What about box scores? Some folks like to see the box score from the previous game in Game Notes, while some folks like to peruse all of that season's box scores. Some like to see the box scores from previous meetings between the two teams playing today.

Given all these possibilities, we have decided not to include any box scores because we are lazy in an effort to rid the planet of unnecessary paper waste. All Aces box scores are located on line.

#### **Individual Player Profiles**

Each player on the roster has at least one page of info in this document.

Included in these are ...

#### **DOMINANCE**

The Aces are off to a 12-1 start, and by at least one measure, they have had the most dominant 13-game start to a season in WNBA history. The team's +15.9 scoring differential is the highest for a team after 13 games in league history.

#### **MAKE IT A DOZEN**

With their win on Saturday, the Aces moved into No. 3 in league history for victories before a 2nd loss on the season. Should they win June 26, they'll move into a tie for No. 2 with a 13-1 mark. The record is a 20-1 start to the season, accomplished by the 1998 Comets and 2016 Sparks.

### HEY NOW, YOU'RE AN ALL-STAR

Three members of the Las Vegas Aces—A'ja Wilson, Chelsea Gray and Jackie Young—have been named starters to the 2023 AT&T WNBA All-Star Game. Wilson was the leading All-Star vote-getter for the second consecutive season, and will serve as a team captain for the third time in her career.

Wilson, the reigning league MVP, is 7th in the league in scoring (19.3), 6th in rebounding (9.4), 5th in field goal percentage (.535) and 2nd in blocked shots (2.15). In more advanced statistics, the five-time All-Star is 3rd in the league in win shares (3.2), 4th in offensive win shares (2.0), 2nd in defensive win shares (1.2), 7th in offensive efficiency rating (120.1), and 3rd in defensive efficiency rating.

Young, the WNBA's 2022 Most Improved Player, has taken another leap forward this year, ranking 6th in the league in scoring (20.2), 3rd in field goal percentage (.588), and 2nd in 3-point field goal percentage (.500). The two-time All-Star is also making .818 percent of her shots from the free throw line, giving her the opportunity to become the first player in WNBA history to post a seasonal shooting percentage slash line of .600/.500/.800 or better.

Gray, long known as the Point Gawd, has added Shooting Gawd to her résumé over the past year. She ranks 3rd in the WNBA in assists this season (6.7), but is also making 50.4 percent of her field goal attempts (10th in the league), 50.0 percent of her 3-pointers (1st), and 94.4 percent of her free throw attempts. Over her past 38 games, including the 2022 playoffs, the 2022 WNBA Final MVP is averaging 16.4 points and 6.6 assists while connecting on a shooting percentage slash line of .549/.487/.907.

#### **VOTE! VOTE! VOTE!**

The Aces are featured prominently in this year's ESPY Awards, and fans can vote for A'ja Wilson for Best Female Athlete and Best WNBA Player, Candace Parker for Best WNBA Player and the Aces for Best Team. The ESPY Awards are slated for July 12 at 5 pm PT on ABC.



#### WHAT'S THE DIFFERENCE?

If you want to know which team historically has the best chance at winning the WNBA Championship, look no further than scoring differential—the difference between a team's points scored and points allowed.

In the WNBA's first 26 years, the team that led the league in scoring differential during the regular season won the championship 19 times. The five teams that had a positive double-digit scoring differential all won the title.

#### POINT GAWD OR SHOOTING GAWD?

Over her last 38 games including the 2022 postseason (dating to 7/6/22), the 2022 WNBA Final MVP is averaging 16.4 points and 6.6 assists while connecting on 54.9 percent from the field, 48.7 percent from 3-point range, and 90.7 percent from the free throw line. The Aces are 31-7 over that span.

Only 4 players in WNBA history have averaged more than 16.0 points and 6.0 assists over a full season. None have come close to shooting as well as Gray has over her last 37 games.

#### **TOP OF THE PECKING OERDER**

Seven teams in WNBA history have boasted both the best offense and defense in the same season as measured by Offensive (OER) and Defensive Efficiency Ratings (DER)—points scored and allowed per 100 possessions. The Aces scored 90+ points in each of their first 5 games in 2023, becoming the only team in league history to accomplish that feat. In fact, no other team has scored 90+ in each of the first three games of the season.

Las Vegas also scored 90+ points in 6-straight games dating back to 2022, which is the 2nd longest such streak in W history (Phoenix, 2010, 7 straight). Indiana ended the Aces run by holding them to 84 points on June 4. However, the Aces got back on the 90s track with 90+ points in each of their last 5 games. Through 13 games they are averaging a league-high 93.2 ppg.

In 2019, Washington Mystics guard/forward Elena Delle Donne became the first, and to date only, member of the WNBA's 50-40-90 club by finishing a season with a field goal percentage of 50% or higher, a 3-point field goal percentage of 40% or higher, and a free throw percentage of 90% or higher while qualifying for league leadership in each category.

Chelsea Gray is looking to leap-frog 50-40-90, and establish the 50-50-90 club, as she is currently shooting 50.4% from the field, 50.0% from 3-point range, and 94.4% from the charity stripe.

Jackie Young also has her sights set on a unique statistical oddity as she could become the first member of the 60-40-80 club ... or even 60-50-80. She currently sits at 58.8 FG%, 50 3PTFG% and 81.8 FT%.

#### **MILESTONE ACHIEVED, EYEING NO. 2**

A'ja Wilson needed just 9 rebounds when she grabbed 12 on June 21 to leapfrog Dearica Hamby and slide into the No. 3 spot for rebounds in franchise history. With 1,378 boards, Wilson needs 152 to draw even with No. 2 Margo Dydek (1,530). #### RECORD SETTING DEBUT

The Aces 105-64 win at Seattle to open the 2023 season set 3 league and/or franchise benchmarks.

The 41-point win set a league mark for opening day margin of victory, which previously was 36 points (Connecticut 101, Las Vegas 65 on 5/20/2018).

It was also the <u>largest margin of victory for the franchise</u> in the history of the series (previous record was 24 points, 90-66, on 9/14/2012).

The Aces broke the league record for <u>most defensive</u> <u>rebounds (44) in a regulation game</u> (previous record of 43 was accomplished twice.

#### **GOLDEN STARTERS**

We believe that the Aces are just the second WNBA team to feature a starting lineup with five Olympic gold medalists. Chelsea Gray, Candace Parker and A'ja Wilson earned their golds playing traditional 5x5 basketball, while Kelsey Plum and Jackie Young made up half of the 2020 U.S. Olympic 3x3 Team. The 2015 Minnesota Lynx started Olympic gold medalists Seimone Augustus, Sylvia Fowles, Asjha Jones, Maya Moore and Lindsay Whalen, who made up 5 of the 12-member U.S. roster in 2012.

There are three new faces on the Aces in 2023 — a trio of free agents the team signed during the offseason.

Two-time WNBA Champion and two-time MVP Candace Parker was the biggest name acqusition for the team as she looks to become the first player to win a title with three different franchises.

Two-time WNBA Champion and two-time All-Defensive Team honoree (2020 1st, 2019 2nd) Alysha Clark also signed with the Aces during the offseason, as did four-time WNBL Champion Cayla George, who was a member of the 2020 Australia Olympic Team and earned one silver (2018) and two bronze medals (2014, 2022) playing for her country over the past three FIBA World Cups.

### **HEAD COACH BECKY HAMMON**



Las Vegas Aces President Nikki Fargas announced on December 31, 2021 that the team hired San Antonio Spurs assistant, and 6-time WNBA All-Star Becky Hammon as the team's head coach. Hammon rewarded the Aces less than nine months later with the fanchise's first WNBA Championship.

The seeds for Hammon's hiring were originally sewn when the Aces retired her jersey on September 13, 2021. That ceremony served as the culmination of the franchise's 25th anniversary alumni initiative, which saw the Aces embrace their Utah and San Antonio roots, and celebrate the players who helped build the franchise and the league from the ground up. Las Vegas owner Mark Davis spent time with Hammon and her family that week, and walked away understandably impressed.

Hammon played 16 seasons in the WNBA, including her final eight in San Antonio, where she led the franchise to its first finals appearance in 2008.

On August 5, 2014, Spurs head coach Gregg Popovich hired Hammon as a full-time assistant making her the first woman in NBA history to hold that position.

Since that time, Hammon has continued to accumulate coaching 'firsts' in the NBA. On July 3, 2015, she became the first woman to serve as head coach in the NBA's Summer League where she led the Spurs to the league title.

Less than a year later, Hammon became the first woman to be part of an All-Star coaching staff, and on December 30, 2020, following Popovich's ejection in San Antonio's game against Los Angeles, Hammon took over on the bench, becoming the first woman acting head coach in the history of the NBA.

A member of the league's 15th, 20th and 25th anniversary teams, Hammon went undrafted in 1999 following her All-American career at Colorado State. She signed with New York as a free agent that same year, helping the team to WNBA Finals appearances in three of her first four years in the Big Apple.

The Rapid City, SD native earned her first All-Star nod in 2003, and represented New York on the Eastern Conference squad in 2005 and 2006 as well.



Following the 2006 season, New York traded Hammon to San Antonio. In her first year in silver and black, she posted what were then career highs in scoring (18.8 ppg), and assists (5.0) while earning another trip to the WNBA All-Star Game. As a team, the Silver Stars made their first appearance in the postseason since 2002, falling to Phoenix in the Western Conference Finals.

In 2008, Hammon led San Antonio to its first trip to the WNBA Finals where they fell to Detroit. The Silver Stars made the playoffs in each of her seven full seasons with the team, and Hammon once again was named to the All-Star team in 2009 and 2011.

She retired as the franchise leader in assists per game (5.1) and scoring average (15.6), and the WNBA leader in career free throw percentage (89.7).

Hammon, who will be inducted into the Naismith Memorial Hall of Fame this year, was inducted into the Colorado Sports Hall of Fame in 2015 and the San Antonio Sports Hall of Fame in 2018.


