What about box scores? Some folks like to see the box score from the previous game in Game Notes, while some folks like to peruse all of that season's box scores. Some like to see the box scores from previous meetings between the two teams playing today.

#### TOP OF THE PECKING OERDER

Seven teams in WNBA history have boasted both the best offense and defense in the same season as measured by Offensive (OER) and Defensive Efficiency Ratings (DER)—points scored and allowed per 100 possessions. Early in the 2023 season, the Aces have their sights set on becoming the 8th. Six of those teams ended up winning the title \*.

#### 3,000, 'TIS BUT A (LARGE) NUMBER

A'ja Wilson, who has scored in double figures in 32-straight games reached the 3,000 career point mark against the Sun on June 8 (watch it here). In doing so, Wilson became, at 26 years, 303 days, the fifth youngest player to score 3,000 points in her career (Lauren Jackson, 25 years, 27 days).

Wilson also reached the 3,000-points pinnacle in her 157th game, which is the 7th fewest games needed to reach the mark (Elena Delle Donne, 148).

#### **STOP**

The Aces had one of the most powerful offenses in league history in 2022, and they are even more efficient in 2023. But the team's defense has improved to near record-setting levels this year after raking in the middle of the pack a year ago.

All the other teams that played at this level did so in the "Before Times" when back-to-the-basket post players roamed the earth, and the 3-pointer was utilized as an offensive weapon only sparingly.

On June 9, BUCKET\$ and Aces staff members visited Nellis Air Force Base where they toured the fitness facility and flightline, and passed out Aces gear and tickets for the July 5 "Heroes of the House" Aces game as a way of saying thank you for all they do.



## ACES THEME NIGHTS CELEBRATE FANS ALL SEASON LONG

Throughout the season the Las Vegas Aces are celebrating fans of all ages and backgrounds in a variety of ways. On May 27 members of the 2022 WNBA Championship team received their rings and the championship banner was unfurled from the roof. The next day the first 7,500 fans were given a replica banner to commemorate the Aces first WNBA title. But that was just the beginning.

Today's game against Chicago is the third themed game of the season and celebrates all the kids in the house! (For more on each theme night, go to page 13).

#### **DEADLY FROM LONG RANGE**

Jackie Young and Kelsey Plum have been shooting lights out from beyond the arc since the start of the 2022 season. Young ranks 1st and Plum 7th in 3-point percentage among players with a minimum of 50 3-point field goals made over that span.

#### **HIGH ROLLERS**

The Aces scored 90+ points in each of their first 5 games in 2023, becoming the only team in league history to accomplish that feat. In fact, no other team has scored 90+ in each of the first three games of the season.

Las Vegas also scored 90+ points in 6-straight games dating back to 2022, which is the 2nd longest such streak in W history (Phoenix, 2010, 7 straight). Indiana ended the Aces run by holding them to 84 points on June 4.

#### **ALL ABOUT THAT PACE**

The Aces have played at one of the fastest paces in the league since moving to Las Vegas as measured by possessions per 40 minutes.

#### **GOLDEN STARTERS**

We believe that the Aces are just the second WNBA team to feature a starting lineup with five Olympic gold medalists. Chelsea Gray, Candace Parker and A'ja Wilson earned their golds playing traditional 5x5 basketball, while Kelsey Plum and Jackie Young made up half of the 2020 U.S. Olympic 3x3 Team. The 2015 Minnesota Lynx started Olympic gold medalists Seimone Augustus, Sylvia Fowles, Asjha Jones, Maya Moore and Lindsay Whalen, who made up 5 of the 12-member U.S. roster in 2012.

#### IF A T(H)REE FALLS IN THE WOODS ...

Although the Aces have been one of the best 3-point shooting teams over the past 5 years, it wasn't always a big part of their arsenal. In 2022, the Aces utilized the 3-pointer to a much greater degree.

**Kierstan Bell**—Has 3 made 3s in 6 games this year after making 3 during the entire 2022 campaign ... Has Scored a total of 15 points in 6 games in 2023 after scoring 8 in her final 9 games of 2022.

Alysha Clark—Scored in double figures in 3 of 8 games this year after not doing so in last 7 regular season games of 2022 ... Is 13 for 28 from 3-point range in 2023, after going 2 for 12 over the final 4 games of 2022 ... Has just 3 turnovers on the year ... Has 14 rebounds in her last 6 games after snagging 1 in her first 2 games.

**Sydney Colson**—DNP last 5 of 6 games of the 2022 season after playing in each of previous 5 ... Has played 4 of 8 in 2023.

#### **RECORD SETTING DEBUT**

The Aces 105-64 win at Seattle to open the 2023 season set 3 league and/or franchise benchmarks.



#### HEAD COACH BECKY HAMMON



Las Vegas Aces President Nikki Fargas announced on December 31, 2021 that the team hired San Antonio Spurs assistant, and 6-time WNBA All-Star Becky Hammon as the team's head coach. Hammon rewarded the Aces less than nine months later with the fanchise's first WNBA Championship.

The seeds for Hammon's hiring were originally sewn when the Aces retired her jersey on September 13, 2021. That ceremony served as the culmination of the franchise's 25th anniversary alumni initiative, which saw the Aces embrace their Utah and San Antonio roots, and celebrate the players who helped build the franchise and the league from the ground up. Las Vegas owner Mark Davis spent time with Hammon and her family that week, and walked away understandably impressed.

Hammon played 16 seasons in the WNBA, including her final eight in San Antonio, where she led the franchise to its first finals appearance in 2008.

On August 5, 2014, Spurs head coach Gregg Popovich hired Hammon as a full-time assistant making her the first woman in NBA history to hold that position.

Since that time, Hammon has continued to accumulate coaching 'firsts' in the NBA. On July 3, 2015, she became the first woman to serve as head coach in the NBA's Summer League where she led the Spurs to the league title.

Less than a year later, Hammon became the first woman to be part of an All-Star coaching staff, and on December 30, 2020, following Popovich's ejection in San Antonio's game against Los Angeles, Hammon took over on the bench, becoming the first woman acting head coach in the history of the NBA.

A member of the league's 15th, 20th and 25th anniversary teams, Hammon went undrafted in 1999 following her All-American career at Colorado State. She signed with New York as a free agent that same year, helping the team to WNBA Finals appearances in three of her first four years in the Big Apple.

The Rapid City, SD native earned her first All-Star nod in 2003, and represented New York on the Eastern Conference squad in 2005 and 2006 as well.



Following the 2006 season, New York traded Hammon to San Antonio. In her first year in silver and black, she posted what were then career highs in scoring (18.8 ppg), and assists (5.0) while earning another trip to the WNBA All-Star Game. As a team, the Silver Stars made their first appearance in the postseason since 2002, falling to Phoenix in the Western Conference Finals.

In 2008, Hammon led San Antonio to its first trip to the WNBA Finals where they fell to Detroit. The Silver Stars made the playoffs in each of her seven full seasons with the team, and Hammon once again was named to the All-Star team in 2009 and 2011.

She retired as the franchise leader in assists per game (5.1) and scoring average (15.6), and the WNBA leader in career free throw percentage (89.7).

Hammon, who will be inducted into the Naismith Memorial Hall of Fame this year, was inducted into the Colorado Sports Hall of Fame in 2015 and the San Antonio Sports Hall of Fame in 2018.


