- Each team has protected their home floor in the 2015 edition of the series in convincing fashion, Phoenix won by 15 on June 14 and Minnesota won by 15 on June 27.
- Phoenix snapped a ten-game regular season losing streak against Minnesota on June 15, 2014 at Target Center (80-72). The Mercury went 3-1 against the Lynx last season and have won four of the last five regular season meetings.
- Phoenix and Minnesota met in the 2014 Western Conference Finals for the third consecutive season. Minnesota swept the previous two playoff series and Phoenix snapped that streak with a 2-1 series win.

THE BIG THREE: Forward **DeWanna Bonner** passed Mercury great **Jennifer Gillom** for third-place on the Mercury all-time scoring list on June 30 vs. San Antonio night with a layin in the third quarter and only eight points away from her 3,000th career point.....Gillom played 184 games in a Mercury uniform while Bonner has played 220 career games, all with Phoenix.

IF IT'S FREE, IT'S FOR DB: Forward **DeWanna Bonner** currently has made 52 consecutive free throws dating back to July 10, marking the longest such streak in team history and the fourth-longest streak in WNBA history.....Bonner is shooting 90.8-percent (119-of-131) from the free throw line this season, which is 6th in the league.....three times during the streak, Bonner has made ten or more free throws in a single game.

COMEBACK KIDS: The Mercury have recorded comebacks of ten or more points in four games this season, including three of the last four games.....the 19-point comeback on July 28 vs. Chicago tied the largest comeback in team history (June 22, 1999 vs. Washington).....the last time a WNBA team came back from 19 points down to win a game was August 25, 2013 when Los Angeles won at home vs. Tulsa, 90-88 in double overtime.

SHOOTING STARS: The Mercury have shot above 50-percent from the field seven times this season and are 7-0 in such games.....Phoenix currently ranks fourth in the league in field goal percentage, shooting 43.4-percent.....as a team, Phoenix has not allowed an opponent to shoot above 50-percent all season and the Mercury defense is holding opponents to shooting 39.4-percent, second-lowest in the league.

PHOENIX MERCURY NEWS AND NOTES

MAKE MINE A DOUBLE: Mercury center **Brittney Griner** has four double-doubles in 13 games this season.....her most recent double-double came on August 4 vs. Tulsa when she scored 18 points and grabbed 13 rebounds.....her four double-doubles is tied for 7th in the league.....Griner and **Sancho Lyttle** (4 double-doubles in 12 games) of Atlanta are the only two players in the WNBA to rank in the top ten in double-doubles in the WNBA having played less than 16 games this season.

AIN'T NOTHIN BUT A "BG" THANG: Mercury center **Brittney Griner** has 58 blocked shots in just 13 games this season.....her average of 4.46 is the highest in the WNBA--1.79 blocks per game more than **LaToya Sanders** of Washington who ranks second with 2.67 blocks per game..... Griner has more blocks than any player in the league despite playing in just 13 of 20 Phoenix games this season.....the WNBA record for blocks per game for a season is 3.80 by **Margo Dydek** in 1998.....only seven times in *NBA* history has a player averaged more blocks per game for a season than Griner is currently averaging.

WNBA JAM: Mercury center **Brittney Griner** dunked for the fifth time in her 74-game WNBA career on July 5 at Los Angeles.....according to Elias Sports Bureau, there have been 11 total dunks in WNBA history and only one other player--**Candace Parker**--has two career dunks.....Griner dunked in 2014 on July 15 vs. Washington and July 6 at Los Angeles.....she also recorded dunks last year in Game 2 of the Western Conference Semifinals vs. Los Angeles and in the WNBA All-Star Game.....in 2013, she dunked twice in her WNBA debut on May 27 vs. Chicago.

ROOKIE ROUNDUP: The Mercury opened the 2015 regular season with three WNBA rookies on the roster.....**Cayla Francis** (free agent), **Alex Harden** (2015 Draft, 18th overall pick) and **Tess Madgen** (free agent) all made their WNBA debuts with their first appearances of the season..... with the debut of **Marta Xargay** on July 5 in Los Angeles, the Mercury have had four players on their roster play in their first WNBA game this season.

BG'S BLOCK PARTY: Mercury center **Brittney Griner** has quickly moved up the Mercury all-time list for career blocked shots.....in her third season, Griner is second on the Mercury all-time list with 268 career blocked shots, second only to **Diana Taurasi** who has 271 career blocks.....Griner set a single-season WNBA record with 129 blocked shots in 2014.....Griner has 20 career games with five or more blocks and 10 career games with six or more blocks.....has four or more blocks in 40 of 74 career games.

TREY-LANI MITCHELL: Mercury guard **Leilani Mitchell** currently leads the WNBA in three-point shooting, hitting 46.9-percent of her three-pointers this season.....she is the only player in the WNBA shooting above 43-percent.....she connected on a career-high 7-of-10 three-point field goals on June 12 at Indiana en route to scoring a career-high 25 points.....the seven three-pointers are the tied with **Kristi Toliver** of Los Angeles for the most by any WNBA player in a game this season.

COACHING STAFF: Mercury head coach **Sandy Brondello** returns for her second year with the Mercury.....Brondello's option for the 2016 season was picked up on May 21, 2015.....Brondello is assisted by **Julie Hairgrove** (11th season) and **Todd Troxel** (2nd season).....Brondello has a career record of 56-32 as head coach in the WNBA and a 42-12 record with the Mercury as head coach.

HEY NOW, YOU'RE AN ALL-STAR: Three members of the Phoenix Mercury team along with the Phoenix coaching staff helped the Western Conference pick up the win at Boost Mobile WNBA All-Star 2015 on July 26 at Mohegan Sun Arena, in Uncasville, Conn.....**DeWanna Bonner** (2 points, 5 assists), **Candice Dupree** (6 points) and **Brittney Griner** (21 points, 9 rebounds) all chipped in for the West win.....as a result of winning the WNBA's Western Conference last season, Mercury head coach **Sandy Brondello** served as head coach of the Western Conference All-Star team.....Brondello was a member of the WNBA Eastern Conference All-Star team in 1999 and became the first former WNBA All-Star to serve as head coach for an All-Star team in WNBA history.....she was joined by her assistants, **Julie Hairgrove** and **Todd Troxel**, and, head athletic trainer, **Tamara Poole**.

SECOND SEASON AS HEAD COACH OF PHOENIX • THIRD SEASON AS WNBA HEAD COACH



Veteran WNBA player, coach and former Australian Olympian Sandy Brondello (braun-DELL-oh) was named the ninth head coach in franchise history on November 15, 2013. Brondello also serves as the team's vice president of player personnel. On May 21, 2015, the Mercury exercised the option on her contract for the 2016 season.

Known for her intense preparation for each opponent, Brondello had a record-breaking rookie season as head coach. She was named WNBA Coach of the Year on August 22, 2014 marking the first time a Mercury coach picked up the honor. She led the team to a WNBA regular season-record 29 wins and capped the season with a WNBA Championship. In 2015, she led the Western Conference All-Star team to a 117-112 win at Boost Mobile WNBA All-Star 2015.

A ten-year veteran of the WNBA coaching ranks, Brondello has been affiliated with the league for 16 of the league's 19 seasons, including her time as a player. A proven winner internationally and in the WNBA, her ten total years as an assistant coach and head coach have featured seven playoff appearances, including four conference finals berths, the 2014 WNBA Championship and a spot in the 2008 WNBA Finals. Brondello joins the Mercury after most recently serving as lead assistant coach for the Los Angeles Sparks (2011-13) under 2012 WNBA Coach of the Year Carol Ross. Brondello led the San Antonio Silver Stars to a 2010 playoff berth in her lone season at the helm following five seasons on the Silver Stars bench as an assistant under Dan Hughes (2005-09), the third-winningest coach in league history.

During the WNBA offseason, Brondello serves an assistant coach with Russian League team UMMC Ekaterinburg. Now the Mercury's head of player personnel, Phoenix's pro scouting efforts are buoyed by Brondello's knowledge of and exposure to overseas talent.

Brondello finished a stellar 17-year professional playing career with a five-year run in the WNBA in which she played for Detroit (1998-99), Miami (2001-02) and Seattle (2003), and was named a 1999 WNBA All-Star. She began her career with the Women's National Basketball League (WNBL) in Australia (1986-96), and was named the league MVP in 1995. The 5-7 guard was a 10-time German Cup champion while playing with BTV Wuppertal (1992-2002), a three-time European Cup All-Star selection (1994, 1996, 1997), and the 1996 European Cup MVP when she led her team to the title.

An 18-year member of the Australian National Team, Brondello is a four-time Olympian, a two-time silver medalist (2000, 2004) and was named the 1992 Australian International Player of the Year. In her time with the national team, she was a teammate of Mercury forward Penny Taylor.

Brondello is married to Olaf Lange, who is the head coach of UMMC Ekaterinburg, and the couple has two children, Brody and Jayda.
