The back page is the Media Cheat Sheet roster, complete with head shots to help you quickly identify our players.

What about box scores? Some folks like to see the box score from the previous game in Game Notes, while some folks like to peruse all of that season's box scores. Some like to see the box scores from previous meetings between the two teams playing today.

Given all these possibilities, we have decided not to include any box scores in an effort to rid the planet of unnecessary paper waste. Box Scores are located on line

Each player on the roster has at least one page of info in this document.

Included in these are ...

- Notes from the 2020 season
- Notes from previous seasons
- Streaks that paint a statistical picture of the player's most recent efforts.
- Singe-season and career highs.

Additional information is available on each player's online biography, but these should give you what you need to cover the game.

Season Notes

This area is divided into three primary sections.

As the season progresses, the first notes will be super specific to this year's team and players, and should tell the story of the season, essentially answering the question, "Why do the Aces have the record they have?"

The second section contains interesting milestones or tidbits about this year's team or individuals.

The third section includes information from recent seasons that might (in theory) still have relevance to this year's team.

WELCOME ADDITIONS

Las Vegas added two key free agents to the roster in the offseason signing five-time All-Star and two-time Olympian Angel McCoughtry, and three-time All-Star Danielle Robinson.

GONE STREAKING

Lindsay Allen

Began the season making 11 of 21 shots over her first 3 games, and averaged 8.7 points per game, but since has gone 2 for 11 from the field over her last 5 games, while averaging 1.2 points ... Handed out a season-high tying 7 assists vs. Minnesota on August 13, after handing out 10 in her previous 6 games ...

Cierra Burdick

Prior to checking in for the Aces on August 5, 2020, last played in the WNBA on September 2, 2017 with the San Antonio Stars ...

Dearica Hamby

Over her first three years in the W, made 41.2 percent of her shots from the field and averaged 7.5 points per game, but since the team moved to Las Vegas, she is connecting on 50.9 percent of her shots, and is averaging 9.5 points per game ... Is 6 of her last 15 from the field (.400) after making 34 of her first 57 shots on the year (.596) ...

Megan Huff

Saw her first action for the Aces at New York on August 9, and has played in all 3 games since she joined the team ...

Kayla McBride

Is 10 for her last 20 from the field over 2 games for 32 points after making 2 of her previous 13 from the field over 2 games for 7 points ... Is 1 of her last 10 from three-point range after making 8 of her previous 16 ...

Angel McCoughtry

At the age of 33, and in her 11th season in the league, is averaging career highs in field goal percentage (.571), three-point field goal percentage (.500) and free throw percentage (.857) ... Went 1 for 4 from the field and scored 4 points vs. Dallas on August 2, but has made 33 of her last 55 shots from the field since (.600) ...

Danielle Robinson

Has 14 assists over her last 5 games after handing out 5 in her first 4 games ... Went 6 for 7 from the free throw line at Washington on August 5, but is a combined 6 of 7 in her other 8 games ... Has made 5 of her last 10 shots from the field after going 2 for 8 at New York on August 9 ...

Sugar Rodgers

Has made 4 of her last 9 shots from the field, including 2 of 5 from long distance for 10 points over 3 games, after going 1 for 8 and 0 for 5 for 3 points in her previous 4 games ...

Carolyn Swords

Went to the free throw line 8 times in the first 4 games, but has not been to the line since ...

A’ja Wilson

Went 10 for 16 vs. Minnesota on August 13 after going 5 for 17 from the field at Indiana the previous game ... Started the year making 14 of 23 shots from the free throw line (.609), but is 33 of 41 since (.805) ... Has 11 blocks in the last 4 games after blocking just 1 in the first 5 games of the season ...

Jackie Young

Has 12 assists in her last 4 games after handing out 8 in the first 5 games of the year ... Has made 25 of her last 43 shots from the field (.581) over 4 games after starting the year making 9 of 23 (.391) in 5 games ... Has gone to the line 14 times over her past 3 games after taking 11 shots from the free throw line during her first 6 games ...

GETTING DEFENSIVE

The Aces finished the 2019 season ranked first in the WNBA in defensive field goal percentage (.399), adjusted defensive field goal percentage (.448), Defensive Efficiency (points allowed per 100 possessions, 95.0), and defensive rebound percentage (78.2%).

WHAT A DIFFERENCE A YEAR MAKES

By nearly every statistical measure, the Aces defense did a complete 180 from 2018 to 2019.

The Las Vegas Aces won seven more games in 2019 than they did in 2018, which was tied for the largest improvement by a team last season.

IF A THREE FALLS IN THE WOODS ...

Las Vegas led the league in three-point field goal percentage a year ago making 36.7 percent of their shots from beyond the arc, but they took the fewest attempts per game in the league (14.9 per game).

In 2020, Las Vegas is 4th in the league in three-point field goal percentage (38.2), but are averaging just 9.5 attempts per game.

The last time a team averaged fewer than 10 three-point field goal attempts per game was back in 2014 when the Liberty and Sparks averaged 9.9 and 8.3 respectively.

The Aces have made 29 three-pointers on the season as a team. Minnesota's Crystal Dangerfield and Damiris Dantas have combined to make 23 by themselves.

ALL GOOD THREES MUST COME TO AN END

Las Vegas didn't make any three pointers in the team's season-opening loss to Chicago. The last time that happened was on July 24, 2007, when the then-San Antonio Silver Stars went 0-for-7 from long distance at Indiana. The Chicago blanking ended the Aces' streak of consecutive games with at least one made at 419, which was the third longest streak in WNBA history.



TWELFTH WOMAN OF THE YEAR

Dearica Hamby is making a strong case already for a second straight WNBA 6th Woman of the Year Award.

Established prior to the 2007 season, two players in league history have won the award multiple times, Allie Quigley (2014, 2015) and DeWanna Bonner (2009, 2010, 2011).

Hamby's teammate, Sugar Rodgers, won the award while playing for Bill Laimbeer in New York in 2017, and Plenette Pierson won the award playing for Laimbeer in Detroit 2007.

ALL ABOUT THAT PACE

Las Vegas is playing at the second fastest pace in the league this year, averaging 83.4 possessions per game. The Aces were the second "fastest" team in the league a year ago at 82.3 possessions per game, and 1st in 2018 at 82.4.

QUICK OFF THE BLOCK

The Aces 7-2 start to the season is tied with the 2011 San Antonio team for the best nine-game start in franchise history. That 2011 team lost its next game.

BID EUCHRE

When the Aces allow an opponent to shoot 50.0 percent or better from the field during the regular season, they are 0-13 since moving to Vegas, including 0-1 in 2020.

BE ... AGGRESSIVE. B. E. AGGRESSIVE

Las Vegas pounded the ball inside in 2018, reaping the rewards by averaging a 23.6 free throw attempts per game, which was the second highest average in the league. In 2019, the team averaged 21.5 free throws per game which ranked 1st in the league.

In 2020, they are taking 23.7 free throws per game which is the most in the league.

SHOOTING IS THE NAME OF THE GAME

When the Aces shoot = or better from the field than the opposition during the regular season over the last 2-plus years, they are 37-6. When they are out-shot, they are 5-28.

DAZZLING DEBUT

Angel McCoughtry became just the fifth player in WNBA history to score 25 or more points in her debut with a new team when she poured in 25 against Chicago on July 26 of this year.
