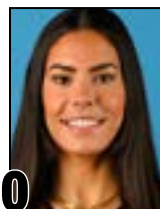

DOMINANCE

The Aces are off to a 10-1 start, and by at least one measure, they have had the most dominant 11-game start to a season in WNBA history. The team's +15.8 scoring differential is the highest for a team after 11 games in league history. The 2020 Storm hold the record for scoring differential after 12 games at +15.4 points.

TOP OF THE PECKING OERDER

Seven teams in WNBA history have boasted both the best offense and defense in the same season as measured by [Offensive \(OER\)](#) and [Defensive Efficiency Ratings \(DER\)](#)—points scored and allowed per 100 possessions. Eleven games into the 2023 season, the Aces have their sights set on becoming the 8th, currently ranking first for both OER and DER. Six of those teams ended up winning the title *.

The Aces have had one of the best offenses in the league since making the move to Las Vegas. In 2020 they ranked 2nd in the WNBA in Offensive Efficiency, and in each of the past two years they finished 1st, and rank [1st through 11 games in 2023](#).

HIGH ROLLERS

The Aces scored 90+ points in each of their first 5 games in 2023, becoming the only team in league history to accomplish that feat. In fact, [no other team has scored 90+ in each of the first three games of the season](#).

Las Vegas also scored 90+ points in 6-straight games dating back to 2022, which is the 2nd longest such streak in W history (Phoenix, 2010, 7 straight). Indiana ended the Aces run by holding them to 84 points on June 4. However, the Aces got back on the 90s track with 90+ points in each of their last 3 games. Through 11 games the are averaging a league-high 91.9 ppg.

IF A T(H)REE FALLS IN THE WOODS ...

Although the Aces have been one of the best 3-point shooting teams over the past 5 years, it wasn't always a big part of their arsenal. In 2022, the Aces utilized the 3-pointer to a much greater degree, and are slightly trailing the use of 3s in 2022 so far this season.

50-40-90? HOWSABOUT 50-50-100?

In 2019, Washington Mystics guard/forward Elena Delle Donne became the first, and to date only, member of the WNBA's 50-40-90 club by finishing a season with a field goal percentage of 50% or higher, a 3-point field goal percentage of 40% or higher, and a free throw percentage of 90% or higher while qualifying for league leadership in each category.

Chelsea Gray is looking to leap-frog 50-40-90, and establish the 50-50-100 club, as she is currently shooting 51.3% from the field, 51.4% from 3-point range, and 100% from the charity stripe.

Jackie Young also has her sights set on a unique statistical oddity as she could become the first member of the 60-40-80 club ... or even 60-50-80. She currently sits at 59.9 FG%, 46.8 3PFG% and 82.7 FT%.

WHAT'S THE DIFFERENCE?

If you want to know which team historically has the best chance at winning the WNBA Championship, look no further than scoring differential—the difference between a team's points scored and points allowed.

In the WNBA's first 26 years, the team that led the league in scoring differential during the regular season won the championship 19 times. The five teams that had a positive double-digit scoring differential all won the title.

RECORD SETTING DEBUT

The Aces 105-64 win at Seattle to open the 2023 season set 3 league and/or franchise benchmarks.

The 41-point win set a league mark for opening day margin of victory, which previously was 36 points (Connecticut 101, Las Vegas 65 on 5/20/2018).

It was also the [largest margin of victory for the franchise in the history of the series](#) (previous record was 24 points, 90-66, on 9/14/2012).

The Aces broke the league record for [most defensive rebounds \(44\) in a regulation game](#) (previous record of 43 was accomplished twice).

GOLDEN STARTERS

We believe that the Aces are just the second WNBA team to feature a starting lineup with five Olympic gold medalists. Chelsea Gray, Candace Parker and A’ja Wilson earned their golds playing traditional 5x5 basketball, while Kelsey Plum and Jackie Young made up half of the 2020 U.S. Olympic 3x3 Team. The 2015 Minnesota Lynx started Olympic gold medalists Seimone Augustus, Sylvia Fowles, Asjha Jones, Maya Moore and Lindsay Whalen, who made up 5 of the 12-member U.S. roster in 2012.

HELLO ... MY NAME IS ...

There are three new faces on the Aces in 2023 — a trio of free agents the team signed during the offseason.

Two-time WNBA Champion and two-time MVP Candace Parker was the biggest name acquisition for the team as she looks to become the first player to win a title with three different franchises.

Two-time WNBA Champion and two-time All-Defensive Team honoree (2020 1st, 2019 2nd) Alysha Clark also signed with the Aces during the offseason, as did four-time WNBL Champion Cayla George, who was a member of the 2020 Australia Olympic Team and earned one silver (2018) and two bronze medals (2014, 2022) playing for her country over the past three FIBA World Cups.

HEAD COACH BECKY HAMMON

Las Vegas Aces President Nikki Fargas announced on December 31, 2021 that the team hired San Antonio Spurs assistant, and 6-time WNBA All-Star Becky Hammon as the team’s head coach. Hammon rewarded the Aces less than nine months later with the fanchise’s first WNBA Championship.

The seeds for Hammon’s hiring were originally sewn when the Aces retired her jersey on September 13, 2021. That ceremony served as the culmination of the franchise’s 25th anniversary alumni initiative, which saw the Aces embrace their Utah and San Antonio roots, and celebrate the players who helped build the franchise and the league from the ground up. Las Vegas owner Mark Davis spent time with Hammon and her family that week, and walked away understandably impressed.

Hammon played 16 seasons in the WNBA, including her final eight in San Antonio, where she led the franchise to its first finals appearance in 2008.

On August 5, 2014, Spurs head coach Gregg Popovich hired Hammon as a full-time assistant making her the first woman in NBA history to hold that position.

Since that time, Hammon has continued to accumulate coaching ‘firsts’ in the NBA. On July 3, 2015, she became the first woman to serve as head coach in the NBA’s Summer League where she led the Spurs to the league title.

Less than a year later, Hammon became the first woman to be part of an All-Star coaching staff, and on December 30, 2020, following Popovich’s ejection in San Antonio’s game against Los Angeles, Hammon took over on the bench, becoming the first woman acting head coach in the history of the NBA.

A member of the league’s 15th, 20th and 25th anniversary teams, Hammon went undrafted in 1999 following her All-American career at Colorado State. She signed with New York as a free agent that same year, helping the team to WNBA Finals appearances in three of her first four years in the Big Apple.

The Rapid City, SD native earned her first All-Star nod in 2003, and represented New York on the Eastern Conference squad in 2005 and 2006 as well.



Following the 2006 season, New York traded Hammon to San Antonio. In her first year in silver and black, she posted what were then career highs in scoring (18.8 ppg), and assists (5.0) while earning another trip to the WNBA All-Star Game. As a team, the Silver Stars made their first appearance in the postseason since 2002, falling to Phoenix in the Western Conference Finals.

In 2008, Hammon led San Antonio to its first trip to the WNBA Finals where they fell to Detroit. The Silver Stars made the playoffs in each of her seven full seasons with the team, and Hammon once again was named to the All-Star team in 2009 and 2011.

She retired as the franchise leader in assists per game (5.1) and scoring average (15.6), and the WNBA leader in career free throw percentage (89.7).

Hammon, who will be inducted into the Naismith Memorial Hall of Fame this year, was inducted into the Colorado Sports Hall of Fame in 2015 and the San Antonio Sports Hall of Fame in 2018.

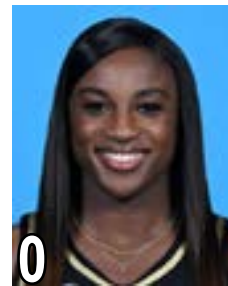
