest points allowed in a WNBA game this season.

PRINCE FACTOR

Although she missed the first 10 games of the season due to obligations to compete internationally, since rejoining the Liberty at the end of June, guard Epiphanny Prince has had no trouble fitting in, helping lead New York to a 17-6 mark since she made her debut at Washington on July 9. She has scored in double figures in 21-of-24 games this season, posting a season-high 30 points at Chicago on August 7, while averaging 15.0 ppg. Her ability to create for others has also played a key role, as she has four-plus assists in 14 games and is second on the team averaging 3.4 assists and first with 2.0 steals per game. Tina Charles has also seen her production take off. Over the last 22 prior to clinching home court, averaged 18.9 ppg while shooting 49.4 percent from the field, during the first 10 games of the season she averaged 15.1 ppg, shooting 38.7 percent.

TINA CHARLES NETS SEASON-HIGH 31 POINTS IN WIN AT CONNECTICUT

All-Star Tina Charles topped 30 points for a second time this season, scorching the Connecticut Sun to the tune of 31 points in a 90-78 Liberty win on August 14. Charles matched her career high of 14 made field goals, and finished one point shy of her career-best of 32. She also scored 30 points in an 81-77 win at Seattle back on July 21. Charles ranked fourth in the WNBA averaging 17.1 ppg this season, and was second with 8.5 rebounds per game.

TINA CHARLES PLAYER OF THE WEEK/MONTH OF JULY

Tina Charles was named the Eastern Conference Player of the Week on Aug. 3, and followed that up with her fifth-career Player of the Month award just 24 hours later. Charles was tabbed as the East's top player for July after leading the Liberty to a 6-2 record, while averaging 19.9 points and 9.5 rebounds per game; New York went 4-2 on the road during the stretch. It is the second time she has been named Player of the Month as a member of the Liberty. In two games the week prior to her Player of the Week nod, she posted 18 points and eight boards at Indiana, then erupted for 29 points in a win over Seattle.

BECKY HAMMON INDUCTED INTO LIBERTY RING OF HONOR

One of the greatest players to ever wear a Liberty uniform and a perennial fan favorite, Becky Hammon was inducted into the New York Liberty Ring of Honor with a halftime ceremony on August 2. Undrafted out of Colorado State, Hammon went on to enjoy a 16-year WNBA career, the first eight of which were spent in New York, where she helped lead the franchise to three WNBA Finals appearances (1999, 2000, 2002). She ranks second in franchise history in games played (227) and is third in points scored (2,367) and fourth in assists (575). Hammon became the sixth member of the Liberty Ring of Honor, joining current Director of Player Development Teresa Weatherspoon, Sue Wicks, Kym Hampton, Rebecca Lobo and Vickie Johnson.

NEW YORK OWNS THE PAINT

Getting to the basket and protecting the rim have emerged as two strengths of this year's New York Liberty team. The Liberty average 33.4 ppg in the paint, which may rank just third in the league, but New York has been outscored in the paint just twice this season. The Liberty's defensive ability has been a highlight all season long, and a lot of that success is due to its interior defense. The Liberty continue to lead the league in defensive field goal percentage at .393. New York is allowing just 23.9 ppg in the paint, by far the fewest in the league; Minnesota is second at 29.2.

TINA CHARLES NAMED EASTERN CONFERENCE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

For the first time this season, New York center Tina Charles was tabbed as the WNBA Eastern Conference Player of the Week on July 20. Charles was a force for New York, as the Liberty went 3-0 in the previous week, picking up wins over San Antonio, Connecticut and Phoenix, scoring in double figures in all three games with a pair of double-doubles averaging 18.0 points and 10.7 rebounds per game while shooting 44.4 percent from the field. She had 22 points and 12 rebounds in a big home win over the Sun and followed that up with 18 points and a season-high 14 rebounds as New York won at Phoenix, 75-73, for the first time since 2012.

KIAH STOKES BLOCKS FRANCHISE RECORD 8 SHOTS

Liberty rookie Kiah Stokes was a shot-blocking machine in the team's 64-57 win over Connecticut on July 16, as she came off the bench to record a franchise single-game record eight blocks, which are also the most for any WNBA player this season. Five of those swatted shots came in the fourth quarter, when New York limited the Sun to just 3-of-16 shooting. The previous Liberty single-game record for blocked shots was six, set by Shameka Christon at Phoenix on July 16, 2006. In a short period of time, Stokes has established herself as a premier defender in the WNBA, ranking fourth in the league with 2.0 blocks per game while displaying the ability to guard nearly any player on the floor.

TINA CHARLES - MS. 3,000

Tina Charles became the 10th-fastest player in WNBA history to score 3,000 points when she finished with 21 points and 10 rebounds in a win over Washington on July 9. With 3,402-career points, she now ranks 45th in WNBA history, while her 17.3 ppg scoring average is the 10th-best mark all-time. Charles led New York in scoring (17.1 ppg) and rebounding (8.5 rpg) this season. She had 12 double-doubles this season and her 109 over her six-year career already rank second all-time, trailing just Lisa Leslie's record of 157.

LIBERTY HOST 18,617 FANS DURING CAMP DAY WIN

The New York Liberty defeated the San Antonio Stars, 84-68, Wednesday afternoon at Madison Square Garden in front of 18,617 people, the largest crowd to watch a Liberty game at The Garden since 2002. It was the sixth-largest crowd to ever see a Liberty regular season game at Madison Square Garden, and the most fans since the team drew 19,563 against the Charlotte Sting on August 11, 2002.

She also entered No. 50 in the all-time WNBA scoring list at 3,005 points, and in New York's game against Indiana on August 23, she moved past Monique Currie for 45th place all-time and 16th amongst active players. Her 10.2 rpg career-average is the best in WNBA history and her 17.3 ppg career scoring average is currently 10th all-time.

DEPTH CHARGE

Even before Epiphanny Prince returned to the lineup, New York was able to put its depth on display, as the Liberty are averaging 27.5 ppg from its bench which ranks second in the WNBA, and the team has won the bench scoring battle 22 times. For the season the Liberty bench holds a 27.5-20.8 advantage over the opposition.

WIGGINS POURS IN FIVE 3-POINTERS AT CHICAGO

Candice Wiggins was a flame thrower on the June 30 matchup at Chicago, shooting 5-of-5 from 3-point range for a season high 15 points. The performance enabled the sharp-shooting guard to break out of a bit of a scoring slump to start the season, where she hit just one 3-pointer through the first nine games of the year. She has hit a career-best six 3-pointers two times, the last of which actually came against the Liberty on Sept. 1, 2013, when she was a member of the Tulsa Shock.

ROOKIE REBECCA ALLEN TO MISS REMAINDER OF 2015 SEASON

The New York Liberty have been short handed to start the season due to Epiphanny Prince's commitment to compete in the EuroBasket Women 2015 Tournament during the month of June, but that lineup became a little thinner when it was announced that dynamic rookie forward Rebecca Allen will miss the remainder of the 2015 season in order to surgically repair a left-knee injury. That absence leaves the Liberty with 10 active players on the roster until Prince returns.

ISIAH THOMAS NAMED TEAM PRESIDENT

Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Famer Isiah Thomas was named the President of the New York Liberty on May 5; he will oversee basketball and business operations for the franchise. Thomas played a critical role in the Liberty's busy offseason, which featured a number of trades and free agent signings, resulting in a new look team that features a blend of veteran leaders and exciting young talent heading into 2015. Additionally, Thomas created the Director of Player Development position now held by Liberty legend Teresa Weatherspoon, the first such position for any franchise in the WNBA. Thomas played 13 seasons for the Detroit Pistons, winning back-to-back NBA titles with Liberty head coach Bill Laimbeer in 1989-90. He has held NBA front office positions with the Toronto Raptors, Indiana Pacers and New York Knicks, spent three years as the head men's basketball coach at Florida International University, and currently works as an analyst for NBA TV.

LIBERTY MAKES A SPLASH IN THE DRAFT

The Liberty made five picks in the 2015 WNBA Draft, including a pair of first rounders, despite entering the day without a first-round pick, which had been sent to Connecticut in 2014 to acquire All-Star center Tina Charles. New York traded Alex Montgomery to San Antonio and selected All-American point guard Brittany Boyd from California. Additionally, the Liberty traded guard Anna Cruz and two picks to the Minnesota Lynx, selecting center Kiah Stokes from the University of Connecticut with the 11th overall pick.

NEW YORK STATE OF MIND

This year's team will have a local feel with three players hailing from the NYC metropolitan area: Tina Charles (Brooklyn – Christ the King), Epiphanny Prince (Queens – Murry Bergtraum), and Essence Carson (Paterson, N.J. – Paterson Eastside). Additionally, veteran guard Tanisha Wright was born in Brooklyn before moving to Pittsburgh as a child.

FRESH LOOK

This New York Liberty roster will look very different from a year ago. Of the 18 players that reported to camp in 2014, three remain on the active roster heading into 2015 (Tina Charles, Essence Carson, Sugar Rodgers). Carson is the only member of the Liberty that was on the roster when head coach Bill Laimbeer took over prior to the 2013 season.

BILL IS BACK

Head coach Bill Laimbeer returns for his third season with the New York Liberty. Laimbeer has won three WNBA titles (2003, 2006, 2008), all with the Detroit Shock, and was named the WNBA Coach of the Year in 2003 when he led the Shock to the first of three championships.

CONNECTICUT CONNECTION

Including 2015 First Round draft pick Kiah Stokes, the Liberty have a University of Connecticut connection, with three former Huskies on the squad (Tina Charles, Swin Cash), which ties for the most in the league (Seattle, Washington).

WELCOME HOME SPOON!

Liberty legend Teresa "T-Spoon" Weatherspoon rejoins the franchise as its first Director of Player Development. Weatherspoon, who played for the Liberty for seven seasons from 1997-2003, is in the Madison Square Garden Walk of Fame. She was a consultant with the team last season, and was the head coach at her alma mater Louisiana Tech from 2009-13. Weatherspoon is the Liberty's all-time leader in assists (1,306) and steals (453).

VETERAN LEADERSHIP

New York's roster is balanced with young players and veteran leaders who have WNBA titles on their resumes, including a pair of offseason acquisitions in Tanisha Wright and Candice Wiggins.

Swin Cash – The Liberty traded for Swin during the 2014 season and then resigned her this winter. A 13-year veteran, Swin has won three WNBA titles, including two with Bill Laimbeer when she played for the Detroit Shock (2003, 2006). She won her third league championship as a member of the Seattle Storm in 2010. Entering her 14th season in the league, Cash is tied for the second-longest WNBA tenure, trailing just Atlanta's DeLisha Milton-Jones.

Tanisha Wright – Wright played her first 10 WNBA seasons with Seattle, winning a WNBA title in 2010. She has been named to the WNBA All-Defensive team four times and has been exceedingly reliable during her career, as she is the only player in league history to compete in at least 32 games for nine consecutive seasons for the same team.

Candice Wiggins – Wiggins was a member of Minnesota's WNBA Championship team in 2011. She was drafted by the Lynx in 2008 and played there for six seasons before suiting up last year for the Los Angeles Sparks.

HERB WILLIAMS JOINS COACHING STAFF

Longtime NBA coach Herb Williams has joined the New York Liberty staff as an assistant coach. Williams began his coaching career as a New York Knicks assistant in 2003, before serving as the interim head coach in 2004 and 2005. The Columbus, Ohio, native, played collegiately at The Ohio State University from 1977-81, then enjoyed an 18-year playing career before joining the coaching ranks in 2003.

WNBA veteran Swin Cash draws inspiration, toughness from her mom

Before she was a WNBA star, before she won two Olympics gold medals and two titles at UConn, Swin Cash was just a kid trying to become just like her mom, Cynthia Cash-Smith — a left-handed basketball standout at McKeesport High School.

The left-handed part is important.

Swin is right-handed but as a kid she modeled her game after her mom's, meaning she tried to do things left-handed as much as possible. It was a cute thing. But as she grew up, it ended up being a huge advantage in her game.

"I used always want to mimic everything that she did, so later in games when people tried to force me left that's where I naturally want to go even though I'm right-handed so I think just things like that, the aggressive way that she played the game, being fearless that's something I got from her."

From the beginning, the two were a ferocious duo. Cynthia had her daughter when she was 17 and a senior in high school. After giving birth to Swin, she returned to finish her high school basketball career when the season began two months later. I knew that was my last chance to play basketball," Cynthia told the Pittsburgh Post-Gazette in 2001. "No college, no nothing. I had to be a mother to my child." She grew from a basketball star herself to Swin's number one cheerleader. In addition to their tendency to go left, their games, at least for awhile mirrored each other said Swin, though Cynthia said her daughter's game is less of a post game than her's.

"I remember everyone used to say you not only look like your mother," Swin said, "you rebound like her." It took until Swin was in college, Cynthia said, for her to be able to beat her in one on one. "When she finally did win it was because she worked really really hard," Cynthia said. "Because I wasn't just going to let her win." Swin inherited her toughness and reasoning too. She remembers her mother making her take all five of her allotted official visits before committing to UConn to make sure that she had what would be the best full college experience. Walking onto the UConn campus for the first time, Cynthia wasn't overtaken by the charm or success of Geno Auriemma.

"We walked onto campus and the first thing we saw were cows," remembers Swin. "And she looked at me and said 'are you sure you want to go here?' I remember she gave me a funny line: 'Yeah I'm not sure you're going to find your future husband here.'"

It's that kind of toughness that helped Swin battle through kidney cancer, public disagreements with her coach and will likely help guide her through her team being propelled into the spotlight after Isiah Thomas was named the team president last week (something Swin declined to comment on.)

When Cash married her longtime boyfriend, Steve Canal earlier this month, there were two things that made the wedding different than most: Because her bridal party was compiled of WNBA players, hair and makeup had to be done around daily workout routines. And during the father-daughter dance, Cash brought her mother on the floor for a special dance. It began with Celine Dion's 'Because you loved me.'

"It was a sweet moment," said Swin.

It then transitioned into a faster song by Juvenile with a fitting chorus line: 'She get it from her mama.'

Former UConn standout Kiah Stokes ready to showcase offense with Liberty

NBA veteran Herb Williams, with his tongue planted firmly in his cheek, delivered quite the scouting report for former UConn standout Kiah Stokes.

"She can't run, she can't jump, a total bust," the New York Liberty assistant coach deadpanned before Wednesday's preseason game against the Atlanta Dream.

Liberty coach Bill Laimbeer, sitting a couple feet away, was eating up every word with his cackling increasing in volume with each passing second as they are fully aware that they may have come up with one of the best picks in the WNBA Draft by trading up to select Stokes with the 11th overall pick.

Laimbeer and Williams combined to score in double figures in 17 of their 31 NBA seasons and they seem to be the ideal 1-2 punch to bring out the offensive potential in their first-round pick who was so quick to defer to her teammates in the star-studded UConn program.

"We are forcing the situation on her because she is one of our better shooters so we want her to be aggressive offensively especially in the preseason," Laimbeer said. "She has to learn that she can do it and we are counting on her to do it. Every time she doesn't shoot, we remind her 'hey, that is a good shot for you.' She has to learn to expect the ball and be ready to shoot. She understands what we are asking of her. She is a very smart player, you don't have to tell her twice. Recognition of where she is going to be open and prepare herself to shoot that is a work in progress."

The early returns have been rather impressive.

In her preseason debut Stokes had 11 points and 11 rebounds and perhaps even more importantly she was willing to shoot early and often. Her 14 field-goal attempts are more than she had attempted in any games during her collegiate career. On Wednesday she added nine points, 11 rebounds and four blocked shots.

"It is definitely a lot different but I am having a lot of fun so far and I want to keep it up," Stokes said. "Some of the shots weren't particularly good so I have to work on that but Coach Laimbeer told me he wants me to be more of a scorer. He said it to my face which is something I haven't necessarily heard that many times at UConn but it is something I have to get used to doing. He has a lot of confidence in me which is great.

"It is going to be a challenge. They have shown a lot of faith in me, there will times I pass up a shot at practice and there will be times I have Herb and Coach Laimbeer say 'shoot the ball, look to shoot.' They are constantly reminding me to be more of a scorer. I didn't have to at UConn but now they are saying we want you to be one of the main scorers which is exciting and nerve wracking."

Being a member of three national championship teams at UConn, Stokes has few regrets even it meant she had almost as many blocked shots as field-goal attempts in her career with the Huskies.

"At UConn I didn't need to score," Stokes said. ""You had Stewie (Breanna Stewart), Kaleena (Mosqueda-Lewis), Morgan (Tuck), Moriah (Jefferson) and everybody could shoot the ball really

well so I didn't have to. Of course Coach (Geno) Auriemma would have loved me to be more offensive minded so I kind of got my role where I didn't have to, 'let's make sure I block shots and rebounds' and that was kind of my mindset."

Williams works with the post players and is already seeing the growth from Stokes.

"She won how many championships? Three?" Williams asked. "She played her role and her role when she came in was to rebound, play defense, move the basketball. She was a team player and they won so you can't say anything. If you look at her stats in high school, she scored points, she can score. She has a nice outside shot, she has a nice post-up game but she was never asked to use it. You can't blame anybody because it ended up working out but now she gets to show what she can do at this level. Coach (Laimbeer) is allowing her to shoot jump shots, get the ball in the post and she is very capable of doing it. When you take a player who has been playing for four years and hasn't been asked to score and haven't take a lot of shots, now you are asking her to take shots and for her to step up and take shots it is a big step. Normally that is tough for a player because they sort of go back to what their role was and that is not looking for shots, looking to move the basketball, looking to play defense and to her credit she stepped in and took the shots."

Perhaps no person in the Liberty camp could impact Stokes than former UConn star Tina Charles, as impactful of a post player as anybody in the WNBA.

"She has kind of taken me in and really helped, she tells me that 'oh, you should have popped here, you should have rolled there,'" Stokes said. "She is always kind of in my ear kind of don't forget this or this. She has been through it and she has done everything I want to be able to do so I think it is great to have her on my team."

"Going against her in practice is one thing and her teaching me how she does it and her way it is going to be great. I am glad to be a part of it, I am glad to be in New York and glad she is kind of taking me under her wing."

Train like a Pro: WNBA Star Tina Charles

Professional athletes dedicate an enormous amount of time and effort to make sure they are in top shape all season long. Now consider what would happen if that season rolled into another—and another. That's what life is like for top female basketball players like Tina Charles, who goes from playing center on the WNBA New York Liberty straight to another full season overseas (this past winter, she played for Fenerbahce, a well-known team in Istanbul, Turkey).

Charles, who helped guide the U.S. to gold in the 2012 Olympics and is a five year WNBA season vet, is a fierce competitor who finds motivation in playing the sport she loves at the highest level possible. Treat your body right

With her packed schedule, Charles puts everything she has into making sure she is at the top of her game, which also means taking steps to **prevent injuries**. She arrives early to daily practices in order to get warmed up, loosen her muscles, and prepare for her workout. She regularly ices her muscles after a workout, gets into the cold tub for 10-15 minutes, uses foam rollers and is a firm believer in contrast hydro therapy. Charles also travels with a NormaTec, which uses compression to help heal the body. As a pre warm-up before games, she makes sure to activate her muscles, especially her hip flexors, by doing band walks.

Eat smart

In order to fuel her body and maintain a high-energy level, Charles loads up on carbohydrates like pasta and proteins like chicken. She tries to **juice in the morning** in order to gain important nutrients that she wouldn't normally receive from her diet. "I'm very fortunate with the New York Liberty to have a chef at my disposal. It's hard to live a healthy lifestyle when you're always on the go," she said.

Maintain your motivation

Playing consecutive seasons, half abroad, makes it tough to spend quality time with friends and family. This is especially hard for Charles during the holidays. She hasn't had a Thanksgiving at home since she began college, and this past year she missed out on both Christmas and New Years. Her coach at the University of Connecticut, Geno Auriemma, gave Charles a piece of advice during her time playing there that has really stuck with her. He told her, 'when you chase perfection you catch excellence.' "I just try to do the best that I can in every aspect that I can off and on the court," Charles said.

Take time to relax

In the limited time that she isn't on the court or traveling, she loves spending time with her bichon poodle and family. She also loves taking advantage of being in New York. Charles is always trying new restaurants and walking around Central and Bryant Park.

Appreciate where you're from—and where you are today.

Charles is a native New Yorker, having grown up in Jamaica, Queens, so being able to play in her hometown is a dream come true. Her parents are longtime ticket holders of both the New York Knicks and the Liberty so it means a lot to her to be able to now be a part of the same organization, and to be able to work in a New York City landmark, Madison Square Garden. "It's a blessing I have the opportunity to play for my home team, not a lot of players are able to do that throughout their career... when you're playing at MSG you're not just playing, you become an entertainer just because it's the Garden. So every night I think I'm trying to entertain out there and do the best that I can," she said.

Bill Laimbeer loves Liberty's talent, excited about Kiah Stokes

Swish Appeal: What newcomers have stood out this preseason?

Bill Laimbeer: "All of them. I'll start with Kiah Stokes, who will start for us opening night. A very steady player. Smart. Always in position, shot blocker -- and we didn't know she was this good of a shooter. She can shoot the three ball with the best of them. Now it's getting her to look for the shot. She's not trained to do that so we're working on that one intensely. But she's really good shooter.

"Second one would be Brittany Boyd. She's really fast with the ball, has great vision. (It's) going to be an adjustment learning the size of the players in the league and the speed of the players. She's shown tremendous improvements throughout training camp. She's going to play significant amount of minutes for us. She brings a different dimension to the game.

"(Boyd) makes us go fast. So that's a big positive for us. She'll compete in our second unit, (and) we have some runners in the second unit. One of them is Rebecca Allen from Australia. She's been doing pretty well since she walked in the door. Deep three ball (and) very fast in transition, tall and lanky. (She's) a solid defender gets her hands on a lot of balls. I expect her to play a significant amount of minutes too."

SA: How would you compare this team to your old Detroit Shock teams?

BL: "Different style. Not as physical as the team I had in Detroit. We were big and physical across the board at all positions, from (Elaine) Powell to Ruth Riley. This is a little different; this is a very skilled big basketball team. We have shooters, some speed, Tina is a very skilled big. Our depth is tremendous.

"I have a playing time problem with 8 good players, and that's without (Epiphanny Prince), so when Prince comes, I really have a playing time problem (laughing). But overall, I think we are deeper than the Detroit team. It's similar in we have a lot of young talent lot of athletic talent. We're probably more skilled, but at the same time, they were more physical."

SA: What was your assessment of Kiah Stokes coming out of college?

BL: "Solid defender, shot blocker. (It's) hard to block shots in the women's game and not foul. (She's) really long and has great timing, and a solid rebounder. You look at her rebounds per minute played, she's a solid rebounder and didn't play many minutes. Those two big things: I looked at her as a glue player alongside Tina or in the worst case, a 3rd post.

"But she's proven herself. She's going to be a really good WNBA player for a lot of years. I don't think spectacular, but in theory she can be a double-double, 10-11 points and 10 rebounds."

SA: What made you decide to trade for Prince?

BL: "Consistent scoring. She's very consistent; she gets her 15, she can get 25 at times, but that every night you know what you're going to get points-wise in a consistent manner. (Prince) shoots a good percentage, she's a veteran, and she knows what she's doing out there, and doesn't panic.

"That's our biggest thing in the past two years, we've really struggled scoring here in New York. I don't think that's going to be the case this year. I think we're going to push the ball up and down

the floor a lot, much better shooters better contingent of three-point shooters. We're looking forward to a better consistent offense."

SA: How do you feel about this year's team?

BL: "I really like this team for a few reasons. One, these are good kids, the chemistry is really solid across the board. We're deep and have a lot of players. We have a good mix young players and some veterans. They're fun to be around and they play really hard. They hold each other accountable. As a coach, you can't ask for much more than that."

"I keep telling people I don't quite have a handle on how many wins/loses we will have this season. We really have to get out there and start playing. We only have one player from 2 years ago, and that's Essence (Carson), so we're all new together. How fast we can gel, both offensively and defensively, is going to be a determining factor on how well we do this year."

"It could happen overnight, or it could take a significant amount of time. I don't quite understand which way it's going to go yet. I have my guess, but I've been wrong before (laughter)."

SA: Any final thoughts?

BL: "(Kiah Stokes) is going to be a solid professional, she's tall. She's long she's athletic. She's not going to be the flashiest person, but at the end of the day, you're going to go away thinking, 'Oh hey, she can really play basketball. This team we put together we put together for a reason. One, we tried to be competitive right now., which we very well could be."

"But our eye was on the next 2-3 years. All these players are in their 20s, except for Swin Cash and Tanisha. They're here for leadership, they can play too. But team was built for the next couple 3, 4, 5, 6 years, not only to be competitive, but for the fans to grow with. This is going to be a fun team to watch for a long time. The fans can grow up with some of the younger players, latch onto them and have a lot of fun."

Liberty looks sharp in home-opening win

In theory, this Liberty season was supposed to be about new starts: Its roster went through a youth movement, longtime star Cappie Pondexter left for Chicago and new team president Isiah Thomas moved in.

And the Liberty did look like a team revived in last night's season opener at the Garden, an 82-73 win over the Atlanta Dream. Even though a lot of the time, it was the same old Tina Charles and Swin Cash doing the reviving.

"The chemistry, I can't say enough about it," pumped-up coach Bill Laimbeer said. "I know how we're going to play and I know how intense we're going to play . . . and anyone who saw them today saw that on display."

Charles did what she does best, scoring 17 points to go with 12 rebounds. The new-look Liberty meshed well and dominated in almost every aspect.

The only significant hiccup came early, when the Dream's Shoni Schimmel hit a jumper for a 12-10 lead. But the hiccups didn't last long. Brittany Boyd, who looked confident and strong in her Liberty debut, sank both ends of a one-and-one to tie it and Charles hit a layup with 4:31 left in the first quarter to give the Liberty the lead for good.

"This is such light years from what we've had the last couple of years," Laimbeer said. "This is fun."

The Liberty went ahead 40-23 when Charles hit a foul shot with 4:50 to go in the second quarter. The Dream cut the lead to six, but a layup by Cash (off a defensive rebound by Charles) helped the Liberty take a 51-38 halftime lead.

Cash scored 15 points and Boyd and Tanisha Wright (five assists) added 14 each for the Liberty, which had 13 steals. The Dream's Angel McCoughtry scored 27 points.

Protest before game. Before the game, 20 to 30 protesters spoke out against the hiring of Thomas, who was named in a 2006 sexual harassment suit filed by a former Knicks employee. The Liberty president, appearing at a pregame news conference, did not comment on the rally.

Friday afternoon, the Liberty released a statement responding to the Women's Sports Foundation's petition to the WNBA board of governors requesting that Thomas' part-ownership of the team be revoked. In the petition, the group said that in 2007, a jury found Thomas guilty of sexually harassing Anucha Browne Sanders, which led to an \$11.5-million settlement.

"The Women's Sports Foundation has continued to rely on erroneous and exaggerated media reports," a Liberty statement read. "Anucha Browne Sanders voluntarily dismissed her complaint. Ms. Sanders accepted that MSG and Mr. Thomas did not admit guilt or concede wrongdoing."

When asked about the protesters, Thomas repeatedly said: "The statement speaks for itself."

Ex-Hoyas star Rodgers writing story of her life

Sugar Rodgers isn't the focal point of her team as she always was during her four years at Georgetown. But the New York Liberty has undergone so much change since last season that the third-year guard has been on the roster longer than all but three of her teammates.

So the Liberty, who fell 67-62 last night at Verizon Center in the Washington Mystics' home opener, might take some time to jell this summer.

But change is nothing new to the 25-year-old Rodgers, who lost her mother and her childhood home before she turned 16. Her father, to whom she wasn't as close, died in 2012.

Rodgers describes her journey from Suffolk, Va., in the Tidewater area, to Georgetown's hallowed halls, and then to the WNBA – with offseason stints in Israel, France and Slovakia – in a book, "A Bittersweet Life:

Overcoming The Odds," that she plans to finish soon.

"I'm just writing about my life," Rodgers said in an exclusive interview for this column. "I hope that the story of my life can help somebody else who's going through some of the things I went through. I was reading someone's autobiography and I could relate to some of the things that they went through so I thought, 'Maybe I should write one because I've been through a lot.' "

Auburn coach Terri Williams-Flournoy, who coached Rodgers for three seasons at Georgetown, discovered her eventual star through her older brother Boo Williams, the leading AAU coach in Tidewater.

"Sugar could flat out shoot the lights out, she had a quick first step, she could get to the basket, but all of her moves were very unorthodox," Williams-Flournoy recalled. "And then at halftime, she would get a hot dog from the concession stand. At that point, you're like, 'Yep, she's different.' "

After Rodgers' mother died from lupus in 2005, the teenager bounced from relative's home to relative's home in Suffolk. She became especially close to Patricia Williams, mother of Boo and Terri, who traveled with the AAU squad. That gave the Hoyas a recruiting edge.

"Sugar was very mature," Williams-Flournoy said. "She never wanted anybody to feel sorry for her. She wasn't angry. She just kept going. People didn't think she was smart, but Sugar is smart. It's just that no one had ever made her do the work or be accountable for anything until we started recruiting her."

Although she and her family struggled at times with reading and writing, Rodgers pushed herself to major in English.

"It was a challenge," said Rodgers, who was a year-round Washington resident during college, in part to avoid returning to Suffolk where she no longer had a home. "I had tutors to help me, but by my senior year, it was easy." Basketball was always easy for the 5-foot-9 Rodgers, who was All-Big East all four of her years at Georgetown, where she's the leading career scorer, men or women, ahead of Allen Iverson, Sleepy Floyd, Alonzo Mourning and Patrick Ewing, among other Hoyas legends.

"For a woman to be Georgetown's leading scorer means a lot," Rodgers said. Rodgers led

Georgetown in scoring and into the national rankings as a freshman in 2009-10. As a sophomore, she poured in a career-high 34 points in a 79-57 rout of local big dog Maryland that put the Hoyas in the Sweet 16 for the first time where they fell to defending NCAA champion Connecticut.

"We had the pieces, but we needed that go-to player," Williams-Flournoy said. "We had a great surrounding cast, but we could depend on Sugar every night. She made her teammates so much better. That game at Maryland, she just went off." Georgetown has been to the tournament four times, but only once without Rodgers. The Hoyas are 15-48 since she graduated. "I have fans from Georgetown who still follow me," said Rodgers, who also had her brother, sister, nieces, nephews and many of the current Hoyas players on hand last night. "I definitely enjoy playing in Washington."

Rodgers averaged just 7.6 minutes and 1.9 points as a rookie for the 2013 WNBA champion Minnesota Lynx before moving on to the Liberty for whom she averaged 16.3 minutes and 6.0 points last season as New York missed the playoffs.

"We're still getting to know each other because we're basically a brand new team, but I think we're going to have a great season," said Rodgers, who had a three-pointer in 14 minutes in New York's opening victory over Atlanta and six points in 21:26 last night when she often didn't touch the ball during Liberty possessions. "At Georgetown, the main focus was me. With the Liberty, I have to play my role: defend, rebound, and share the ball." Rodgers has been so focused on basketball that when she played in Arras, France, she didn't tour Paris which was just two hours south. "The overseas experience is great, but it's also hard because you're over there by yourself," Rodgers said.

Williams-Flournoy is looking forward to the book's publication.

"People love to hear athletes' stories and boy does Sugar have a story to tell," Williams-Flournoy said. "You hope that somebody out there will read it and think, 'If he she can do it. I know I can do it.' "

NEW YORK — Liberty star Tina Charles' foundation is always close to her heart.

The New York native once again will donate half of her WNBA salary to a charity she started to honor her aunt who died of multiple organ failure in 2013.

Charles has already bought 142 automatic external defibrillators over the past few years. She'll donate approximately \$50,000 of her salary for the second straight season to purchase more, including 16 that are headed to Europe on July 4.

"It means a lot just to keep the awareness out there about sudden cardiac arrest," Charles said. "Taking an interest in others is key in my life. It's my way of giving back. My passion of placing AEDs. Anything I can do to impact an institution with an AED is extremely important to me."

The foundation, Hopey's Heart, provides health education, CPR training and lifesaving AEDs in schools, communities and recreational centers. It doesn't just honor Charles' aunt, but also Wes Leonard, a high school basketball player in Michigan who died in 2011 of sudden cardiac arrest after hitting the game-winning shot for his team.

Now Charles is expanding her foundation's reach to Europe. Starting next season, all EuroLeague women arenas will be required to have an AED on site thanks in large part to Charles, who played in Turkey this past winter.

Charles spoke at a meeting of the EuroLeague women's general managers that took place during their Final Four in April.

"I commend Tina Charles for all of the great work she does through Hopey's Heart Foundation," said FIBA Europe President Turgay Demirel in April. "Tina is a fantastic example of a basketball player making a difference on and off the court, and this project is a welcome contribution to our efforts to provide the safest possible playing environment for our athletes."

Being charitable is nothing new for Charles. She donated money to build a school in Mali in 2012.

"She makes a difference," said Washington coach Mike Thibault, who coached Charles in Connecticut at the start of her WNBA career from 2010-13 before she came to New York. "It's a wonderful thing and she sets a great example for other players in the league and allows our fans to see our players in our league can make a difference outside of basketball. I'm proud of her for it."

Teammate Swin Cash has been impressed by the 26-year-old Charles' maturity.

"She's the type of person that has a passion to not only be a great leader on the court but also the community," said Cash, who has her own charity and hosted 35 kids this past weekend in New York. "There are so many players that do amazing things."

Cash's group from her hometown of McKeesport, Pennsylvania, took in the Liberty's game against the Mystics on Sunday and went to the Statue of Liberty, World Trade Center and Empire State Building before heading back home.

Epiphanny Prince back with Liberty following EuroBasket tournament

NEW YORK (AP) - Epiphanny Prince will finally get to play for her hometown team, the New York Liberty.

Prince is back after missing the first 10 games of the regular season while she was competing for Russia in the EuroBasket tournament. The Liberty held their own without the New York native whom they acquired in a blockbuster offseason from Chicago for Cappie Pondexter. New York (6-4) is tied for second place in the Eastern Conference.

"I'm happy to be back here and hope that I can provide them some help," Prince said at practice Monday. "I'm still trying to learn the plays and know we have a busy month ahead."

Prince tried to play in the Liberty's last game, at Chicago on June 30, but wasn't feeling well after the long trip from Hungary.

"I flew from Hungary to Italy, Italy to New York and then New York to Chicago," Prince said of her travel back from the tournament. "I wish I could have played, but I was feeling the effects of the travel. I'm glad we were able to win that game."

Prince was disappointed her Russian team couldn't do more at the Olympic qualifier. Russia finished in sixth place, losing to Turkey in overtime. Had Prince's team won, it would have made a final Olympic qualifier next spring. Now Russia will not compete in the Olympics for the first time since 1984 when the country boycotted the Los Angeles games.

"It's unfortunate that was the outcome," Prince said. "Now I'm home and can focus on helping this team."

Fortunately for Prince and the Liberty, due to a scheduling quirk, the team will have had nine days between the Chicago game and their next one Thursday against Washington. The break has come at a good time to allow Prince to become accustomed to her new team.

"We got a little practice time with her to get her up to speed," Liberty coach Bill Laimbeer said. "I think we need the other scorer, no question about that. Getting Phipps, she can make things happen on the basketball court."

Prince did play with the team in the preseason for five days before heading to the tournament. While the Liberty play Thursday in Washington, Prince will have to wait until next week before she gets a chance to play at home at Madison Square Garden.

The Liberty have a difficult month ahead with six of their eight games on the road.

No, the WNBA schedule makers didn't have it out for them. It was their own company, with Madison Square Garden hosting concerts for most of the month. Comedian Kevin Hart has two shows this week followed by Dispatch Hunger's two concerts. U2 is performing eight shows from July 18-31.

The only home games for New York will be against San Antonio and Connecticut next week.

"We had some dates blocked in July because of big concerts. It's like having the circus in town," Laimbeer said. "I think we've got pretty good chemistry. If we can come together and play well, going on the road isn't so bad for us. I'm not worried about it."

Stokes blocks 8 shots in victory, sets franchise record

New York fought back from a nine-point deficit in the second quarter and capped it off with an 8-0 run to open the third en route to a 64-57 win against Connecticut Thursday night.

The Sun (7-6), the WNBA's second-best three-point shooting team, was rolling from behind the arc early, but it was the Liberty's (9-5) paint play that dominated.

"After the second quarter, we knew the guards had to do better defensively," Tina Charles said. "Stopping their momentum helped us get going in the second half."

Charles finished with 22 points and 12 rebounds for her sixth double-double of the season. Kiah Stokes broke the franchise record (six) in blocks with eight and added seven points and eight rebounds.

"I have to keep her on the floor. That's saying a lot. She is only 22 and can provide the kind of energy that we need," Liberty head coach Bill Laimbeer said. "She anchors our defense ... The kid can guard everybody in the gym. She can guard guards, and she has this year.

"If there's a better defender in this league, I don't see it. There may be some as good as her but not any better."

Stokes said she was glad to be making an impact on the team, but she seemed focus on the bigger picture.

"We had to make sure we came out ready to play because they're fighting for the same position as we are," she said. "We want to make it to the top of the Eastern Conference and so do they. We knew they were going to come out fighting, so we made sure we were focused and ready to go."

The Liberty narrowly outscored the Sun in the paint 22-20, but outrebounded the Sun 41-32.

"This is the biggest team we've faced thus far and probably the most physical team, but you know that's New York's identity," Sun head coach Ann Donovan said. "We really wanted to come at them and get some inside action and get some points in the paint, but you have to give New York some credit, they made our lives difficult."

It was the third 3-pointer from Shekinna Stricklen that put the Sun up by nine, 25-19, at the 7:18 mark of the second quarter. The team made four in the quarter, but finished just 7-of-19, 36.8 percent.

Stricklen finished with 11 points, along with Kelsey Bone, and Alex Bentley led the Sun with 15 points.

New York reached its largest lead, 62-54, with 5:28 left to play, and Connecticut scored just three points the remainder of the game.

The loss extended the Sun's loss streak to five straight.

"Obviously we're struggling a little bit," Donovan said. "We started out 7-1, and I knew there were going to be roller coasters in the season, and we're facing a valley now that we're equipped to handle, and we will."

WNBA: Sugar Rodgers Has Been a Special Spice in the New York Liberty's Revival

WASHINGTON – Sugar Rodgers' journey to being a key contributor to the New York Liberty's best start since 2001 has been arduous.

However, thanks to a steely determination along with the motivation of her mother's memory, Rodgers has successfully navigated the rocky road in which she was homeless for a period of time as a teenager.

"I lost my mom and my house," Rodgers said. "I was basically homeless, living house to house, with my coaches, best friend and just anywhere I could lay my head at the time.

"The passing of my mom (from lupus in 2005) was my motivation to succeed in life. I had to do something. I couldn't get into the drugs or the gangs. I had to do it for my mom because I know she worked so hard for us."

Rodgers admitted that basketball saved her life.

"Basketball was my outlet," Rodgers said. "When I went into the gym, I forgot about everything that was going on at home.

"I just focused on getting better. Basketball got me out of a lot of situations. Technically, basketball took me out of the 'hood and gave me opportunities to see the world and do different things that kids from my area wouldn't have had the chance to do."

Rodgers' mom, Barbara, is beaming from above with pride at the young lady her daughter has developed into.

Sugar became the first in her family to earn a college degree and then she was drafted out of Georgetown here, where she got her higher education, in the first round of the much-heralded 2013 WNBA Draft by the Minnesota Lynx, in which she was reserve on a championship squad.

Fast forward three years later, a relaxed and smiling Rodgers rested comfortably on a black leather chair prior to her team's game against the Washington Mystics at the Verizon Center about two weeks ago politely answering questions.

It's the perfect picture of the affable Rodgers, who has found her groove in her third season in the WNBA.

Her game has blossomed and because of it, New York leads the Eastern Conference.

The soaring Liberty extended its winning streak to four games and overall record to 11-5 with a hard-earned 81-77 road win over Seattle Tuesday night at Key Arena as former UConn star Tina Charles scored 30 points.

The Liberty finishes the first half of its season Wednesday night against Los Angeles (10:30 p.m., NBA-TV) after winning seven of its last eight games.

Sweeping the road swing farthest west has always been difficult for Eastern teams visiting Phoenix, Los Angeles and Seattle, which the Connecticut Sun did earlier this season before its current slump and New York could be the second to do it with as win over the Sparks.

Rodgers has been in the middle of the surge for the Liberty, averaging 11.8 points since June 21 against Atlanta.

New York went 4-1 overall when Rodgers started.

A sharp-shooting guard with a quick trigger finger, she scored a career-high 23 points in a win against the Sparks on June 28 back home in Madison Square Garden.

"I treat everything the same, whether I come off the bench or whether I start," Rodgers said. "I prepare the same way and try to be consistent in what I do.

"It's more of a confidence thing for me right now and everybody believing in you. In the beginning of the season, I was struggling with my jump shot and they say great shooters, keep shooting and that's what I did."

Rodgers has reached double digits in scoring nine times this season.

While Charles is making a strong case for league MVP honors, Rodgers has been the perfect complement.

She's tenacious on defense, electric on offense and a leader among a team with plenty of seasoned veterans. She's one of four Liberty players with a championship ring (Tanisha Wright, Swin Cash and Candace Wiggins are the others).

In the win over Washington two weeks ago, Rodgers finished with 15 points, hit a pair of critical free throws in overtime, and buried two 3-pointers in a game that featured a 17-minute delay because of a power outage in the arena.

Rodgers scored 13 points, all in the second half, while dishing out a team-high five assists in a victory over San Antonio last week.

In the Liberty's most impressive victory of the season, Rodgers scored eight of her 10 points in the second quarter in a 75-73 comeback win at Phoenix on Saturday.

New York scored a season-best 27 fourth-quarter points while ending the game on a 13-4 run over the final 2:52 to sweep Phoenix for the first time since 2012.

"My coaches' and teammates have continued to push me," Rodgers said. "Just knowing that my teammates have my back means the world to me. They continue to swing the ball to me and they're not going to say, 'she's not going to make the shot, so why should I swing the ball to her.'"

Even though she was Georgetown's all-time leading scorer with 2,518 points and helped the Hoyas advance to three consecutive Sweet 16 appearances, Rodgers spent most of her time glued to the bench in Minnesota as a rookie.

Looking back, it may have been the best thing that happened to her.

"In Minnesota they teach you how to win," Rodgers said. "I didn't get a chance to play, but they taught me how to mentally stay together when you don't play.

"I think it was good for me because all my life I had been used to playing and there you have to learn how to cheer for your teammates and be a good teammate. Even though I am playing a significant role here, I take everything that I learned from Minnesota as a rookie and last year and keep moving forward."

Believe it or not, golf was Rodgers specialty sport growing up until one day her older brother

nailed a wooden backboard and a bent rim to the side of their house.

The rest was history for Rodgers, who immediately became quickly adept at playing basketball and learning the nuances of it from watching.

From there, Rodgers played on an elite AAU travel team, which ultimately helped her earn a scholarship to Georgetown where she turned the old rugged Big East into her personal playground.

"Everybody always says to me that your mom would be proud and that's all I ever wanted," Rodgers said. "I always said no matter what you're going through, there's a way out.

"I made it out. Wherever you are, you have to keep dreaming. If you dream and you believe it, then you can accomplish it," she said. "If you let others dictate what you're going to be, then it's not going to happen. You just have to keep believing."

Liberty No. 1 in East heading into All-Star break

The New York Liberty now head into All-Star Weekend confident as the number one team in the Eastern Conference. They gained their fifth consecutive win in a rough defeat Wednesday night against the L.A. Sparks.

This was the lowest scoring game all season for the Liberty as they shot a mere 25% from the floor. The Sparks bailed New York out by putting them on the free throw line 17 times, and allowing them to snag 19 offensive rebounds.

Tina Charles, whose coming off her season high of 30 points against Seattle, led her team with 14 points to match her 14 rebounds. She was one of the only two New York starters who scored in this game. The other being Epiphanny Prince, who had 13 points and 7 rebounds.

Kristi Toliver, who remained pretty silent in the first half, ended up leading the Sparks with 16 points. Toliver hit a 3-pointer in the final 22.4 left seconds of the game to come within three points of the Liberty, but missed an inside jumper the following possession that locked in the win for New York. Nneka Ogumike, who averages 18 points a game, allowed New York to get her out of rhythm, and she ended the game with just 6 points.

The Sparks just recently ended their five-game slump with a 70-65 home defeat over the defending champions, the Phoenix Mercury. Jantel Lavender had 19 points, and 11 rebounds for her ninth double-double and Ogumike had 17 points. Although having the worst record in the league, things are looking up for L.A. as Candace Parker will be back in the lineup their first game after the all-star break against the Minnesota Lynx.

L.A. had a great defensive start with an excellent job by Lavender protecting the paint, which in turn gave New York problems finishing inside shots. In the first five minutes of the game, L.A. was able to hold the Liberty to just 21% shooting from the field. However, the Sparks, who led the majority of the first, received two technical fouls in the quarter alone. The second technical gave the Liberty the chance to tie 12-12. Both teams had a low scoring start, a pattern that continued throughout the following quarters.

Rookie Crystal Bradford, the 7th overall 2015 draft pick, made her first game appearance with the Sparks and scored her first career points with just 20 seconds of her entry in the second quarter. However, L.A. did not keep up their momentum on defense and the Liberty, leading the league in rebounds, got off many second chance points. Center Avery Warley-Talbert came off the bench and scored her first bucket, giving New York their first lead, in which they kept throughout the game. New York went on a 7-0 run in the last three minutes of the first half, going into halftime 31-24. The second quarter was the worst point production all year for the Sparks who scored a mere 10 points.

Both teams came into the second half seeming a little fatigue, resulting in lazy passes and off the mark shots. The Sparks, who continued to struggle to score in the second half, held New York to just 26% shooting in the third quarter, just 1% above their overall shooting. It was a sorry performance by both teams, each who made just three field goals in the third quarter. But the Liberty was able to hold off the Sparks throughout the fourth quarter and go into the All-Star weekend on top.

From Wednesday night's performance, both New York and L.A. are in great need of the break coming up as the players of the Eastern Conference battle those of the West. Charles is the only player from both teams that made a starting lineup. However, Brittany Boyd, Sugar Rodgers, Swin Cash, and Kiah Stokes are all receiving votes for Team East while Sparks' Ogumike, Toliver and Jantel Lavender are receiving votes for Team West.

Becky Hammon inducted into Liberty's Ring of Honor

Throughout Sunday's Liberty game, the 10,682 fans in attendance got glimpses into the past.

Decade-old highlights of Becky Hammon flashed on the Madison Square Garden scoreboard. Accompanying her dribbling, passing and shooting were her bouncing blonde ponytail as she ran the floor, her bushy bangs, her bubbly, almost cartoonlike attitude that went hand-in-hand with her 5-6 stature.

As she addressed the media before being inducted into the Liberty's Ring of Honor at halftime of the team's 78-62 win over the Seattle Storm, the distinction between then and now was evident. No more bangs. Darker hair. A certain maturity about her, one that could be acquired only by a player who had been through it all.

But most evident: the weight of the words she spoke, and the barriers she is breaking as a coach.

"Leadership," Hammon said, "has no gender."

When she signed with the Spurs last year, Hammon became the NBA's first full-time female assistant coach. A year later, she was named the Spurs' summer league head coach and led the team to a title July 20.

That in itself is worthy of headlines. But the story surrounding Hammon has been her gender.

"I hope we get to the point in society that this is not news anymore," Hammon said. "[It should be] we hired this person because they're right for the job. All that other stuff doesn't really matter."

Hammon, who was an undrafted free agent out of Colorado State before playing seven seasons with the Liberty between 1999-2006 and becoming a six-time WNBA All-Star selection, joined five others -- Vickie Johnson, Teresa Weatherspoon, Rebecca Lobo, Sue Wicks and Kym Hampton -- in the Liberty's Ring of Honor. Liberty president Isiah Thomas presented her a ring.

"You guys loved me first," Hammon said to the New York crowd during her speech.

Before the game, Hammon praised Spurs coach Gregg Popovich, the man who hired her.

"There's lots of guys that would say, 'Oh, yeah, she has a great basketball mind' and leave it at that," Hammon said. "Pop said she has a great basketball mind and I'm going to give this girl an opportunity.

"In professional sports, it's so male-dominant, but we're not asking the man to get up and leave his seat. We're just saying scoot over a little bit. Make a little room at the table for the ladies."

Before her pregame news conference concluded, Hammon was asked if she could imagine herself as an NBA head coach in the future.

"Even just two years ago, the question would probably be preposterous," Hammon said. "But just because something hasn't been done doesn't mean it can't be done. I don't see why not; if not me, someone else. The point is do you know basketball, do you know what it takes to lead people? And leadership really has no gender."

1 reason why the Liberty are so successful

With any team's success, there's usually a multitude of reasons for their success. But, in the New York Liberty's case, there is one reason for their rise to the top of the Eastern Conference.

New York City, NY - Back in the day Red Holtzman patrolled the sideline and fans bellowed 'dee-fense, dee-fense'. Those Knick teams defended, but the fans utilized the signature chant at a key juncture in the contest. These days, the New York Liberty do not have a rallying cry, yet, but they do have something those vintage Knick teams had: Outstanding defense.

Following the an 84-63 victory over the Chicago Sky on Tuesday, Bill Laimbeer was asked if he knew the Liberty were working on the best defensive efficiency in the league.

The Liberty mentor admitted he is a former player from another era who really does not get involved in the analytics and numbers of today. Still, he admitted to continuously looking at the underlying numbers of field goal percentage defense and points allowed.

Laimbeer, whose team held Chicago to a superlative 78 defensive efficiency, was happy in limiting the Sky to 41% shooting from the floor. "That (defense) is how we win ball games," Laimbeer said. "That's how we play...everyone on our team defends because if you don't you aren't playing."

The Liberty sit at 14-6 perched atop the WNBA Eastern Conference. The defense has been a constant and main reason behind their success. The question beckoned, is the defense a byproduct of talent, drills or schemes? Or a little of each?

"Talent is a big factor," Kiah Stokes said. The Liberty forward has become a defensive terror inside, a feared shot blocker, in this her rookie season. "You have to want to be good on defense. You have to be a one on one defender and also play help side defense."

Stokes continued, "if you get beat, it is important to know a teammate will be there to pick up the help side. We trust each other and with our chemistry that allows us to play such good defense."

Prior to the game Sky coach Pokey Chatman spoke of the Liberty defense. Not about what makes it tick, rather how it is special. Chatman said the Liberty have something very unique, "three rim protectors. They allow the guards to gamble and get in the passing lane. If the guards get beat, someone is waiting in the lane. No team in our league has what the Liberty has, three people like that who defend inside."

The defensive question asked of Stokes was posed to Epiphanny Prince. Interestingly the Liberty guard said the defense is rooted in 'trust'. "We all trust each other to help," Prince said. "I know if I get beat Kiah (Stokes), or Tina (Charles) is waiting inside with help side defense."

Prince said it also gets back to Pride. Some say pride is a sin. Basketball coaches feel a lack of pride is sinful. "We take a lot of pride in our defense," Prince said. "Everyone on the team has pride in how we defend."

Laimbeer said as Labor Day creeps up on the caliber the stakes are higher, and competition will be tougher. "Late in the season everyone has seen each other and can make the necessary adjustment," Laimbeer said. "That is the time when your defense (if it is good) really sees you through."

What is the secret to the Liberty's staggering success?

There is something special brewing in the Big Apple, as the New York Liberty has risen to the top of the WNBA. But what has caused such a remarkable turnaround? Chemistry.

New York City, NY - In coaching lore they say getting a technical foul can take a team struggling with a listless approach and fire them up. The technical is normally by the coach's design. It can happen with a player, though not really by design.

On Friday early in the third quarter at Madison Square Garden, Tina Charles of the New York Liberty was assessed a 'T'. At the time, the Liberty had a one-point lead. The visiting Atlanta Dream would soon take the lead, increasing it to nine midway through the third stanza. Then Charles took over. Dominating and ultimately leading the Liberty to a 78-67 victory.

The first half the Dream doubled down on Charles in the low post. Sensing the double, she reversed the ball to the weak side. Atlanta had that covered with a defender sliding down to deflect or intercept the pass.

The second half, Charles stepped out near the foul line and hit the mid-range jumper. She scored 17 of her game-high 25 points that final half. In addition, Charles pulled down seven boards. The technical may have had a delayed effect on firing Charles up, but she did not mention it.

"This is a rivalry game," Charles said in the Liberty locker room. "This was a tough, aggressive game. They (Atlanta) are very physical. They came in needing to win this one." As Liberty coach Bill Laimbeer who called this a 'playoff type game' later assessed, "this game was a test for us. And we passed."

Give a world of credit to Charles. Don't forget Epiphanny Prince, an 18 point scorer, knocking down three treys and playing no small part in the Liberty comeback. It would be a severe oversight to terminate the discussion with Charles and Prince. Prominent mention must be made of the supporting cast. Called on by Laimbeer to get the job done they responded.

Brittany Boyd came off the bench to "give us a great deal of energy," per Laimbeer. Boyd scored 7 points, handed out 4 assists and grabbed 5 rebounds. Carolyn Swords started, played well the first half then "got a little tentative," in Laimbeer's estimation. Kiah Stokes scored 8 points with a game-high nine rebounds in relief. "Kiah had two blocked shots," Laimbeer said, "but she probably changed 10 more."

Tanisha Wright and Candace Wiggins combined for two points. Their roles were crucial, taking turns defending Angel McCoughtry. The Dream's leading scorer, McCoughtry scored 13 points.

She had six the second half and did not enter the scorebook the final twenty minutes until just under 6 minutes remained. "Candace (Wiggins) and Tanisha (Wright) played physical defense on Angel (McCoughtry)," Laimbeer said.

"They bumped her, got physical and made it tough on her getting looks," Charles added the praise saying, "our guards Candace and Tanisha defended Angel (McCoughtry) well. She (McCoughtry) can go off on you for 40 points. Our defenders kept her in check tonight."

The Liberty are atop the East at 18-8. The Dream are now 10-16 with their clock ticking. Laimbeer still will not discuss playoffs except to say "we haven't qualified or won anything yet." He will openly discuss team chemistry.

"We built a team this year with the emphasis on chemistry," he said. "How outstanding this chemistry has been is a pleasant surprise." It is evident in playing time. Laimbeer said among the reserves playing time can often be dispersed unevenly. Get 15 to 20 minutes one night 2 or 3 the next, all according to the situation.

"Our players know, (Tina) Charles scores," said, "(Epiphanny) Prince is our guard threat. The others have different roles. Those roles change and can divide up playing time in different ways." The team realizes this and has totally bought in. "Winning," Laimbeer added, "can also cure a lot of ailments."

Epiphanny Prince helps Liberty hold off Lynx to clinch playoff berth

It was hyped as a potential WNBA Finals preview, and the atmosphere at Madison Square Garden on Friday night certainly screamed "playoffs!"

But the Liberty simply saw the Minnesota Lynx as the last hurdle to overcome before clinching its first playoff berth since 2012

"It was just a team that was in our way of accomplishing what we want to get done," All-Star forward Tina Charles said after the Liberty clinched that berth with an 81-68 victory. "Just treating it as the next opponent."

Yet WNBA fans will recognize the Liberty's win over the best in the West as a statement of sorts. Unlike the recent success enjoyed by the Lynx (19-10) -- which made the Finals three of the previous four seasons and won two titles -- the Liberty (19-8) finished fifth in the Eastern Conference in each of the previous two seasons before racing off to the best start in franchise history this year.

The Eastern Conference-leading Liberty is 2 1/2 games ahead of Chicago and Indiana.

Behind a six-point first quarter by Epiphanny Prince (22 points), the Liberty built a 27-16 lead in the first 10 minutes. But after shooting 0-for-5 in the first quarter, MVP candidate Maya Moore scored 14 points in the second.

The Lynx got to within three points after a free throw by Moore with 58 seconds left in the first half, but Prince's pull-up jumper with less than a second remaining gave the Liberty a 43-38 lead heading into the break.

In the second half, the Liberty's lead peaked at 14 points. Prince drained a corner three-pointer and was fouled with three minutes left in the third. She hit the ensuing free throw for a four-point play that gave the Liberty a 58-44 lead.

The 10,059 in attendance ensured a playoff atmosphere. "There were no intensity lulls," Liberty coach Bill Laimbeer said.

Charles had 18 points and 11 rebounds. The Liberty shot 50.7 percent and limited the Lynx to 37.3 percent shooting.

"They're a fine-shooting team, but we're a fine defensive team," Laimbeer said. "Holding them to 37 percent is right in our wheelhouse."

"We have a long way to go. This just happens to be one game. We beat a quality team in our building. We expect that. We didn't really get anything accomplished today. You'll all write that we made the playoffs. In the locker room, we'll be like, 'OK, great. Let's go play tomorrow.' "

Epiphanny Prince's Arrival Raises Liberty's Hopes of Returning to W.N.B.A. Playoffs

Epiphanny Prince had just finished her second practice with the Liberty this month when she griped to a staff member.

Feigning anger, yet still somewhat serious, Prince let the employee know that she was from Brooklyn — not Queens, as had been listed on the team's website.

Prince was raised in the Ingersoll Houses in Fort Greene and cultivated her game on nearby blacktop courts like so many Brooklyn guards before her. But it was in Manhattan, at Murry Bergtraum High School, where she made national headlines for scoring 113 points in a game.

Such offensive proficiency has been absent from the Liberty in recent years.

In February, Prince became the second former local high school star to be acquired by the Liberty over the last two years. During the 2014 draft, they obtained Tina Charles, the 2012 W.N.B.A. most valuable player, who graduated from Christ the King in Queens.

The Liberty are relying on the two homegrown stars to form a potent inside-out scoring attack that can lead them back to the playoffs for the first time since 2012.

"You have an offensive player on the perimeter that teams have to account for all the time," Washington Mystics Coach Mike Thibault said of Prince. "I think that's going to make a difference for them. She's a lethal offensive weapon. It will take pressure off Tina a little bit."

Prince and Charles first met when they were about 11 and playing in summer tournaments. Two weeks before Prince broke the girls' national high school single-game scoring record — previously held by Cheryl Miller — in a 137-32 win over Brandeis High School in 2006, Charles hit a winning shot at the buzzer to defeat Prince and Murry Bergtraum at Madison Square Garden.

Brandeis Coach Vera Springer speculated at the time that the 113-point effort against her team was a salvo to prove Prince's supremacy over Charles.

Before this season, Liberty Coach Bill Laimbeer made clear the hierarchy on his roster: The team was built around Charles. But it could be Prince's play that ultimately determines how far the Liberty go.

Prince missed the first 10 games of the season while playing for the Russian national team at the 2015 EuroBasket tournament, a qualifier for the 2016 Olympics. Prince became a naturalized Russian citizen in 2010, a year after she skipped her senior year at Rutgers and signed with the Russian team Spartak Moscow.

Throughout the Liberty's first month of play, the inability to establish a second primary

scorer was obvious.

On June 14, with Charles shooting 3 for 17 and scoring 6 points, the Liberty were handed their first home loss of the season, by the Mystics, 74-59.

In the Liberty's next game, against the Indiana Fever, Charles was in early foul trouble and missed most of the first quarter as the Liberty fell behind, 32-12. Charles was again held to 6 points, shooting 3 for 13.

"We're not a powerful superteam in this league," Laimbeer said after the Fever loss. "We're marginal and scraping by at best. If we don't do what we're supposed to do, we're going to get beat, and get beat sometimes handily like this one."

After Russia's EuroBasket elimination on June 27, the Liberty were reeling, having lost three of four. Prince received a text from a front office member asking her to fly to Chicago for their June 30 game against the Sky.

A virus prevented her from playing, but with an eight-day layoff for the Liberty after the Sky matchup, Prince was able to go through essentially a midseason minicamp of practices, becoming familiar with her new team and her mission.

"They want me to be an efficient scorer, not a volume shooter," Prince said.

Prince, who once attended Liberty games with her Amateur Athletic Union team and watched Teresa Weatherspoon and Becky Hammon, made her long-delayed debut last Thursday.

She scored 12 points, and the Liberty defeated the Mystics for the first time in three tries this season.

Laimbeer, known for his fiery demeanor as a core member of the Detroit Pistons' Bad Boys teams of the 1980s, spent much of his first two years with the Liberty reacting out of frustration.

During the second quarter of the win at Washington, after standing up to watch Prince breeze past two defenders and draw contact for a basket and a foul, Laimbeer emphatically pumped his fist.

In Prince's first home game, an 84-68 win over the San Antonio Stars on Wednesday, she scored 13 points and again showed fearlessness in creating offense. With the Liberty ahead, 37-28, in the final seconds of the first half, Prince sliced through two defenders and rushed into 6-foot-4, 210-pound Jayne Appel before wrapping around a no-look pass to Charles for a layup.

"When I see Epiphanny Prince on the court, I have an extra boost of confidence," Charles said.

Prince's success could define Laimbeer's tenure with the Liberty. Since arriving in 2012, Laimbeer has had a hand in several notable trades, with varied results.

Before the 2013 draft, he dealt Kia Vaughn for the seventh overall pick, which was used

on Toni Young. In June 2014, Young was waived after averaging 3.5 points a game over two seasons.

Days later, the Liberty acquired the rights to Deanna Nolan, who had won three titles with Laimbeer as a member of the Detroit Shock but had not played in the league since 2009.

Although Charles remains one of the league's best frontcourt players and was voted an All-Star Game starter, her first year with the Liberty was a flop as they finished 15-19 and missed the playoffs.

To acquire the scoring threat necessary to complement her, the Liberty relinquished Cappie Pondexter, who was the most valuable player of 2007 W.N.B.A. finals with the Phoenix Mercury. Laimbeer said Prince's age — she is five years younger than Pondexter — was a critical factor in giving up a player who had been the face of the franchise since 2010.

"There's multiple ways to get to where you want to be at, but you can't be afraid," Laimbeer said. "I'm not. You get a vision, and you go for the vision. If the vision didn't work, O.K., it didn't work. But you have to have a vision of what your basketball team's going to look like not only in the present, but also two, three years down the road."

After three years of tinkering with the roster with a number of ineffective moves, Laimbeer believes the younger and more athletic core of Prince and Charles is the solution to changing the Liberty's fate. Essence Carson, who played with Prince at Rutgers and is the longest-tenured Liberty player, agreed.

"The base is finally there," Carson said. "Especially since Piph is now back and with us, you can see the complete puzzle."

Doing It All For 'Kicks'

She's got sole!

If there's one thing more impressive than New York Liberty point guard Epiphanny Prince's court skills, it's her shoe-store game.

The Brooklyn-born B-ball player has more than 400 pairs of kicks, an ever-growing collection she says is worth about \$100,000.

"I'm still thinking I need to move to a bigger place — so I can get a bigger room," said Prince, 27.

Prince gave The Post an exclusive tour of her Long Island apartment, opening the door to a room entirely dedicated to her hobby.

Hundreds of plastic containers, each containing a single pair, stretch from floor to ceiling — all monitored by the nanny cam she installed to keep a watchful eye on her "babies" while she plays across the country and overseas.

"This is serious. I'm in Chicago looking, I'm in Russia looking. If I get robbed, I'm looking to see, how many did they take?" she said.

Prince grew up at the Ingersoll Houses in Fort Greene, Brooklyn, taking up basketball when she was around 11 years old.

"One of my cousins told me, 'Just sit down — a girl is never going to beat a boy.' So that's what really motivated me. Just to prove him wrong," she said.

She made national headlines in 2006, when she scored 113 points in a game for Murry Bergtraum HS, shattering a record held by Hall of Famer Cheryl Miller.

“For me, I always loved new shoes growing up. Always wanted to look clean, just loved the feeling of wearing new shoes,” she said.

She credits NBA legend Michael Jordan — or at least his signature line of Nike sneakers — for sparking her obsession when she was in sixth grade and her Size 9 feet stopped growing.

“Growing up, that’s what everybody wanted — Jordans,” she said. “It was, like, the thing to do.”

Her mom, Loretta, enabled her shoe addiction, but when money was tight, Prince looked to other family members to get her fix.

“I went around the line [of relatives] being like, ‘Who has me this weekend?’ ” Prince recalled.

Prince had a homecoming last February, when she was traded to the Liberty from the Chicago Sky.

When the WNBA isn’t in season, she plays for a Russian-league team called the Dynamo Kursk.

“Now that I’m back in New York, every day, I’m out in a new pair. I’m excited I can wear my shoes again,” she said.

And so can fellow sneakerheads in her old Brooklyn neighborhood.

“I’m running out of space, so I’ll go back to the neighborhood and give away some old shoes so I can get the newer ones,” she said.

Kymora Johnson and her teammates may not have been able to walk onto the court at their youth basketball tournament, but they've just been given an upgrade.

The New York Liberty are flying in the under-11 Charlottesville Cavaliers to play a game at Madison Square Garden this weekend, exactly two weeks after being disqualified from the National Travel Basketball Association (NTBA) tournament in Myrtle Beach, South Carolina, for playing Johnson on their team.

"The Liberty organization thought it would be great to do something special for the team," Kristin Bernert, SVP Business & Basketball Operations for the New York Liberty, told The Huffington Post. "Ultimately, the Liberty are striving to inspire young women to take their basketball experiences and build a foundation for successful, healthy adult lives."

Johnson had played with the Cavaliers for years and previously played at the NTBA tournament, but the organization told HuffPost earlier in August that it decided to ban girls from playing on boys' teams this year after receiving numerous complaints from parents.

The team was not told that it was disqualified from the tournament until it had reached the semifinals. The organization had reportedly not been aware that Johnson was not only suiting up and sitting with the team, but actually playing. The Cavaliers stood at the semifinal game in quiet protest of the rule to ban girls from boys' teams.

The story quickly became national news, which led the New York Liberty to talk with Delta Airlines about getting the team, their coaches and parents up to New York this weekend.

The Cavs will be guests at the Liberty's game against the Tulsa Shock on Saturday and then play a game of their own against a team from the MSG's "Basketball in the Boroughs and Beyond" program, a youth basketball initiative. Liberty players and alumni will be on the bench with the teams, and fans who attend the game will be invited to watch Johnson and the Cavs play.

Along with Charles' double-double for the Liberty, Epiphanny Prince finished the game with 22 points. Center Kiah Stokes recorded 11 rebounds in the game, tying her career high.

Maya Moore once again led the way for the Lynx, scoring 25 points and grabbing nine rebounds. Sylvia Fowles, also recorded a double-double for Minnesota with 18 points and 10 rebounds.

The Liberty will have very little time to recover from Friday's victory, as they take the court again on Saturday against the Connecticut Sun. The Lynx will head home to host the Phoenix Mercury on Sunday.

"It's a regular season game that gives us positioning for home court advantage," said Cash. "I understand the importance of having home court throughout the whole playoffs, and we're in a position to be able to have that."

Tuesday night, the Liberty pulled out a tough 80-75 win over the Atlanta Dream in overtime. Sugar Rodgers had 23 points.

"Off the court we get along really well, and on the court we all have a common goal and we want to do something great together," said post player Carolyn Swords. "In [tough] games, it's good to be able to really lean on each other and be able to trust each other. That's certainly helping us."

Liberty clinch first in the East

A 75-71 victory over the Minnesota Lynx Sunday evening allowed the New York Liberty to clinch the No. 1 seed in the Eastern Conference for the first time since 2002. This win guarantees the Liberty home-court advantage through the first two rounds of the playoffs.

After a season filled with good news—guard Epiphanny Prince was named Eastern Conference Player of the Month for August—last week was rough. The Liberty suffered a crushing 82-60 defeat on home court last Thursday at the hands of the Chicago Sky, with New York shooting just 34.8 percent from the field and 66.7 percent at the free-throw line.

“We probably took them a little for granted,” said veteran guard Tanisha Wright. “They came out and punched us in the face, and we couldn’t recover from it. It’s a wake-up call that everybody wants it just as bad as we want it. We’re not the only team that wants it.”

Coach Bill Laimbeer noted that the Sky out-defended the Liberty, which was quite stunning because the Liberty are the top defensive team in the WNBA. He called the defeat a great lesson for the coaches and players.

“They showed us the atmosphere we’re going to face coming into the playoffs,” Laimbeer said. “It’s good experience for our young players and our collective team to show the intensity level, energy and effort you have to put forth to win a game.”

Forward Swin Cash said the Liberty players needed to take a deep breath after the Sky loss, get a little rest and come back strong against the Lynx, which is precisely what happened.

Guard Candice Wiggins said it was obvious how focused the Sky were, determined not to be swept by the Liberty this season. “You have to swallow that, give them credit for what they did,” Wiggins said. “The good news is that this isn’t the end of the season. It really is a new start.”

Unfortunately, the start won’t include rookie guard Brittany Boyd, who suffered a fracture to her left wrist during the third quarter of the Chicago game. She underwent surgery Sept. 4. With recovery time expected to take five to six weeks, she is done for the 2015 season.

The Liberty close out regular season play Friday night versus the Washington Mystics.

Liberty Reap Benefits of a Rearranged Frontcourt

The photo of Carolyn Swords on her W.N.B.A. player page has not been updated in years, but it perfectly encapsulates her influence on the Liberty, who finished the regular season 23-11 and clinched home-court advantage through the playoffs for the first time.

Swords, then a member of the Chicago Sky, is shown in a defensive stance that would make James Naismith proud, with arms spread wide. She is stationed outside the post, preparing to guard Tina Charles, then of the Connecticut Sun, one of the league's most versatile offensive players.

Now they are teammates, and the Liberty are headed to the playoffs for the first time since 2012.

Charles has spent much more time this season roaming the perimeter on both offense and defense as the team's power forward, while Swords has anchored the lane at center along with the rookie Kiah Stokes. The rotation has been beneficial to the players, all of them defensive stalwarts. Swords became a regular starter for the first time in her pro career, and Stokes is a contender for rookie of the year. Charles has re-emerged as a contender for the league's Most Valuable Player Award.

"They took loads of pressure off me," Charles said, referring to Stokes and Swords.

Coach Bill Laimbeer traded for Charles in 2014, planning to move her to power forward, away from the center position that she had regularly managed for the Sun, including when she was the M.V.P. in 2012. A lack of depth at center last year changed those plans.

"Most people thought I was nuts, but I thought that was her natural position," Laimbeer said.

"Banging bodies against the big trucks out there wears her down a little bit. It was imperative to get somebody who handles that role, even if it's for 12 to 15 minutes a game, which is what Carolyn is playing now."

Charles still handles the Liberty's opening tipoffs, but that is the extent of her duties at center. She then transitions into a multifaceted role, becoming the team's top scoring option and defensive engine. She regularly catches entry passes and drives to the basket but is no longer tied to the post on defense, instead scanning the perimeter, often poking the ball away from guards or jumping out to contest 3-point shots. On average, the Liberty allowed the fewest points and the lowest opponent field-goal percentage in the league this season on their way to a franchise record for victories.

"It's the best defense I've ever seen her play in this league," Laimbeer said.

Laimbeer's calculated move was a gamble. Stokes, who is 6 feet 3 inches and 190 pounds, was a dominant defensive player in college at Connecticut, but there were

doubts that her thin frame would stand up to the rigors of the W.N.B.A.

No longer having to battle for space with the likes of Kelsey Bone and Sylvia Fowles, Charles taught Stokes about the tendencies of centers across the league. At UConn, Stokes could drift and play from behind to block shots. Now, not only are elbows to the face more frequent, but so are pump fakes. Charles drilled into Stokes the idea that post players have to be pushed off the block early and that if they do gain position, she has to stay on her feet, not jump.

Continue reading the main story Stokes has exceeded the coaching staff's expectations. On July 16 against the Sun, she blocked eight shots, a franchise record. In August, she was named rookie of the month. She finished the regular season ranked among the league leaders in rebounding and blocked shots.

"Honestly, she has my vote for rookie of the year," Sun Coach Anne Donovan said recently.

Swords was an even more unknown quantity. In July 2013, she tore her left medial collateral ligament playing for the Sky. Seven months later, shortly after completing her rehabilitation, she reinjured the knee. Doctors told her to wear a brace for the rest of her career. Swords began to doubt whether she would play professionally again.

"There's always that thought: Is this going to be possible again?" Swords said.

Swords, who is 6-6 and 206 pounds, is less mobile than Charles. The giant black knee brace she wears limits her leap to a few inches off the ground. Swords's numbers are modest, but her averages of 5.1 points and 4.0 rebounds per game are actually career highs. More important, she has given Laimbeer the true center he wanted for his system, one able to absorb contact on defense and to alter shots.

"She was frustrated because she told me she couldn't move the way she used to be able to," said Courtney Vandersloot, who played with Swords for three seasons in Chicago. "But she's one of the toughest players I ever played with. She's got the work ethic like no one else."

Laimbeer said he had no reservations about keeping the rotation in the playoffs, which could be tested against their first-round opponent, the Washington Mystics. Coach Mike Thibault has two potent frontcourt scorers in Stefanie Dolson and Emma Meesseman, who can stretch a defense and stick to Charles throughout the halfcourt. The Mystics crushed the Liberty, 82-55, on Friday and took three of four games in the season series.

But Laimbeer has seen other positive effects of Charles's switch away from center, which he believes may become more evident in the postseason.

"I think she's much more confident in her ability to take over a game smartly, not just as a volume shooter but as a precisionist," Laimbeer said. "I think she wants the ball in big possessions and is very focused in those possessions. Her overall awareness and focus is so much better this year."

Elena Delle Donne, another M.V.P. contender, said Charles had craved that kind of freedom for years. The veteran forward Swin Cash, who was traded to the Liberty late

last season, said that the change in team chemistry had been just as important.

“By having bigger players this year, I think all of our post players give Tina a freer mind to be able to be more mobile,” Cash said. “They have been a tremendous help for her. I came into the season late last year, and there were a lot of things that were not going right. Her maturation, becoming more of a leader, I think the sky’s the limit for her.”

But does Charles miss playing center?

“No,” she said, laughing. “I definitely do not.”
