QUICK HITS

The Liberty had its six-game winning streak snapped with a 104-97 overtime loss to the Phoenix Mercury on Sunday afternoon at Madison Square Garden. Tina Charles scored 26 points and Sugar Rodgers poured in 23, but the Mercury erased a late six-point deficit, tying the game with 7.8 remaining on three Diana Taurasi free throws. The six-game winning streak was the longest for the Liberty since the 2010 season and New York started 10-4 for the first time since 2001.

Tina Charles was named the WNBA Eastern Conference Player of the Week for the fourth time this season on Monday afternoon. She averaged 23.3 ppg, 10.0 rpg, and 6.3 apg last week. The four Player of the Week wins already tie for the second-most in a single-season in league history.

The Liberty has seen three of its last four games go into overtime, and New York has already played five overtime games this season, tied for the most in a single-season in franchise history. The only other time the Libs played five OT games in the same year was 1999.

The Lynx jumped out to a 28-11 lead through one quarter in the first meeting with New York, a deficit that the Liberty was unable to recover from. Tina Charles (23) and Shavonte Zellous (12) scored in double figures for New York.

Bill Laimbeer, a two-time WNBA Coach of the Year and three-time WNBA Champion, enters his fourth season as head coach of the New York Liberty.

During the 2015 campaign, his third full season as the head coach of the Liberty, Laimbeer helped guide the franchise to the best regular season in team history, posting a franchise-record 23 victories while the Liberty was able to grab the top overall seed in the WNBA for the first time ever and the top spot in the Eastern Conference for the first time since 2002. New York advanced to the Eastern Conference Finals for its deepest playoff run since 2010.

Additionally, New York boasted a pair of All-WNBA performers for the first-time in Tina Charles (First Team) and Epiphanny Prince (Second Team) while also seeing a pair of rookies, Kiah Stokes and Brittany Boyd, land on the WNBA All-Rookie Team. The Liberty led the league in points allowed per game (71.1) and defensive field goal percentage (.393).

Laimbeer previously spent eight seasons from 2002-09 as general manager and head coach of the Detroit Shock (now Tulsa Shock), where he earned WNBA Coach of the Year honors in his first full season as head coach (2003). He took over a team that finished 9-23 in the previous year and led them to a league-best 25 wins the following season. The 16-win improvement was the largest in WNBA history. Laimbeer led the Shock to a 137-93 (.596) overall record, including six-straight playoff appearances as the squad won the WNBA Championship in 2003, 2006 and 2008.

As general manager of the Shock, Laimbeer made several key moves during his tenure that were integral in Detroit capturing three WNBA Championships, which still stand as second most in league history. In his first full season, Laimbeer drafted former All-Star and 2003 Rookie of the Year Cheryl Ford. He also acquired the Finals MVP that year Ruth Riley in the WNBA dispersal draft.

Prior to returning to the WNBA, Laimbeer spent two seasons as an assistant in the NBA with the Minnesota Timberwolves (2009-2011).

A 14-year NBA veteran, Laimbeer was a four-time All-Star for the Detroit Pistons. As a member of the famed "Bad Boys," Laimbeer totaled 13,790 points and 10,400 rebounds in his career, becoming just the 19th player in NBA history to eclipse 10,000 in both categories. A key member of back-to-back NBA Championships in 1989 and 1990, he had his jersey No. 40 retired by the franchise in 1995. Laimbeer played college ball at Notre Dame from 1975-79, graduating with a degree in economics in 1979.

Laimbeer and his wife Chris are parents to their son Eric and daughter Keri

HISTORIC 20TH WNBA SEASON

- The WNBA is celebrating its historic 20th WNBA season in 2016, a milestone that is of additional significance for the Liberty as a founding member of the league and one of three original franchises (Phoenix, Los Angeles).
- The Liberty played in the inaugural WNBA game against the Los Angeles Sparks in the Great Western Forum on June 21, 1997.
- The Liberty is the only WNBA franchise to operate under the same ownership group for all 20 years of the WNBA's existence.
- New York played in the first-ever WNBA Championship game, falling to the Houston Comets, 65-52 on August 30, 1997.
- The Liberty has been to the WNBA Finals three times, last in 2002.
- The Liberty has an all-time record of 336-305 (.524) with 13 playoff berths.

EASTERN CONFERENCE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

TINA CHARLES - JUNE 27

After averaging 23.3 ppg, 10.0 rpg, and 6.3 apg, Tina Charles was tabbed as the Eastern Conference Player of the Week for the fourth time this season. She nearly recorded a triple-double with 23 points, 10 assists, and 9 rebounds at Atlanta on June 22, scored 21 with 13 boards in a victory over Chicago, and led the Liberty with 26 points in an overtime loss to Phoenix.

TINA CHARLES - JUNE 20

For the third time this season Tina Charles picked up Eastern Conference Player of the Week honors, this time after leading the Liberty to a 3-0 week while putting up incredible numbers across the board. In wins over Dallas, Connecticut, and Indiana, Charles led the WNBA in scoring with 28.7 ppg, including a career-high matching 32 points in the win at Connecticut.

TINA CHARLES - JUNE 6

Tina Charles was named the WNBA Eastern Conference Player of the Week for the 16th time in her career on June 6. She led the Liberty to a 2-1 record the week before, averaging a double-double of 18.7 points and 11.0 rebounds per game, also dishing out 3.3 assists per contest. She scored in double figures in all three games, netting a high of 23 against the Minnesota Lynx.

TINA CHARLES - MAY 24

Over the first three games of the season she led the league in rebounding (12.7 rpg) and ranked first in the Eastern Conference in scoring (21.7 ppg) and sixth in assists (3.3 apg). She led the Liberty in scoring in all three games over the first week of the season in addition to posting three double-doubles.

LIBERTY WELL-REPRESENTED ON WNBA TOP-20 AND MOST INFLUENTIAL 20@20 LIST

The New York Liberty had a strong showing on the WNBA's Best and Most Influential Top-20@20 list when it was announced on June 21, with three current players or coaches making the team: Teresa Weatherspoon, Swin Cash, and Katie Smith

TERESA WEATHERSPOON

One of the most influential people in WNBA history and the first player in league history to score 1,000 points with 1,000 assists for a career. Her halfcourt shot to win game two of the 1999 WNBA Finals remains one of the most iconic images of the league's 20-year history.

SWIN CASH

Recently became just the second player in league history to score 5,000 points with 2,000 rebounds and 1,000 assists. She ranks 13th in the league in scoring, winning three WNBA titles (2003, 2006, 2010) and two Olympic gold medals (2004, 2012).

KATIE SMITH

All-time leading scorer in women's professional basketball history. She ranks third in WNBA history with 6,452 points, third with 482 games played and second with 15,725 minutes. Smith won WNBA Championships in 2006 and 2008 and Olympic Gold in 2000, 2004, and 2008.

TINA CHARLES - SPORTS HUMANITARIAN OF THE YEAR FINALIST

Tina Charles received an incredible honor on June 16, when it was announced that she was named one of four finalists for the 2016 Sports Humanitarian of the Year Award. Joining Charles in vying for the award is Carlos Dunlap (Cincinnati Bengals), Brent Burns (San Jose Sharks), and Chris Paul (LA Clippers). The Sports Humanitarian of the Year Award recognizes an athlete whose continuous, demonstrated leadership has created a positive impact on their community through sports, which for Charles has been creating the Hopey's Heart Foundation, which since 2013 has placed more than 200 AEDs in schools, athletic teams and recreation centers worldwide. The winner will be able to direct a \$100,000 grant from ESPN to the qualified charity related to the award-winning humanitarian efforts. The finalists will be able to direct a \$25,000 grant to the charity related to their award-winning efforts. The winner will be announced at a gala in Los Angeles on July 12.

GOING THE EXTRA MILE

Through just 15 games the Liberty has already tied its franchise record for overtime games in a single season, as New York has seen five contests need at least one extra session so far in 2016. The 1999 season was the only other time the Liberty had that many games go to OT; New York is currently 2-3 in overtime games this year.

HISTORIC RUN TO START THE SEASON FOR NEW YORK

New York's 80-79 win over the Chicago Sky on June 24 was its sixth in a row, the longest winning streak for the Liberty since the 2010 season, when it rattled off 10-straight on the way for a then franchise record 22 regular season wins. It is just the second time since 2004 that New York has a win streak of at least six games. The victory also improved the Liberty's overall record to 10-4, its best record through 14 games since 2001, and just the second time in franchise history New York had at least 10 wins through 14 games (1997 was the other).

TINA CHARLES WINS MAY WNBA CARES COMMUNITY ASSIST AWARD PRESENTED BY STATE FARM

Tina Charles won the May WNBA Cares Community Assist Award presented by State Farm. Throughout the month of May, expanding on her extraordinary work to improve the health and safety of children and families across the country, Charles and the Hopey's Heart Foundation (HHF) launched the "Build-Up NYC" Program. With support from the New York City Council, the program is designed to assist with AED placement and CPR training throughout the five boroughs. Charles also became the first player in league history to win the Community Assist and Player of the Month Awards for the same month of competition.

INSTANT IMPACT

Although she joined the team prior to its game in Atlanta, Rebecca Allen officially made her return to the court in the Liberty's 80-79 win over Chicago on June 24 at The Garden. She came off the bench and looked like she hadn't missed a beat in her first WNBA action since June 6 of last year, finishing with eight points, a pair of 3-pointers, and two rebounds in 12 minutes.

TINA CHARLES FLIRTS WITH HISTORY

Tina Charles came close to notching her name in the record books as she finished merely one rebound shy of posting what would have been just the sixth regular season triple double in WNBA history when the Liberty beat the Atlanta Dream 90-79 in double overtime on June 22. Charles finished with 23 points, a career-high 10 assists, and nine rebounds to lead New York to the win. She did notch her ninth double-double of the season, and continues to lead the WNBA in scoring (22.3 ppg) and rebounding (9.9 rpg).

RARE DOUBLE OT

When the Liberty and Dream went into double overtime on Wednesday afternoon, it was a rarity. While it was the third-straight game between the two teams to need extra time to determine a winner, it was just the fourth double overtime game in Liberty history, and the first time New York has played in double overtime since 2008.

FINDING THE OPEN WOMAN

The Liberty dished out a season-high 28 assists in its 90-79 double overtime win at Atlanta on June 22, handing out a dime on a remarkable 80.0 percent of its made baskets. That is a trend that has been moving upward for the Liberty all season, but particularly over the last seven games, with Tina Charles and Tanisha Wright leading the way with 38 assists apiece over the last seven contests.

FOR YOUR CONSIDERATION - KIAH STOKES

Kiah Stokes is making a case to be considered for the WNBA 6th Woman and Defensive Player of the Year Awards, with her increased impact on what the Liberty is able to do on both ends of the floor. She is finishing around the basket (2nd in the league with a .676 FG%), rebounding the basketball (7th in the league in rebounding), blocking shots (2.1) and helping anchor a defensive unit that once again leads the league in defensive field goal percentage and points allowed in the paint.

BECOMING A COMPLETE PLAYER

Originally known as a volume 3-point shooter, Liberty guard Sugar Rodgers has shown that she can contribute in a myriad of ways. First the 3-point shooting, not only is she 2nd in the league with 41 triples, but she is shooting at a high percentage, ranking sixth in the league at .427 beyond the arc. She is also getting to the line, third for the Liberty with 39 makes from the stripe, and is also 38th in rebounds per game (4.2) and 27th with 1.1 steals per game. Her scoring average has nearly doubled from the 8.1 ppg she put in during the 2015 season.

RANGE FINDER

Tina Charles has continued to prove that she is a threat from the perimeter, as she is now shooting 9-of-20 (.450) from 3-point range this year. Charles added two more 3-point makes at Atlanta on June 22. This is a drastic departure from her first 6 WNBA seasons when she shot a combined 2-of-17 from 3-point range. Her three triples in the win over Dallas on June 14, were more than she had in her career heading into 2016.

DEFENSE FIRST

Once again the Liberty is hanging its hat on defensive effort, making life very difficult for opposing offenses. New York has limited 8-of-15 opponents, most recently Atlanta on June 19, to under 36.0 percent shooting from the field, and the Liberty leads the league in defensive field goal percentage of .398 (the league average is .440).

BETTER NOT COME INSIDE

Last season the Liberty led the league in defense and played to its strength of impressive interior defense, a trait that has held true so far in 2016 as well. New York ranks first in the WNBA with an opponent field goal percentage of just .398, and teams are shooting .501 (168-335) on shots inside of five feet against the New York, best in the league.

CONTROLLING THE PAINT

Last season, New York dominated the interior, outscoring its opponents in the paint in 28-of-34 games played, posting a 20-8 mark in those contests. The Liberty is right back at it this season:

- New York has outscored 12-of-15 opponents inside of the paint.
- The Liberty ranks first in the WNBA in paint scoring, averaging 39.6 ppg.

- New York is first in defensive points allowed in the paint, giving up just 28.1 ppg
- The Liberty is 1-2 in those games where it failed to hold the advantage offensively on the interior.
- So far New York has a 594-422 advantage in the paint, an average of 11.5 more points per game in the interior.

DOMINANT PERFORMANCE IN ROAD WIN

It was the most dominant performance of the season for early MVP candidate Tina Charles as she matched her career-high of 32 points in the Liberty's 80-72 win at Connecticut on Jun 16. Charles shot 13-for-25 from the field, matching the most field goals made in a WNBA game this season (a mark she already held). It was the eighth 30-point game of her career and the fifth time she has hit 30 points as a member of the New York Liberty.

ANOTHER CAREER MILESTONE FOR SWIN CASH - 5,000 POINTS

Liberty forward Swin Cash became the 14th player in WNBA history to score 5,000 points in her career when she drove to the rim for two in the first quarter at Connecticut on June 16. Cash has proven to be a versatile player throughout the course of her career and is just the 2nd player to have 5,000 points, 2,000 rebounds, and 1,000 assists. The only other is also active, and also has announced her retirement at the end of this season - Tamika Catchings has 7,142 points, 3,222 rebounds, and 1,453 assists. Cash also ranks fifth in games played (460) and 8th in rebounds (2,462).

THROWBACK TO THE 90'S

With its 91-88 victory over the Dallas Wings on Jun 14, the Liberty hit the 90-point mark for a second game in a row, having come off a 90-75 win at San Antonio three days before. It was the first time New York scored 90 points in back-to-back games since June 2011.

DROPPING DIMES, DROPPING DIMES

Tina Charles is known as a great scorer and rebounder, but so far in 2016 she has also been New York's best distributor of the basketball. Charles has recorded at least three assists in 14-of-15 games this year, and posted four games with six dimes, most recently in the win over Atlanta on June 22 when she had a career-high 10 assists. Charles is leading New York, averaging 4.5 assists per game, which ranks 6th in the league.

TOP REBOUNDING DUO IN THE LEAGUE

Tina Charles ranks 1st in the WNBA, pulling in 9.9 rebounds per game, which when combined with Kiah Stokes' 8.1 rebounds per game makes them the top rebounding duo in the league. Stokes is ranked 6th overall, and has seen her rebounding number increase from 6.4 during her rookie season. The second place duo is currently Candace Parker and Nneka Ogumike, averaging a combined 16.1 boards per game.

TANISHA WRIGHT EMERGING AS THE 1

Tanisha Wright has turned in seven-straight strong performances distributing the basketball, and now ranks 10th in the WNBA, averaging 4.1 assists per game. Over the past seven contests, she has racked up 38 assists, including a season-high eight at Atlanta on June 22, averaging 5.4 assists per game during that stretch with a 2.2 assist-to-turnover ratio.

CASH HAULS IN SEASON-HIGH 10 BOARDS AT SAN ANTONIO

Forward Swin Cash narrowly missed out on recording a double-double in the Liberty win at San Antonio on June 11, finishing with eight points and a season-high 10 rebounds. In fact, the 10 boards are a personal best for Cash as a member of the Liberty. It was her 38th regular season game with at least 10 rebounds, but her first since she had 14 boards on July 2, 2013. She is the eighth player in WNBA history to have at least 10 rebounds in a game for at least four different franchises (Taj McWilliams-Franklin, Michelle Snow, Chamique Holdsclaw, Betty Lennox, Wendy Palmer, Sheri Sam, and Ann Wauters.)

RARE COMPANY

Tanisha Wright secured her 1,000th-career rebound in the Liberty's win over Dallas on June 14, which put her on a very rare list, as she became just the 11th player in WNBA history to score at least 2,500 points, with 1,000 rebounds and 1,100 assists. That list quickly grew to 12 members, as Swin Cash picked up career assist 1,100 in the win over Indiana on June 19, to go along with more than 5,000 points and 2,000 rebounds.

SPORTSCENTER TOP-10 PLAYS - KIAH STOKES

Kiah Stokes turned in one of the best highlights of the WNBA season thus far, with her emphatic denial of a Breanna Stewart drive to the basket late in the Liberty's 86-78 win over the Seattle Storm on June 5. Stokes met Stewart near the basket and cleanly denied her from converting what at first appeared to be an easy two points. She checked in at No. 3 on the Sportscenter Top-10 plays list for that day.

TINA CHARLES NAMED EASTERN CONFERENCE PLAYER OF THE MONTH FOR MAY

Forward Tina Charles led the WNBA in scoring (23.4 ppg) and rebounding (11.8 rpg) through the first month of the season, leading to her being named the Eastern Conference Player of the Month for games played in May. Charles recorded a double-double in all five games, increasing her career double-double tally to 114, second all-time. It is the third time as a member of the Liberty that Charles has been named Player of the Month and the sixth in her career, which ranks second all-time behind Maya Moore (7). Dating back to last season, the Liberty has captured the last three Eastern Conference Player of the Month awards, tied for the second-longest streak in the award's seven-year history. Epiphanny Prince was the recipient last August, and Charles won the award in July '15.

WHAT A PERFORMANCE

When the Liberty faced the Atlanta Dream on May 24, Tina Charles did something that only two other players in WNBA history had accomplished. She finished with 29 points, 10 rebounds, 6 assists, and 7 steals, becoming just the third player ever to score at least 29 points with 10 rebounds and also post five-plus assists and steals.

OFFENSE CLICKS IN BIG WIN OVER INDIANA

The Liberty found an offensive rhythm in its win over the Indiana Fever on June 3, scoring a season-high 91 points:

- It was the largest margin of victory for New York since beating the Phoenix Mercury by 38 points on August 14, 2010.
- The Liberty secured its largest-ever victory over Indiana. In addition to snapping a four-game regular season losing streak against its Eastern Conference foe, New York topped its previous all-time best win margin of 19 points, which was 74-55 back on June 25, 2002.
- The 91 points scored was the most for the Liberty since a 105-100 overtime loss to the Chicago Sky on June 18, 2014.
- It was the most points New York has scored in regulation since a 93-88 win over Washington on August 6, 2013.

THE DOUBLE-DOUBLE MACHINE

Forward Tina Charles has posted 10 double-doubles so far this season. With 21 points and 13 rebounds against Chicago on June 24, Charles recorded the 119th double-double of her career, second all-time in league history, and she has posted a double-double in 55.9 percent of her games played as a pro. Her career 10.2 rebounds per game are first all time, while her career scoring average of 17.6 ppg is 10th.

LEAN ON ME

In New York, Tina Charles has had some of the highest usage numbers in the league, and so far the 2016 season is no exception. Charles has used 30.3 percent of the Liberty's offensive plays when she is on the court, the 2nd-highest rate in the league. Obviously all of the attention is warranted as she is posting an impressive Player Impact Estimate of 20.2, which ranks second in the league.

LIBERTY 2015 SEASON HEADLINES

- New York finished the 2015 regular season with the best record in the WNBA for the first time in franchise history.
- New York was 23-11 overall, posting the most regular season wins in franchise history, passing the previous mark of 22.
- New York swept the season series with Phoenix for the first time since 2012, both games from Los Angeles for the first time since 2010, and went 2-0 against Minnesota for the first time since 2007.
- Bill Laimbeer was named WNBA Coach of the Year for the second time in his career.
- Tina Charles (1st Team) and Epiphanny Prince (2nd Team) earned All-WNBA accolades.
- Tina Charles, Kiah Stokes, and Tanisha Wright were all named WNBA Second-Team All-Defensive honorees.
- Kiah Stokes was runner-up for 2015 WNBA Rookie of the Year and she was named to the All-Rookie team along with Brittany Boyd.

TINA CHARLES ON THE #ROADTORIO

Tina Charles will represent her country in the Olympics for a second time as she has been selected as one of 12 players to compete for the 2016 U.S. Olympic Women's Basketball Team at the Summer Games in Rio de Janeiro. With her selection, Charles becomes the first active New York Liberty player to play for the U.S. at the Olympic games. Charles, who won a gold medal at the 2012 games in London, was also a member of a pair of FIBA World Championship gold medal winning teams (2010, 2014). The United States will begin its quest for a historic sixth-consecutive gold medal when it faces Senegal on either August 6 or 7.

LIBERTY LONG ON OLYMPIC EXPERIENCE

While Tina Charles will play for gold at the 2016 Summer Games in Rio, she is one of several members of the Liberty team and coaching staff with Olympic Experience. Swin Cash, a 15-year veteran of the WNBA, is a two-time gold medal winner, helping Team USA capture gold medals at Athens in 2004 and London in 2012. Associate head coach Katie Smith won gold three times, Sydney in 2000, Athens, and Beijing in 2008. Teresa Weatherspoon won at gold medal at the 1988 games in Seoul, and won bronze in Barcelona in 1992.

LIBERTY MAKES A 'BIG' TRADE

The second overall picks in the 2015 WNBA Draft made her way to New York as the Liberty sent its 2017 first round pick to the Dallas Wings in exchange for Amanda Zahui B. and a 2017 second round pick. Zahui B., who was the Big Ten Player of the Year and a First-Team All-American at Minnesota in 2015, averaged 3.4 points and 2.4 rebounds per game during her rookie season. She also shot .333 from 3-point range and averaged 0.6 blocks per game.

SHOWTIME IN THE BIG APPLE

The New York Liberty completed a trade for guard Shoni Schimmel on May 2, sending its 2017 second round pick to the Atlanta Dream in exchange for the two-time WNBA All-Star and the MVP of the 2014 All-Star game. Over her first two WNBA seasons, Schimmel averaged 8.0 points and 3.4 assists per game, while knocking down 102 3-pointers, an average of 1.5 per game.

ROSTER TURNOVER

New York entered the 2016 season with seven returning players and six new faces. Bill Laimbeer begins his fourth season as head coach of the Liberty and all 13 current members of the Liberty have arrived after Laimbeer started, meaning no players remain from the time he took over as head coach.

SHINING STARS

With the addition of two-time WNBA All-Star Shoni Schimmel, the Liberty now boasts five players on its roster that have earned at least one All-Star appearance during their careers. Tina Charles (2011, 2013, 2014, 2015) and Swin Cash (2003, 2005, 2009, 2011) have each earned four selections, while Epiphanny Prince (2011, 2013) and Shoni Schimmel (2014, 2015) are two-time All-Stars, and Shavonte Zellous (2013) has earned one All-Star appearance.

TURKISH CONNECTION

There are a couple of important ties between Liberty players and playing overseas in Turkey during the WNBA offseason. In 2014-15, Tina Charles and Shavonte Zellous were teammates on Fenerbahce, and Charles has said she helped recruit Zellous to sign with New York as a free agent this past winter. Looking to Zellous again, in January 2016 she Adana Aski Mersin, where she was teammates with Amanda Zahui B.

NEW YORK INKS FREE AGENT SHAVONTE ZELLOUS

The Liberty made arguably the most impactful free agent signing of the 2016 offseason by signing unrestricted free agent guard Shavonte Zellous. Zellous, a seven-year veteran of the league, played the last five-plus seasons in Indiana, winning a WNBA Championship in 2012, and making a return trip to the finals in 2015. She was a WNBA All-Star in 2013, the same year she was named the league's Most Improved Player after averaging 14.7 points per game. Zellous has extensive playoff experience, having qualified for postseason play in each of her pro seasons, averaging 10.4 ppg in 43-career playoff games.

PRINCE INJURES KNEE

Epiphanny Prince suffered a torn right anterior cruciate ligament and two lateral meniscus tears in while playing for her Russian club team Dynamo Kursk in November. She underwent successful ACL reconstruction at Hospital for Special Surgery on December 9, 2015. She is suspended to start the 2016 season but eligible to return to action later this year.

LIBERTY COACHING STAFF SECOND TO NONE

The Liberty coaching staff, led by 2015 WNBA Coach of the Year Bill Laimbeer, includes Associate Head Coach Katie Smith, Assistant Coach Herb Williams, Director of Player Development Teresa Weatherspoon, and Head Athletic Trainer Rosemary Ragle. Laimbeer is a two-time WNBA Coach of the Year and has led his teams to three WNBA Championships. Two members of the staff, Smith and Weatherspoon, were named to the WNBA Top-15 players in league history list in 2011, while Williams has more than 30 years of professional basketball experience, 18 as a player in the NBA, and 11 on the coaching staff with the Knicks. Ragle joins the Liberty from the University of Connecticut women's basketball team where she served as the head athletic trainer since 1999.

KIAH STOKES SETS FRANCHISE BLOCK RECORDS

Kiah Stokes was one of the most effective interior defenders in the WNBA last season, averaging 2.0 blocks per game while setting a New York Liberty single-season record with 67 swats. In a win over the Connecticut Sun on July 16, she blocked eight shots, setting a new Liberty single-game record. New York was one of the best defensive teams in the WNBA a year ago, limiting opponents to just 71.1 ppg and .393 shooting from the field, the league average was .425.
