QUICK HITS

The New York Liberty return home to face the Seattle Storm after erasing a 10-point third-quarter deficit for a 94-92 win in Phoenix on Aug. 1 to close a three-game road trip at 2-1.

New York has scored at least 94 points in five consecutive games, the longest such streak in franchise history.

Sabrina Ionescu led the Liberty with 27 points, a season-high 10 assists and seven rebounds in Phoenix and became the third player in WNBA history to make 500 3-pointers within the first 200 games of her career.

Han Xu led the Liberty's reserves with a season-high 17 points on 66.7 percent (6-for-9) shooting from the field on Aug. 1, tying her career high with three 3-pointers and reaching 500 career points.

Breanna Stewart became the Liberty's all-time franchise blocks leader with 196 on Aug. 1 while posting a double-double of 14 points and 11 rebounds.

Stewart's 26.4 points per game in July 2026 marked her highest scoring average in any month of her career. Stewart became the first player in WNBA history to average at least 26.0 points, 8.0 rebounds and 3.0 assists while shooting 40 percent from deep on 3+ attempts per game in any nine-game span throughout WNBA history.

Pauline Astier scored 19 points on 8-for-12 shooting with four assists and two steals on July 30 at Las Vegas, joining Teresa Weatherspoon as the only rookies in Liberty franchise history to do so while shooting better than 60 percent from the field in a game.

New York set season highs in points (113), field goals (41) and 3-pointers (17) on July 28 at Los Angeles for the Liberty's highest scoring total since 2022.

Stewart put up 29 points, four rebounds, seven assists, four steals and three blocks on July 28, becoming the second player all-time to record such a stat line. She combined with Ionescu for 56 points against the Sparks, the duo's highest single-game total of the season.

Jonquel Jones was named Most Valuable Player of the 2026 WNBA All-Star Game with 22 points, 13 rebounds and eight assists. Jones became the first player in WNBA history to win WNBA MVP, Commissioner's Cup MVP, Finals MVP and All-Star MVP.

RALLY IN THE DESERT

The Liberty erased a 10-point third-quarter deficit and closed the period on a 12-1 run to take a 94-92 win at Phoenix on Aug. 1, completing a 3-0 season sweep of the Mercury. New York held Phoenix to 25 percent (4-for-16) shooting in the first quarter, matching the lowest field-goal percentage and fewest field goals made by any Liberty opponent in a quarter this season. The Liberty shot 66.7 percent (6-for-9) from beyond the arc in the second half, their best 3-point percentage in any half this season. This was New York's fourth time coming back from a deficit of at least eight points to win over the past five games, marking the first time in franchise history that the Liberty recorded four such comeback wins in a five-game span. The Liberty have now scored at least 94 points in five consecutive games, the longest such streak in franchise history.

500 THREES FOR SABRINA

Sabrina Ionescu became the third player in WNBA history to make 500 3-pointers within the first 200 games of her career, reaching the mark in her 199th game on Aug. 1 at Phoenix. Ionescu led New York with 27 points, a season-high 10 assists and seven rebounds on Aug. 1 at Phoenix for her fourth career game with 25 points, 10 assists and seven rebounds, and no other player in WNBA history has done so more than twice.

HAN HEATING UP

Han Xu led the Liberty's reserves with a season-high 17 points on 66.7 percent (6-for-9) shooting at Phoenix on Aug. 1, including 50 percent (3-for-6) from deep as she tied her career high for 3-pointers in a game and reached 500 career points. Han is the third player this season and one of two reserves in franchise history to record at least 17 points, six rebounds and two 3-pointers while shooting better than 60 percent from the field off the bench. She has connected on seven 3-pointers over her last three games, the most in any three-game span of her WNBA career.

STEWART CONTINUES TO SHATTER RECORD BOOKS, BECOMING FRANCHISE BLOCKS LEADER

Breanna Stewart passed Tari Phillips (1,077) for the third-most rebounds in Liberty franchise history on July 11 at Minnesota. Stewart posted 33 points with season-highs of 13 rebounds and eight assists at Dallas on July 20, joining Tina Thompson as the only players in WNBA history with 33 points, 13 rebounds and eight assists in a game. With her 1,000th career assist, Stewart became the fastest player in WNBA history to reach 6,000 points, 2,500 rebounds and 1,000 assists (317 games) and just the fifth player all-time to reach those marks. She also recorded the 17th 30-point double-double of her career, second-most in WNBA history, and passed Courtney Vandersloot (463) for the 10th-most assists in Liberty franchise history. Stewart added 20 points, nine rebounds and three blocks against Chicago on July 22 to become the first player in franchise history with three consecutive games of at least 20 points, eight rebounds and two blocks, and recorded her 250th career game scoring at least 15 points. She passed Candace Parker (6,574) for 10th on the WNBA's all-time scoring list at Las Vegas on July 30, posting a double-double of 26 points and 11 rebounds with three steals and a block. Stewart scored at least 15 points for the 14th consecutive game, matching the longest such streak of her career, and joined A'ja Wilson as the only players to record at least 26 points, 11 rebounds and three steals in a game this season. Stewart blocked two shots on Aug. 1 at Phoenix to pass Kiah Stokes (195) and become the Liberty's all-time franchise blocks leader with 196, and reached 6,600 points in her 321st career game to become the fastest player in WNBA history to that mark.

ALLEN ANSWERS THE CALL

Rebecca Allen made her first Liberty start since 2022 on July 20 at Dallas, recording her 200th career block to become the 12th player in WNBA history with 200 blocks and 200 3-pointers in fewer than 300 games. She scored 12 points against Chicago on July 22 while reaching 150 made 3-pointers in a Liberty uniform. Allen set her season highs with 13 points and three made 3-pointers on July 30 at Las Vegas.





PAULINE POWERS UP THE ROOKIE RANKS

Pauline Astier scored 19 points on 66.7 percent (8-for-12) shooting with four assists and two steals at Las Vegas on July 30, joining Teresa Weatherspoon as the only rookies in Liberty franchise history to record at least 19 points, four assists and two steals while shooting better than 60 percent from the field in a game. Astier became the seventh rookie in franchise history to make 100 field goals and moved past Leonie Fiebich (267), Kym Hampton (273) and Michaela Onyenwere (275) for sole possession of the fifth-most points by a Liberty rookie.

LIBERTY LIGHT UP LOS ANGELES

The Liberty set season highs in points (113), field goals (41) and 3-pointers (17) in a 113-109 win at Los Angeles on July 28, shooting a season-best 58.6 percent from the field and 53.1 percent from beyond the arc. It was New York's highest-scoring game since 2022 and the second-highest total in franchise history, as well as the highest scoring total in a regulation game by a team with a first-year head coach in WNBA history. New York outscored the Sparks 18-5 in second-chance points and allowed just 21 rebounds, the fewest by any Liberty opponent this season.

DEPTH DELIVERS IN WIN OVER SPARKS

The Liberty's reserves outscored the Los Angeles bench 41-19 on July 28 to match New York's season high for bench points, with **Rebekah Gardner** (15), **Han Xu** (13) and **Marine Fauthoux** (13) each scoring 13 points, marking the second time in franchise history that three Liberty reserves have done so in a game. Gardner shot 83.3 percent (5-for-6) from the field in her highest-scoring game since July 23, 2022 while making her 100th field goal in a Liberty uniform and recording her 25th career double-digit scoring game. Han set a career high with three 3-pointers and added three rebounds and two blocks, scoring 11 of her 13 points in the first quarter for her highest-scoring quarter of the season while posting a career-best plus-29, tied for the third-highest by a Liberty reserve in franchise history. Fauthoux set her career high with 13 points, including 10 in the fourth for the highest-scoring quarter of her career.

DOMINANT DUOS

Sabrina Ionescu and **Breanna Stewart** each scored at least 20 points in the same game as teammates for the 18th time on July 28, which is more than twice as many as any other duo in Liberty history. The pair combined for 56 points at Los Angeles, their highest single-game total of the season, and became the third pair of teammates in franchise history to each record at least 25 points and five assists in a game. Stewart and **Jonquel Jones** each recorded a double-double on July 20 for the 11th time in the same game as teammates, the most by any Liberty duo all-time and the second-most by any pair of teammates in WNBA history. On June 11, Jones and Stewart also became the second pair of teammates in WNBA history to each record 15 points, 10 rebounds and five assists in a single game, and the first since 2000.

SAB STEPS UP IN CLUTCH TIME

Sabrina Ionescu scored 12 points in overtime to tie the WNBA record for points in a single overtime period on July 20 at Dallas, shooting a perfect 5-for-5 from the field to also match the league mark for made field goals without a miss in an overtime period. For the second straight game, the Liberty erased a 12-point deficit to win by a single point, rallying past the Chicago Sky 95-94 on July 22. New York became just the third team in WNBA history to overcome an eight-point deficit in the final minute of regulation, and the comeback from 12 down in the final five minutes was the first in franchise history and the seventh in WNBA history. Sabrina Ionescu scored the Liberty's final nine points and 13 in the fourth, finishing with a season-high 29 points while passing Vickie Johnson (3,246) for the second-most points in franchise history. She became the second player in WNBA history to score at least nine points in the final minute of a game where her team was trailing and came back to win, and the first to do so in a regulation win.





MVP SWEEP FOR JONES

Jonquel Jones was named Most Valuable Player of the 2026 WNBA All-Star Game, becoming the first player in WNBA history to win WNBA MVP (2021), Commissioner's Cup MVP (2023), Finals MVP (2024) and All-Star MVP (2026). Jones is the first Liberty player in franchise history to win All-Star MVP and just the fourth All-Star reserve to earn the honor. She finished with 22 points, 13 rebounds, eight assists and three 3-pointers to become the first player in WNBA All-Star Game history to post that stat line. It was her fourth career All-Star double-double, the most in WNBA All-Star Game history, and her third 20-point All-Star performance, tying Maya Moore for the most all-time.

SECOND-CHANCE POINTS SPUR LIBERTY TO COMEBACK WIN IN DALLAS

The Liberty rallied from 12 points down to beat Dallas 99-98 in overtime on July 20, snapping the Wings' six-game win streak. New York set season highs with 48 rebounds, 17 offensive rebounds and 30 second-chance points while committing a season-low eight turnovers. The Liberty outscored Dallas 30-6 in second-chance points, tied for the second-largest second-chance point differential by any team in the past three seasons. **Marine Fauthoux**, **Breanna Stewart** and **Jonquel Jones** each posted a double-double, the first time three teammates have done so in the same game since 2023 and just the 10th time in WNBA history. Jones set her season high with seven offensive rebounds.

IONESCU'S SCORING STRETCH

Sabrina Ionescu posted season highs of 28 points, eight assists and three steals to go with four rebounds on 50 percent shooting (9-for-18) at Toronto on July 12, becoming the only player this season and one of three players in WNBA history to record at least 25 points, five assists, four rebounds and two steals in consecutive games. She set her season high for 3-pointers in a single quarter with four in the first at Los Angeles on July 28, and after knocking down three in the final minute against Chicago on July 22, became the second Liberty player in the last 20 seasons to record consecutive quarters with three or more made 3-pointers, joining **Jonquel Jones**. She passed Vickie Johnson (1,053) for fifth on the franchise rebounding list and recorded her 32nd career game of at least 20 points, five rebounds and five assists, tying Diana Taurasi for the second-most through a player's first seven seasons.

PAULINE'S EFFICIENT PLAYMAKING

Pauline Astier is on pace to become the first rookie in WNBA history to record an assist-to-turnover ratio of 2.0 or better and a true-shooting percentage above 60 percent (63.6) on at least 150 field goal attempts, with Paige Bueckers (56.7) as the only other qualified rookie all-time with a true shooting percentage above 56 percent.

FRENCH GUARDS FUEL LIBERTY ON ROAD TRIP

Marine Johannès led all scorers with 12 points in the first quarter at Indiana on July 18, matching her highest-scoring quarter of the season and tying her career high with four 3-pointers in a single quarter. Johannès passed Sugar Rodgers (257) for the fifth-most made 3-pointers in Liberty franchise history and moved past Rodgers and Shameka Christon (40) for the fourth-most games with three or more made triples. She also recorded a steal for the sixth consecutive game, the longest single-season steals streak of her career. **Pauline Astier** tied her career high with three steals in Indiana and set her career high for steals in a three-game span with seven. She became the fastest Liberty rookie since Crystal Robinson in 1999 to reach 250 career points, doing so in 26 games. **Marine Fauthoux** scored the first points of her WNBA career in Indiana and added a career-high four assists off the bench. She posted career highs of 10 points and 10 rebounds on July 20 to become the first rookie guard in WNBA history to record 10 points, 10 rebounds and two 3-pointers off the bench, and just the seventh rookie overall. Fauthoux then scored a career-high 13 points on 66.7 percent (4-for-6) shooting from the field and 75 percent (3-for-4) from long range on July 28, including a career-high 10 points in the fourth quarter.





JONES JOINS JACKSON, SOLIDIFYING STATUS AS PREMIER SHOOTING CENTER

Jonquel Jones became the second center all-time to reach 400 made 3-pointers, joining Lauren Jackson, while recording her fourth consecutive double-double on July 12. Jones posted at least seven rebounds and a 3-pointer in six straight games from June 28 to July 12, tied for the third-longest such streak in franchise history.

SABRINA'S THIRD-QUARTER TAKEOVER

Sabrina Ionescu recorded season highs of 25 points and eight rebounds to go with five assists on July 11 at Minnesota, including 19 points in the third for her highest-scoring quarter since 2023 while becoming the second player to score 19 points in a single quarter so far in 2026. Ionescu passed Cappie Pondexter (1,047) for the third-most field goals made in franchise history and moved past Leilani Mitchell (186) for eighth on the franchise steals list.

LIBERTY DEFENSE CAUSES CHAOS IN MONTREAL BUT COMEBACK BID FALLS SHORT

The Liberty fought back from a 20-point deficit to tie the game late in the fourth quarter before falling 93-91 to the Tempo in Montreal on July 12. New York forced 23 turnovers, the most by any Liberty opponent this season and Toronto's highest total all-time, while recording season highs of 11 steals and 17 second-chance points.

TWO-TIME CUP CHAMPIONS

The New York Liberty became the first team in WNBA history to win multiple Commissioner's Cup Championships, beating the Las Vegas Aces 93-85 on June 30 at Barclays Center. **Breanna Stewart** posted a double-double of 25 points and 11 rebounds as she became the first player to win multiple Cup MVP awards and the first to win the Commissioner's Cup Championship three times. **Sabrina Ionescu** scored 26 points, the second-highest single-game total in Commissioner's Cup Championship history, and became the first player to record at least 20 points, five rebounds and five assists in a Cup Championship. **Pauline Astier** set the rookie scoring record for a Commissioner's Cup Championship with 15 points, while **Jonquel Jones** put up nine points and nine assists to extend her all-time Cup Championship rebounding record to 47 boards.

STEWIE STUMPS LEAGUE'S TOP DEFENSE

Breanna Stewart scored a season-high 36 points on 73.7 percent (14-for-19) shooting in a 99-86 win over the league-leading Minnesota Lynx on July 3, including 16 points on a perfect 7-for-7 in the first quarter to become the first player this season to score over 15 points in an opening quarter without missing a shot. Stewart passed Angel McCoughtry for the third-most 30-point games in WNBA history and matched Tina Charles for the third-most 25-point games. New York shot 58.1 percent from the field, including 59 first-half points on 64.7 percent shooting.

ASTIER ASCENDS

Pauline Astier put up 17 points, five assists and four rebounds on 80 percent (4-for-5) shooting in 21 minutes off the bench on June 21 at Los Angeles, becoming the first rookie in WNBA history to record such a stat line off the bench in a single game and the first player all-time to do so in less than 25 minutes. She recorded a career-high three steals on June 25 at Seattle. Astier became the fourth player in the last 10 seasons to total 200 points, 75 assists, 60 rebounds and 15 steals through her first 20 career games, joining Caitlin Clark, Paige Bueckers and Olivia Miles. She recorded 16 points, five assists and a career-high eight rebounds on June 11 at Atlanta, including nine points, seven rebounds and three assists in the first half alone to become the first rookie in franchise history to record such a stat line in a single half, and the first WNBA rookie to do so since Caitlin Clark in 2024.





CLUTCH WIN IN CHICAGO

Sabrina Ionescu hit a game-winner with 10.3 seconds left to lift New York to a 96-95 win at Chicago on June 17 for the team's largest comeback of the season after trailing by 15. It was the Liberty's first road comeback from a 15-point deficit since Game 3 of the 2024 WNBA Finals, with Ionescu hitting game-winners in both contests.

STEWART STUFFING THE STAT SHEET

Breanna Stewart posted 16 points, 10 rebounds and a season-high six assists to go with one steal and a pair of blocks on June 19, extending her own franchise record to six straight games with at least 14 points, six rebounds and three steals (steals + blocks) from June 6 to June 19. This was her seventh game with at least 15 points, 10 rebounds, five assists and two blocks in a Liberty uniform, and no other Liberty player has done so more than once. Stewart has recorded a steal or a block in 25 consecutive games, the longest streak in the WNBA in 2026.

JJ'S JUNE TO REMEMBER

Jonquel Jones dominated during the month of June, averaging 17.4 points, 8.9 rebounds, 2.6 assists and 1.9 blocks per game while shooting 60.2 percent (59-for-98) from the field and 45.5 percent (25-for-55) from deep in 10 games. Jones opened the month by becoming the first player in WNBA history to record 17 rebounds and four made 3-pointers in a single game, going for 22 points and 17 boards against Toronto on June 3 with the first halftime double-double of her Liberty regular-season career. Jones scored a season-high 26 points on 58.8 percent shooting at Seattle on June 25 and added 21 at Golden State on June 28. She also recorded three straight games with at least three 3-pointers, 15 points and a block from June 11-17 to match the longest such streak in WNBA history. Jones continued her hot streak into July with 14 points and 15 rebounds on July 3 and joined Tamika Catchings as the only players to record 15 rebounds, five assists and multiple 3-pointers in a game more than once.

RECORD-SETTING RETURN

In her first game back from a seven-game absence, **Sabrina Ionescu** grabbed the 1,000th rebound of her career on June 14 to become the fastest player in WNBA history to reach 3,000 points, 1,000 rebounds and 1,000 assists. Ionescu hit the mark in her 183rd career game, 60 games faster than the next-quickest player, Jackie Young (243). She recorded her 172nd game with a made 3-pointer on July 7 to break Crystal Robinson's franchise record.

LIBERTY RESERVES DOMINATING FROM DEEP

Han Xu scored 12 points on 100 percent (4-for-4) shooting from the field while connecting on both of her attempts from long range on June 23 against Las Vegas. She scored 10 points in the third quarter alone, spurring a 17-4 Liberty run as she recorded the second double-digit scoring quarter of her career and became the ninth player in franchise history to score at least 12 points off the bench on perfect shooting from the field in a game. **Marine Johannès** set her career high with seven 3-pointers on May 27 and set the franchise record for 3-pointers through the first nine games of a season with 29, which was previously held by **Sabrina Ionescu** in the first nine games of the 2023 season as she went on to set the WNBA single-season record with 128 made threes. Johannès connected on at least one 3-pointer in 14 consecutive games from May 25 to June 28, marking the longest streak of her career. **Anneli Maley** knocked down a 3-pointer for her first made field goal in a Liberty uniform on July 18 at Indiana.





LIBERTY DEFENSE LOCKS UP MYSTICS

In an 86-64 win on June 14, the Liberty held the Mystics to a season-low 64 points on 33.8 percent shooting, the lowest field-goal percentage by any New York opponent this season. New York set a season high of 10 blocks and matched a season high with nine steals, just the second time in franchise history the team recorded 10 blocks and nine steals in a game. All 11 Liberty players to check in scored at least four points, the first time in franchise history that 11 different players reached four points each in a single game.

LEO LIGHTS IT UP

Leonie Fiebich connected on at least three 3-pointers in four consecutive games from June 19-25, the longest such streak of her career, and her 63 points in that stretch tied her career high for points in any four-game span. She matched her season high with 19 points at Seattle on June 25 and tied her career high with four threes on June 23 at Las Vegas, shooting 80 percent (4-for-5) from long range. This was the fourth time Fiebich shot at least 80 percent from deep on five or more attempts in a single game, tied for the second-most by a player through their first three WNBA seasons and only trailing Maya Moore's five such games. Fiebich recorded her 31st game shooting at least 50 percent from deep on three or more attempts, tied for the fourth-most all-time through a player's first three seasons, only behind Stewart, Crystal Robinson and Tamika Catchings. Fiebich has shot 43 percent from deep in her career, the second-highest 3-point percentage by any player with at least 250 career attempts in WNBA history.

JJ DOMINATING ON THE BOARDS

Jonquel Jones put up 22 points and 17 rebounds on June 3 and became the first player in WNBA history to record 17 rebounds and four 3-pointers made in a single game. She grabbed 12 rebounds on June 6 while tying her career high for rebounds in a quarter with eight in the fourth to become the first player in Liberty franchise history to record consecutive games with an eight-rebound quarter. She also reached 1,000 rebounds with the Liberty on May 27 to become the second-fastest player in franchise history to reach that mark (118 games).

STEWIE CELEBRATES ELLIE'S BIRTHDAY WITH A BLOCK PARTY

Breanna Stewart recorded her 100th career double-double on June 14 against Washington, finishing with 14 points, 12 rebounds and a career-high seven blocks to become the first player since 2024 to record at least seven blocks in a game. Stewart accumulated 11 points, 10 rebounds and five blocks before halftime alone, becoming the second player in WNBA history to post that line in any half. It was her third game with at least five blocks in a Liberty uniform, passing Kiah Stokes and Amanda Zahui B. for the most such games in franchise history.

LIBERTY DEFENSE LOCKS DOWN MERCURY WITH HISTORIC RUN

The Liberty went on a 23-0 run to end the third quarter on May 27 against the Mercury, the longest scoring run in franchise history. New York's defense held Phoenix scoreless over the final six minutes of the third quarter, the longest scoreless stretch by a Liberty opponent to end a quarter since 2016.

PAULINE POPS OFF

Pauline Astier posted 16 points, six assists and six rebounds with a 75 percent field-goal percentage on May 29. Astier is the third rookie in WNBA history to record at least 12 points, six rebounds and six assists while shooting 75 percent from the field and finishing with two or fewer turnovers in a single game, and both previous players to do so went on to win Rookie of the Year. Astier recorded a 65.8 percent eFG% through 10 games to join Stewart and Aliyah Boston as the only rookies in the last 20 years with an eFG% of 65% in any 10-game span.





STEWIE OFF TO AN ELITE START

Breanna Stewart became the first player in the WNBA to win multiple Player of the Week awards in 2026 after receiving her second Eastern Conference Player of the Week honor of the season for games played from Monday, June 1 to Sunday, June 7. This was the 20th weekly honor of her career and the 10th of her Liberty tenure, making her the third Liberty player in franchise history to win 10 Player of the Week awards and the third in WNBA history to win 10 Player of the Week awards each with multiple teams. Stewart led New York to a 2-0 record in Week 4, leading the conference in scoring at 24.5 points per game while adding 8.5 rebounds, 3.0 assists and 2.0 steals per game.

HISTORIC START FOR LIBERTY OFFENSE

New York dished out 32 assists on May 14 at Portland, tied for the third-highest single-game assists total in franchise history, and became the first team in franchise history to shoot over 50 percent from the field through the first four games of a season (50.9 percent). The Liberty also scored 61 points in the second half at Portland to become the second team in WNBA history to begin a season with a 50-point half in each of the first four games. The 2026 Liberty became the first team in WNBA history to average at least 100 points per contest through the first four games of a season, and the first to open a season with four consecutive games of at least 95 points. The Liberty set WNBA records for eFG% (59.3%) and true shooting percentage (62.4%) through the first five games of a season.

SABALLY SIGHTING

Three-time WNBA All-Star **Satou Sabally** made her Liberty debut on May 21 after signing a multi-year contract with New York this offseason. Sabally earned 2023 All-WNBA First Team honors and was named the 2023 Most Improved Player after averaging a career-high 18.6 points, 8.1 rebounds and 1.8 steals per game and dishing out 4.4 assists per contest to join Candace Parker as the only players in league history to record such a stat line in a season. With the addition of Sabally alongside **Breanna Stewart** and **Jonquel Jones**, the Liberty become the first team in WNBA history with three players listed at 6-4 or taller who all have been named to an All-WNBA First Team.

THE BIG THREE IS BACK

Breanna Stewart, **Jonquel Jones** and **Sabrina Ionescu** look to build on an unprecedented run of success after becoming the first group of three teammates in Liberty franchise history to earn All-WNBA Team honors in the same season in 2024. In 1,740 regular season minutes with Ionescu, Jones and Stewart all on the court from 2023-2025, the Liberty recorded a +16.8 net rating, and New York posted a 70-17 record (80.5 percent) in games with all three stars in the starting lineup, the best winning percentage by any trio with at least 50 starts together since at least 2002.





The 2026 season marks the 30th anniversary of the Liberty as one of the WNBA's three remaining original franchises. The organization is bringing the historic campaign to life by celebrating the trailblazers, moments, and community that have defined the organization since 1997.

Throughout the season, the Liberty are celebrating the franchise's legacy with commemorative merchandise, in-arena giveaways, community events, theme nights, and original storytelling that highlight the special people and moments that have defined the Liberty's journey. New York will honor the legendary Liberty players who made significant contributions to the Liberty's tradition of excellence and played pivotal roles in some of the most memorable moments and seasons in the franchise's 30-year history.

Anchored by a "30 Seasons" throwback-inspired logo, the campaign's visual identity blends the franchise's earliest influences with a modernized aesthetic. The bold "30" symbolizes three decades of continuity and strength, incorporating the original orange torch from the Liberty's original Lady Liberty primary logo, representing both the origins of the franchise and the energy that continues to drive it forward. Angular crown details, accented with the team's original blue colorway, pay homage to the Liberty's foundational era and trailblazing spirit since 1997. A star set on the finger of the torch-bearing fist stands as a symbol of the Liberty's 2024 WNBA Championship, capturing a defining moment in franchise history. Completed with a contemporary color palette and dimensional accents, the logo blends retro inspiration with modern design, capturing the movement of the city and the momentum of the team today.

The "30 Seasons" mark appears across merchandise, in-arena branding, digital platforms, and storytelling moments, serving as a unifying symbol that connects generations of players and fans through a shared past and a collective future.



SWIN CASH



WNBA Hall of Famer Swin Cash finished her WNBA career in New York as a forward on the Liberty for two and a half seasons (2014-16).

Cash was namely a part of the 2015 roster that won 23 matches, setting a record for the most wins by a team in Liberty franchise history up until that season.

Cash is one of the most decorated players to ever grace the league, retiring as a three-time WNBA Champion (2003, 2006 & 2010), a four-time All-Star (2003, 2005, 2009 & 2011) and a two-time Olympic gold medalist (2004 & 2012). The forward lead two different teams to WNBA championship titles, winning one championship with the Seattle Storm in 2012 and two with the Detroit Shock in 2003 and 2006. Cash sits in the top 50 of the WNBA record books in several categories — the legend currently ranks 9th all-time in games played (479), 19th in total rebounds (2,521), 28th in points (5,119), 36th in assists (1,133), 37th in blocks (258), 39th in made field goals (1,773) and 46th in double-doubles (30).

After retiring from the WNBA in 2016, Cash went on to become the Liberty's Director of Franchise Development in 2017, and was inducted into the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame in 2022. The legend was named to both the WNBA's Top20@20 and the W25 as one of the greatest and most influential players in WNBA history.

BROOKLYN BASKETBALL



Brooklyn Basketball opened the 18,600 sq. ft. Brooklyn Basketball Training Center in September of 2025 and since then, the initiative has continued to grow and expand their reach across New York.

This marks the third year of the partnership between Brooklyn Basketball and the NYC Department of Education on an innovative program that gives elementary and middle school students access to free, in-school basketball clinics. This year alone, the program has reached over 23,000 youth across 170 schools and is on track to exceed 35,000 students by the end of 2026. In addition to schools, Brooklyn Basketball has partnered with organizations like the YMCA and Boys & Girls Clubs to bring community-based clinics to neighborhoods across Brooklyn, making the game more accessible.

Brooklyn Basketball also brings schools to the Brooklyn Basketball Training Center for programs during the school day. To date, the training center has hosted over 1,600 students from 24 schools, many of whom do not have their own facilities, for on-site experiences. The center has also hosted after-school programs, weekend training, camps, all-girls programs and other activations, while making space for students to finish homework and address other needs before and after training.

The multi-court youth basketball training facility is the first in the tri-state area to use Shoot 360 technology. Shoot 360, a leader in basketball innovation and skill development, uses advanced ball detection technology that is leveraged by teams across the WNBA and NBA, and now by the training center as well. The technology utilizes interactive features and physical activity to measure participants' skillset and analyzes performance data for suggestions on how participants can improve their game. Empowering youth with this technology aligns directly with Brooklyn Basketball's mission to deliver high-quality, inclusive, and accessible basketball programming.

The Brooklyn Basketball Training Center is right across the street from Barclays Center on Flatbush Avenue, providing the Liberty and the Nets a unique opportunity to impact children, families, schools and programs across New York.

CONNECTIONS

Breanna Stewart was selected first overall by the Seattle Storm in the 2016 WNBA Draft and went on to win Rookie of the Year. She captured two WNBA championships (2018, 2020) and earned her first league MVP award in 2018 while with the Storm. Stewart remained in Seattle through the 2022 season, during which she was named to the All-WNBA First Team and All-Defensive First Team, selected as an All-Star, finished third in Defensive Player of the Year voting, and was runner-up in MVP voting. Storm head coach **Sonia Raman** was an assistant coach for the Liberty in 2025. Storm forward **Ezi Magbegor** was also on the Storm roster with Stewart from 2020-22. Storm foward **Katie Lou Samuelson** won an NCAA championship with Stewart at the University of Connecticut during their 2015-16 season. Samuelson also shared a locker room with Stewart and Liberty Director of Player Engagement and Community Relations **Epiphanny Prince**. In the inaugural season of Unrivaled, Samuelson teamed up with **Sabrina Ionescu** for Phantom Basketball Club. Samuelson and Liberty forward **Satou Sabally** spent time on the Dallas Wings together for the 2020 season. Storm center **Stefanie Dolson** was on the New York Liberty for two seasons (2022-23). Dolson and Stewart played on the University of Connecticut women's basketball team together from 2012-14. Dolson and Liberty guard **Rebekah Gardner** were teammates at the Chicago Sky in 2017. Storm center **Awa Fam** and Liberty forward **Raquel Carrera** are on the Spain national team together. Liberty center **Jonquel Jones** and Storm guard **Natisha Hiedeman** were both on the Connecticut Sun's roster from 2019 to 2022. Liberty guard/forward **Rebecca Allen** played with Magbegor and Storm guard **Jade Melbourne** on the Australia national team during the 2024 Paris Olympics.

CHRIS DEMARCO

NEW YORK LIBERTY HEAD COACH
1ST SEASON WITH NEW YORK | 1ST SEASON IN WNBA

Four-time NBA Champion Chris DeMarco was named the 10th head coach in New York Liberty franchise history on December 3, 2025. DeMarco arrives in Brooklyn following 14 seasons with the Golden State Warriors, where he won NBA titles in 2015, 2017, 2018, and 2022. He joined Golden State under Mark Jackson in 2012 and was retained by Steve Kerr, working across player development, assistant coaching, and defensive roles during the Warriors' championship era.

In Golden State, DeMarco played a pivotal role on Steve Kerr's coaching staff, largely focusing on the team's individual skill development and systems, that ultimately culminated in one of the most successful dynasties in modern basketball history. During DeMarco's tenure, Golden State's defense held opponents to the league's second-lowest shot quality over the past 10 seasons (49.9% qSQ), per Second Spectrum. The Warriors also led the league in net rating three times during that span and won an NBA single-season record 73 games in the 2015-16 season.

In addition to his NBA success, DeMarco has served as head coach of the Bahamas Men's National Team since 2019. Under his leadership, the team achieved its most significant victory in program history, defeating host Argentina in the 2024 Olympic Pre-Qualifying Tournament final. He has also been a featured coach at Basketball Without Borders (BWB) Americas, mentoring top international prospects and advancing the game globally.

The 2026 campaign is DeMarco's first as a WNBA head coach after beginning his professional career with the Warriors in video and scouting before advancing to Director of Player Development and ultimately serving as an assistant coach.
