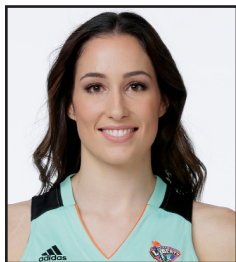

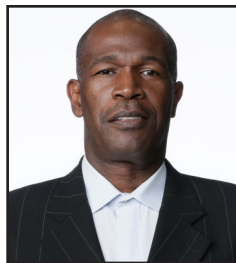

Katie Smith enters her fourth season as a member of the New York Liberty coaching staff, having been promoted to associate head coach for the 2016 season, after serving two years as an assistant coach. Since Smith joined the coaching staff, the Liberty has posted an overall record of 59-43 (.578), posting back-to-back 20-win seasons and WNBA Playoffs berths in 2015 and 2016.

Smith spent the 2013 season – her final in the WNBA – with the Liberty, reuniting with Bill Laimbeer who she won two titles with as a member of the Detroit Shock (now Dallas). She retired after the 2013 campaign, finishing her 17-year playing career as the all-time leading scorer in women's professional basketball and second in WNBA history, scoring 7,885-career points as a professional and 6,452 in the WNBA.

A 15-year veteran of the WNBA, Smith was a seven-time All-Star and two-time First Team All-WNBA selection. She won WNBA Championships in 2006 and 2008 with the Shock, and in 2011 was voted one of the Top 15 Players in WNBA history. She ranks first in the WNBA in both three-point field goals made (906) and attempted (2,466), second in career points (6,452), fourth in free throws made (1,440) and 10th in all-time assists (1,258).

Smith is the all-time leading scorer in the history of U.S. women's professional basketball (ABL & WNBA) with 7,885 career points. Smith signed with the WNBA in 1999, joining Minnesota after a two-year stint in the ABL. In 2006, she became the only player to win a championship with both the ABL and WNBA, which was the same year she became the first player to win a WNBA All-Star game as a member of both the Eastern and Western Conference teams. During the WNBA's 20th season in 2016, Smith was voted as one of the top-20 best and most influential players in league history.

Her success also extended to the international level, having won three Olympic Gold Medals in 2000, 2004 and 2008, and the World Championships in 1998 and 2002.

Smith spent several seasons on the women's basketball staff at her alma mater Ohio State University. As a student-athlete for the Buckeyes, Smith helped guide her team to the NCAA championship game as a freshman, and went on to break the Big Ten scoring record for points scored in a career in men's or women's basketball. On Jan. 21, 2001, Ohio State honored her as the first female Buckeye athlete to have her number retired.

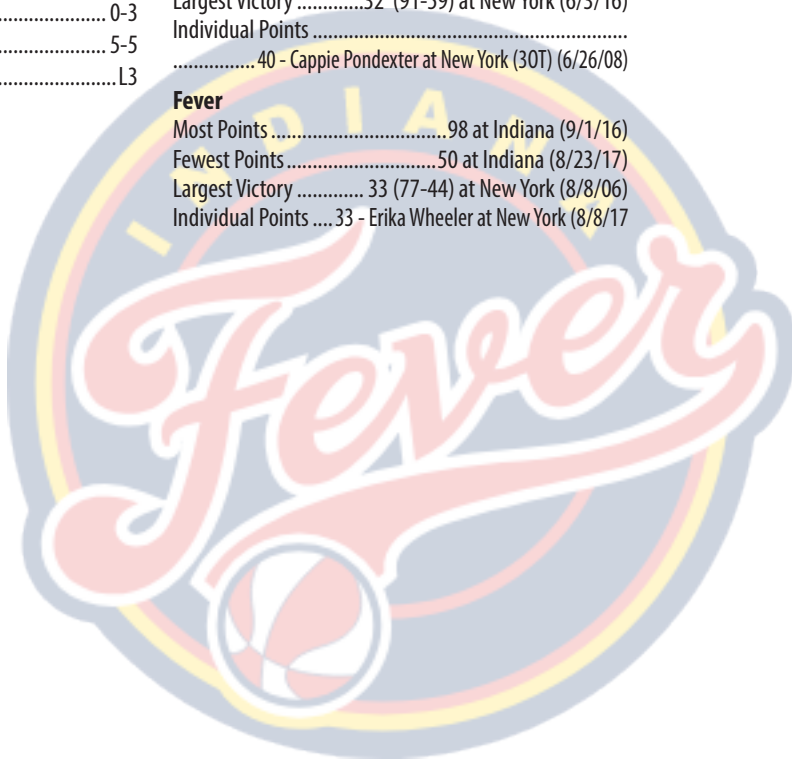

LIBERTY 2018 SEASON HEADLINES

- New York finished with the best record in the WNBA Eastern Conference for the 3rd-straight season, going 22-12 overall, earning the No. 3 seed in the WNBA Playoffs.
- The Liberty posted three consecutive seasons with at least 20 victories.
- New York lost to Washington in the 2nd Round of the WNBA Playoffs, falling in a single-elimination game at The Garden 82-68.
- Tina Charles finished the season ranked 3rd in the WNBA in scoring, 4th in rebounding, and 6th in minutes (32.2 mpg). She was named 1st Team All-WNBA for a 3rd-straight season and named 1st Team WNBA All-Defensive for the 1st time in her career. Charles was named 1st Team All-WNBA for a 2nd-straight season, becoming the 1st Liberty player to earn the accolade in back-to-back seasons.
- Katie Smith became the 7th head coach in franchise history this year. Smith retired following the 2013 season in New York, and spent the last four years as an assistant coach with the Liberty, having been promoted to Associate Head Coach prior to the 2016 season.

Following a very close battle against the reigning champion Minnesota Lynx, the New York Liberty returned to action on Tuesday night and faced the Dallas Wings. Despite behind down 17 points in the first half and dealing with various struggles, the Liberty fought and crawled their way back into the game before pulling off a 94-89 victory over the Wings. Below are my three takeaways from the game.

1. A successful second quarter push

Even though the Liberty faced a 17 point deficit after the first quarter, their comeback was sparked by a strong performance in the second quarter. Shavonte Zellous and Tina Charles began having success in one on one situations and it resulted in the Liberty cutting a 17 point deficit to eight. On defense, the Wings' hot three point shooting and constant drives to the basket were neutralized as the Liberty successfully switched and recovered on time.

2. Containing the duo of Diggins-Smith and Cambage

After last Friday's defensive performance against the Lynx's trio of Maya Moore, Seimone Augustus, and Sylvia Fowles in which they scored 56 combined points, the Liberty had to quickly move on and prepare for Skylar Diggins-Smith and Liz Cambage. Dallas's two best offensive options are respectively averaging 18 and 16 points per game. On Tuesday, the Liberty were able to hold Diggins-Smith to 6/15 shooting from the field but struggled with Cambage as the Australian posted 28 points and 16 rebounds.

3. Tina Charles has a MVP type of performance

While some will say it's too early in the season to discuss who's MVP, a player such as Tina Charles can make it a great time to have the

conversation. The former MVP winner and multi-time All Star produced a signature performance against the Wings with 31 points, 10 rebounds, and three assists. As the Liberty kept fighting their way back into the game, Charles found new ways to counter the 6-foot-8 Cambage and whoever else was defending her. It didn't matter if it was a fadeaway, three pointer, or free throw shooting. Charles rose to the occasion and led the Liberty to victory.

QUOTES-NEW YORK VS. DALLAS (5/29)

Charles on Katie Smith's first win as a head coach...

"Everyone is very happy for Coach Katie, she's a Hall of Fame player and I know that's the same thing she is striving to be as a coach and as a person. She is that as a person. We are all locked in and going to do whatever she feels we need to do to win games."

Charles on the win...

"What was more important than getting the first win of the season was that we came back because this is something that we are always going to remember. When we are down 15 or 16 points, hopefully we are not in that situation again, but anyone can get hot."

Charles on her 4th quarter mentality...

"My mentality was not necessarily to take charge but I wanted to be aggressive. I was very passive and 'Spoon' and Sugar Rogers were telling me that. They are very transparent and they know I want to be great. Once I am playing at a certain level it makes the game easier for my teammates."

Charles on Dallas...

"In the 1st quarter they were fitting shots. I believe Diggins-Smith was 4 for 5 from three, Thornton hit a three and Azura Stevens came down and hit a three. They are making threes and we were coming down trying to make twos. It's really hard to come back that way. We just locked down on our defense. When Cambage started dominating, as she should being 6'8, 6'9, but just our defense, staying together and staying resilient really helped."

Zellous on her mindset with the shot clock winding down...

"We just needed a possession. We talk about it every day in practice. As long as we get a possession, whether it's a good shot, bad shot, we just don't want to have a turnover. Clock going down, you just have to make something happen and that's what I did."

Zellous on how the Liberty's game was different in the second half...

"We just knew the first half wasn't us. We watched the Chicago and Minnesota game, each game we wanted to grow and get better. We knew the first half was not how we were getting better, we knew we needed to clamp down on defense. Dallas is a very good, physical team and we knew we had to stop Skylar and Liz. We did a good job of doing that. Everyone helped each other and down the stretch, everyone hit a big shot."

Kiah Stokes on Coach Smith's practices...

"They are good, they are intense. [Smith] definitely doesn't mess around. If we have too many turnovers, we are on the line. If we aren't talking enough, we are on the line. She just makes us play really hard and be accountable for everything that we do."

Stokes on the win...

"I think it's great that we got this win. Obviously, we want to try and win all of our home games. So, we didn't want to let this one slip away, like we did against Minnesota. It is still early in the season, it's just hard seeing that zero in the win column. So, getting that first one I think will just help us keep it rolling."

CHARLES NETS 34; ZELLOUS DRILLS LATE THREE TO SEAL COME-FROM-BEHIND VICTORY OVER DALLAS 94-89

Head coach Katie Smith earns first win of her career

WHITE PLAINS, NY— May 29, 2018 — The New York Liberty played from behind for a large majority of the night against the visiting Dallas Wings. However, the Liberty used a 17-5 spurt to turn the tide midway through the fourth quarter and ultimately seal the come-from-behind victory for not only their first win of the season, but first victory under the direction of first-year head coach Katie Smith.

Tina Charles was the Liberty's (1-2) frontrunner with a game-high 34 points but it was a 25-foot three-point heave from Shavonte Zellous with 34 ticks left that moved New York in front of Dallas (2-3) for good.

Zellous began. "We just needed a possession. We talk about it every day in practice. As long as we get a possession, whether it's a good shot, bad shot, we just don't want to have a turnover. Clock going down, you just have to make something happen and that's what I did."

Zellous' triple broke the game's third and final tie in the fourth quarter. The Liberty overcame its largest deficit of the year, trailing by as many as 17 points, evident at the 3:59 of the first quarter.

Smith explained. "We didn't press up and knew they could shoot, we allowed them to look over us and take uncontested shots. Just a little bit of effort making them do something different, like putting the ball on the floor. We finally had that sense of urgency and put some pressure on them and dictated the game to make them uncomfortable. They really responded after that first quarter, challenging each other and flying around.

NEW YORK UNABLE TO HOLD ON; LYNX HIT TOUGH SHOT TO TAKE GAME 78-72

WHITE PLAINS, NY— May 25, 2018 — The New York Liberty competed in a back-and forth affair with reigning WNBA Champion Minnesota Lynx until a three-point heave from the release of Maya Moore ultimately put the game in the Lynx's favor, 78-72. Tina Charles and Kia Nurse concluded the Liberty's (0-2) home opener in double-figures for a consecutive time while Charles also credited a double-double.

After playing to five ties and through 14 lead changes, Moore nailed a 25-foot dagger for Minnesota (2-1), with 19.5 seconds left to play, to credit the game's 15th and final lead swap of the night.

"I'm never surprised when Maya let's it go," Charles began. "There are more chances of her making it than missing it, especially with the game on the line. That's her time. Again, it was great defense, there are other things that led to that opportunity that we shouldn't have even let them have that opportunity or think it was a game for them."

Charles finished with 18 points on 50-percent shooting to lead the Liberty while also coming down with a team-high 12 boards. She played a second team-leading 30 minutes tonight. Moore ended with 20 points while also hitting three attempts from downtown, including the one to turn the tide for good.

Nurse also knocked down a clutch triple from Shavonte Zellous to reward New York a four-point lead at the 1:39 mark of the fourth-quarter. The reserve was a 50-percent three-point shooter on the night and registered 14 points-nine of which were earned from distance.

"Personally, I see myself doing whatever role the team needs me to do," Nurse stated. "When I came here and got drafted I had the opportunity to play anywhere. This was a great fit for me and a place I really wanted to be with the great vets that I get to learn from and great coaching staff as well. So, if my role is to come off the bench and play some defense than I am all for it."

Zellous ended with nine points at the team's new home after not being able to connect last Sunday.

"We're excited that the fans came out to support us for the home opener," Zellous added. "We just hope they continue to support us throughout the season."

New York invites Dallas to the Westchester County Center, Tuesday, May 29 for a 7:00 p.m. (ET) tip-off.

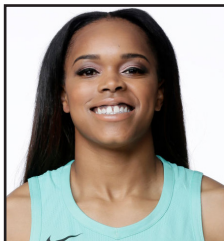

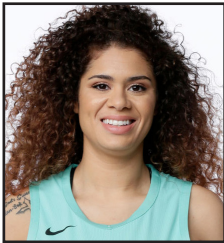

Kia Nurse, Liberty rookie, can make immediate impact on defense

The Connecticut alumna will make her home debut Friday against the visiting Minnesota Lynx in Westchester.

In the one-game, second-round WNBA playoffs last year, Mystics guard Kristi Toliver dropped a game-high 32 points with a single-game record nine threes as Washington came back from behind to hand the New York Liberty their second-straight one-and-done in the postseason.

New head coach Katie Smith has emphasized defense with the Liberty this year and rookie guard Kia Nurse out of Connecticut is the one who's expected to bring that lockdown defense to the team in 2018.

"She knows how to play basketball," Smith said of the 10th overall pick Nurse from this year's WNBA Draft. "So, at the end of the day, she's just always going to give 100 percent and that's something you can really hang your hat on."

"My defense is still pretty solid. I'll take that," Nurse said. "But it's definitely a system that I think works well toward my strengths. I'm trying to do all those extra little things and then everything else just falls into place."

Nurse enters her rookie season with a lot of experience already behind her. She played for the storied UConn women's basketball program, where she was named the 2018 WBCA Defensive Player of the Year. She averaged 13.8 points, 3.5 rebounds and 2.8 assists along with total 44 steals during the 2017-18 season.

During the 2016 Summer Olympics, she averaged 11 points, including dropping 25 points against Serbia. The Olympic experience, along with her time at UConn, helped prepare her for the pros.

"I think it's helped in the confidence section of my life," Nurse said. "When you get to play in tournaments like the Olympics and play with older players from different teams I think it allows you to kind of come in here and understand, 'Hey, I've done this before. Have a confidence in yourself to put yourself out there, make mistakes and come out on top.'"

Nurse debuted in Sunday's 80-76 season-opening loss to the Chicago Sky, scoring 17 points in 29 minutes off the bench. She'll make her home debut for the Liberty on Friday against the Minnesota Lynx at the Westchester County Center in White Plains.

Coaching Change to Smith Could Benefit Liberty This Season

What if the Oklahoma City Thunder hadn't traded Victor Oladipo to the Indiana Pacers? Would we be talking about a player who is a finalist for the NBA's Most Improved Player award?

The same dynamics can occur for an entire franchise. Sometimes change is good.

The New York Liberty achieved some great success under former coach Bill Laimbeer. He posted a 91-78 record from 2013-17, including the best record in the Eastern Conference the last three seasons.

But the team lost in the second round of the playoffs the last two seasons. As last season came down the stretch, it wasn't uncommon to hear players talk about the challenges playing for a coach such as Laimbeer, who is caustic and as subtle as a heavy metal guitar riff.

Laimbeer bolted the Liberty after the season to take the head coaching position with the now Las Vegas Aces.

Enter Katie Smith, one of Laimbeer's assistants and one of the greatest players in WNBA history.

When the Liberty tip off their season Sunday at the Chicago Sky, Smith will make her head coaching debut. Despite playing for Laimbeer and learning the fine points of coaching from the former Detroit Pistons' Bad Boy, Smith will bring a more even-keeled persona to the first chair.

"I always thought of myself as someone who leads by example and not a great talker," Smith said with a laugh. "I believe showing up every day and being consistent. There's no better way to prepare than doing the work every day in practice."

Smith has several advantages going into her rookie coaching season:

1. In Tina Charles, the Queens' Bee, the Liberty has one of the elite players in the league. Charles made a conscious decision last season to become more of a leader and she was the leading voice in the locker room.
2. Smith has a veteran staff led by Herb Williams, Barbara Farris and Teresa Weatherspoon, the point guard whisperer. Last season, Weatherspoon helped Manhattan's Epiphanny Prince return to elite form after suffering a torn ACL in 2015. She'll work with Brittany Boyd, who tore her Achilles tendon in the second game of last season.
3. There is no shortage of experience on this team. Six of the top players have at least five seasons of WNBA experience. Smith doesn't have to spoon feed this group.

"I'm going to be anxious Sunday night, no question," Smith acknowledged. "I hope I keep all the plays in my head because my job is to put the players in the best position to succeed. But I have a great staff, I have one of the great leaders in the league in Tina Charles and we all have the same purpose."

"Hopefully once the ball goes up I'm not thinking as much as reacting to what I see. You rely on your intuition, just as you did as a player. You watch the game and make your decisions."

Smith was known as a relentless, tenacious player. She was inducted into the Naismith Basketball Hall of Fame at this year's Final Four. She was a seven-time WNBA All-Star, a two-time WNBA champion and a three-time Olympic gold medalist.

But the way she played, a drill sergeant with a basketball, will be how she expects the Liberty to compete this season.

"You talk about Katie and that fierce competitor that she is, I think we're going to mirror that," said first-year Liberty player Marissa Coleman, a WNBA veteran who gives the team another frontcourt option. "That's the one thing we're going to do."

"We have a ton of talent on this team but if we compete night in and night out we'll have a very successful season."

The question that Liberty fans want to know is this: What constitutes a successful season? The Liberty went 22-12 last season. Most franchises would take that in a heart

beat. Not the Liberty.

The franchise is yearning for its first-ever WNBA title. Laimbeer got them to the playoffs only to have the season end with home playoff losses.

"We always want to win a championship every year," said guard Bria Hartley of Long Island.

"The last couple of years didn't end the way we wanted it to so we want to make sure this season ends really well."

Learn from the Leader: Katie Smith Talks About Becoming Liberty Head Coach

There are two full courts at the New York Liberty's practice facility in Tarrytown, NY. Katie Smith, the Liberty's new head coach, stands between them on the sideline, watching her squad go through a 5-on-5-on-5 drill. The Liberty's roster has been split into two teams and a group of college-level men's players make up the other five. They go back-and-forth in a fast paced drill, trying to score three points. Get a bucket, stay and sprint to the other side to try and get another. The losers of the drill have to run baseline-to-baseline.

A few moments later Smith stands on the court with a big smile on her face and lines up the losers. She blows her whistle and darts out of the way of an incoming sprinter, looking over at her assistant coaches and laughing.

Then she kicks everyone off the court and goes through a shell drill, walking the Liberty through one of their offensive sets. Fourth-year forward Rebecca Allen raises her hand and asks Smith to detail the play again.

"[Smith is] teaching it," Liberty assistant coach Teresa Weatherspoon says. "There's a difference in coaching and teaching. There's a huge difference. It's about stopping and talking about the small details so the kids can understand the proper angle to set screens, the proper way to have your feet, the movement, the timing. She's teaching that."

Smith, 43, has already locked up a spot in the Naismith Hall of Fame because of what she did as a player—two-time WNBA champion, 2008 Finals MVP, three-time Olympic Gold Medalist, seven-time All-Star. Now she's just a few days away from her first season as a head coach.

"Being a player is way easier than a coach," Smith says. "The time, it just never ends. Honestly, most of my career, I didn't want to coach. I literally said it, all the way up until four years left. And then Bill [Laimbeer] was like, 'Hey, you want to coach?' And I didn't have anything lined up."

Smith played her last pro season with the Liberty in 2013 and then transitioned right to the bench. It was only a matter of time before she was given the reins in New York.

"I wouldn't say I expected it but I had a good feeling that it was going to be somebody that we were familiar with," Liberty guard Brittany Boyd says with a grin. "Katie's been here since I came in. I was excited, you know, to get to play for Katie. It's a good experience to have a new head coach for the first time."

Smith says that she's been calling around to her former coaches learn as much as possible in an effort to put Boyd and the rest of her players in the best position to win.

She says that Brian Agler and Cheryl Reeve have been key during the offseason to helping her in all aspects of coaching, from writing practice plans to effectively teaching technique.

"What's also been special about the game is not just the playing. It truly is the relationships," she says, standing underneath one of the baskets at the practice facility. Two of her former teammates, Shavonte Zellous and Marissa Coleman, are to her left. Weatherspoon, dribbling around the gym, has played against her and coached with her for well over 20 years. The recently retired Swin Cash was intensely watching today's practice. She played on Team USA and two WNBA teams with Smith.

Boyd says Smith, with all of her knowledge and years of playing, is already a good coach. "She explains things, she's breaking stuff down. But she's also holding us all accountable for our mistakes. It doesn't matter who you are. If you make a mistake, she's going to put you on the line and run. I think we're learning from that," the fourth-year guard says.

But Smith is also known for constantly joking around. Practices are always light, with lots of laughs. Smith and Weatherspoon have spent the last few seasons working with the Liberty's guards and forwards before games start. Those pregame warmup sessions regularly feature trash talk, smirking and mock games of one-on-one.

"If they see that with us, it trickles to them," Weatherspoon says. "We walk in, it's about having fun, they're going to have fun. It's important."

"I think that breeds an environment of excitement," Smith says. "Because it is work, but we're also playing a game. You just don't want them to get so worried. You want to go out there and play a little bit."

The Liberty are gearing up for a big season. They've been the three seed in the playoffs for the past two years and they've been bounced out early in each of those post-season runs. One-time WNBA MVP Tina Charles is still in her prime and Smith has veterans like Zellous, Coleman, Epiphanny Prince, Kia Vaughn and Sugar Rodgers to help Boyd, Bria Hartley, Kiah Stokes and the rest of NY's young players.

"You go home and start thinking about it at night," Smith says. "Maybe I should pull up some new plays. Like, how can I help them? Your brain is just never off."

Smith, with the weight of the franchise on her shoulders, walks to the far baseline after a moment, right past Weatherspoon, who's forever dribbling.

New York Liberty unconcerned with playoff woes entering 2018 season

Last year, the New York Liberty won over 20 games, finished first in the Eastern Conference and made the playoffs for the third straight season. But, even after winning 10 straight games to end the regular season, they went one-and-done in the playoffs, again, this time losing 82-68 to the Washington Mystics.

Now, with a new head coach and a new primary home arena, the Liberty are looking toward an Eastern Conference title and their first WNBA Finals appearance since 2002.

"I don't think we talk about [the playoffs] because we're trying to build up every day in creating an environment where it's competitive," said Katie Smith, the Liberty's first-year head coach. A two-time WNBA champion and 2018 Hall of Fame inductee, she was the team's associate head coach under Bill Laimbeer for the last four years.

"Hopefully practice becomes harder than games, and we're demanding more of them, and they're going after each other and competing so that we can execute."

The Liberty return a solid core from last year, led by top-scorer Tina Charles and supported by reigning Sixth Woman of the Year Sugar Rodgers and two-time All-Star Epiphanny Prince. The veteran center Charles, a Queens native, averaged 19.7 points (third in the WNBA) while also averaging 9.4 rebounds (fourth) in 2017. She was named first team All-WNBA and first-team All-Defense last year as well for the fifth and second time in her career, respectively.

Joining Charles in Smith's defensive-minded Liberty is guard Kia Nurse, the team's first-round pick out of Connecticut and the 2017-18 WBCA Defensive Player of the Year. Along with her lockdown defense, Nurse has solid range from the perimeter. She averaged 13.5 points as a senior at UConn while shooting 44 percent from beyond the arc. She led the Liberty in scoring (14.5 ppg) in their two preseason games last week.

"There's a lot of learning going on, a lot of different transitions," Nurse said after practice Wednesday. "I think for me, personally, I want to just succeed in whatever role the team needs me to do."

The Liberty open their season at Chicago against the Sky on Sunday. The May 25 home opener against the Minnesota Lynx tops off at their new home, the Westchester County Center in White Plains.

New Liberty coach's no-nonsense shtick gives hope for redemption

Rookie coaches don't often get handed teams as good as the Liberty roster Katie Smith is inheriting.

They also don't usually face the pressure of getting a seasoned squad over the hump, or of erasing years of bad playoff karma and postseason choke jobs.

That's what Smith stepped into when she replaced Bill Laimbeer (now with the Las Vegas Aces) as coach of New York's WNBA squad.

Fortunately, Smith — who was named to the Naismith Hall of Fame in March and is the all-time leading scorer in women's pro basketball — is used to challenges.

"So far so good," said Smith, who was a Liberty assistant coach since 2014. "I thank Bill all the time. He allowed us to have a voice even as assistants and to be able to do a lot, so a lot of things we do now are very similar. The decision-making and some of those things will be different but a lot of it's very comfortable: We're playing basketball. . . . I enjoy it. We have a good time. We work hard. But there's going to be discipline about execution.

"It's enjoying what we do every day but also competing at the highest level. . . . [Laimbeer's advice] was just be yourself, don't be different than who you are. Other than that, it's decision-making. You'll have to make tough calls, but hopefully we're prepared. And we're going to work hard. We'll make mistakes and have to get back after it, but that's OK. We're going to be doing it the best we can."

The Liberty have done just fine in the regular season, 66-36 over the past three campaigns. But after falling in the Eastern Conference finals in 2015, they got first-round byes the past two seasons only to get upset in their opener each time.

So what's going to make this year any different?

"[We have to] get some guts, some heart," guard Shavonte Zellous, who is beginning her third Liberty season, said. "We relax and lose focus a little bit. This year we have to continue to stay at our peak. . . . That's what's going to get us over this year. . . . Having Katie leading us, it's going to be right. Having the leadership of Katie makes it easier. Her being our assistant for so long and [taking] the head-coaching position just makes it more fun.

"We're more loose, we're having a lot of fun, we believe in each other. . . . We're not trying to go through that again, one-and-done."

First-round pick Kia Nurse adds perimeter versatility to a stout defense, and Tina Charles is the unquestioned star, tied for third in the WNBA general managers' survey for MVP. But Smith, a former guard herself, is bringing in more ball movement.

"We're open now. It's more free," Zellous said. "It's going to be fun to watch. It's not going to be just stand and pass it in to Tina and watch Tina work. It's everybody getting involved, whether Tina gets it we're doing a lot of movement now. It's going to be fun to watch."

Smith is a stickler for details and discipline, obvious from watching Wednesday's media-day practice in Tarrytown, when she sometimes cut play off to correct mistakes.

"She is no nonsense at all," Kiah Stokes said. "If there's too many turnovers in a row, on the line; if people aren't talking on defense, on the line. It doesn't matter if it's starting five, last person off the bench, anybody, it doesn't matter who you are, she's going to hold you accountable and make sure you hold yourself accountable.

"Especially with Katie [as] head coach there's a new sense of 'all right, we're going to get things right, work hard, restart.' We've lost in the same place the last three years so we're sick of that. We want to go to the next level."

After three straight seasons atop the conference, Liberty aim for more

Every few weeks, Shavonte Zellous would shoot off a message from across the globe, asking if the New York Liberty were still the New York Liberty.

Scattered across Europe in their various EuroLeague assignments, members of the team this offseason were at least united in the uncertain future of their WNBA team. Coming off a successful but still disappointing 2017 campaign, where they once again were the best team in the Eastern Conference only to fall in a single-elimination playoff game, the Liberty now too had to contend with news that the team in the process of being sold.

And though the sale hasn't happened, Madison Square Garden Company still is looking for a new owner, the company said. So the Liberty will move from the Garden to the Westchester County Center, which has a capacity of 5,000. The team will return to the Garden for two games, one in June and one in August.

"Every two weeks I think I was talking to [the coaching staff], like 'What's going on? Did you hear anything? Who's buying us? Are we staying the same?'" said Zellous, a nine-year WNBA veteran in her third season with the Liberty. "I think it was challenging, especially for most of us that were overseas in Europe, not knowing the possibility of whether we were staying in New York or we were leaving, going into a new city. I think having our core group back with me, Tina [Charles], Epiphanny [Prince], Sugar [Rodgers], Kia [Vaughn], it makes the transition a lot easier."

Whatever they feel about the uncertainty, everyone can agree that it's been one very strange, very eventful offseason. Longtime coach Bill Laimbeer left to head the Las Vegas Aces and associate head coach Katie Smith took his place. Frustration ran high after back-to-back years of single-elimination playoff losses, center Kiah Stokes said, adding they were "sick of that."

Despite finishing first in their conference for three years running, the Liberty continue to be something of an afterthought to the Minnesota Lynx and Los Angeles Sparks, both of whom were listed ahead of the Liberty in the Associated Press' preseason power rankings.

The proverbial chip on their shoulder is boulder-sized at this point.

"We've gotta get some guts, some heart," said Zellous, a guard. "We tend to relax and we tend to lose focus a little bit when other teams are at their peak, we're kinda going down. We've got to continue to stay at our peak no matter what part of the season we're in. That's what's going to get us over this year."

Despite a roster very similar to last year, the Liberty is different in integral ways. Defense always was a sticking point under Laimbeer, and that should continue to be a strength this season thanks to the addition of rookie Kia Nurse, the Liberty's first-round pick and the Women's Basketball Coaches Association defensive player of the year in her final season at the University of Connecticut. But Smith also is championing a very fluid, more run-and-gun offense. Charles, who averaged 19.7 points last year (third in the league), still will be a key, just not the only one.

"We're open now," Zellous said. "It's more free . . . It's going to be fun to watch, and it's not just going to be standing and passing it to Tina and watch Tina work."

The hope, Smith said, is to make sure "everybody is a threat."

"Everybody is a scorer," she said. "Everybody needs to be able to handle the basketball. Everybody needs to be involved, whether you're playing or not . . . We have some main threats that are going to carry the load . . . but we need everybody to have that scorer's mentality. They're ready at every moment to knock down big shots and make big plays."

And no matter what the future holds off the court, the Liberty wants to make sure that they control their own destiny on it. Part of that is going to be playing for the one or two seed in the playoffs, which could very well mean shocking a WNBA community that's very used to the Liberty being very good, but not quite good enough.

"We're just preparing and whatever happens, happens," Zellous said. "We still have to go out and perform [whether] the stands are empty or the stands are full."
