Each player on the roster has at least one page of info in this document.

Included in these are ...

- Notes from the 2021 season
- Notes from previous seasons
- Streaks that paint a statistical picture of the player's most recent efforts.
- Single-season and career highs.
- Career Stats

Additional information is available on each player's online biography, but these should give you what you need to cover the game.

Season Notes

This area is divided into three primary sections.

As the season progresses, the first notes will be super specific to this year's team and players, and should tell the story of the season, essentially answering the question, "Why do the Aces have the record they have?"

The second section contains interesting milestones or tidbits about this year's team or individuals.

FINALS RETURN

Seven teams have made a return trip to the WNBA Finals after losing the championship the year before. Four teams won the title in that return trip.

SAME TEAM, DIFFERENT PLAYERS

The Aces return just one active starter from the group that started all three of last year's WNBA Finals games. No WNBA Finals team has ever had fewer than three returning starters in the lineup for the season opener the following year.

WELCOME ADDITIONS

Las Vegas added two key free agents to the roster in the offseason signing three-time All-Star Chelsea Gray and one-time All-Star and 2013 6th Woman of the Year Riquna Williams.

QUICK OFF THE BLOCK

The Aces 18-4 start to the 2020 season was the franchise's best 22-game start in the 24-year history of the franchise.

SLOW STARTS

The Aces dropped 2 of their first 3 games in 2020 en route to an 18-4 record and the franchise's second appearance in the WNBA Finals.

GETTING DEFENSIVE

By nearly every statistical measure, the Aces defense did a complete 180 from 2018 to 2019, and they maintained that improvement in the 2020 season.

The Aces finished the 2019 season ranked first in the WNBA in defensive field goal percentage, Defensive Efficiency (points allowed per 100 possessions), and defensive rebound percentage, and second in defensive three-point field goal percentage.

In 2020 they ranked second in the league in defensive three-point field goal percentage, second in defensive rebound percentage, second in defensive efficiency, and third in defensive field goal percentage.

TWELFTH WOMAN OF THE YEAR

Dearica Hamby won her second straight WNBA 6th Woman of the Year Award in 2020.

Established in 2007, two other players have won the award multiple times, Allie Quigley (2014, '15) and DeWanna Bonner (2009, '10, '11).

Hamby's current assistant coach, Sugar Rodgers, won the award while playing for Bill Laimbeer in New York in 2017, and Plenette Pierson won the award playing for Laimbeer in Detroit 2007.

BE ... AGGRESSIVE. B. E. AGGRESSIVE

Las Vegas pounded the ball inside in 2018, reaping the rewards by averaging a 23.6 free throw attempts per game, which was the second highest average in the league.

In 2019, the team averaged 21.5 free throws per game which ranked 1st in the league.

In 2020, they took 23.4 free throws per game which were the most in the league.

Against Seattle in the 2021 season opener, Las Vegas went to the line 12 times.

ALL RIGHT NOW

In 2018, A'ja Wilson ranked first in the league in free throw attempts per game with 7.5, and she did so again in 2019 averaging 5.5 trips to the charity stripe.

In 2020, she took 6.9 free throw attempts per game—tops in the league.

She went 5 for 5 against Seattle in the 2021 season opener.

IF A THREE FALLS IN THE WOODS ...

Las Vegas led the league in three-point field goal percentage in 2019 making 36.7 percent of their shots from beyond the arc, but they took the fewest attempts in the league (14.9 per game).

In 2020, Las Vegas finished 4th in the league in three-point field goal percentage (36.6), and averaged just 11.5 attempts per game.

The Aces went 3 for 12 from three-point range in the 2021 season opener at Seattle.

ALL ABOUT THAT PACE

Las Vegas played at the fastest pace in the league last year, averaging 82.6 possessions per 40 minutes. The Aces were the 2nd fastest team in 2019 (82.3), and 1st in 2018 at (82.4).

A'JA WILSON ... FOR THREE?

A'ja Wilson connected on the first three-pointer of her career on May 5, 2021 at Seattle—the 82nd game of her pro career.

That is far from the latest in a career that a player has hit their first shot from long range, however. Former Sacramento and Minnesota forward Rebekkah Brunson didn't make her first three until the 290th game of her WNBA career.

THIS TABLE IS RESERVED

Dearica Hamby and Jackie Young averaged double figures in scoring last season despite not starting a single game. Only seven other players in WNBA history had done that, and no set of teammates had.

THE BENCH MOB

Las Vegas' bench averaged 35.0 points per game in 2020. Only 7 other teams in league history have averaged more than 30 points per game from their reserves.

The Aces' bench also led the league in minutes per game (18.0), rebounds per game (15.7), and assists per game (10.6). The minutes and assist figures set records, and the rebounds figure was just off the 2015 New York Liberty (coached by Bill Laimbeer), for highest rebound average for a bench unit (15.8).

Las Vegas' bench scored 22 points at Seattle in the 2021 season opener.

BENCH BACKLASH

The Aces had the highest scoring bench in WNBA history during the regular season, averaging 35.0 points per game. In the post-season, however, Las Vegas reserves averaged 16.3 points per game. That was, in part, due to Danielle Robinson moving into the starting lineup and Dearica Hamby getting injured in the WNBA Semifinals

BID EUCHRE

When the Aces allow an opponent to shoot 50.0 percent or better from the field during the regular season, they are 0-15 since moving to Vegas, including 0-1 in 2021.

SHOOTING IS THE NAME OF THE GAME

When the Aces shoot = or better from the field than the opposition during the regular season over the last 3 years, they are 47-6, including 17-1 in 2020. When they are out-shot, they are 6-31 including 0-1 in 2021.

THREE IS A CROWD

The Aces have made more three pointers than their opponents in a game 14 times in the regular season since moving to Vegas. They are 13-1 in those games, including 8-0 in 2019, 4-0 in 2020.

GOOD COMPANY

Bill Laimbeer has coached 13 full seasons in the W, and 9 times his teams have won at least 60-percent of their games, including in 2020.
