### QUICK HITS

The New York Liberty is making its 14th postseason appearance and secured the No. 3 seed by finishing 1st in the Eastern Conference with a 21-13 overall record. The Liberty is in the WNBA Playoffs for a 2nd-straight season and reached 20 victories in consecutive seasons for the 2nd time in franchise history and the first since 2000-01.

Saturday will be just the 2nd ever postseason meeting between New York and Phoenix. The two met in the one-game WNBA Semifinals during the league's inaugural season in 1997, a game the Liberty won 59-41.

Tina Charles became just the 3rd player in WNBA history to win the league scoring and rebounding titles in the same season. Charles nearly averaged a double-double with 21.5 points and 9.9 rebounds per game. She posted a league-leading 20 double-doubles. It is the 4th time in her career Charles led the league in rebounding and the 1st since 2012. She is the first Liberty player to ever lead the WNBA in scoring or rebounding.

New York won the season series with Phoenix 2-1, including the most recent matchup, 92-70, on Sept. 3 at Madison Square Garden. Tina Charles averaged a double-double of 26.7 points and 11.0 rebounds in three games against the Mercury this season.

Bill Laimbeer, a two-time WNBA Coach of the Year and three-time WNBA Champion, enters his fourth season as head coach of the New York Liberty.

During the 2015 campaign, his third full season as the head coach of the Liberty, Laimbeer helped guide the franchise to the best regular season in team history, posting a franchise-record 23 victories while the Liberty was able to grab the top overall seed in the WNBA for the first time ever and the top spot in the Eastern Conference for the first time since 2002. New York advanced to the Eastern Conference Finals for its deepest playoff run since 2010.

Additionally, New York boasted a pair of All-WNBA performers for the first-time in Tina Charles (First Team) and Epiphanny Prince (Second Team) while also seeing a pair of rookies, Kiah Stokes and Brittany Boyd, land on the WNBA All-Rookie Team. The Liberty led the league in points allowed per game (71.1) and defensive field goal percentage (.393).

Laimbeer previously spent eight seasons from 2002-09 as general manager and head coach of the Detroit Shock (now Tulsa Shock), where he earned WNBA Coach of the Year honors in his first full season as head coach (2003). He took over a team that finished 9-23 in the previous year and led them to a league-best 25 wins the following season. The 16-win improvement was the largest in WNBA history. Laimbeer led the Shock to a 137-93 (.596) overall record, including six-straight playoff appearances as the squad won the WNBA Championship in 2003, 2006 and 2008.

As general manager of the Shock, Laimbeer made several key moves during his tenure that were integral in Detroit capturing three WNBA Championships, which still stand as second most in league history. In his first full season, Laimbeer drafted former All-Star and 2003 Rookie of the Year Cheryl Ford. He also acquired the Finals MVP that year Ruth Riley in the WNBA dispersal draft.

Prior to returning to the WNBA, Laimbeer spent two seasons as an assistant in the NBA with the Minnesota Timberwolves (2009-2011).

A 14-year NBA veteran, Laimbeer was a four-time All-Star for the Detroit Pistons. As a member of the famed "Bad Boys," Laimbeer totaled 13,790 points and 10,400 rebounds in his career, becoming just the 19th player in NBA history to eclipse 10,000 in both categories. A key member of back-to-back NBA Championships in 1989 and 1990, he had his jersey No. 40 retired by the franchise in 1995. Laimbeer played college ball at Notre Dame from 1975-79, graduating with a degree in economics in 1979.

Laimbeer and his wife Chris are parents to their son Eric and daughter Keri

### HISTORIC 20TH WNBA SEASON

- The WNBA is celebrating its historic 20th WNBA season in 2016, a milestone that is of additional significance for the Liberty as a founding member of the league and one of three original franchises (Phoenix, Los Angeles).
- The Liberty played in the inaugural WNBA game against the Los Angeles Sparks in the Great Western Forum on June 21, 1997.
- The Liberty is the only WNBA franchise to operate under the same ownership group for all 20 years of the WNBA's existence.
- New York played in the first-ever WNBA Championship game, falling to the Houston Comets, 65-52 on August 30, 1997.
- The Liberty has been to the WNBA Finals three times, last in 2002.
- The Liberty has an all-time record of 349-313 (.527) with 14 playoff berths.

### LIBERTY PLAYOFF NOTES

- New York's all-time record in the WNBA Playoffs is 27-34 (.443)
- The Liberty is 19-13 all-time in WNBA Playoffs home games.
- The Liberty is 16-13 all-time in playoff elimination games. New York was 2-1 in elimination games last season.
- New York is 7-6 all-time in its first game of the postseason.
- New York is 10-14 all-time in its first game of a WNBA Playoff series.
- New York has won the Eastern Conference Title three times (1999, 2000, 2002) and been to the WNBA Finals four times (1997, 1999, 2000, 2002).
- This is the 2nd ever postseason meeting between New York and Phoenix. The team met in the inaugural WNBA semifinals in one game the Liberty won on the road, 59-41.

### CHARLES IN RAREFIED AIR

- Charles became just the 3rd player in WNBA history to lead the league in scoring and rebounding with 21.5 points and 9.9 rebounds per game.
- Only Chamique Holdscaw (2002) and Lauren Jackson (2007) have accomplished that feat previously, so Charles is the first to do so in nearly a decade.
- The only NBA players to lead the league in scoring and rebounding were Wilt Chamberlain, Bob Pettit, and Neil Johnston.
- The Liberty has never had a player lead the league in scoring or rebounding; Charles accomplished both in the same year
- Charles' 21.5 ppg average is a new single-season franchise record, eclipsing Cappie Pondexter's 21.4 ppg during the 2010 season
- Charles had never led the league in scoring, but she has previously led the WNBA in rebounding on three occasions, from 2010-12, which includes her Rookie of the Year (2010) and Most Valuable Player (2012) seasons.

### DEFENSE STILL REIGNS

The Liberty is known as one of the top defensive teams in the league, and the 2016 season continued that trend as New York once again led the league in defensive field goal percentage (.413) and proved to be the toughest team to score on in the paint in the WNBA. New York saw its opponents shoot just .504 on shots inside of five feet, the next closest team would be Minnesota at .540, and the league average was .571. Controlling the paint proved to be key all season, as the Liberty saw 18 of its 21 wins come when it won points in the paint.

### BILL LAIMBEER BRINGS EXPERIENCE

Head Coach Bill Laimbeer has won three WNBA Championships, all three as the head coach of the Detroit Shock (2003, 2006, 2008), and has a career playoff coaching record of 30-19 (.612). Laimbeer has the most playoff wins in league history and his career playoff winning percentage ranks 4th in WNBA history. This is his eighth-career postseason appearance.

### TINA CHARLES - SPORTS HUMANITARIAN OF THE YEAR FINALIST

Tina Charles received an incredible honor on June 16, when it was announced that she was named one of four finalists for the 2016 Sports Humanitarian of the Year Award. Joining Charles in vying for the award is Carlos Dunlap (Cincinnati Bengals), Brent Burns (San Jose Sharks), and Chris Paul (LA Clippers). The Sports Humanitarian of the Year Award recognizes an athlete whose continuous, demonstrated leadership has created a positive impact on their community through sports, which for Charles has been creating the Hopey's Heart Foundation, which since 2013 has placed more than 200 AEDs in schools, athletic teams and recreation centers worldwide. The winner will be able to direct a \$100,000 grant from ESPN to the qualified charity related to the award-winning humanitarian efforts. The finalists will be able to direct a \$25,000 grant to the charity related to their award-winning efforts. The winner will be announced at a gala in Los Angeles on July 12.

## DEEPER LOOK AT LIBERTY WNBA PLAYOFF EXPERIENCE

- For the Liberty 10-of-12 players have experienced the WNBA playoffs previous, only Brittany Boyd and Rebecca Allen will be appearing in the postseason for the first time; both were injured during New York's 2015 playoffs run
- Swin Cash has appeared in 55-career postseason games, the 6th most in WNBA history. She has won three WNBA Championships (2003, 2006, 2010).
- Shavonte Zellous is making her 8th-straight WNBA Playoffs appearance and has participated in the postseason in every one of her professional seasons, making the playoffs as a rookie with Detroit in 2009, and for 7-straight years in Indiana, winning a WNBA title in 2012 and returning to the Finals in 2015
- Tanisha Wright is in the postseason for the 10th time in her career. She has played in 34 WNBA Playoffs games and won a championship with Seattle in 2010.
- Tina Charles is playing in the postseason for the 4th time in her career; she averaged 20.3 points and 8.7 rebounds per game for the Liberty in six playoff games in 2015 and boasts career playoff averages of 18.5 points and 9.7 rebounds per game.

## MAKING A CASE FOR #MVP

Tina Charles was First-Team All-WNBA and an All-Star in 2015, finishing 3rd in the league MVP voting. She averaged 17.1 ppg and finished second in the league with 8.5 rebounds per game, the expected level of production for one of the games most dominant players. But this season, Charles has taken her game to another level as she continues to make the case for being tabbed as the league's Most Valuable Player for a second time. ## PRETTY SWEET RECORD

Nailing two more 3-pointers against Dallas on Sept. 11, Sugar Rodgers added to her franchise single-season record with 86 3-pointers, surpassing Shameka Christon's 2011 campaign of 78 makes from downtown. Rodgers finished 2nd in the WNBA in 3-pointers this season, trailing only Diana Taurasi who sunk 89, the 3rd most for a single-season in league history.

## BRITTANY BOYD HEATING UP AT THE POINT

Going back to before the Olympic break, second-year point guard Brittany Boyd has been enjoying a tremendous hot streak for the Liberty, which included a season-high 19 points in the win over Phoenix on Sept. 3 and 10 assists at Dallas on Sept. 11. Over the previous 10 games, Boyd's stats have been significantly more efficient compared to her season averages, as during that stretch she ranks third for the Liberty averaging 9.2 points per game, with four games in double figures. She has also seen sizable increases in her assists (6.3 apg) and steals (2.2 spg) over that stretch, as she moved up to finish 4th in the WNBA in steals per game with 1.6 and 15th in assists with 3.6 per game.

## MOST IMPROVED

Sugar Rodgers saw her scoring average nearly double from 2015 to 2016, making her a prime candidate for the WNBA's Most Improved Player, a vote where she finished 3rd. Rodgers averaged a career-best 8.1 ppg last season, showing increased production off the bench and in times as a starter, but she has taken her game to a whole different level this year. Her 14.5 ppg ranked 14th in the league and she was 2nd in the WNBA with 86 3-pointers. Rodgers shot the long-ball at a very high percentage, ranking 5th in the league at .413 from distance. She logged 30.5 minutes per contest, 15th overall, and cracked the top-40 in assists, steals, and blocks.

## I'LL TAKE THAT

Brittany Boyd became known as an opportunistic defender even as a rookie when she led all first year players in steals, but during her second WNBA season she has reached new heights especially as of late. Coming away with three steals in 4-straight games and 7-of-11 overall, Boyd vaulted all the way up to 4th in the WNBA, averaging 1.6 steals per game. Her 51 steals this season were the most for New York since Leilani Mitchell had 55 in 2010.

## CLIMBING THE CAREER CHARTS

Tina Charles eclipsed 4,000-career points this season, becoming the 6th fastest player in WNBA history to do so. She is steadily climbing the all-time charts for points and rebounds, as she is currently ranked 27th all-time in scoring, with 4,101 points, and 12th in rebounding, pulling down 2,335 boards. Her career rebounding average of 10.1 per game is the best per game rate in the history of the league.

## CAREER YEAR FOR CAROLYN

Carolyn Swords enjoyed a strong finish to the 2016 regular season, scoring in double figures in 2-of-3 games to close out the year while averaging 10.3 points and 6.0 rebounds per game over that stretch. Swords was the only Liberty player to start all 34 games this season, a career-best for the 5th-year center, and also averaged career highs in scoring (5.2 ppg) and rebounding (4.6 rpg).

## START THE GAME OFF RIGHT

Getting off to a strong start has proven to be critically important to the Liberty's success this season. New York is 17-1 when it leads after 10 minutes of action, and 16-1 when in front heading into the half. If the Liberty finds itself behind after the first quarter, the team has come back to win just four times, with a 4-12 record in those games.

## THE DOUBLE-DOUBLE MACHINE

Forward Tina Charles posted 20 double-doubles this season. With 22 points and 11 rebounds against Washington on Sept. 13, Charles recorded the 129th double-double of her career, second all-time in league history, and she has posted a double-double in 56.1 percent of her games played as a pro. Her career 10.1 rebounds per game are first all time, while her career scoring average of 17.8 ppg is 8th.

## THAT'S MORE LIKE IT

Guard Epiphany Prince turned in her best performance since coming back from offseason knee surgery in the Liberty's 89-82 win over the Sun on Sept. 9, as she scored in double figures for the first time, finishing with 13 points while hitting her first three 3-point attempts and getting to the line four times. Prince also played a season-high 20 minutes.

## SWIN CASH HONORED WITH STAR-STUDED RETIREMENT CEREMONY AT THE GARDEN

The New York Liberty held a retirement ceremony to honor the incredible career of Swin Cash, immediately following its game against the Seattle Storm on Sept. 7. The impressive event included speeches from WNBA President Lisa Borders, Tina Thompson, Sue Bird, Tina Charles, Tanisha Wright, Bill Laimbeer, and Isiah Thomas.

- Earlier this year, Cash was named one of the WNBA's 20 greatest and most influential players in its history, having won three WNBA Championships (2003, 2006, 2010), two Olympic gold medals (2004, 2012) and two NCAA Championships (2000, 2002).
- At the conclusion of the season, she will end her career ranked in the top-15 in WNBA history in scoring, rebounding, assists, and games played.
- She is one of two players in league history to amass more than 5,000 points, 2,000 rebounds, and 1,000 assists, the other being Tamika Catchings, who is also retiring at the end of the 2016 WNBA season.

## SHARP SHOOTER FROM DOWN UNDER

Rebecca Allen has not attempted many 3-pointers this season, but when she does rise and fire she has been converting at a blistering hot rate. Despite missing the first 13 games of the season to train with the Australian National Team, Allen ranks 2nd on the team with 17 made 3-pointers and is shooting .567 (17-of-30) from 3-point range.

## TINA CHARLES MAKES HISTORY WITH 4,000TH-CAREER POINT

Tina Charles finished with 23 points in the Liberty's win over Phoenix on Sept. 3, and in doing so became the 29th player in WNBA history to surpass 4,000-career points. Charles is the 6th-fastest in the history of the WNBA to reach the 4K threshold, doing so in just 226-career games, and she became the 3rd youngest, at 27 years old and 273 days. Only Lauren Jackson and Diana Taurasi were younger when they passed 4,000 points.

## 20-20 VISION

With its 92-70 win over the Phoenix Mercury on Sept. 3, the Liberty reached 20 victories for the second-straight season. It is just the second time in franchise history that New York has won 20 games in back-to-back seasons, as the Liberty is coming off a franchise record 23 wins in 2015. The last time New York reached that threshold in consecutive years was back in 2000-01.

## DROPPING DIMES, DROPPING DIMES

Tina Charles is known as a great scorer and rebounder, but so far in 2016 she has also been one of New York's best distributors of the basketball. Charles has recorded at least three assists in 25-of-32 games, and posted four games with at least six dimes, most recently against Seattle on Sept. 7 when she led the Liberty with seven assists. Charles led New York this season, averaging 3.8 assists per game, which ranked 13th in the league.

## GOLD STANDARD X2

Tina Charles helped lead the U.S. Women's Basketball National Team to its 6th-consecutive gold medal victory at the 2016 Summer Games in Rio. Charles, who started all 8 games at forward for the United States during the Olympic Tournament, is a gold medal winner for the 2nd time in her career; she was a member of the USAB Women's National Team for its gold medal win in London in 2012. While the Liberty has had U.S. gold medal winners on its roster in the past, Charles became the franchise's first active member to represent the United States in the Olympics.

### SHE'S BACK!

On August 19 the Liberty removed guard Epiphanny Prince from the temporarily suspended list, and activated her as she returned to practice for the first time this season after suffering a torn ACL in Nov. 2015 while competing for her international club Dynamo Kursk in the Russian Premier League. Prince, a Brooklyn native who is in her second season with the Liberty, was a Second-Team All-WNBA Player last season when she averaged 15.0 ppg. As a result of activating Prince to practice with the team, New York waived 2016 12th overall selection forward Adut Bulgak.

### RODGERS AND STOKES JOIN USA BASKETBALL SELECT TEAM

Liberty center Kiah Stokes and guard Sugar Rodgers were both selected to the 11-member USA Basketball Women's Select Team in July. They received the opportunity to travel to Los Angeles to train with the U.S. Olympic team in preparation for an exhibition between the two squads at USC's Galen Center on July 24. After a couple of days of training under the guidance of the U.S. National Team Coaching Staff, Rodgers and Stokes helped the Select Team battle the National Team in a hard fought 88-84 loss. Stokes had two points and four rebounds for the Select squad and Rodgers finished with three points and two boards.

### SWORDS POSTS UP IN THE COMMUNITY

Carolyn Swords was awarded the July WNBA Cares Community Assist Award presented by State Farm. During a recent Garden of Dreams event she spent time with families from the New York Police and Fire Widows' and Children's Benefit Fund. A former Girl Scout, she spoke to 100 local Girl Scouts and their families after a recent Liberty game about her journey from a young scout to the woman and WNBA player she is today. Swords also assisted City Harvest's Greenmarket Rescue in Union Square, helping fill trucks with nearly 9,000 pounds of excess food from farmers to be delivered to community programs across the five boroughs. She will split her \$7,500 award between the Garden of Dreams Foundation and Tina Charles' Hopey's Heart Foundation.

### CHARLES MAKES IT FOUR PLAYER OF THE MONTH WINS IN A ROW

Charles earned her fourth consecutive Player of the Month honor and her ninth overall, keeping ahead of Maya Moore for the most since the award's inception in 2010. Charles becomes the first player in league history to win Player of the Month for four consecutive months. Additionally, dating back to last season, the previous six Eastern Conference Player of the Month Awards have gone to New York (Charles - July '15; Epiphanny Prince - August '15), making it the most consecutive honors awarded to one franchise in WNBA history.

### LIBERTY BENCH MOB SETS NEW WNBA RECORD

The Liberty saw its second unit combine for a WNBA record 69 points in the 88-81 win at Washington on July 20. Rebecca Allen led four New York reserves in double figures with a career-high 19 points on four 3-point field goals. New York topped the previous all-time high of 63 points, set by Washington in 2014, but that came in an overtime effort, the non-OT record was 62, set by New York in 2008. The Liberty averaged 28.3 bench points per game, which ranked 4th in the WNBA.

### MORE ON THE BENCH'S BIG GAME

With five reserves combining to score 69 points in New York's 88-81 win at Washington on July 20, there weren't many points left for the starters. Tina Charles led the way with 13 for the Liberty starting five, but the 19 points for New York's starters tied a WNBA record for the fewest points scored by a team's starting five in a win in league history. It had been done twice before, but not since Cleveland saw 19 points come from its starters in a 66-53 win over Indiana on June 29, 2003. The WNBA record for fewest points by a starting five in any game is 15.

### ALLEN EXPLODES FOR CAREER DAY

Second-year forward Rebecca Allen enjoyed her best game with the Liberty as she came off the bench to lead the team with 19 points in an 88-81 win over the Washington Mystics on July 20. Allen was lethal from 3-point range, knocking down 4-of-6 attempts from deep. It was just her second-ever game scoring in double figures, and she easily surpassed her previous career-high of 11 points, which came against the Atlanta Dream on July 13. Additionally, she was the first Liberty player other than Sugar Rodgers or Tina Charles to hit at least three 3-pointers in a game.

### TURN BACK THE CLOCK

Forward Swin Cash turned in a vintage performance in the Liberty's win over the Connecticut Sun on July 17, scoring a team-high 16 points with six rebounds. Cash shot 6-of-9 from the field and also had two assists and two steals. It was the most points Cash has scored in a Liberty uniform, and her highest scoring output since netting 16 as a member of the Chicago Sky on Sept. 8, 2013. It was also the first time she led her team in scoring since finishing with 18 points for Chicago on Aug. 15, 2013.

### BATTLE OF THE BOARDS

Head coach Bill Laimbeer places an emphasis on rebounding to team success and the Liberty has proven to be one of the best rebounding teams in the league across all metrics so far this season. Overall, New York has out-rebounded 23 opponents with a 17-6 record in those games, while the Liberty is just 3-6 when being outrebounded and 5-9 when losing out on 2nd chance scoring:

## WINNING THE CLOSE ONES

With its 84-81 setback at Dallas on September 11, the Liberty lost for the first time when a game was decided by one possession, falling to 5-1 in one possession games, and New York is 6-1 in games decided by five or fewer points. The Liberty played in a franchise record six overtime games this season, posting a 3-3 mark in those contests. The WNBA record for overtime games by a single-team in the same season is seven, accomplished three times.

## BILL LAIMBEER PICKS UP CAREER WIN NO. 200

Bill Laimbeer picked up career victory No. 200 when the Liberty defeated the Chicago Sky on July 8, becoming just the seventh coach in WNBA history to reach the milestone. Laimbeer boasts a career record of 207-158 and is 70-66 with the Liberty, although over the past two seasons he is 44-24 (.647) with New York. He has twice been named the WNBA Coach of the Year during his career (2003, 2015) and led his teams to three WNBA Championships during his time with the Detroit Shock (2003, 2006, 2008).

## TANISHA WRIGHT SCORES 3,000TH-CAREER POINT

Sinking a free throw with 15.1 remaining in an 88-85 win over the Chicago Sky on July 8, Liberty guard Tanisha Wright scored her 3,000th-career point, her second big milestone of the season, as she secured her 1,000th-career rebound in the Liberty's win over Dallas on June 14. A 12-year veteran of the league, Wright is on a very rare list, as one of just 10 players in WNBA history to score at least 3,000 points, with 1,000 rebounds and 1,200 assists.

## CHARLES SEES ONE OF THE BEST 20-POINT STREAKS IN LEAGUE HISTORY COME TO AN END

Tina Charles saw her streak of nine-consecutive games scoring at least 20 points come to an end when she netted just 18 in a victory over Seattle on July 6. From June 11 through July 3, Charles scored at least 21 points in every game she played, a stretch that matched the fourth-longest such streak in WNBA history, and also had a pair of 30 point performances during that period, averaging 26.1 ppg overall. The record for consecutive 20 point games is 13, held by Diana Taurasi (2006-07).

## EASTERN CONFERENCE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

### TINA CHARLES - SEPTEMBER 12

Charles led the WNBA in scoring the week prior en route to her WNBA single-season record 7th Player of the Week victory. She averaged 24.7 ppg and was fourth overall with 9.7 rebounds per game for the Liberty. Charles surpassed 20 points in all three of New York's games that week and finished with 29 points, 10 rebounds, and 5 blocks at Dallas.

### TINA CHARLES - JULY 25

Charles set a WNBA single-season record with her sixth Player of the Week honor in 2016, raising her career total to 20 in seven seasons (second all time behind Tamika Catchings' 22). Charles tied for first in scoring (19.0 ppg), ranked first in rebounding (11.0 rpg) and tied for eight in assists (3.5 apg) among East players to win the award.

### TINA CHARLES - JULY 6

Three in a row for Tina Charles after winning Player of the Week again on July 6. In two games the previous week, Charles averaged 29.0 ppg, 9.5 rpg, and shot .500 from the field. Her 31 points in a win at Phoenix was just one shy of her career-high, and she followed that up two days later with 27 points at Los Angeles.

### TINA CHARLES - JUNE 27

After averaging 23.3 ppg, 10.0 rpg, and 6.3 apg, Tina Charles was tabbed as the Eastern Conference Player of the Week for the fourth time this season. She nearly recorded a triple-double with 23 points, 10 assists, and 9 rebounds at Atlanta on June 22, scored 21 with 13 boards in a victory over Chicago, and led the Liberty with 26 points in an overtime loss to Phoenix.

### TINA CHARLES - JUNE 20

For the third time this season Tina Charles picked up Eastern Conference Player of the Week honors, this time after leading the Liberty to a 3-0 week while putting up incredible numbers across the board. In wins over Dallas, Connecticut, and Indiana, Charles led the WNBA in scoring with 28.7 ppg, including a career-high matching 32 points in the win at Connecticut.

### TINA CHARLES - JUNE 6

Tina Charles was named the WNBA Eastern Conference Player of the Week for the 16th time in her career on June 6. She led the Liberty to a 2-1 record the week before, averaging a double-double of 18.7 points and 11.0 rebounds per game, also dishing out 3.3 assists per contest. She scored in double figures in all three games, netting a high of 23 against the Minnesota Lynx.

### TINA CHARLES - MAY 24

Over the first three games of the season she led the league in rebounding (12.7 rpg) and ranked first in the Eastern Conference in scoring (21.7 ppg) and sixth in assists (3.3 apg). She led the Liberty in scoring in all three games over the first week of the season in addition to posting three double-doubles.

## EXTRA SUGAR

Liberty guard Sugar Rodgers went on a hot streak from June 26 through July 1, topping 20 points in three-straight games for the first time in her career. Including a career-best 30 points in the win at Minnesota on June 29, Rodgers averaged 25.0 ppg over those three contests, having knocked down 14 3-pointers during that span, an average of 4.7 triples per game. Her seven 3-pointers in the win over the Lynx tied the Liberty single-game record and was one shy of the WNBA single-game record.

## PUSHING 90

The Liberty topped at least 90 points in three-straight games for the first time in franchise history with the 99-88 victory over the Phoenix Mercury on July 1. Over that three-game span, New York averaged 97.0 ppg, while shooting .472 from the field and .413 from 3-point range, with 6.3 3-pointers per game. The New York second unit contributed a great deal to that overall success as the Liberty saw 33.7 ppg come from its bench over those three contests.

## STEPPING UP BIG TIME

With Tina Charles missing New York's game at Minnesota on June 29, second-year center Amanda Zahui B stepped into the starting lineup for the first time in her career, and she more than made the most of the opportunity. Zahui B nearly recorded a double-double, pouring in a career-high 17 points (6-of-12 FG) with nine rebounds, posting a team-best +14 in her 34 minutes of action. She was able to get it done on the defensive end as well, swatting away three shots.

## LIBERTY BIG COME BACK - CLOSER EXAMINATION

New York erased a 15-point deficit with six minutes remaining to win at Minnesota, 95-92, in overtime on June 29. The Liberty trailed 81-66 when Brittany Boyd drove to the rim to spark what turned into a 17-2 run to end regulation. Tanisha Wright found Sugar Rodgers out on the wing for the game-tying 3-point attempt, and New York used three balls from Rodgers and Shavonte Zellous to pull away in OT. The Liberty limited Minnesota to just 11 points in the 4th quarter on 4-of-14 shooting. The Lynx turned the ball over six times in the final period, with New York capitalizing to the tune of 10 points off the extra possessions.

## LIBERTY WELL-REPRESENTED ON WNBA TOP-20 AND MOST INFLUENTIAL 20@20 LIST

The New York Liberty had a strong showing on the WNBA's Best and Most Influential Top-20@20 list when it was announced on June 21, with three current players or coaches making the team: Teresa Weatherspoon, Swin Cash, and Katie Smith

### TERESA WEATHERSPOON

One of the most influential people in WNBA history and the first player in league history to score 1,000 points with 1,000 assists for a career. Her halfcourt shot to win game two of the 1999 WNBA Finals remains one of the most iconic images of the league's 20-year history.

### SWIN CASH

Recently became just the second player in league history to score 5,000 points with 2,000 rebounds and 1,000 assists. She ranks 13th in the league in scoring, winning three WNBA titles (2003, 2006, 2010) and two Olympic gold medals (2004, 2012).

### KATIE SMITH

All-time leading scorer in women's professional basketball history. She ranks fourth in WNBA history with 6,452 points, third with 482 games played and second with 15,725 minutes. Smith won WNBA Championships in 2006 and 2008 and Olympic Gold in 2000, 2004, and 2008.

## TINA CHARLES WINS MAY WNBA CARES COMMUNITY ASSIST AWARD PRESENTED BY STATE FARM

Tina Charles won the May WNBA Cares Community Assist Award presented by State Farm. Throughout the month of May, expanding on her extraordinary work to improve the health and safety of children and families across the country, Charles and the Hopey's Heart Foundation (HHF) launched the "Build-Up NYC" Program. With support from the New York City Council, the program is designed to assist with AED placement and CPR training throughout the five boroughs. Charles also became the first player in league history to win the Community Assist and Player of the Month Awards for the same month of competition.

## TINA CHARLES FLIRTS WITH HISTORY

Tina Charles came close to notching her name in the record books as she finished merely one rebound shy of posting what would have been just the sixth regular season triple double in WNBA history when the Liberty beat the Atlanta Dream 90-79 in double overtime on June 22. Charles finished with 23 points, a career-high 10 assists, and nine rebounds to lead New York to the win.

## CONTROLLING THE PAINT

Last season, New York dominated the interior, outscoring its opponents in the paint in 28-of-34 games played, posting a 20-8 mark in those contests. The Liberty is right back at it this season:

- New York houtscored 26-of-34 opponents inside of the paint.
- New York is first in defensive points allowed in the paint, giving up just 28.1 ppg.
- The Liberty is 3-5 in those games where it failed to hold the advantage offensively on the interior.
- New York had a 1,206-954 advantage in the paint, an average of 7.4 more points per game in the interior.

## ANOTHER CAREER MILESTONE FOR SWIN CASH - 5,000 POINTS

Liberty forward Swin Cash became the 14th player in WNBA history to score 5,000 points in her career when she drove to the rim for two in the first quarter at Connecticut on June 16. Cash has proven to be a versatile player throughout her career and is just the 2nd player to have 5,000 points, 2,000 rebounds, and 1,000 assists. The only other is also active, and also has announced her retirement at the end of this season - Tamika Catchings has 7,380 points, 3,316 rebounds, and 1,488 assists. Cash also ranks fourth in games played (478) and 7th in rebounds (2,521).

## CASH HAULS IN SEASON-HIGH 10 BOARDS AT SAN ANTONIO

Forward Swin Cash narrowly missed out on recording a double-double in the Liberty win at San Antonio on June 11, finishing with eight points and a season-high 10 rebounds. In fact, the 10 boards are a personal best for Cash as a member of the Liberty. It was her 38th regular season game with at least 10 rebounds, but her first since she had 14 boards on July 2, 2013. She is the eighth player in WNBA history to have at least 10 rebounds in a game for at least four different franchises (Taj McWilliams-Franklin, Michelle Snow, Chamique Holdsclaw, Betty Lennox, Wendy Palmer, Sheri Sam, and Ann Wauters.)

## WHAT A PERFORMANCE

When the Liberty faced the Atlanta Dream on May 24, Tina Charles did something that only two other players in WNBA history had accomplished. She finished with 29 points, 10 rebounds, 6 assists, and 7 steals, becoming just the third player ever to score at least 29 points with 10 rebounds and also post five-plus assists and steals.

## LIBERTY LONG ON OLYMPIC EXPERIENCE

Tina Charles won her second gold medal at the 2016 Summer Games in Rio, and she is one of several members of the Liberty team and coaching staff with Olympic Experience. Swin Cash, a 15-year veteran of the WNBA, is a two-time gold medal winner, helping Team USA capture gold medals at Athens in 2004 and London in 2012. Associate head coach Katie Smith won gold three times, Sydney in 2000, Athens, and Beijing in 2008. Teresa Weatherspoon won at gold medal at the 1988 games in Seoul, and won bronze in Barcelona in 1992.

## LIBERTY MAKES A 'BIG' TRADE

The second overall picks in the 2015 WNBA Draft made her way to New York as the Liberty sent its 2017 first round pick to the Dallas Wings in exchange for Amanda Zahui B. and a 2017 second round pick. Zahui B., who was the Big Ten Player of the Year and a First-Team All-American at Minnesota in 2015, averaged 3.4 points and 2.4 rebounds per game during her rookie season. She also shot .333 from 3-point range and averaged 0.6 blocks per game.

## ROSTER TURNOVER

New York entered the 2016 season with seven returning players and six new faces. Bill Laimbeer begins his fourth season as head coach of the Liberty and all 13 current members of the Liberty have arrived after Laimbeer started, meaning no players remain from the time he took over as head coach.

## **Swin Cash proud of what she's done on and off the court**

Swin Cash has been synonymous with winning over her entire career. She's had success at virtually every level she's played at, from her two championships at UConn to three titles in the WNBA.

And still, some around the league think of her more for what she's done off the court, like leading her Cash for Kids charity.

"We've been able to positively help so many kids over the years, getting them to choose the right path," said Cash after New York practiced Tuesday. "That is a legacy that will last long after my career is over."

Twenty-five of those kids will be in attendance Wednesday night when the Liberty play the Seattle Storm. They'll be there to see Cash get honored after the game at Madison Square Garden. The 15-year WNBA veteran announced in June that she would retire at the end of the season.

"During the season, you're always like, 'It's down the road,' but now it's here," Cash said. "I'll go into it and try and make sure that I don't cry. That's the biggest thing. I'm happy to see how many people are able to come in from out of town to celebrate this day with me."

It's fitting that the retirement ceremony will come with Seattle in town as Cash helped the Storm win a title in 2010.

"It's ironic how it all worked out. It's awesome, Sue (Bird) and I being college roommates, teammates, the career we had," Cash said. "It's going to be special having her there. It's going to be a lot of emotions and a lot of happiness, too."

Bird will partake in the ceremony as well as former teammate Tina Thompson and WNBA President Lisa Borders.

"She's accomplished so much in her career. Of course there's on the court, she's a winner," Bird said. "The impact she's had on not just one community in this league, because she played for a couple teams. She went out of her way to make sure she connected with each city she played in. Not many players do that, not many players have the passion to do that. For Swin that's the mark she's left."

Cash has played most of her career under Liberty coach Bill Laimbeer in both New York and Detroit. Don't expect the Liberty's coach to be overly sentimental on Wednesday, it's just the way he is. Laimbeer joked postgame Saturday when first asked about Cash and the ceremony, "Who?"

He was more serious Tuesday about Cash's impact.

"It's always easier when you have good leadership in a locker room for a coach," he said. "That won't show in the public eye, but that's why we brought her to New York. I think as far as her on the floor, she's a great ambassador. Works hard. That's what the fans appreciate. It remains to be seen if her biggest impact in women's basketball is on or off the court. That story still has to be written."

Cash was at the forefront in July when New York took a stand in support for the Black Lives Matter movement and for five Dallas police officers who were killed.

"She's been a leader in every sense of the word," said teammate Tanisha Wright, who played with Cash in Seattle and New York. "People respect what she does on the court and off it."

Besides her charity, Cash has been a broadcaster for a few years doing in-studio work for ESPN as well as being part of an all-woman talk show on CBS. She hopes to continue that after her basketball career ends.

"I've been blessed to have a lot of opportunities," Cash said.

Wednesday night, the fans and her teammates will get a chance to say thank you. It would be sweeter if it comes after a victory, which would secure the third seed for New York in the playoffs.

**Liberty's Cash Still Leaving Her Mark**

When the W.N.B.A. introduced a new logo before the 2013 season, there was no indication of the identity of the player represented in silhouette. While the image remains up for interpretation, Liberty forward Swin Cash would have been a fitting inspiration.

Few players have matched the influence and accomplishments of Cash, who has said she will retire at the end of this season, her 15th in the W.N.B.A. Named in June as one of the 20 greatest players in the league's history, she won two titles with the Detroit Shock and one with the Seattle Storm, as well as two Olympic gold medals.

On Wednesday, after a game against the Storm at Madison Square Garden, the Liberty will hold a ceremony to honor her achievements.

Liberty Coach Bill Laimbeer is unlikely to get overly sentimental — that is just his nature — but Cash's impact on his W.N.B.A. coaching career is not lost on him. For nine of his 12 seasons on the sideline, Cash has been on his roster.

"It's always easier when you have good leadership in a locker room for a coach," Laimbeer said.

Laimbeer was hired by the Shock during Cash's rookie season, in 2002, after the team got off to an 0-10 start. Almost immediately, Cash was named team captain and was made the crux of Detroit's rebuilding.

Despite her storied college résumé — Cash had won two national titles at Connecticut — some veterans bristled at the attention given to the newcomer. The next season, though, the Shock won the W.N.B.A. title, and they won another in 2006.

The relationship between Cash and Laimbeer soured in 2007 when he questioned her performance as she dealt with severe back pain and a malignant kidney tumor that only they and the team trainer knew about. After the season, Cash was traded to Seattle.

"Bill and I obviously have had ups and downs," Cash said. "The one thing we do have very much in common, we are supercompetitive, and we understand, at the end of the day, there's a certain level of trust — no matter what words can be said, you have to come in and play for a coach and an organization.

"I think the one thing I can say is that he does treat the organization and the players like pros," she continued, adding, "Obviously, there were differences a lot of times, but it's amazing to think that things come full circle."

Hired by the Liberty in 2013, Laimbeer traded for Tina Charles after that season and desired a veteran to help mold Charles into a stronger leader. Cash and Laimbeer then tried to "clear the air," she said.

Although Cash no longer has the scoring average of her years in Detroit and plays about half the minutes, Laimbeer knows she will always "give all she has," he said. Cash, who turns 37 this month, has been a starter for most of the season.

Cash has also fulfilled Laimbeer's request to aid in the development of Charles, a leading candidate for most valuable player.

Her name means astounding woman," Charles said of Cash's given name, Swintayla, from Swahili. "And that's what she is."

Cash's influence is all over the Liberty. Center Carolyn Swords, who was in her second year when Cash joined her on the Chicago Sky, credited Cash with helping her mature and praised Cash's role as an extension of Laimbeer on the floor.

"Swin knows what Bill expects of us," Swords said. "She helps communicate that to us. Then I think it goes the other way; Swin has a good idea of the pulse of the team, and she can communicate that back. I think that connection and that relationship really benefits us."

The Liberty, who have five regular-season games remaining, are on track to finish with the best record in the Eastern Conference for a second straight season. And Cash has been at the forefront of expanding the Liberty's presence in community initiatives, another request of Laimbeer's.

"It brings me a lot of joy to walk in Harlem and have people coming up — they don't want to talk about the Knicks first; they want to talk about the Liberty," Cash said.

In July, Cash also helped lead the Liberty in a show of support for the Black Lives Matter movement and for five Dallas police officers who were fatally shot, with the Liberty shedding their league-mandated warm-ups for black T-shirts.

"I don't think you can play basketball, have a platform that we have, and not be able to be a voice for people that are voiceless," Cash said at the time.

Throughout her career, Cash has not been hesitant to use her voice. For years, she has been a driving force in the W.N.B.A. players' union. And she wrote a 2013 book, "Humble Journey: More Precious Than Gold," that detailed her experiences with cancer, gender barriers as she entered a career in broadcasting, and personal relationships.

I needed to write it because there may be a girl that's struggling with a toxic relationship; there may be a girl that's struggling with how to deal with coaches and the business of basketball, the business of any sport," Cash said.

Recently, before a game at San Antonio, Cash looked around the arena and began to laugh. She has not had the time for much introspection this season. Instead she has made use of small moments to reflect on her career and her life.

"I wouldn't change anything that's happened to me," Cash said. "It was a lot of scary stuff; there were a lot of times when my face was planted on the floor in tears and you cry out to God and you're trying to understand, Why is this happening to me?"

"Whenever it's raining, when it stops, you get to the other side, and you see this rainbow, and you see this sunshine, and then that's when you're just smiling. I feel like at this point in my career, I can smile because I see the other side and I see there's this other door that's opening, but everything that's behind me is something that's beautiful."

**Life is sweeter for Sugar Rodgers**

She had survived losing both her mother and her family home before she turned 16. She had survived seeing her older brother and sister being sent to prison for selling drugs. And almost two years ago, the Liberty's fourth-year guard survived a frightening home invasion in which four men broke into the home where she was sleeping, forced her to the floor and stuck a gun to her head.

So when Liberty coach Bill Laimbeer told Rodgers that the team was going to give her some big-time minutes this season while Epiphanny Prince was out rehabbing her torn ACL, Rodgers knew that she was going to have to produce some big-time numbers.

"I knew when I stepped on the court for the first game this year that if I didn't show them what I had, they were going to get someone else," Rodgers said. "After all the hard work and tears, I was getting my opportunity. The lights came on and I shined."

The Liberty heads into the final weeks of the WNBA regular season with the best record in the Eastern Conference and the performance of Rodgers has been a major reason why. Rodgers, a top candidate for the league's most improved player award, has given the Liberty a much-needed offensive complement to superstar Tina Charles. Through 28 games, Rodgers has averaged a career-high 14.5 points per game, shooting 43.3 percent from three-point range, the fifth best in the league.

"This young lady is driven," said Teresa Weatherspoon, the Liberty's director of player development. "She went through some things no 14-year-old should ever have to see or do. She's been through a lot in life and she wants to be an example for her community, to show that anyone can get it done no matter what you've been through."

There are plenty of players in professional sports who come from difficult circumstances, but few have endured the heartbreak and poverty that marked Rodgers' journey to the WNBA. It's a journey so unlikely that she regularly speaks to youth groups about her experience and plans to write a book to inspire young people dealing with difficult home situations.

"Basketball saved my life," Rodgers said after a recent practice. "I say that every day. It gave me something to concentrate on and stay focused on."

**Supportive mother dies**

Rodgers' story begins in Suffolk, Virginia, where she was born Ta'Shauna Rodgers and nicknamed Sugar by an uncle when she was a toddler. Her mother, Barb Mae, was 42 when Rodgers was born, old enough to have figured out what's important.

Though Barb Mae had played basketball herself, she believed there was more of a future in golf. She enrolled her daughter in a program in which Sugar did so well that she was the top-ranked girl golfer in her area and appeared in a television commercial with Tiger Woods when she was 10.

And then Barb Mae, who had worked two jobs to support Sugar and the three children of her older daughter, got sick. She couldn't come out to the golf course to watch Sugar play anymore. In fact, she was so sick with complications from Lupus that she couldn't get out of bed.

"I was 14 when she got really sick, 15 when she passed away," said Rodgers, 26. "I was her nurse and changing her. I knew how to change a diaper from changing my nephew's. It was the same thing. Just more body weight."

Rodgers quit playing golf when Barb Mae got sick, she said, because it was too painful to be out there without her. She spent what little free time she had on a makeshift basketball hoop her brother Deshawn had erected in the street in front of their house. Rodgers' oldest sister, Sharon, was in prison on a drug charge and couldn't help out, she said. Deshawn, now supporting the family, also was arrested and jailed on a drug charge.

Several months before Barb Mae died, there was a drug bust at the house, Sugar said. Barb Mae was taken to a nursing home, where she quickly went downhill.

The family home was condemned and torn down. At 15 years old, Sugar was both motherless and homeless. Her father, who was in his 60s when she was born, did not play a major role in her life, she said.

Sugar spent her high school years bouncing from house to house, living with various friends and relatives and a basketball coach.

"I didn't want to get put in the foster care system," she said. "I would forge my mom's name at school even after she had passed for a while. I didn't want anyone to know anything about me."

### **Talent and chance at college**

The one thing that everyone seemed to know is that she could play basketball. Sugar blossomed into a McDonald's All-American at Suffolk's Kings Fork High School and an AAU star for coach Boo Williams, whose sister Terri Williams-Flournoy was then the women's coach at Georgetown University. Sugar never had thought about going to college; she basically was just barely attending high school. But she and Williams-Flournoy developed a tight bond and off to Georgetown she went.

"She had such unbelievable talent. She could just shoot the lights out," said Williams-Flournoy, now the coach at Auburn. "Sugar is a very smart young lady and a very determined competitor. You put all of that together and there's not much she's not going to get accomplished."

Georgetown, at first, was like stepping on another planet. While many of her classmates looked down on the cafeteria and had the money to go out for dinner every night, Rodgers said she remembers being so happy the first couple of weeks of school because she could get all the hamburgers and chicken tenders she wanted.

She also struggled at first with school, but she eventually learned to reach out for help. This is something she often stresses when she speaks to at-risk youths.

"I tell kids I didn't know what a complete sentence was when I got to Georgetown, but I stayed with it and worked hard," she said. "You never know who will help you. Don't be scared to ask."

Rodgers graduated in 2013 with a degree in English and totaled a school record 2,518 points, surpassing Sleepy Floyd and Patrick Ewing. She was taken with the 14th overall pick by the Minnesota Lynx, but averaged less than seven minutes a game her rookie season. After she was traded to the Liberty before the 2014 season, things started looking up.

And then she decided to go visit a close relative in Virginia, whom she identifies only as Tanya.

Rodgers said she was sleeping on the couch and her 11-year-old nephew was sleeping on the floor next to her when four men kicked in the door and began screaming about money. A man in a red hoodie put a gun to her head and she lay on the floor to cover her nephew with her body.



"I could hear them in the backroom using a tazer on Tanya," Rodgers remembered. "All of the sudden, the gun lifted from my head and I heard people running out of the house."

Rodgers said that Tanya's boyfriend had been able to get to a registered gun he kept in the house for protection and chased the men out. "The police never caught the robbers," she said. "And where I'm from that's not uncommon."

Rodgers is a religious person, and she believes there is a reason that she has made it to where she is. Her one wish is that her mother could see how it all turned out, that she could share her success and see how well the family is doing. Sharon, she said, has started her own nursing business since getting out of prison. Deshawn, she added, also was recently released from prison. And the family remains close as Rodgers often goes back to Suffolk to visit with family and talk to kids.

"I love to go back and let kids know there is a way out, no matter what you go through," Rodgers said. "For me, it was basketball, but it doesn't have to be that. You just have to keep believing in yourself and not let other people kill your dreams."

**Quiet Protest Helped Tina Charles Find the Voice of Her Conscience**

July has been a momentous month for Liberty center Tina Charles.

On Monday, she set a single-season W.N.B.A. record by winning her sixth Player of the Week Award. On Tuesday, she continued her sweep of Eastern Conference player of the month accolades, notching her third consecutive honor.

Leading the league with averages of 21.4 points and 9.6 rebounds, Charles is having a historic season. Over the next month, she will pursue her second Olympic gold medal with the United States women's national team.

For Charles, the importance of those numbers, which have positioned her as a front-runner to win the W.N.B.A. Most Valuable Player Award, are almost trivial compared to her sudden emergence as an impassioned voice addressing social issues affecting the daily lives of black Americans.

During much of her career, even in college when she helped lead Connecticut to two national championships, Charles was known as a reserved personality, reluctant to take the spotlight.

But since the fatal police shootings this month of Philando Castile in Falcon Heights, Minn., and Alton Sterling in Baton Rouge, La., Charles has spoken up to galvanize protests with her teammates in support of the Black Lives Matter movement and has called for curbing gun violence in response to the attack against police officers in Dallas.

"Of course, as an individual, I do have goals to be one of the best players in the W.N.B.A.," Charles said Thursday. "But when you reach a goal, nothing compares to the person you become along the way."

Charles said those recent events had helped her mature. "I had to," she said.

Before the Liberty's game on July 10, players wore black T-shirts with the printed slogans "#BlackLivesMatter" and "#Dallas." The back featured another hashtag followed by a blank space.

The previous night, the Minnesota Lynx had worn similar shirts. There had rarely been such a public demonstration by W.N.B.A. players during the league's 20-year history without advance league approval.

The Liberty, joined by other teams, continued wearing plain black T-shirts in a gesture against gun violence. As a result, three teams, including the Liberty, and the players who participated were fined for violating the league's uniform guidelines.

On July 21, before a game against the Indiana Fever, Charles was scheduled to receive her Player of the Month Award for June. That morning, upon learning about the police shooting of Charles Kinsey in North Miami, Fla., Charles wore a league-approved warm-up shirt inside-out, to further her message.

"I thought, 'No, I can't comply with what the W.N.B.A. is saying for us to do in the wake of the fines,'" said Charles, who credited her teammates Swin Cash and Tanisha Wright with guiding her.

Charles said it was not just about her in that moment. She said she was also representing W.N.B.A. players who were reluctant to take similar steps in fear of being fined.

Two days later, amid increased public outcry and support from fellow players, the penalties were rescinded.

Charles had not yet spoken to W.N.B.A. President Lisa M. Borders regarding her actions. Assessing the past week, Charles said she understood the business behind the W.N.B.A.'s decision and trusted that Borders would work with players to address their concerns.

Charles was not planning any protests during the Olympics out of respect for U.S.A. Basketball.

"I definitely have seen growth in the person that I am," Charles said. "It definitely meant a lot, and it's something that I'll remember for the rest of my career."

While leading a national public discussion was a new realm for Charles, she is no stranger to basketball superiority. Four years ago, at age 23, she won her first M.V.P. Award with the Connecticut Sun.

Incorporating the court vision of a guard, the 6-foot-3 Charles regularly sets up the offense or finds cutting teammates for backdoor passes. On the block, she is a bastion of offensive aggressiveness who can also connect from the elbow and beyond.

In an interview this month, Charles said that she found it amusing that reporters repeatedly asked what changes had brought about her success this season.

"I think you guys are just paying attention to me," Charles said. "I don't think it's me. I've been doing the same thing throughout my career. Maybe another superstar isn't playing the way they do, and then it's like, 'Oh, let me pay attention to Tina.'"

Her continued elite play has often been overlooked, in part because she did not seek marketability. In 2012, she told The New York Times, "My goal is not to be a face of the league."

Instead of filming commercials after practices, Charles often drives to the Midtown Manhattan office of her foundation, Hopey's Heart, which honors her late aunt, Maureen Vaz, and provides automated external defibrillators throughout the country. Charles donated her W.N.B.A. salary this season to the cause, after having contributed half of her salary in past years.

Charles said she had accepted that she was not at the center of the league's promotional efforts, despite her performance.

"You can't cry over what you can't control," she said. "Again, I know why I'm playing. I know what's more important: the work that I'm doing through my foundation and how I'm able to impact my teammates around me."

Charles's talent is not lost on her colleagues. Liberty Coach Bill Laimbeer often refers to her as the world's best player. Before a game in late June, Phoenix Mercury Coach Sandy Brondello noted Charles's maturation as a leader and said, "Tina gets better and better every year I see her, which is quite amazing."

In her third season with the Liberty, Charles has become their unequivocal general — a role the Sun questioned her ability to fulfill when she considered sitting out the 2014 season if she was not traded.

Geno Auriemma, Charles's coach at Connecticut and with the national team, said Charles exudes leadership qualities.

"It's one thing for Tina to say, 'I want this' or 'I want to stand up for this,' but when you see her actions and you see what she does, that's a more powerful statement than anything she might say," Auriemma said.

Over the past month, Charles's willingness to visibly push the conversation on police violence and treatment of black Americans has also resonated outside women's basketball.

"Some responses I would see saying, 'I've never seen you play, I've never seen a W.N.B.A. game, but I'm a fan now,' just because of who we are," Charles said. "So to be noticed for who you are versus what you do, I think that's awesome."

She added: "It shows that there's more to us than putting a ball in a basket. We are women. We have a voice. Oftentimes women are forced to be silent, and that's why I think it's really a beautiful thing what we were able to do, very resilient of us to say, 'No, this time we're not going to be silent.'"

Through a combination of her basketball mastery and thoughtful social engagement, more people than ever are recognizing who Charles is.

The longtime national team member Tamika Catchings, who wore similar black shirts in protest with the Fever, is retiring after this season. As her generation steps aside, Catchings sees Charles's foray into the limelight as a necessity.

"I told her, 'I feel like I've watched you grow up in the last few years, just being so quiet and taking a step back, to being really outgoing and outspoken,'" Catchings said. "Now it's like Tina made a name for herself in the W. She's playing on an M.V.P. level this year, already has one under her belt, but I just think her being able to use her voice takes her to another level."

**Rodgers sets new goal**

Sugar Rodgers is no stranger to stardom. However, after three seasons of professional basketball, the Suffolk native has reached new levels of exposure this season.

Rodgers cemented herself as the starting guard for the WNBA's New York Liberty this season, starting every game and leading the league in three-pointers. Her breakout season earned her a spot on the U.S. Select Team, which practiced with and competed against the women's national basketball team last weekend.

"I knew it was an opportunity to showcase my talent," Rodgers said. "It was good to work with them and see what it takes to be an Olympian."

Though she did not start the game, Rodgers ended up playing more than 14 minutes.

She said the opportunity to train with a national team vying for its sixth straight Olympic gold allowed her to see how to reach that same level.

"The difference is more in their experience," she said. "Talent-wise, everyone's around the same level, since we all play in the WNBA."

Rodgers has shown she has no shortage of talent.

The Suffolk native graduated from King's Fork High School in 2007, after being named the school's most valuable player all four years. She continued her career at Georgetown University, where she holds the scoring record for men and women with a total 2,518 points over her career.

Rodgers was selected by the Minnesota Lynx as the second pick of the second round of the 2013 WNBA draft. However, she could not break into the first team in Minnesota, and she ended up going to to play for the New York Liberty.

Since then, she has become a key player, starting every game of the 2016 season, which sees the Liberty in first place in the Eastern conference.

Rodgers said the opportunity to be a starter came with patience.

"I got an opportunity to play, and I ran with it," she said. "You have to continue to work hard and be patient. Your time will come; my time happened to be this year."

During the 2016 season, Rodgers has averaged 14.7 points per game, compared to 8.1 last season. She has also seen dramatic increases in nearly every important statistic for her position.

She said she worked hard in the off season to develop her game.

"I just worked on tightening up and being consistent," she said. "My goals were to be consistent and be the best two-way guard."

Rodgers said she spends time practicing offense and defense in order to contribute going both ways. She said this

gives her an advantage over other players.

"It gives me something a lot of players don't focus on," she said. "Some people only focus on offense."

There has been an upwelling of support for Rodgers in her hometown. Young basketball players attended the Liberty's game in Washington, D.C. to see their hero play.

Rodgers said knowing she is a role model provides her with extra motivation to work hard and continue to succeed.

"It's definitely motivation for me. I didn't have a WNBA player to look up to when I was growing up."

Despite her success so far this season, Rodgers is looking for more. She said the Liberty have a good chance of going all the way and becoming WNBA champions.

Looking further down the road, she said she wants to find herself on the Olympic team in 2020.

"It's my ultimate goal," she said. "I definitely think I can do it. But we'll see in four years."

**Liberty Show Solidarity With Black Lives Matter in Rare Public Stance**

Before their game against the San Antonio Stars on Sunday at Madison Square Garden, the Liberty players wore black T-shirts addressing the recent shooting deaths of black men by the police in Minneapolis and Baton Rouge, La., and the fatal shooting of five Dallas police officers. The shirts, which were printed without notice to the W.N.B.A., read: #BlackLivesMatter and #Dallas5. The back of the shirts had another hashtag followed by a blank space.

"We do need people to stand up and understand and express that black lives are just as important as any other lives in America, and right now that's not being seen," Liberty guard Tanisha Wright said.

The coordinated effort was a rare spontaneous public stance on a social issue for a team in the W.N.B.A., which is in its 20th season. The Minnesota Lynx also wore similar warm-up shirts before their game Saturday night.

Liberty forward Swin Cash, in her 15th season, said the players did not fear repercussions or fines from the league.

After video surfaced of the shootings of Alton Sterling and Philando Castile last week, Liberty players began discussing ways to respond to the recent spate of shooting deaths involving the police, as well as the planned attack on police officers in Dallas.

Recently, Knicks forward Carmelo Anthony posted a photo of civil rights leaders on Instagram and wrote a caption calling for athletes to effect social change. On Saturday, after winning her 22nd Grand Slam title at Wimbledon, Serena Williams also discussed the recent shootings.

In December 2014, shortly after a grand jury did not indict a New York police officer whose chokehold led to the death of Eric Garner, an unarmed black man, N.B.A. players struck a similar stance to that of the Liberty players.

Knicks guard Derrick Rose, then with the Chicago Bulls, wore a T-shirt with the phrase "I Can't Breathe" and was followed by LeBron James, Kobe Bryant and members of the Nets. Most of the players focused on supporting Garner's family, and were not as directly engaged in relating their attire to the Black Lives Matter movement.

After the game on Sunday, which the Liberty won, 75-65, Kiah Stokes, Tina Charles and Carolyn Swords joined Cash and Wright to answer questions about their statement.

"I think it's a shame that we keep seeing people that want to make this movement as something that's violent," said Cash, who repeatedly hit the lectern with her fist and whose voice cracked while speaking. "Five cops gave their lives up trying to protect a peaceful movement. And in this country, I do believe that you can assemble peacefully and protest against injustice. So until the system transforms, we cannot sit here and act like there is not a problem here in America."

Liberty guard Shavonte Zellous added that she thought W.N.B.A. players were finally beginning to feel

comfortable addressing social issues. Zellous, who is from Orlando, Fla., has written “LGBT” and “Orlando Strong” across her sneakers since 49 people were killed at an Orlando nightclub on June 12.

On Friday, the W.N.B.A. released a statement with the N.B.A. offering condolences to families affected by the shootings in the three cities. The W.N.B.A. did not provide a follow-up statement about the Liberty’s actions on Sunday.

In the locker room after the news conference, Cash continued to talk about race relations. She recalled how her grandmother would tell her about her fears living during the civil rights era.

“It’s like the boogeyman’s come back out of the closet and those things that used to be are now being brought to the forefront once again, and that’s what really scares me,” Cash said.

She added: “Each person can do something, if not publicly, within your community. Your perception can change, how you view people, just, I don’t know,” as her voice trailed off.

A lanky 14-year-old stood basking in the events of McKeesport's International Village, a lively food and music festival, when a gentleman approached with a business card.

Runways and magazine covers, he believed, were in store for this striking ninth-grader. The cameras soon found Swin Cash. Spindly legs and all, she transformed into a noted regional print model. Next was a spot in New York City's Fashion Week. Was she destined to become America's next top model? Not quite. Not with mom monitoring matters.

Cynthia Cash, who was a teenager when she gave birth to Swin, declared it was time to swap the high heels for high tops. The catwalk could wait for her photogenic daughter. "A lot of people don't know that story, other than my family," Swin Cash says, reflecting on the events of 22 years ago. "It all happened so fast. Here I am, this skinny kid, and they say, 'We have to shave your legs, fix your makeup ...' I'm like, 'What? I'm 14.' It was getting serious. My mom said, 'It's time we focus on the sports side of things.'"

That prescient decision launched a basketball career entering its last months — in New York City, of all places. Cash, 36, is in her 15th and final WNBA season with the New York Liberty. On June 7, she announced her retirement, effective at season's end. She will leave the game ranked among the top 15 in WNBA history in scoring, rebounding, assists and games played. No longer physically able to dominate as she did while winning two NCAA titles with the University of Connecticut, three WNBA championships and two Olympic gold medals, Cash has this season relied on her self-described "McKeesport mentality" as a key reserve for the Liberty, her fifth WNBA team.

"Her pride pushes her to keep playing this game," Liberty coach Bill Laimbeer says. "She has a great desire to compete at the highest level at all times." This explains why she'll selflessly dive into a scorer's table for a loose ball, as she did in a game against Connecticut, or chase down a player 10 years her junior to block a shot, as she did in Phoenix.

"To watch her inspires me," says teammate Tanisha Wright, a West Mifflin High School graduate. "[She] pretty much inspires everyone around her." Oh yes, that inspiration. The morning of April 22 underscores the point. It was 9:30 a.m. and Cash had just rung the opening bell at the New York Stock Exchange with her Liberty teammates. By 9:40 a.m., she was gone, racing to LaGuardia Airport, bound for McKeesport. "Had to see my kids back home," says Cash.

Those "kids" she refers to are participants in the Cash for Kids program, which Cash founded 11 years ago to educate and empower children with a focus on fitness. Upwards of 2,000 youngsters from McKeesport have benefited. On this day, the basketball playoffs are in full swing for the 9- and 10-year-old group. Cash watches intently. She cheers for — and challenges — the young players.

She hangs on every shot, pass and turnover. This is where Cash says she is most at ease. It means more to her than the TV work she does with the New York Knicks, CBS Sports Network and Turner Television. It trumps her April selection as one of Sports Illustrated's "50 Most Fashionable Athletes."

And it far surpasses her two WNBA All-Star game MVP awards. A hug. A high-five. A massive smile. That's all "Ms. Swin" needs from her kids. "I made a promise that I would come and see them play, and it's important to stay true to those promises," Cash says. "To get a chance to put my arms around them, to talk to them, to listen to them and to encourage them, means everything to me.

It was cool ringing the bell at the stock exchange, but the highlight of my day was being there with those kids in McKeesport.” Back in New York, Cash is basking in her final run through the WNBA. She also is preparing for future success. A full-time TV job is a possibility, she says. Ditto for an executive position with a WNBA team. Motherhood remains a goal, too, for this recently married trendsetter. “I’m truly humbled by my experiences,” Cash says. “Every day, I think about the people who believed in me, invested in me. They gave so much to me. It’s a great lesson. And it’s one I want to share with as many people as I can.

## **No one can stop Tina Charles, who just keeps getting better for Liberty**

What do you do when you're a two-time NCAA champion, an Olympic gold medalist and the WNBA MVP by age 23? You keep working to get better.

It sounds simplistic. Even kind of drab and boring, right? Except it's the formula for greatness, and there aren't any easy roads to get there. Nothing replaces the time in the gym, the commitment to fitness, the unforgiving demands of goal setting.

So in the case of New York post player Tina Charles, who is in the midst of making a compelling run for another MVP award, we already know the general answer as to why she's one of the most consistently productive players in the league. She works very hard at it.

However, there are specifics as to why Charles has been able to ratchet her own high bar up a little higher.

She has improved her perimeter shooting. She has fully committed to being a premier defender. She is embracing areas of team leadership that were initially less compatible with her somewhat strong, silent-type personality.

At age 27 and in her seventh season in the WNBA, Charles is in full bloom as a professional superstar. And it's exactly what the Liberty need from her.

"Consistency and stability go hand in hand, and she brings that," Liberty coach Bill Laimbeer said of Charles. "You know every night what you're going to get, and you can plan your team around her accordingly. There is much more to her now, though. Her defense last year was the best it's ever been, and this year, it's even better.

"She can easily be overlooked, because you just expect it from her. Overall, it's a consistent body of work. I don't think she gets nearly the amount of credit for what she does for our basketball team. She's not flashy, she's not emotional, she doesn't draw attention to herself."

That's been true of Charles going back to her days as a star at UConn, where she won NCAA titles as a junior and senior before becoming the WNBA's top draft pick in 2010.

This season, Charles has been the Eastern Conference Player of the Week five times (which ties the WNBA's single-season record) and her numbers speak loudly: She's averaging a league-best 22.8 points -- four points better than her best average in her six completed seasons -- and 9.8 rebounds. Her career numbers are 17.7 PPG and 10.1 RPG.

For Charles, the key word always has been accountability, a trait inspired by her parents. She is the first to critique her own performances and find them lacking. She is motivated by a strong sense of "owing it" to her team to do more -- even when she's already doing plenty. There's a lot going on in her mind even when she's not showing any of it on her face.

"Every time you step on the court, you're playing for your teammates' and your coaches' respect," Charles said. "I'm playing for them and their trust, for them to be able to depend on me night in and night out.

"I know I've been blessed with great talents, and I'm always playing for a reason. I know a high percentage of what I do on the court can make it easier for my teammates. I put that weight on my shoulders, and I welcome it."

Now, you might be saying, "OK, but what's new? Charles has been a standout since she came into the league." Yes, that's true. But let's look at some more specific highlights we're seeing in 2016.

Charles has made 9-of-25 3-pointers this season; she attempted just 17 treys in her previous six seasons combined. She's shooting 78.3 percent from the free throw line (65-of-83), the second-best percentage of her WNBA career, behind just the 80.2 she shot from the line in her MVP season of 2012. And she's averaging a career-best 4.1 assists; her previous best was 2.4 last season.

Laimbeer has helped by trying to keep Charles in the power forward spot that is the best fit for her, rather than having her at center, where he can use Kiah Stokes, Carolyn Swords and Amanda Zahui B.

But Charles can take on whatever assignment she has to for the Liberty, who at 13-6 have the WNBA's third-best record behind Los Angeles and Minnesota.

"She'll guard anybody now," Laimbeer said. "If she has to go out on a small forward? No problem. We try to keep her away from the super-bigs, but she has no problem doing it.

"Our league's getting bigger all the time, and we don't necessarily need her sumo-wrestling with some of those players. That just drains her strength from what her necessity is for us: scoring and rebounding. And in this year, you've also seen her passing skills more."

Laimbeer said that Charles particularly recognized during the 2015 playoffs how much teams were gearing their defenses toward stopping her.

"Now, she passes out of the double-teams much quicker -- and smarter -- than she has before," he said. "Every year her game is evolving, adding a piece."

That's something her fellow competitors have noticed.

"She has added different elements to her game," Indiana's Tamika Catchings said. "It's hard to be an MVP, make the All-Star Game, get these accolades. But the even harder part is, how do you stay at that level? Or improve? You have to work on your game and get better. You look at someone like Tina, and it's a prime example of someone who has continued to get better and better."

Charles will be on her second U.S. Olympic team in August. After that, she might have Liberty teammate Epiphanny Prince -- who has been out with a knee injury suffered in November 2015 -- back on the court. New York guard Sugar Rodgers (16.1 PPG) has taken a big step up in Prince's absence, but having both of those perimeter sharpshooters would boost the Liberty.

Regardless of who is around her, though, Charles isn't just ready to shoulder that heavy load -- she's flat-out eager to do it.

"I have learned to trust my teammates around me, too," Charles said. "I have no problem knowing if I don't make it easier on them -- by the way I play, by how hard I sprint down the floor even when I'm tired -- I'm not doing my job. My mindset has just become even more like that as I've gotten older in the game."

## **New York Liberty honor their inaugural 1997 team**

Teresa Weatherspoon, Rebecca Lobo and the rest of the inaugural New York Liberty team were back in Madison Square Garden again.

The 1997 team was honored before the Liberty played the Phoenix Mercury on Sunday. The players were introduced using their original video introductions, much to the delight of the crowd that included the first WNBA President Val Ackerman. The Liberty fans gave a long ovation to former players.

"That was the best when we were stepping out of Times Square billboards," said Lobo, who watched the game behind the Liberty bench with her family.

"When I came into the Garden today there were a bunch of season ticket holders who were here when I played and they are still die-hard fans. Whenever I come here it feels like home."

The pregame festivities capped off a weekend long reunion for the squad.

On Saturday night, the current squad had a dinner with the 1997 team. Weatherspoon served as the MC of the dinner. The former Liberty star, who was honored earlier this week as one of the WNBA's Top 20 players, has served as a bridge between the franchise's start to its current team.

She hit the biggest shot in the Liberty's history when her half-courter sent the 1999 WNBA Finals to a decisive third game. She's now the team's director of player development.

Weatherspoon introduced everyone in the room at the dinner doing spot-on impressions of each member of both teams that drew laughter from the assembled group.

"That was such a great night," Weatherspoon said. "When you talk about getting back together with the young ladies you had the opportunity to play with that's something really special. We came together as a family again."

New York is the lone inaugural team still playing that has not won a WNBA championship. They made it to the finals four times in the league's first six seasons. They haven't been back since, losing in the Eastern Conference finals last season.

Weatherspoon expects that to change soon.

"Once you get a taste of it you're so hungry for it," Weatherspoon said. "Unfortunately we didn't get over the hump. This group has such an amazing opportunity to get it done for this franchise and for all of us that didn't get over that hump."

"There's a responsibility on their shoulders and they carry it well. We definitely see this team having an opportunity and they work hard every single day knowing that they can take advantage of the opportunity."

**Passing the test of time**  
**WNBA celebrates 20 years of hoops**

The first postgame locker room in WNBA history looked like something out of a M\*A\*S\*H episode, exhausted bodies dropping wherever they could. Such was the price of an emotional (participating in the historic debut of a brand new basketball league) and physical (actually playing in the 60-minute game) toll. Players from the New York Liberty and Los Angeles Sparks were worn out.

"Right now, I'm emotionally spent," Liberty center Rebecca Lobo told me that California day in June 1997. "We had so much emotion running through us for this game. We were wound tight and wanted to explode."

They had arrived amid so much fanfare, walking into the famed L.A. Forum through a carnival in the parking lot (complete with a giant Ferris wheel), taking the arena floor to the tune of the Rolling Stones' "Start Me Up," tipping off in front of a regular Hollywood celebrity row, taking the airwaves in front of a record television audience.

I covered that game for another newspaper, and looking back now, it's impossible not to remember the jumbling mix of anticipation, excitement, skepticism and curiosity. But if observers felt all of that, imagine what it was like for the players. More than anything that would happen on that single day, the women putting on the inaugural WNBA uniforms knew they carried the weight of women's team sports with them, knew they were the faces of the latest attempt in a long string of failed attempts to build a sustainable women's league on U.S. soil. It felt every bit like a final shot, years in the planning, months in the making, and, they all hoped, perfect in the timing.

No surprise that when the first game finally finished, they were done.

And yet, they were only beginning.

Twenty years later, they're still here. Bigger and better than ever, the WNBA is using the entire 2016 season to celebrate its roots, to remember a time when no one was sure the league would last, when no one knew if a woman could dunk, when no one could guarantee the fans would show up, when all of that seemed possible — but none of it guaranteed.

"Like anybody, I say, 'Wow.' Just 'Wow,' Ĩ" Teresa Weatherspoon said inside the Liberty's training facility, her storied point guard career as one of the franchise's founding players giving way to a new job in their player development office. "Not in disbelief, because we knew given the opportunity that we could do some great things. Was it a huge responsibility? Yes, a huge responsibility on our shoulders.

"But the majority of us had already been playing overseas and we were already considered professionals. We knew how to handle ourselves and we knew the importance of this league in America. It was an incredible time for us, a 'wow' moment to say 20 years, and really 'wow' because we were told we wouldn't make five. We knew better. We're still here."

So many threads had to be weaved together to make it happen, and the master craftsman was Val Ackerman, the league's first president. Now the commissioner of the Big East, Ackerman was handpicked by former NBA commissioner David Stern, and no doubt the backing of the NBA was one of the key components for the league's success. But there was so much more. The bold decision to play games in the summer, when sports competition

was lean and television slots were available. The wise decision to launch in the wake of the 1996 Atlanta Olympics, dubbed the women's Olympics for the U.S. golds in soccer, softball and basketball. The smart decision to distribute talent via assignment by the league office, a super draft and then a college draft.

"There were naysayers around every corner when we launched, many, many skeptics," Ackerman said. "We were doing something bold. Women's pro basketball was a graveyard back then. We did our research and calculated 15 or 16 prior attempts, all failed.

"Twenty years. I would say that anybody associated with the league in those early days and pre-early days, should feel really good."

Not just about what they did, but what they built for the long term. Players like Weatherspoon, like Lobo, like Sheryl Swoopes and Lisa Leslie, their legacy lives in the generations that followed them, the young girls who once watched them on television and dreamed of tracing their path.

"It gave me an opportunity, something more to look forward to if I stayed dedicated to my sport," Liberty forward Tina Charles said. "They had a lot of pressure on their shoulders, what they did, as far as people wondering, 'Can it last?' They were the first ones to do it and what they were able to do allowed me to have a dream."

So many of the WNBA's current stars remember exactly where they were when Leslie dunked for the first time in a women's pro game, racing out front of a fast break and slamming the league's signature orange-and-oatmeal ball through the rim, doing as much to change the conversation of skepticism as any one play could. If that first game lacked something in polish and execution thanks to a combination of nerves and unfamiliarity, the years since have seen the level of play grow, change and improve. Players are bigger, faster and stronger, coaching is better, and talent is deeper.

Yet as sports leagues go, the WNBA is still in its infancy.

"I think women's sports has come of age to a point and our league is a perfect example of that," said Liberty coach and former NBA star Bill Laimbeer. "It's been around for 20 years, it continues to grow, the popularity of women's basketball has grown tremendously since the inception of the league because now the college kids have something to point for. TV has picked up on a lot of college basketball and our basketball also and it just fuels the fire for the young kids, the 11-, 12-year-olds. They have a goal, to one day play professional basketball, as a livelihood, and to do it here in the United States."

Thanks to something that debuted 20 years ago, yes they do.

## **In My Library: Carolyn Swords**

Being tall isn't enough: If you want to play good basketball, you've got to be coordinated and fast. Carolyn Swords learned that in seventh grade, when she was cut from her middle-school team. So hard did she focus that she earned a full scholarship to Boston College. Later, she tore her MCL and missed two seasons when she played in Chicago, but she fought through it to become the starting center for the New York Liberty, whose first playoff game is Saturday at Madison Square Garden. At 6-foot-6, she still finds it hard to dress well: "I think it's gotten easier in the last 10 years, but it's definitely a challenge!"

Here's what's in her library:

*The Boys in the Boat* by Daniel James Brown

This is the true story of the US men's rowing team that won the gold medal at the 1936 Summer Olympics in Berlin. My sister's a rower and my aunt rowed in college, so I was familiar with the sport, and Brown does a nice job of explaining it and how the team came together. I like historical novels, and it was interesting reading about the history of the time and what was going on in Berlin then.

*The No. 1 Ladies Detective Agency* by Alexander McCall Smith

My mom found this series for me at Costco a couple of years ago, and I've read five books. They're all set in Botswana, Africa — a part of the world I've never seen but enjoy learning about. There's humor here, but it's also very suspenseful.

*Inferno* by Dan Brown

I like Dan Brown's whole Robert Langdon series about a Harvard professor of religious symbolism who gets into grand adventures around the world. This starts in Italy, and I'd just been to Florence, where much of the book takes place. Spoiler alert: It goes to Istanbul, where I lived for a time when I played for Turkey. He describes the "Blue Mosque" and old aqueduct perfectly!

*Pride and Prejudice* by Jane Austen

Who doesn't love "Pride and Prejudice"? I think I saw the Keira Knightley movie first and read the book when I was in Turkey, a great place to read a dramatic novel. I love how Lizzy Bennet and Mr. Darcy were able to work through their mistakes and grow together.
