### **Statistics**

Let's take these items in reverse order. If all you need are our season statistics, just flip to the end of these notes. Both team's stats are always located on the second to last page.

There is also a separate statistical packet in a different document with more detailed information about both teams.

The back page is the Media Cheat Sheet roster, complete with head shots to help you quickly identify our players.

What about box scores? Some folks like to see the box score from the previous games in Game Notes, while some folks like to peruse all of that season's box scores. Some like to see the box scores from previous meetings between the two teams playing today.

Given all these possibilities, with the exception of 2023 games between the two teams playing today, we have decided not to include any box scores because we are lazy in an effort to rid the planet of unnecessary paper waste. All WNBA box scores (PDFs) are located online and can be downloaded here.

### **Additional Notes**

Each player on the roster has at least one page of info in this doc.

Additional information is available on each player's online biography, linked from various spots in the notes, including the front page, but these should give you what you need to cover the game.

#### **Season Notes**

This area is divided into 3 primary sections.

As the season progresses, the first notes will be super specific to this year's team and players, and should tell the story of the season, essentially answering the question, "Why do the Aces have the record they have?"

The second section contains interesting milestones or tidbits about this year's team or individuals.

The third section includes information from recent seasons that might (in theory) still have relevance to this year's team.

These pages let you know how the Aces have performed historically against today's opponent (pages 4-5)

#### **Additional Information**

Also included in these notes are an Aces' roster, and Pronunciation Guide (page 3).

#### ON THE VERGE OF HISTORY

The Las Vegas Aces (28-3) have tied the 2000 Los Angeles Sparks for the most wins in league history through 31 games. A win against the Sparks Saturday would make Las Vegas the only team in WNBA history to win 29 of its first 32 games, as well as tie them with the 2014 Phoenix Mercury (29-5) for the most wins in a season.

### **TRIPLE CROWN**

Chelsea Gray made history with the first points-rebounds-assist game in franchise history when she recorded 22 points, a career-best 11 rebounds and 11 assists against New York on Aug. 17. It was the franchise's 2nd triple-double—Margo Dydek had 12 points, 11 rebounds and 10 blocked shots against the Orlando Miracle on June 7, 2001.

Gray's triple-double was the second of her career (13 points, 10 rebounds, 13 assists; July 7, 2019 vs. Washington). It also was the 30th in league history and 10th in the W this season through Aug. 17.

### **CHASING HISTORY**

A'ja Wilson, secured her 1,500th career rebound this season, is currently 2nd in the league in rebounding (9.6 rpg) and leads the W in blocked shots (2.1 bpg).

Should she lead the league in both categories, she would become just the 3rd player in WNBA history to do so (Lisa Leslie, 2004 and Candace Parker, 2009).

Only one other player in franchise history has led the WNBA in rebounding (Natalie Williams, 2000).

Only 2 players in WNBA history have led the league in blocked shots 3 or more times (Margo Dydek, 8; Brittney Griner, 8). Should Wilson lead the league in 2023, it would be the 3rd time she has done so.

#### **LAYING POINTS**

Only 21 players in WNBA history scored 40 or more points in a single game (there have been a total of 32 40+ point games overall). Kelsey Plum (at Minnesota, July 9) and A'ja Wilson (vs. Washington, Aug. 11) are 2 of them, having scored 40 points apiece in games this season. Plum and Wilson became the <u>first pair of teammates in league history to accomplish the feat in the same season.</u> Only one franchise in W history has seen 3 different players score 40 or more, but not in the same season (Los Angeles: Kristi Toliver, 43, 2015; Lisa Leslie, 41, 2006; Candace Parker, 40, 2008).

### **TESTING, TESTING, 1, 2 .... 3?**

In scoring a career-high 40 points (17-25 FGs, 0-1 3PTs, 6-7 FTs) against Washington on Aug. 11, A'ja Wilson not only tied the franchise record set by Kelsey Plum earlier this season, she also broke her own <u>WNBA record for most points scored in a game without hitting a 3-pointer</u>.

Also, Wilson's 17 made field goals are the second most in a game in WNBA history and the most in franchise history (18, Lauren Jackson, Seattle at Washington, July 24, 2007). Her 17 made 2-pointers tied Lauren Jackson's WNBA record for most made 2s in a game (Seattle vs. Los Angeles, Aug. 6, 2003).

### **ALL RIGHT NOW**

A'ja Wilson has made a living at the free throw line, leading the league in attempts in each of her first 3 seasons in the league, while finishing 2nd in 2021 and 3rd in 2022. She currently is ranked No. 1 this year.

In scoring 40 points against the Lynx on July 9, Kelsey Plum not only upped the franchise scoring standard, since tied by A'ja Wilson, but she also set the bar for all-time WNBA single-game shooting percentage when scoring 40 or more points, eclipsing the 77.27% shot by Liz Cambage when she set the WNBA single-game scoring mark of 53 points.

### **ACES THEME NIGHTS**

Throughout the season the Las Vegas Aces are celebrating fans of all ages and backgrounds in a variety of ways.

On May 27 members of the 2022 WNBA Championship team received their rings and the championship banner was unfurled from the roof. The next day the first 7,500 fans were given a replica banner to commemorate the Aces first WNBA title.

But that was just the beginning.

June 11 was Kids Day, on June 15 the Aces celebrated Pride Month, June 26 was Bobblehead Night, featuring giveaways of limited-edition 2022 WNBA Finals MVP Chelsea Gray bobbleheads, July 5 honored members of the military, first responders and all local heroes on Heroes of the House Night and July 11 was Sneakerhead Night.

Breast Health Awareness Night was Aug. 1 and featured moments throughout the game that paid tribute to survivors and honored lives lost. The Aces helped raise funds benefitting the Kay Yow Cancer Fund via the "Shooting for a Cure" Pledglt Campaign.

### Aug. 19 vs. Los Angeles: Alumni Night

It's time to celebrate and honor the history of the Aces as we honor alumni. The franchise will be bringing back approximately 65 former players who played for the Utah Starzz (1997-2002), the San Antonio Stars (2003-2017) and Las Vegas Aces (2018-current). These players have shattered expectations on and off the court. They have stood at the forefront of advancement, inclusion and social change, and following the game fans will have the opportunity to attend an autograph session with franchise alumni. ### Sept. 10 vs. Phoenix: Fan Appreciation Day

The Aces will celebrate and show appreciation to their loyal and dedicated fanbase! All fans in attendance will receive an exclusive team poster, and the Aces will thank the fans with in-game giveaways, contests and 40% off at in-arena retail locations.

### **HEAD COACH BECKY HAM!**



Las Vegas Aces President Nikki Fargas announced on December 31, 2021 that the team hired San Antonio Spurs assistant, and 6-time WNBA All-Star Becky Hammon as the team's head coach. Hammon rewarded the Aces less than nine months later with the fanchise's first WNBA Championship.

The seeds for Hammon's hiring were originally sewn when the Aces retired her jersey on September 13, 2021. That ceremony served as the culmination of the franchise's 25th anniversary alumni initiative, which saw the Aces embrace their Utah and San Antonio roots, and celebrate the players who helped build the franchise and the league from the ground up. Las Vegas owner Mark Davis spent time with Hammon and her family that week, and walked away understandably impressed.

Hammon played 16 seasons in the WNBA, including her final eight in San Antonio, where she led the franchise to its first finals appearance in 2008.

On August 5, 2014, Spurs head coach Gregg Popovich hired Hammon as a full-time assistant making her the first woman in NBA history to hold that position.

Since that time, Hammon has continued to accumulate coaching 'firsts' in the NBA. On July 3, 2015, she became the first woman to serve as head coach in the NBA's Summer League where she led the Spurs to the league title.

Less than a year later, Hammon became the first woman to be part of an All-Star coaching staff, and on December 30, 2020, following Popovich's ejection in San Antonio's game against Los Angeles, Hammon took over on the bench, becoming the first woman acting head coach in the history of the NBA.

A member of the league's 15th, 20th and 25th anniversary teams, Hammon went undrafted in 1999 following her All-American career at Colorado State. She signed with New York as a free agent that same year, helping the team to WNBA Finals appearances in three of her first four years in the Big Apple.

The Rapid City, South Dakota native earned her first All-Star nod in 2003, and represented New York on the Eastern Conference squad in 2005 and 2006 as well.



Following the 2006 season, New York traded Hammon to San Antonio. In her first year in silver and black, she posted what were then career highs in scoring (18.8 ppg), and assists (5.0) while earning another trip to the WNBA All-Star Game. As a team, the Silver Stars made their first appearance in the postseason since 2002, falling to Phoenix in the Western Conference Finals.

In 2008, Hammon led San Antonio to its first trip to the WNBA Finals where they fell to Detroit. The Silver Stars made the playoffs in each of her seven full seasons with the team, and Hammon once again was named to the All-Star team in 2009 and 2011.

She retired as the franchise leader in assists per game (5.1) and scoring average (15.6), and the WNBA leader in career free throw percentage (89.7).

Hammon, who was inducted into the Naismith Memorial Hall of Fame on Aug. 12, 2023, was inducted into the Colorado Sports Hall of Fame in 2015 and the San Antonio Sports Hall of Fame in 2018.
