#### QUICK HITS

New York struck a deal with Dallas for 2015 second overall pick Amanda Zahui B. and a 2017 second round pick for the Liberty's 2017 first round pick on May 11. Zahui B. averaged 3.4 ppg and 2.4 rpg during her rookie season.

New York acquired All-Star guard Shoni Schimmel from the Atlanta Dream on May 2 in exchange for the Liberty's 2017 second round draft pick. Schimmel is a two-time All-Star with career-averages of 8.0 ppg and 1.5 3-pointers per game.

The Liberty lost the 2015 season series to the Mystics 3-1, but defeated Washington, 2-1, in the Eastern Conference Semifinals, including an 86-68 win in New York's last trip to the Verizon Center.

New York posted the best record in the WNBA last season at 23-11, setting a franchise record for wins. The Liberty advanced to the Eastern Conference Finals.

During the offseason, New York signed Shavonte Zellous and Lindsey Harding. In the WNBA Draft, the Liberty took Adut Bulgak (6-3 • C • Florida State) at 12th overall and Ameryst Alston (5-10 • G • Ohio State) at 24th overall. Both Bulgak and Alston made the Liberty's opening night roster.

Bill Laimbeer, a two-time WNBA Coach of the Year and three-time WNBA Champion, enters his fourth season as head coach of the New York Liberty.

During the 2015 campaign, his third full season as the head coach of the Liberty, Laimbeer helped guide the franchise to the best regular season in team history, posting a franchise-record 23 victories while the Liberty was able to grab the top overall seed in the WNBA for the first time ever and the top spot in the Eastern Conference for the first time since 2002. New York advanced to the Eastern Conference Finals for its deepest playoff run since 2010.

Additionally, New York boasted a pair of All-WNBA performers for the first-time in Tina Charles (First Team) and Epiphanny Prince (Second Team) while also seeing a pair of rookies, Kiah Stokes and Brittany Boyd, land on the WNBA All-Rookie Team. The Liberty led the league in points allowed per game (71.1) and defensive field goal percentage (.393).

Laimbeer previously spent eight seasons from 2002-09 as general manager and head coach of the Detroit Shock (now Tulsa Shock), where he earned WNBA Coach of the Year honors in his first full season as head coach (2003). He took over a team that finished 9-23 in the previous year and led them to a league-best 25 wins the following season. The 16-win improvement was the largest in WNBA history. Laimbeer led the Shock to a 137-93 (.596) overall record, including six-straight playoff appearances as the squad won the WNBA Championship in 2003, 2006 and 2008.

As general manager of the Shock, Laimbeer made several key moves during his tenure that were integral in Detroit capturing three WNBA Championships, which still stand as second most in league history. In his first full season, Laimbeer drafted former All-Star and 2003 Rookie of the Year Cheryl Ford. He also acquired the Finals MVP that year Ruth Riley in the WNBA dispersal draft.

Prior to returning to the WNBA, Laimbeer spent two seasons as an assistant in the NBA with the Minnesota Timberwolves (2009-2011).

A 14-year NBA veteran, Laimbeer was a four-time All-Star for the Detroit Pistons. As a member of the famed "Bad Boys," Laimbeer totaled 13,790 points and 10,400 rebounds in his career, becoming just the 19th player in NBA history to eclipse 10,000 in both categories. A key member of back-to-back NBA Championships in 1989 and 1990, he had his jersey No. 40 retired by the franchise in 1995. Laimbeer played college ball at Notre Dame from 1975-79, graduating with a degree in economics in 1979.

Laimbeer and his wife Chris are parents to their son Eric and daughter Keri.

## HISTORIC 20TH WNBA SEASON

- The WNBA is celebrating its historic 20th WNBA season in 2016, a milestone that is of additional significance for the Liberty as a founding member of the league and one of three original franchises (Phoenix, Los Angeles).
- The Liberty played in the inaugural WNBA game against the Los Angeles Sparks in the Great Western Forum on June 21, 1997.
- The Liberty is the only WNBA franchise to operate under the same ownership group for all 20 years of the WNBA's existence.
- New York played in the first-ever WNBA Championship game, falling to the Houston Comets, 65-52 on August 30, 1997.
- The Liberty has been to the WNBA Finals three times, last in 2002.
- The Liberty has an all-time record of 328-300 (.522) with 13 playoff berths.

## LIBERTY 2015 SEASON HEADLINES

- New York finished the 2015 regular season with the best record in the WNBA for the first time in franchise history.
- New York was 23-11 overall, posting the most regular season wins in franchise history, passing the previous mark of 22.
- New York swept the season series with Phoenix for the first time since 2012, both games from Los Angeles for the first time since 2010, and went 2-0 against Minnesota for the first time since 2007.
- Bill Laimbeer was named WNBA Coach of the Year for the second time in his career.
- Tina Charles (1st Team) and Epiphanny Prince (2nd Team) earned All-WNBA accolades.
- Tina Charles, Kiah Stokes, and Tanisha Wright were all named WNBA Second-Team All-Defensive honorees.
- Kiah Stokes was runner-up for 2015 WNBA Rookie of the Year and she was named to the All-Rookie team along with Brittany Boyd.

## TINA CHARLES ON THE #ROADTORIO

Tina Charles will represent her country in the Olympics for a second time as she has been selected as one of 12 players to compete for the 2016 U.S. Olympic Women's Basketball Team at the Summer Games in Rio de Janeiro. With her selection, Charles becomes the first active New York Liberty player to play for the U.S. at the Olympic games. Charles, who won a gold medal at the 2012 games in London, was also a member of a pair of FIBA World Championship gold medal winning teams (2010, 2014). The United States will begin its quest for a historic sixth-consecutive gold medal when it faces Senegal on either August 6 or 7.

## LIBERTY LONG ON OLYMPIC EXPERIENCE

While Tina Charles will play for gold at the 2016 Summer Games in Rio, she is one of several members of the Liberty with Olympic Experience. Associate head coach Katie Smith won gold three times, Sydney in 2000, Athens, and Beijing in 2008. Teresa Weatherspoon won a gold medal at the 1988 games in Seoul, and won bronze in Barcelona in 1992.

## LIBERTY MAKES A 'BIG' TRADE

The second overall picks in the 2015 WNBA Draft made her way to New York as the Liberty sent its 2017 first round pick to the Dallas Wings in exchange for Amanda Zahui B. and a 2017 second round pick. Zahui B., who was the Big Ten Player of the Year and a First-Team All-American at Minnesota in 2015, averaged 3.4 points and 2.4 rebounds per game during her rookie season. She also shot .333 from 3-point range and averaged 0.6 blocks per game.

## SHOWTIME IN THE BIG APPLE

The New York Liberty completed a trade for guard Shoni Schimmel on May 2, sending its 2017 second round pick to the Atlanta Dream in exchange for the two-time WNBA All-Star and the MVP of the 2014 All-Star game. Over two WNBA seasons, Schimmel has averaged 8.0 points and 3.4 assists per game, while knocking down 102 3-pointers, an average of 1.5 per game.

## ROSTER TURNOVER

New York enters the 2016 season with seven returning players and six new faces. Bill Laimbeer begins his fourth season as head coach of the Liberty and all 13 current members of the Liberty have arrived after Laimbeer started, meaning no players remain from the time he took over as head coach.

## MAKING MOVES

The Liberty has been very busy finalizing its 2016 roster over the past four weeks, starting with the WNBA Draft. Both 1st Round pick Adut Bulgak and 2nd Round pick Ameryst Alston are on New York's opening night roster. Shortly after the draft the Liberty signed free agent guard Lindsey Harding, who boasts career averages of 10.4 ppg and 4.2 apg, in the past month, New York has executed trades for guard Shoni Schimmel and center Amanda Zahui B.



### SHINING STARS

With the addition of two-time WNBA All-Star Shoni Schimmel, the Liberty now boasts five players on its roster that have earned at least one All-Star appearance during their careers. Tina Charles (2011, 2013, 2014, 2015) has earned four selections, while Epiphanny Prince (2011, 2013) and Shoni Schimmel (2014, 2015) are two-time All-Stars, and Lindsey Harding (2010) and Shavonte Zellous (2013) have earned one All-Star appearance.

### TURKISH CONNECTION

There are a couple of important ties between Liberty players and playing overseas in Turkey during the WNBA offseason. In 2014-15, Tina Charles and Shavonte Zellous were teammates on Fenerbahce, and Charles has said she helped recruit Zellous to sign with New York as a free agent this past winter. Looking to Zellous again, in January 2016 she Adana Aski Mersin, where she was teammates with Amanda Zahui B.

### COMING UP BIG

The Liberty's 2016 first round draft pick Adut Bulgak had a big-time debut performance in New York's preseason opener against the Chicago Sky over the weekend, coming off the bench to log 23 minutes while posting a double-double with 17 points and 12 rebounds, leading all players in both categories. Bulgak shot 5-of-10 from the field, hitting a 3-pointer, and saw six of her rebounds come on the offensive end of the floor.

### PROTECTING THE ROCK

In its preseason opener against the Chicago Sky, New York turned the ball over 20 times, which directly led to 25 points for the Sky, which had a plus-19 margin in points off turnovers in their win. When the Liberty took care of the basketball during the 2015 season, the result was almost always a win. Last year New York was 14-3 when committing fewer turnovers and 16-4 when outscoring an opponent in points off turnovers.

### DOUBLE-DOUBLE MACHINE

Tina Charles is beginning her seventh WNBA season, but already Charles ranks second in league history with 109 double-doubles. She has posted 109 double-doubles in 198 career games played, meaning in 55.1 percent of her appearances she has posted a double-double. Lisa Leslie is the WNBA all-time leader with 157 career double-doubles. Charles had a team-best 15 double-doubles last season, when she averaged 17.0 ppg and 8.5 rpg, finishing second in the league in rebounding and fourth in scoring.

### ZELLOUS 2K

Shavonte Zellous is closing in on a career milestone as one of the newest members of the Liberty is just nine points shy of 2,000 for her career. Entering her eighth WNBA season, Zellous has a career average of 9.3 ppg. Last season, she averaged 8.4 ppg in Indiana, and her career-best came in 2013, when she was a WNBA All-Star for the Eastern Conference and averaged 14.7 ppg.

### NEW YORK INKS FREE AGENT SHAVONTE ZELLOUS

The Liberty made arguably the most impactful free agent signing of the 2016 offseason by signing unrestricted free agent guard Shavonte Zellous. Zellous, a seven-year veteran of the league, played the last five-plus seasons in Indiana, winning a WNBA Championship in 2012, and making a return trip to the finals in 2015. She was a WNBA All-Star in 2013, the same year she was named the league's Most Improved Player after averaging 14.7 points per game. Zellous has extensive playoff experience, having qualified for postseason play in each of her pro seasons, averaging 10.4 ppg in 43-career playoff games.

### LIBERTY SELECTS THREE IN WNBA DRAFT

New York had the final selection in each round of the 2013 WNBA Draft, and selected Adut Bulgak (12th overall) center from Florida State, Ameryst Alston (24th overall) guard from Ohio State, and Shacobia Barbee (36th overall) guard out of Georgia. Bulgak and Alston will both be in training camp, while Barbee continues to recover from a broken leg suffered late in her senior season. Bulgak averaged 12.5 points and 8.7 rebounds per game in two seasons at Florida State, earning 2016 WBCA Honorable Mention All-American honors. Alston finished fourth on Ohio State's all-time scoring list with 2,165-career points, averaging 16.2 ppg during her career. She also hit 181 3-pointers, 73 during her senior season.

### HARDING HEADED TO NEW YORK

Free agent point guard Lindsey Harding signed a free agent deal with the Liberty on April 18, 2016. The eight-year veteran of the league and former No. 1 overall pick last played with Los Angeles during the 2014 season. She will report to training camp during the week before the start of the regular season. Harding, an All-Star in 2010, has averaged double figures in six of her eight professional seasons, with a career-average of 10.4 ppg, and 4.2 apg. She led the league in assists with 5.2 per game in 2013, and helped guide Atlanta to the WNBA Finals in 2011. Another free agent acquisition with extensive playoff experience, Harding has played in the postseason in her previous six seasons and has started 18-of-20 playoff games played, averaging 12.9 ppg.

### SWEET AS SUGAR

Sugar Rodgers turned in an impressive performance in the Liberty's final 2016 preseason game against the Minnesota Lynx. She led all scorers with 22 points, when she shot 7-of-10 from the floor and 3-of-4 from 3-point range. The Liberty trailed by as many as 18 in the game but pulled within one in the fourth quarter thanks to Rodgers' hot hand, she scored 13 of her points in the final stanza, knocking down a pair of long-range shots. Last year, Rodgers ranked third on the team in scoring at 10.3 ppg, and led New York with 41 3-pointers.

### PRINCE INJURES KNEE

Epiphanny Prince suffered a torn right anterior cruciate ligament and two lateral meniscus tears in while playing for her Russian club team Dynamo Kursk in November. She underwent successful ACL reconstruction at Hospital for Special Surgery on December 9, 2015. She is suspended to start the 2016 season but eligible to return to action later this year.

### LIBERTY COACHING STAFF SECOND TO NONE

The Liberty coaching staff, led by 2015 WNBA Coach of the Year Bill Laimbeer, includes Associate Head Coach Katie Smith, Assistant Coach Herb Williams, Director of Player Development Teresa Weatherspoon, and Head Athletic Trainer Rosemary Ragle. Laimbeer is a two-time WNBA Coach of the Year and has led his teams to three WNBA Championships. Two members of the staff, Smith and Weatherspoon, were named to the WNBA Top-15 players in league history list in 2011, while Williams has more than 30 years of professional basketball experience, 18 as a player in the NBA, and 11 on the coaching staff with the Knicks. Ragle joins the Liberty from the University of Connecticut women's basketball team where she served as the head athletic trainer since 1999.

### TINA CHARLES AND EPIPHANNY PRINCE NAMED TO ALL-WNBA TEAMS

Tina Charles (1st Team) and Epiphanny Prince (2nd Team) each earned All-WNBA honors last season, the first time the Liberty had two players named All-WNBA since Rebecca Lobo and Teresa Weatherspoon were Second-Team honorees following the inaugural 1997 season. Charles finished third in the MVP voting, averaging 17.1 points and 8.5 rebounds per game, while Prince averaged 15.0 points, 3.4 assists and 2.0 steals per game. Charles was named the Eastern Conference Player of the Month for July, and Prince followed that up by winning the award for the month of August.

### STOKES AND BOYD NAMED TO 2015 WNBA ALL-ROOKIE TEAMS

The New York Liberty landed two players on the 2015 WNBA All-Rookie Team in Kiah Stokes and Brittany Boyd, who finished second and third respectively in the voting with nine and eight points apiece. Additionally, Stokes finished second in the WNBA Rookie of the Year voting, compiling 16 votes, five fewer than Seattle's Jewell Loyd. Stokes led all rookies in rebounds (6.4), and blocked shots (2.0), also posting three double-doubles, the only rookie to have any last year. Boyd was sixth among league rookies in scoring at 6.6 ppg and was first with 1.2 spg, while also contributing 2.3 assists and 2.7 rebounds per contest. Seattle was the only other team in the league with two All-Rookie team selections (Loyd/Tokashiki)

### BILL LAIMBEER NAMED 2015 WNBA COACH OF THE YEAR

New York Liberty Head Coach Bill Laimbeer led his team to a league-best 23-11 record to complete the most successful regular season in franchise history and was named the 2015 WNBA Coach of the Year. That marked the second such honor for Laimbeer, who also won in 2003 with the Detroit Shock, and it is the first time any Liberty head coach has received the honor in the franchise's 19-year history. Laimbeer received 23 votes from a national panel of 39 sportswriters and broadcasters. Laimbeer's other WNBA Coach of the Year honor came in his first full season guiding the Shock, which went a league-best 25-9 in 2003 after finishing 9-23 the previous season.

## STOKES SECOND IN VOTING FOR ROOKIE OF THE YEAR

Kiah Stokes had one of the most impressive rookie seasons in the WNBA and made a solid case for being considered the league's Rookie of the Year, finishing second in the voting with 16 points, five behind Jewell Loyd's winning tally of 21. In terms of total all-around impact and overall team success, it is tough to argue any first year player is more critical to team success than Stokes, who led all rookies in blocks and rebounds per game and field goal percentage.

## KIAH STOKES SETS FRANCHISE BLOCK RECORDS

Kiah Stokes was one of the most effective interior defenders in the WNBA last season, averaging 2.0 blocks per game while setting a New York Liberty single-season record with 67 swats. In a win over the Connecticut Sun on July 16, she blocked eight shots, setting a new Liberty single-game record. New York was one of the best defensive teams in the WNBA a year ago, limiting opponents to just 71.1 ppg and .393 shooting from the field, the league average was .425.

## LEADING THE LEAGUE IN DEFENSE IN 2015

- The Liberty ranked 1st in the league in opponent field goal percentage, limiting teams to 39.3 percent, and first allowing 71.1 ppg.
- New York held 19 opponents under 40.0 percent shooting, the league average for field-goal percentage was .425.
- In its 73-64 win at Atlanta on June 21, the Liberty held the Dream to just 29.7 percent shooting, on 19-for-64 from the field.
- The Liberty had not held an opponent to under 30-percent on the road since June 1, 2007, when it held Minnesota to .274 (20-for-73) from the field in a 70-60 victory.
- New York held four teams under 30 percent from the field, doing so three times on the road.
- New York held the Stars to just 45 points in its win on August 19, which matched the fewest points allowed in a WNBA game last season.

## CLIMBING THE CAREER CHARTS

Tina Charles eclipsed 3,000-career points last season, becoming the 10th fastest player in WNBA history to do so. She is steadily climbing the all-time charts for points and rebounds, entering the 2016 campaign ranked 45th all-time in scoring, with 3,413 points, and 17th in rebounding, pulling down 2,018 boards. Her career rebounding average of 10.2 per game is the best per game rate in the history of the league.
