QUICK HITS

The Liberty visit the Toronto Tempo after a 93-81 win in Minnesota on Sept. 18.

Breanna Stewart led the Liberty with 24 points and 10 rebounds on Sept. 18 as she passed Sue Bird (6,803) for the ninth-most points in WNBA history and moved past Cappie Pondexter (1,047) for the fourth-most made field goals in Liberty franchise history.

Jonquel Jones reached 2,000 points in a Liberty uniform against the Lynx, finishing with a double-double of 18 points and 10 rebounds.

Sept. 18 was the 12th time that Jones and Stewart each recorded a double-double in the same game as teammates, tied for the second-most by any duo in WNBA history.

Marine Johannès scored 10 points in the final 1:30 of the third quarter in Minneapolis, becoming the first player to score at least 10 points in the final 90 seconds of a quarter since 2024.

Pauline Astier became the first rookie in franchise history to reach 300 points, 100 rebounds and 100 assists while passing Crystal Robinson (375) for the second-most points by a Liberty rookie.

Leonie Fiebich matched her career high with four steals against Minnesota, including three in the fourth quarter to tie her career high for a single quarter.

The Liberty sent a league-high seven players to the 2026 FIBA Women's World Cup in Berlin and had a player on each of the four semifinalists (France, Spain, Germany and Team USA), marking the first time a WNBA team has been represented on all four World Cup semifinal teams.

Stewart won her fourth consecutive gold medal with Team USA and was named Women's World Cup MVP for the second time, making her the only two-time MVP in men's or women's FIBA World Cup history.

Jones recorded a double-double in the first half on June 3 against the Tempo while joining Tamika Catchings and Lauren Jackson as the only players in WNBA history to make three 3-pointers and grab 12 rebounds in a single half.

New York forced 23 Tempo turnovers on July 12, marking the highest turnover total by a Liberty opponent this season.

- One of two players in the WNBA this season with 300 rebounds, 100 assists, 50 steals and 50 blocks.
- Ranks 2nd in the WNBA in average Game Score at 17.1.
- One of four players in WNBA history to average over 20.0 points, 8.0 rebounds, 3.0 assists and 1.0 blocks in a season, and one of two to do it in 2026.

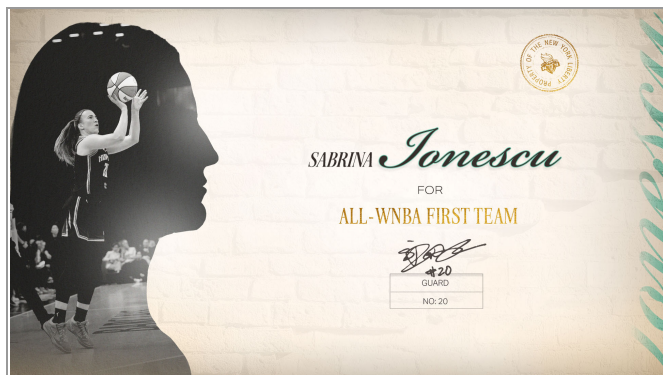

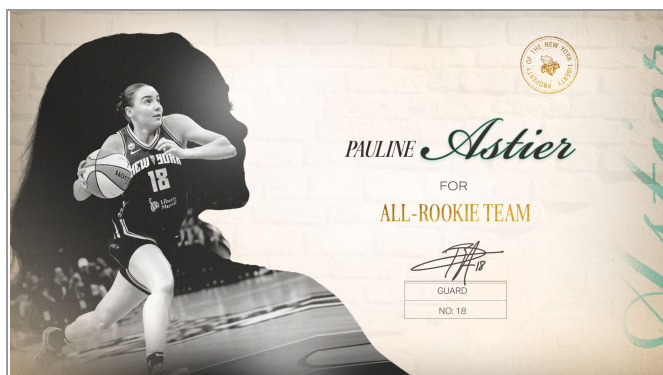

NEW YORK MAKES HISTORY AT THE FIBA WORLD CUP

The Liberty were the league's most represented team at the 2026 FIBA Women's World Cup in Berlin, sending seven players and placing a player on each of the four semifinalists (France, Spain, Germany and Team USA), marking the first time a WNBA team has been represented on all four World Cup semifinal teams.

STEWIE WINS GOLD WITH TEAM USA

Breanna Stewart won her fourth consecutive gold medal with Team USA, tying Sue Bird for the most all-time, while leading the Americans in both points (12.8) and rebounds (7.3) per game and shooting 55.8 percent from the field across six contests. She was named Women's World Cup MVP for the second time, making her the only two-time MVP in men's or women's FIBA World Cup history, and earned All-Star 5 honors for the third straight World Cup, the first



player to do so in Women's World Cup history. Stewart passed Cheryl Miller (264) for fifth on Team USA's all-time World Cup scoring list and is now the only player in Team USA history ranked in the top five for career points, rebounds and assists at the World Cup.

HAN LEADS THE CHARGE FOR CHINA

Han Xu led China in scoring (18.8) and rebounding (10.8) and finished second among all players in Berlin in both categories, becoming the first player to average more than 18.5 points and 10 rebounds per game at a World Cup since Haixia Zheng did so for China in 1994. Han earned All-Second Team honors and was the only player in the tournament to shoot better than 50 percent from deep on more than 2.0 attempts per game.

LIBERTY DOMINATE IN GERMANY

Leonie Fiebich led Germany to its first World Cup semifinal appearance with 9.9 points, a team-high 8.6 rebounds and 3.6 assists per game and became the first German player in World Cup history to earn All-Star 5 honors. Marine Johannès helped France to its first World Cup silver medal and its first podium finish since 1953, leading all players in Berlin with 20 3-pointers. Raquel Carrera averaged 8.0 points and 5.7 rebounds as Spain claimed the bronze medal, while Pauline Astier and Elizabeth Balogun each made their World Cup debuts.





BACK WITH A BANG

The Liberty pulled away from the 31-10 Lynx for a 93-81 road win on Sept. 18 in the team's first game back from the FIBA Women's World Cup break. New York held Minnesota to 25 percent (4-for-16) shooting in the second quarter, the Lynx's lowest field-goal percentage and fewest field goals made in any second quarter this season, and to 35.1 percent (13-for-37) before halftime, Minnesota's second-worst shooting half of 2026. New York recorded 12 steals to tie the team's season high and forced 19 Lynx turnovers for Minnesota's third-highest turnover total of the season.

DEFENSE DIMS THE SKY

The Liberty held Chicago to 66 points in an 85-66 win on Aug. 29, the second-lowest scoring total by a Liberty opponent in 2026. New York limited the Sky to 11 points in the opening quarter, tied for the fewest by a Liberty opponent in a first quarter this season, and to 28 before halftime, matching the lowest-scoring half by a New York opponent all year. The Liberty closed the first on a 19-4 run and held Chicago scoreless over the final 4:34.

STRETCH FIVE

Jonquel Jones set her career high for points in a single season against Golden State on Aug. 27, surpassing her previous high of 553 points in 2024. Jones is the only player in the WNBA averaging 9.0 rebounds and 1.5 made 3-pointers per game, and the only player in the league this season with 350 rebounds, 70 made 3-pointers and 40 blocks. Jones is the second center in league history to make 400 career 3-pointers, joining Lauren Jackson, and her 73 3-pointers this season are the second-most by a center in a single season all-time. She has posted a league-high 15 double-doubles with a made 3-pointer in 2026 and became the first player in WNBA history to record 17 rebounds and four made 3-pointers in a game. Jones grabbed her 351st rebound of the season on Aug. 29, the highest single-season rebounding total of her Liberty tenure, and ranks fourth in total rebounds this season. She reached 2,000 points in a Liberty uniform in her 150th game with New York on Sept. 18.

STEWIE SURGING

Breanna Stewart has scored 821 points in 2026, her highest-scoring season since her 2023 MVP campaign and the second-most points by a Liberty player in franchise single-season history. Stewart is one of four players in league history to average at least 20.0 points, 8.0 rebounds, 3.0 assists and 1.0 blocks in a single season. She passed Sue Bird (6,803) for the ninth-most points in WNBA history at Minnesota on Sept. 18 and moved past Cappie Pondexter (1,047) for the fourth-most made field goals in Liberty franchise history. Stewart has scored in double figures with at least one steal or block in 31 consecutive games, the longest such streak in franchise history and one game shy of tying Maya Moore's WNBA single-season record streak of 32 games.

PAULINE'S EFFICIENT PLAYMAKING

Pauline Astier is the first rookie guard in league history to score at least 350 points while shooting at least 50 percent from the field, and her 63.7 true-shooting percentage is the highest by any rookie in WNBA or NBA history with at least 200 field-goal attempts. Astier is the first rookie in franchise history with 300 points, 100 rebounds and 100 assists, and she passed Crystal Robinson (375) for the second-most points by a Liberty rookie.

SABRINA SETS THE TABLE

Sabrina Ionescu put up a double-double of 18 points and a season-high 12 assists with seven rebounds and a block in Chicago on Aug. 18, her highest assist total in a game since July 31, 2022. It was the 16th points/assists double-double of her career, passing Sue Bird and Ticha Penicheiro for the second-most by a player through seven career seasons. Ionescu put up 17 points, a game-high six assists and a season-high-tying three steals at Minnesota on Sept. 18, with all three takeaways in the second quarter to set her career high for steals in a single quarter.





LOCKDOWN LEO

Leonie Fiebich returned from a seven-week absence on Aug. 22 against Indiana and set season highs with 20 points and five assists while adding five rebounds and a steal. Fiebich shot 70 percent (7-for-10) from the field and 60 percent (3-for-5) from long range, scoring nine points in the third quarter alone to match her highest-scoring quarter of the season. It was the first game of her career with at least 20 points, five rebounds and five assists. Fiebich scored 11 points on 50 percent (3-for-6) shooting and 66.7 percent (2-for-3) from long range with four rebounds and three assists against Chicago on Aug. 29, recording her 40th career game shooting at least 50 percent from deep on multiple 3-point attempts, the third-most by a player within their first three seasons in WNBA history. Fiebich matched her career high with four steals at Minnesota on Sept. 18, including three in the fourth quarter to tie her career high for takeaways in a single quarter.

MARINE MAGIC

Marine Johannès scored a career-high 27 points off the bench against Las Vegas on Aug. 9, shooting 64.3 percent (9-for-14) from the field and matching her career high with seven 3-pointers on 58.3 percent (7-for-12) from deep. She poured in 20 points in the second half, the highest-scoring half of her career, and tied her career high with four 3-pointers in a quarter in the fourth. Johannès matched the franchise record for 3-pointers off the bench in a single game and became the seventh reserve in WNBA history to knock down seven threes in a game. She also surpassed her previous career highs for 3-pointers (65) and points (281) in a single season. Johannès added 17 points on 66.7 percent (6-for-9) shooting from the field and 62.5 percent (5-for-8) from beyond the arc with five assists in Connecticut on Aug. 15. It was her 14th game in a Liberty uniform with at least five made 3-pointers, the second-most in franchise history behind **Sabrina Ionescu**. She collected her 100th career steal and set a career high for field goals made in a single season, passing her previous best of 100.

Johannès scored 13 points on 50 percent (4-for-8) shooting from beyond the arc at Minnesota on Sept. 18, including 10 in the final 1:30 of the third quarter. She became the first player to score at least 10 points in the final 90 seconds of a quarter since Kahleah Copper on June 7, 2024 and the first Liberty player to do so since Sabrina Ionescu on July 12, 2022. It was her 44th game with three or more made 3-pointers in a Liberty uniform, tying Becky Hammon for the third-most in franchise history.

DOMINANT DUOS

Sabrina Ionescu and **Breanna Stewart** each scored at least 20 points in the same game as teammates for the 18th time on July 28, which is more than twice as many as any other duo in Liberty history. The pair became the third pair of teammates in franchise history to each record at least 25 points and five assists in a game. On June 11, Jones and Stewart also became the second pair of teammates in WNBA history to each record 15 points, 10 rebounds and five assists in a single game, and the first since 2000. Stewart and **Jonquel Jones** each recorded a double-double on Sept. 19 for the 12th time in the same game as teammates, the most by any Liberty duo all-time and the second-most by any pair of teammates in WNBA history.

LAST CALL AT MOHEGAN SUN ARENA

The Liberty closed the book on the franchise's all-time matchup against Connecticut with an 82-75 win on Aug. 15, completing a 3-0 season sweep in the final meeting between the teams before the Sun's planned relocation to Houston for the 2027 WNBA season. New York went on a 15-0 run in the second and held the Sun to 10 points in the period on 17.6 percent (3-for-17) shooting, the second-fewest by a Liberty opponent in any quarter this season. Connecticut shot 35.8 percent (24-for-67) from the field, the third-lowest by a Liberty opponent, and the Sun's 24 made field goals was the second-fewest by a New York opponent in 2026. **Jonquel Jones** tied Tina Charles for the second-most career double-doubles at Mohegan Sun Arena (45), combining regular season and playoffs.





LIBERTY BURN OUT FEVER WITH HOT SHOOTING

The Liberty shot 57.8 percent from the field in a 109-102 win over Indiana on Aug. 22 and became the fifth team in WNBA history to score at least 109 points in regulation three times in a single season. **Breanna Stewart**, **Leonie Fiebich** and **Jonquel Jones** each scored at least 19 points on 50 percent or better shooting, just the third time three Liberty players have done so in franchise history. New York dished out 10 assists in the first quarter to tie its season high for a single quarter then scored 32 points in the third while shooting 76.5 percent (13-for-17) from the field.

STEWIE HITS 3K

Breanna Stewart reached 3,000 points with the Liberty on Aug. 18 in Chicago, becoming the fastest player in WNBA history to score 3,000 points with a single franchise in 145 games. She is also the first player in league history to reach 3,000 points each with multiple franchises. Stewart finished with 22 points for the 72nd 20-point game of her Liberty tenure, passing Cappie Pondexter for second in franchise history.

LIBERTY DOMINATE ACES TO CLINCH SEASON SERIES

The Liberty routed the Aces 111-71 on Aug. 9 for the third-largest margin of victory in franchise history and the team's largest win over Las Vegas all-time. New York's 111 points marked the second time the Liberty topped 110 this season, the first time in franchise history they have done so multiple times in the same year. New York outscored Las Vegas 52-26 in the paint and 13-4 on second-chance points, and the team's 37 points in the fourth quarter set a season high for any quarter. **Chris DeMarco** became the fastest coach in franchise history to 20 wins (33 games).

ALLEN ANSWERS THE CALL

Rebecca Allen made her first Liberty start since 2022 on July 20 at Dallas, recording her 200th career block to become the 12th player in WNBA history with 200 blocks and 200 3-pointers in fewer than 300 games. She added 12 points on 66.7 percent (4-for-6) shooting from the field on Aug. 5, including 10 points in the opening quarter for the highest-scoring first quarter of her career. Allen finished with 11 points on 66.7 percent (4-for-6) shooting at Indiana on Aug. 11 and reached 1,000 points in a Liberty uniform. Allen set a new season high with 14 points in Chicago on Aug. 18, hitting all three of her 3-pointers in the third quarter to tie her season high for made threes.

HAN HEATING UP

Han Xu led the Liberty's reserves with 17 points on 66.7 percent (6-for-9) shooting at Phoenix on Aug. 1, including 50 percent (3-for-6) from deep as she tied her career high for 3-pointers in a game and reached 500 career points. She grabbed a season-high seven rebounds on Aug. 3 and recorded her 22nd block of the season on Aug. 15 to set her career high for blocks in a single season. Han added 12 points and seven rebounds off the bench in Chicago on Aug. 18 to match her season high for rebounds in a game, and also joined **Jonquel Jones** (2018) as the only players in WNBA history to record 30 3-pointers and 20 blocks off the bench in a single season.

Han led all scorers with a season-high 19 points on 75 percent (6-for-8) shooting from the field and 66.7 percent (2-for-3) from deep against Chicago on Aug. 29, her highest-scoring game since July 6, 2022 and the second-highest total of her career. She is the first reserve in the WNBA this season to record 19 points, five rebounds and two blocks in a game and just the second Liberty player to do so off the bench in franchise history, and she became the second player in WNBA history to post that line while shooting 75 percent from the field in under 20 minutes.

TERRIFIC TRIO

Sabrina Ionescu, **Jonquel Jones** and **Breanna Stewart** each scored at least 15 points in the same game for the 15th time on Sept. 18, and no other trio in Liberty franchise history has done so more than five times.





RALLY IN THE DESERT

The Liberty erased a 10-point third-quarter deficit and closed the period on a 12-1 run to take a 94-92 win at Phoenix on Aug. 1, completing a 3-0 season sweep of the Mercury. New York held Phoenix to 25 percent (4-for-16) shooting in the first quarter, matching the lowest field-goal percentage and fewest field goals made by any Liberty opponent in a quarter this season. The Liberty shot 66.7 percent (6-for-9) from beyond the arc in the second half, their best 3-point percentage in any half this season. This was New York's fourth time coming back from an eight-point deficit to win in five games, the first time in franchise history the Liberty recorded four such wins in a five-game span.

JJ RULES THE BOARDS

Jonquel Jones poured in 23 points on Aug. 15 in Connecticut, including 19 before halftime for her highest-scoring half of 2026 and 13 in the second quarter for her highest-scoring quarter of the year. She grabbed a season-high 18 rebounds to go with 11 points, four assists, a block and a steal against Los Angeles on Aug. 13, tying her high for rebounds in a Liberty uniform. It was her sixth game with at least 17 rebounds with New York, twice as many as any other player in franchise history, and the 25th game of her career with at least 15 boards, the fifth-most in WNBA history. Jones posted a double-double of 14 points and 10 rebounds with three blocks and three 3-pointers at Indiana on Aug. 11 while shooting 71.4 percent (5-for-7) from the field and 75 percent (3-for-4) from deep, becoming the first player in franchise history to record that line multiple times in a Liberty uniform. She joined Elena Delle Donne (2019) and Napheesa Collier (2025) as the only players to do it twice in a single season in WNBA history.

STEWART'S BLOCK PARTY CONTINUES

Breanna Stewart blocked two shots on Aug. 1 at Phoenix to pass Kiah Stokes (195) and become the Liberty's all-time franchise blocks leader with 196. Stewart blocked at least one shot in 11 consecutive games through Aug. 9, tied for the longest blocks streak of her career. Stewart became the first player in franchise history to reach 200 blocks on Aug. 9, joining Sylvia Fowles as the only players to record 200 blocks each with multiple franchises.

500 THREES FOR SABRINA

Sabrina Ionescu became the third player in WNBA history to make 500 3-pointers within the first 200 games of her career, reaching the mark in her 199th game on Aug. 1 at Phoenix. She also recorded her fourth career game with 25 points, 10 assists and seven rebounds, and no other player in WNBA history has done so more than twice.

LIBERTY LIGHT UP LOS ANGELES

The Liberty set season highs in points (113), field goals (41) and 3-pointers (17) in a 113-109 win at Los Angeles on July 28, shooting a season-best 58.6 percent from the field and 53.1 percent from beyond the arc. It was New York's highest-scoring game since 2022 and the second-highest total in franchise history, as well as the highest scoring total in a regulation game by a team with a first-year head coach in WNBA history. New York outscored the Sparks 18-5 in second-chance points and allowed just 21 rebounds, the fewest by any Liberty opponent this season.

MVP SWEEP FOR JONES

Jonquel Jones was named Most Valuable Player of the 2026 WNBA All-Star Game, becoming the first player in WNBA history to win WNBA MVP (2021), Commissioner's Cup MVP (2023), Finals MVP (2024) and All-Star MVP (2026). Jones is the first Liberty player in franchise history to win All-Star MVP and just the fourth All-Star reserve to earn the honor. She finished with 22 points, 13 rebounds, eight assists and three 3-pointers to become the first player in WNBA All-Star Game history to post that stat line. It was her fourth career All-Star double-double, the most in WNBA All-Star Game history, and her third 20-point All-Star performance, tying Maya Moore for the most all-time.





DEPTH DELIVERS

The Liberty's reserves scored 58 points against Las Vegas on Aug. 9, the third-highest bench scoring total in franchise history and New York's highest since 2016. **Marine Johannès** scored a career-high 27 points while matching the franchise record for 3-pointers off the bench in a single game with seven, also tying her career high. **Rebekah Gardner** put up 11 points and a season-high seven rebounds, including four offensive boards, while **Marine Fauthoux** dished out a career-high nine assists, including seven in the second half.

The Liberty's reserves previously outscored the Los Angeles bench 41-19 on July 28, with Gardner (15), **Han Xu** (13) and Fauthoux (13) each scoring 13 points, marking the second time in franchise history that three Liberty reserves have done so in a game. Gardner shot 83.3 percent (5-for-6) from the field in her highest-scoring game since July 23, 2022 while making her 100th field goal in a Liberty uniform and recording her 25th double-digit scoring game. Han set a career high with three 3-pointers and finished +29, tied for the third-highest plus-minus by a Liberty reserve. Fauthoux set her career high with 13 points, including 10 in the fourth for the highest-scoring quarter of her career.

SAB STEPS UP IN CLUTCH TIME

Sabrina Ionescu scored 12 points in overtime to tie the WNBA record for points in a single overtime period on July 20 at Dallas, shooting a perfect 5-for-5 from the field to also match the league mark for made field goals without a miss in an overtime period. For the second straight game, the Liberty erased a 12-point deficit to win by a single point, rallying past the Chicago Sky 95-94 on July 22. New York became just the third team in WNBA history to overcome an eight-point deficit in the final minute of regulation, and the comeback from 12 down in the final five minutes was the first in franchise history and the seventh in WNBA history. Sabrina Ionescu scored the Liberty's final nine points and 13 in the fourth, finishing with a season-high 29 points while passing Vickie Johnson (3,246) for the second-most points in franchise history. She became the second player in WNBA history to score at least nine points in the final minute of a game where her team was trailing and came back to win, and the first to do so in a regulation win.

STEWART SHATTERING RECORD BOOKS

Breanna Stewart passed Tari Phillips (1,077) for the third-most rebounds in Liberty franchise history on July 11 at Minnesota. Stewart posted 33 points with season-highs of 13 rebounds and eight assists at Dallas on July 20, joining Tina Thompson as the only players in WNBA history with 33 points, 13 rebounds and eight assists in a game. With her 1,000th career assist, Stewart became the fastest player in WNBA history to reach 6,000 points, 2,500 rebounds and 1,000 assists (317 games) and just the fifth player all-time to reach those marks. Stewart added 20 points, nine rebounds and three blocks against Chicago on July 22 to become the first player in franchise history with three consecutive games of at least 20 points, eight rebounds and two blocks. She passed Cappie Pondexter (2,971) for fourth on the Liberty's franchise scoring list on Aug. 13.

TWO-TIME CUP CHAMPIONS

The New York Liberty became the first team in WNBA history to win multiple Commissioner's Cup Championships, beating the Las Vegas Aces 93-85 on June 30 at Barclays Center. **Breanna Stewart** posted a double-double of 25 points and 11 rebounds as she became the first player to win multiple Cup MVP awards and the first to win the Commissioner's Cup Championship three times. **Sabrina Ionescu** scored 26 points, the second-highest single-game total in Cup Championship history, and became the first player to record at least 20 points, five rebounds and five assists. **Pauline Astier** set the rookie scoring record for a Commissioner's Cup Championship with 15 points.

STREAKING INTO THE RECORD BOOKS

New York scored at least 90 points in a WNBA-record 10 consecutive games through Aug. 13, the longest such streak in WNBA history. The Liberty also reached 10 second-chance points in a franchise-record 17 straight games.





SECOND-CHANCE POINTS SPUR LIBERTY TO COMEBACK WIN IN DALLAS

The Liberty rallied from 12 points down to beat Dallas 99-98 in overtime on July 20, snapping the Wings' six-game win streak. New York set season highs with 48 rebounds, 17 offensive rebounds and 30 second-chance points while committing a season-low eight turnovers. The Liberty outscored Dallas 30-6 in second-chance points, tied for the second-largest second-chance point differential by any team in the past three seasons. **Marine Fauthoux**, **Breanna Stewart** and **Jonquel Jones** each posted a double-double, the first time three teammates have done so in the same game since 2023 and just the 10th time in WNBA history. Jones set her season high with seven offensive rebounds.

FRENCH GUARDS FUEL LIBERTY ON ROAD TRIP

Marine Johannès led all scorers with 12 points in the first quarter at Indiana on July 18, matching her highest-scoring quarter of the season and tying her career high with four 3-pointers in a single quarter. Johannès passed Sugar Rodgers (257) for the fifth-most made 3-pointers in Liberty franchise history and moved past Rodgers and Shameka Christon (40) for the fourth-most games with three or more made triples. She also recorded a steal for the sixth consecutive game, the longest single-season steals streak of her career. **Pauline Astier** tied her career high with three steals in Indiana and set her career high for steals in a three-game span with seven. She became the fastest Liberty rookie since Crystal Robinson in 1999 to reach 250 career points, doing so in 26 games. **Marine Fauthoux** scored the first points of her WNBA career in Indiana and added a career-high four assists off the bench. She posted career highs of 10 points and 10 rebounds on July 20 to become the first rookie guard in WNBA history to record 10 points, 10 rebounds and two 3-pointers off the bench, and just the seventh rookie overall.

IONESCU'S SCORING STRETCH

Sabrina Ionescu posted season highs of 28 points, eight assists and three steals to go with four rebounds on 50 percent shooting (9-for-18) at Toronto on July 12, becoming the only player this season and one of three players in WNBA history to record at least 25 points, five assists, four rebounds and two steals in consecutive games. She set her season high for 3-pointers in a single quarter with four in the first at Los Angeles on July 28, and after knocking down three in the final minute against Chicago on July 22, became the second Liberty player in the last 20 seasons to record consecutive quarters with three or more made 3-pointers, joining **Jonquel Jones**.

JONES JOINS JACKSON, SOLIDIFYING STATUS AS PREMIER SHOOTING CENTER

Jonquel Jones became the second center all-time to reach 400 made 3-pointers, joining Lauren Jackson, while recording her fourth consecutive double-double on July 12. Jones posted at least seven rebounds and a 3-pointer in six straight games from June 28 to July 12, tied for the third-longest such streak in franchise history. She connected on her 200th 3-pointer in a Liberty uniform on Aug. 9 while becoming the first player in the WNBA this year to record multiple quarters of 12 points, three rebounds and multiple 3-pointers while shooting 65 percent from the field.

STEWIE STUMPS LEAGUE'S TOP DEFENSE

Breanna Stewart scored a season-high 36 points on 73.7 percent (14-for-19) shooting in a 99-86 win over the league-leading Minnesota Lynx on July 3, including 16 points on a perfect 7-for-7 in the first to become the first player this season to score over 15 points in an opening quarter without missing a shot.

CLUTCH WIN IN CHICAGO

Sabrina Ionescu hit a game-winner with 10.3 seconds left to lift New York to a 96-95 win at Chicago on June 17 for the team's largest comeback of the season after trailing by 15. It was the Liberty's first road comeback from a 15-point deficit since Game 3 of the 2024 WNBA Finals, with Ionescu hitting game-winners in both contests.





ASTIER ASCENDS

Pauline Astier put up 17 points, five assists and four rebounds on 80 percent (4-for-5) shooting in 21 minutes off the bench on June 21 at Los Angeles, becoming the first rookie in WNBA history to record such a stat line off the bench in a single game and the first player all-time to do so in less than 25 minutes. She recorded a career-high three steals on June 25 at Seattle. Astier became the fourth player in the last 10 seasons to total 200 points, 75 assists, 60 rebounds and 15 steals through her first 20 career games, joining Caitlin Clark, Paige Bueckers and Olivia Miles. She recorded 16 points, five assists and a career-high eight rebounds on June 11 at Atlanta, including nine points, seven rebounds and three assists in the first half alone to become the first rookie in franchise history to record such a stat line in a single half, and the first WNBA rookie to do so since Caitlin Clark in 2024.

JJ'S JUNE TO REMEMBER

Jonquel Jones dominated during the month of June, averaging 17.4 points, 8.9 rebounds, 2.6 assists and 1.9 blocks per game while shooting 60.2 percent (59-for-98) from the field and 45.5 percent (25-for-55) from deep in 10 games. Jones opened the month by becoming the first player in WNBA history to record 17 rebounds and four made 3-pointers in a single game, going for 22 points and 17 boards against Toronto on June 3 with the first halftime double-double of her Liberty regular-season career. She also recorded three straight games with at least three 3-pointers, 15 points and a block from June 11-17 to match the longest such streak in WNBA history.

RECORD-SETTING RETURN

In her first game back from a seven-game absence, **Sabrina Ionescu** grabbed the 1,000th rebound of her career on June 14 to become the fastest player in WNBA history to reach 3,000 points, 1,000 rebounds and 1,000 assists. Ionescu hit the mark in her 183rd career game, 60 games faster than the next-quickest player, Jackie Young (243).

LIBERTY DEFENSE LOCKS UP MYSTICS

In an 86-64 win on June 14, the Liberty held the Mystics to a season-low 64 points on 33.8 percent shooting, the lowest field-goal percentage by any New York opponent this season. New York set a season high of 10 blocks and matched a season high with nine steals, just the second time in franchise history the team recorded 10 blocks and nine steals in a game. All 11 Liberty players to check in scored at least four points, the first time in franchise history that 11 different players reached four points each in a single game.

LIBERTY RESERVES DOMINATING FROM DEEP

Han Xu scored 12 points on 100 percent (4-for-4) shooting from the field while connecting on both of her attempts from long range on June 23 against Las Vegas. She scored 10 points in the third quarter alone, spurring a 17-4 Liberty run as she recorded the second double-digit scoring quarter of her career and became the ninth player in franchise history to score at least 12 points off the bench on perfect shooting from the field in a game. **Marine Johannès** set her career high with seven 3-pointers on May 27 and set the franchise record for 3-pointers through the first nine games of a season with 29, which was previously held by **Sabrina Ionescu** in the first nine games of the 2023 season as she went on to set the WNBA single-season record with 128 made threes. Johannès connected on at least one 3-pointer in 14 consecutive games from May 25 to June 28, marking the longest streak of her career.

STEWIE CELEBRATES ELLIE'S BIRTHDAY WITH A BLOCK PARTY

Breanna Stewart recorded her 100th career double-double on June 14 against Washington, finishing with 14 points, 12 rebounds and a career-high seven blocks to become the first player since 2024 to record at least seven blocks in a game. Stewart accumulated 11 points, 10 rebounds and five blocks before halftime alone, becoming the second player in WNBA history to post that line in any half.





The 2026 season marks the 30th anniversary of the Liberty as one of the WNBA's three remaining original franchises. The organization is bringing the historic campaign to life by celebrating the trailblazers, moments, and community that have defined the organization since 1997.

Throughout the season, the Liberty are celebrating the franchise's legacy with commemorative merchandise, in-arena giveaways, community events, theme nights, and original storytelling that highlight the special people and moments that have defined the Liberty's journey. New York will honor the legendary Liberty players who made significant contributions to the Liberty's tradition of excellence and played pivotal roles in some of the most memorable moments and seasons in the franchise's 30-year history.

Anchored by a "30 Seasons" throwback-inspired logo, the campaign's visual identity blends the franchise's earliest influences with a modernized aesthetic. The bold "30" symbolizes three decades of continuity and strength, incorporating the original orange torch from the Liberty's original Lady Liberty primary logo, representing both the origins of the franchise and the energy that continues to drive it forward. Angular crown details, accented with the team's original blue colorway, pay homage to the Liberty's foundational era and trailblazing spirit since 1997. A star set on the finger of the torch-bearing fist stands as a symbol of the Liberty's 2024 WNBA Championship, capturing a defining moment in franchise history. Completed with a contemporary color palette and dimensional accents, the logo blends retro inspiration with modern design, capturing the movement of the city and the momentum of the team today.

The "30 Seasons" mark appears across merchandise, in-arena branding, digital platforms, and storytelling moments, serving as a unifying symbol that connects generations of players and fans through a shared past and a collective future.



BROOKLYN BASKETBALL



Brooklyn Basketball opened the 18,600 sq. ft. Brooklyn Basketball Training Center in September of 2025 and since then, the initiative has continued to grow and expand their reach across New York.

This marks the third year of the partnership between Brooklyn Basketball and the NYC Department of Education on an innovative program that gives elementary and middle school students access to free, in-school basketball clinics. This year alone, the program has reached over 23,000 youth across 170 schools and is on track to exceed 35,000 students by the end of 2026. In addition to schools, Brooklyn Basketball has partnered with organizations like the YMCA and Boys & Girls Clubs to bring community-based clinics to neighborhoods across Brooklyn, making the game more accessible.

Brooklyn Basketball also brings schools to the Brooklyn Basketball Training Center for programs during the school day. To date, the training center has hosted over 1,600 students from 24 schools, many of whom do not have their own facilities, for on-site experiences. The center has also hosted after-school programs, weekend training, camps, all-girls programs and other activations, while making space for students to finish homework and address other needs before and after training.

The multi-court youth basketball training facility is the first in the tri-state area to use Shoot 360 technology. Shoot 360, a leader in basketball innovation and skill development, uses advanced ball detection technology that is leveraged by teams across the WNBA and NBA, and now by the training center as well. The technology utilizes interactive features and physical activity to measure participants' skillset and analyzes performance data for suggestions on how participants can improve their game. Empowering youth with this technology aligns directly with Brooklyn Basketball's mission to deliver high-quality, inclusive, and accessible basketball programming.

The Brooklyn Basketball Training Center is right across the street from Barclays Center on Flatbush Avenue, providing the Liberty and the Nets a unique opportunity to impact children, families, schools and programs across New York.

CHRIS DEMARCO

NEW YORK LIBERTY HEAD COACH
1ST SEASON WITH NEW YORK | 1ST SEASON IN WNBA

Four-time NBA Champion Chris DeMarco was named the 10th head coach in New York Liberty franchise history on December 3, 2025. DeMarco arrives in Brooklyn following 14 seasons with the Golden State Warriors, where he won NBA titles in 2015, 2017, 2018, and 2022. He joined Golden State under Mark Jackson in 2012 and was retained by Steve Kerr, working across player development, assistant coaching, and defensive roles during the Warriors' championship era.

In Golden State, DeMarco played a pivotal role on Steve Kerr's coaching staff, largely focusing on the team's individual skill development and systems, that ultimately culminated in one of the most successful dynasties in modern basketball history. During DeMarco's tenure, Golden State's defense held opponents to the league's second-lowest shot quality over the past 10 seasons (49.9% qSQ), per Second Spectrum. The Warriors also led the league in net rating three times during that span and won an NBA single-season record 73 games in the 2015-16 season.

In addition to his NBA success, DeMarco has served as head coach of the Bahamas Men's National Team since 2019. Under his leadership, the team achieved its most significant victory in program history, defeating host Argentina in the 2024 Olympic Pre-Qualifying Tournament final. He has also been a featured coach at Basketball Without Borders (BWB) Americas, mentoring top international prospects and advancing the game globally.

The 2026 campaign is DeMarco's first as a WNBA head coach after beginning his professional career with the Warriors in video and scouting before advancing to Director of Player Development and ultimately serving as an assistant coach.

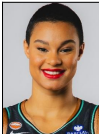
