WE'RE GOING STREAKING!: The Mercury are currently enjoying a 17-game home win streak..... including the 2014 WNBA Playoffs, the streak is 22 games.....the Mercury have not lost at US Airways Center since May 23, 2014 when San Antonio topped Phoenix, 78-74.....the streak began with a 100-78 win vs. Tulsa on May 30, 2014.....a win tonight vs. Connecticut would tie Phoenix with Seattle and Minnesota for the third-longest home win streak in WNBA history.

THE BIG THREE: Mercury forward **DeWanna Bonner** currently sits fourth on the all-time Mercury scoring list with 2,711 career points.....she is just 82 points shy of **Jennifer Gillom** for third-place on the Mercury all-time scoring list and just 289 points away from her 3,000th career point.

A WEEK TO REMEMBER: Forward **DeWanna Bonner** was named WNBA Western Conference Player of the Week for June 5 - June 14.....it marked the fourth career WNBA Player of the Week honor for Bonner, and her first such award since September 2, 2012..... for the four games during the first week of the season, Bonner averaged 19.3 points, 6.3 rebounds, 2.8 assists and 1.5 steals.....Bonner has scored 21 or more points and grabbed six or more rebounds in three of the first four games of the season.

LEILAN-THREE: Mercury guard **Leilani Mitchell** connected on a career-high 7-of-10 three-point field goals on 6/12 at Indiana en route to scoring a career-high 25 points.....the seven three-pointers are the most by any WNBA player in a game this season..... over the last two games, Mitchell is shooting 10-of-15 (66.7-percent) from beyond the three-point arc.....her 11 three-pointers made this season are the most in the WNBA.

DEFENSE WINS CHAMPIONSHIPS: The Mercury are second in the WNBA in steals per game (10.00) and also have the fewest turnovers per game (11.75) in the league.....as a team, the Mercury's steal-to-turnover ratio is 0.85, tops in the WNBA this season.

WARM WELCOME TO THE W: WNBA rookie **Cayla Francis** scored 10 points in her debut on 6/5 vs. San Antonio.....she became the first Mercury rookie to score 10 or more points in a debut since **Brittney Griner** scored 17 points in her debut on May 27, 2013.....Francis currently ranks 2nd among WNBA rookies in rebounding (5.8 rpg) and 6th among rookies in scoring (6.3 ppg).

20/20 VISION: Mercury forward **Candice Dupree** entered the 2015 season ranked 20th on the WNBA All-Time scoring list and moved past her former Mercury teammate **Penny Taylor** in the first game of the season for 19th on the list.

ROOKIE ROUNDUP: The Mercury open the 2015 regular season with three WNBA rookies on the roster.....**Cayla Francis** (free agent), **Alex Harden** (2015 Draft, 18th overall pick) and **Tess Madgen** (free agent) all made their WNBA debuts with their first appearances of the 2015 season.....Francis and Madgen have each played professionally in Australia and Europe.

COACHING STAFF: Mercury head coach **Sandy Brondello** returns for her second year with the Mercury.....Brondello's option for the 2016 season was picked up on May 21, 2015.....Brondello is assisted by **Julie Hairgrove** (11th season) and **Todd Troxel** (2nd season).....Brondello has a career record of 45-27 as head coach in the WNBA and a 31-7 record with the Mercury as head coach.

PHOENIX MERCURY NEWS AND NOTES

MS. 3,000: Mercury forward **Monique Currie** scored her 3,000th career point on 6/5 vs. San Antonio..... she became the 49th player in WNBA history to reach the 3,000 point plateau.....Currie is in her 10th WNBA season and her first with Phoenix.

FIRST TIME FOR EVERYTHING: Head coach **Sandy Brondello** last season became the first former WNBA player to win a WNBA Championship as a head coach.....she also became the first head coach in Mercury history to be named WNBA Coach of the Year.

TROPHY CASE: The Mercury won their third WNBA Championship in 2014 and became the third franchise in the 19-year history of the league with three or more championships.....the Houston Comets (1997, 1998, 1999, 2000) and Detroit Shock (now Tulsa) (2003, 2006, 2008) are the other two.

NEW TO THE MIGHTY MERCURY: The Mercury have seven new players on the roster for 2015: **Shameka Christon** (free agent), **Monique Currie** (free agent), **Cayla Francis** (free agent), **Alex Harden** (2015 Draft, 18th overall pick), **Tess Madgen** (free agent), **Leilani Mitchell** (free agent) and **Noelle Quinn** (free agent).

GONE FROM 2014: Players no longer on the team from the 2014 team include: **Anete Jekabsone-Zogota** (free agent), **Ewelina Kobryn** (free agent), **Shay Murphy** (free agent), **Erin Phillips** (signed with Los Angeles) and **Penny Taylor** (free agent).....**Diana Taruasi** is currently on the suspended list (rest) and will sit out the entire 2015 season.

UPDATE YOUR CALENDARS: The August 9th game at Chicago has been moved to an 11 a.m. start (Phoenix time) and will air on ESPN.

PURPLE FOR PRIDE: The Phoenix Mercury will wear their purple uniforms tonight as they host its second annual Pride Night, brought to you by Simple.....the purple uniforms will show support of LGBT youth and anti-bullying.....fans will also have the chance to purchase a Mercury PRIDE shirt in the Team Shop.....Pride Night festivities will tip off with the Phoenix Gay Men's Chorus singing the National Anthem.....the first 4,000 fans in attendance will receive a special double-sided "Proud Mercury X-Factor" placard that will include the statement: "I'm Proud of ____".....fans can fill in their placard at each entrance to the arena.....as a part of the organization's commitment to equality, a number of LGBT organizations will be

honored throughout the night including the Greater Phoenix Gay and Lesbian Chamber of Commerce, One'n'Ten, and Phoenix Pride.....ONE Community will also show a Unity Pledge video recapping all of the work the organization has done for the LGBT community in 2014.

#VOTEMERC: WNBA All-Star Balloting 2015 presented by Boost Mobile launched on Wednesday.....fans can vote on multiple digital platforms, including WNBA.com, the WNBA app, Twitter and Facebook.....WNBA All-Star Balloting previously included 30 players from each conference, now fans will choose from the entire WNBA player pool when voting.....Boost Mobile WNBA All-Star 2015 will take place at Mohegan Sun Arena in Uncasville, Conn. on Saturday, July 25 at 12:30 p.m. Phoenix time and will be televised by ESPN.....**Candice Dupree** (2006, 2007, 2009, 2014), **Brittney Griner** (2013, 2014) are the only two Mercury players with All-Star experience.....**Monique Currie** was selected to the "WNBA All-Star Team" in 2010 in a pre-Olympic exhibition against Team USA.....Mercury head coach **Sandy Brondello** along with assistants **Julie Hairgrove** and **Todd Troxel** will coach the Western Conference All-Star team this year.....a complete list of Phoenix Mercury All-Star history can be found on page 65 of the 2015 Phoenix Mercury Media Guide.

SECOND SEASON AS HEAD COACH OF PHOENIX • THIRD SEASON AS WNBA HEAD COACH



Veteran WNBA player, coach and former Australian Olympian Sandy Brondello (braun-DELL-oh) was named the ninth head coach in franchise history on November 15, 2013. Brondello also serves as the team's vice president of player personnel. On May 21, 2015, the Mercury exercised the option on her contract for the 2016 season.

Known for her intense preparation for each opponent, Brondello had a record-breaking rookie season as head coach. She was named WNBA Coach of the Year on August 22, 2014 marking the first time a Mercury coach picked up the honor. She led the team to a WNBA regular season-record 29 wins and capped the season with a WNBA Championship.

A ten-year veteran of the WNBA coaching ranks, Brondello has been affiliated with the league for 16 of the league's 19 seasons, including her time as a player. A proven winner internationally and in the WNBA, her ten total years as an assistant coach and head coach have featured seven playoff appearances, including four conference finals berths, the 2014 WNBA Championship and a spot in the 2008 WNBA Finals. Brondello joins the Mercury after most recently serving as lead assistant coach for the Los Angeles Sparks (2011-13) under 2012 WNBA Coach of the Year Carol Ross. Brondello led the San Antonio Silver Stars to a 2010 playoff berth in her lone season at the helm following five seasons on the Silver Stars bench as an assistant under Dan Hughes (2005-09), the third-winningest coach in league history.

During the WNBA offseason, Brondello serves as an assistant coach with Russian League team UMMC Ekaterinburg. Now the Mercury's head of player personnel, Phoenix's pro scouting efforts are buoyed by Brondello's knowledge of and exposure to overseas talent.

Brondello finished a stellar 17-year professional playing career with a five-year run in the WNBA in which she played for Detroit (1998-99), Miami (2001-02) and Seattle (2003), and was named a 1999 WNBA All-Star. She began her career with the Women's National Basketball League (WNBL) in Australia (1986-96), and was named the league MVP in 1995. The 5-7 guard was a 10-time German Cup champion while playing with BTV Wuppertal (1992-2002), a three-time European Cup All-Star selection (1994, 1996, 1997), and the 1996 European Cup MVP when she led her team to the title.

An 18-year member of the Australian National Team, Brondello is a four-time Olympian, a two-time silver medalist (2000, 2004) and was named the 1992 Australian International Player of the Year. In her time with the national team, she was a teammate of Mercury forward Penny Taylor.

Brondello is married to Olaf Lange, who is the head coach of UMMC Ekaterinburg, and the couple has two children, Brody and Jayda.
