Given all these possibilities, with the exception of 2024 games between the two teams playing today, we have decided not to include any box scores because we are lazy in an effort to rid the planet of unnecessary paper waste. WELCOME TO THE FAMILY!

During the offseason, the Las Vegas Aces welcomed three newcomers to the family—sixth-year vet Megan Gustafson and rookies Dyaisha Fair and Kate Martin—and welcomed back sixth-year vet Emma Cannon.

Cannon returns to the Aces after playing for Las Vegas in 2020 and 2021, including all six of the Aces' 2020 playoff contests. Waived by the Dallas Wings during the 2024 training camp, Cannon played this past offseason in Turkey for Nesibe, and averaged 18.3 points and 10.3 rebounds over 26 games. Her first taste of the WNBA came in 2017 with the Phoenix Mercury. She also has played for Connecticut and Indiana.

Prior to joining the WNBA, Gustafson was lowa's all-time leading scorer until you-know-who eclipsed her mark this season. She joins the Aces for her sixth year in the league after stints at Dallas, Washington and Phoenix. Gustafson is coming off a 2024 EuroCup championship and 2024 Great Britain League title with the London Lions, who suffered just 1 loss across both leagues all year.

Fair was selected at No. 16 by the Aces in the 2024 WNBA Draft. A 2024 Associated Press and USBWA All-America third team honoree, Fair played the first three years of her collegiate career at Buffalo and closed out her final two at Syracuse. The five-time all-conference first team selection left college ranked No. 3 among all-time NCAA Division I scorers with 3,403 points.

Martin, selected by the Aces at No. 18 in the 2024 WNBA Draft, spent six years in Iowa City after sitting out Iowa's 2018-19 season due to injury. She played a total of five years and, after her freshman season in 2019-20, started the final 139 games of her career. Martin was a 2024 All-Big 10 second team fselection and closed out her career with averages of 8.0 points, 4.6 rebounds and 2.9 assists over 163 games. Martin aided Iowa to a 132-37 (.781) record, four-straight NCAA Tournaments, including the past two championship games.

RAREFIED AIR

Only 5 players in the history of the league have produced 60 or more games with 20+ points and 10+ rebounds (regular season and playoff games combined). One of the two active players on the list is A'ja Wilson, who started the season with back-to-back 20/10 games, and has achieved a 20/10 game in more than 28% of her outings.

DOUBLE THE FUN

On opening night against Phoenix, A'ja Wilson scored 30 points, marking the 14th time she had and grabbed 13 rebounds for the the 77th double-double of her career. She now has 78, which ranks fourth among active players. It also marked the 14th time she had scored 30 or more points in a regular-season game, which ranks 8th among active W players, and is tied for 17th among all-time WNBA players.

SCORING MACHINES

The Aces roster lists three of the top 25 scorers all-time in NCAA Division I history in No. 2 Kelsey Plum (3,582), No. 3 Dyaisha Fair (3,403) and No. 24 Alysha Clark (2,865).

OUAD LIFT

A'ja Wilson (22.8), Kelsey Plum (18.7), Jackie Young (17.6) and Chelsea Gray (15.3) finished last year as the first four teammates in WNBA history to average 15 or more points per game in the same season.

WNRA 1K

On Sept. 26, 2023, against Dallas in the WNBA Semifinals, A'ja Wilson became the first player in league history to score 1,000 points in a single year when combining regular season and postseason points.

Kierstan Bell—Made 20 3-pointers over 44 games in 2023 after making 6 in 25 games in 2022, did not attempt a 3 in her first game and did not play in the Aces second game.

Emma Cannon—Made 32 of her final 33 free throws of the 2023 season, including 28 straight from July 25 to September 5.

Alysha Clark—In the playoffs, made 52.9% of her field goal attempts and 31.8% from distance, after closing out the final 11 games of the regular season making 32.8% from the floor and 28.3% from 3-point range.... Played more than 30 minutes on 2 occassions in 2023, both of which were starts—the July 5 win against Dallas and Oct. 18 championship victory at New York. She got the starting nod in the first game of 2024 and played 34 minutes.

Sydney Colson—Had 6 steals in her last 11 games of 2023 after picking off just 4 over her previous 24 games ... Megan Gustafson—Averaged 11.0 points per game over her last 19 contests of 2023, 13 of which she scored in double digits, after scoring just 4.0 points a game and reaching double figures just once over her first 15.

Chelsea Gray—Credited for 2 or more blocks 8 times last year, including in 3 of 8 playoff games, after not having done so more than once in any previous year... Had 11 double-doubles in 2023, 5 in the last 12 games of the regular season and 1 in the playoffs... Averaged 8.3 apg in final 12 games of the season...Dished out at least 2 assists in 154-straight regular season games, the longest active streak in the W.

Kelsey Plum—Has 20 games of 20 or more points over her last 39 games, including her first 3 Finals games in 2023 and first game of 2024, after reaching that mark just once in her first 10 games last year...Shot 93.5% (72-77 FTs) from the line over 21 games before dropping to 84.6% (22-26 FTs) in her final 6 games of 2023. After going 0 of 2 from the line on opening night, she hit on 6 of 6 on May 18.

SHOOTING OFF FIREWORKS

The Aces led the W in 2023 with 92.8 ppg, 4.8 bpg, 48.6% shooting from the field, 54.9% from 2-point, 84% from the line, a +12.6 scoring differential, a WNBA-record for offensive efficiency rating at 113.0, 97.7 defensive efficiency rating, 15.3 net rating and 1.85 assist-to-turnover ratio, and a league-low 11.8 turnovers a game. They missed out on leading in all 4 shooting percentage categories after dropping to 37.2% from 3-point range, just behind NY's 37.4%.

BLOCK PARTY

A'ja Wilson, who ranks No. 19 on the league's all-time career blocked shot list and 4th among active players, has blocked more shots than anyone else since entering the league in 2018.

LOOK AT ALL THE PEOPLE HERE TONIGHT

Over the past two seasons, the Aces have been rewriting their home attendance record books, and made WNBA history by selling out 15 of their 20 home games (and counting) this season.

- After seeing attendance averages list no higher than 5,606 over their first four seasons in Las Vegas, the Aces upped their average to 9,551 fans per game in 2023, and are on pace to surpass that number in 2024.
- The Aces sold out of their season-ticket memberships in early March and had 7 full sellouts by the third week in April, breaking the Las Vegas record of 6 regular season sellouts set in 2023. As of May 17, the Aces have 15 sold out home games this year.
- The attendance mark of 10,419 in their 2024 home opener against Phoenix on May 14 is the largest crowd for an Aces game at Michelob ULTRA Arena.
- The Las Vegas Aces welcomed 10,000 or more fans at 13 home games since arriving in the Valley in 2018—9 of which came in 2023, 2 in 2022 and 2 (so far) in 2024.
- They listed a franchise-high 17,406 fans at their final 2023 regular season game against the Mercury on Sept. 10, eclipsing the previous regular season record of 15,657, set on Aug. 4,1998, when the Utah Starzz played host to the Houston Comets.
- Three nights later, the Aces rewrote their playoff attendance record since arriving in Las Vegas with 12,927 fans at T-Mobile Arena for their first game of the First Round against the Sky. The franchise high for a playoff game is 16,012, set Oct. 3, 2008, when the San Antonio Stars hosted the Detroit Shock in the Finals.
- On Oct 8, 2023, against New York, the Aces welcomed the most fans ever to attend a playoff game in Michelob ULTRA Arena (10,300).
- The Aces ranked 1st in the W in attendance in 2023 with the help of 6 sold out games in the regular season and 2 more in the playoffs, and are among the top 3 in the league in 2024.

A'ja Wilson poured in a WNBA record-tying 53 points in the Aces 112-100 victory over Atlanta on Aug. 22, 2023. The 53-point outburst also set a new franchise scoring standard—just 11 days after tying the previous franchise-high of 40 points set initially by Kelsey Plum on July 9.

THAT'S OFFENSIVE

The Aces have had one of the best offenses in the W since making the move to Vegas. In 2020 they ranked 2nd in the WNBA in OER, and in each of the past 3 seasons they finished 1st, including posting a leaguerecord 113.0 OER in 2023.

The record is 45.28 percent set by Maya Moore in 2013.

The Aces scored 100 or more points in 7 games in 2021 and 2022, and upped that to a WNBA record-setting 11 times in 2023. The WNBA record for most times reaching the century mark in a season was previously 10, set by the 2010 Phoenix Mercury.

TIPPING BACK 40S

In scoring 40 points against the Lynx on July 9, 2023, Kelsey Plum not only upped the franchise scoring standard, since eclipsed by A'ja Wilson, but after making 77.8% (14-18 FGs) of her attempts, she also set the bar for all-time WNBA single-game shooting percentage when scoring 40 or more points, bypassing the 77.3% shot by Liz Cambage when she set the WNBA single-game scoring mark of 53 points (since tied by Wilson).

DOUBLE THE FUN TAKE 2

A'ja Wilson broke the franchise record for most regular season doubledoubles in a career in the final game of the 2022 season. Since being drafted (2018-present), Wilson has secured the most double-doubles in the league, and her 78 double-doubles list 10th on the all-time WNBA leader board and 4th among active players. Wilson's 22 double-doubles last year are tied as the 3rd most in a season in WNBA history, and ranked 2nd in the W in 2023 (Alyssa Thomas, 28).

TRIPLE CROWN

Chelsea Gray made history with the first points-rebounds-assist game in franchise history when she recorded 22 points, 11 rebounds and 11 assists against New York on Aug. 17, 2023. It was the franchise's 2nd triple-double-Margo Dydek had 12 points, 11 rebounds and 10 blocked shots against the Orlando Miracle on June 7, 2001. It also marked the second of Gray's career (13 points, 10 rebounds, 13 assists; July 7, 2019 vs. Washington).



JUST THE FACTS: 50+ MONEY LINE

In scoring a league-high-tying 53 points (16-23 FGs, 1-1 3FGs, 20-21 FTs) against Atlanta on Aug. 22, 2023, A'ja Wilson:

- Scored 20 or more points for a league-best 24th time in 2023, and the 98th time in her career. By the end of 2023, she had upped that mark to 103 and enters 2024 ranked 19th in WNBA history for most career 20+ point games, behind Brittney Griner in 18th place with 105.
- Scored 30 or more points for the 10th time in her career, tying her with Becky Hammon for most 30+ point games in franchise history. She picked up 3 more 30-point games before the end of the year, putting her alone in first place on that franchise list.
- Scored at least 40 points in a game twice in 2023, making her the 7th player in WNBA history to score 40 or more points in a game at least twice in the same year.
- Made 20 free throws, marking the second-most free throws ever made in a WNBA game (22, Cynthia Cooper)
- Set the franchise single-season scoring record, surpassing Kelsey Plum's 726 points scored in 2022. Wilson closed the season with 912 points.

TESTING, TESTING, 1, 2 3?

In scoring a then-career-high 40 points (17-25 FGs, 0-1 3PTs, 6-7 FTs) against Washington on Aug. 11, 2023, A'ja Wilson not only tied the franchise record set by Kelsey Plum earlier in the season, she also broke her own WNBA record for most points scored in a game without hitting a 3-pointer.

Wilson's 17 made field goals are the second most in a game in WNBA history (18, Lauren Jackson, Seattle at Washington, July 24, 2007) and the most in franchise history. Her 17 made 2-pointers tied Lauren Jackson's WNBA record for most made 2s in a game (Seattle vs. Los Angeles, Aug. 6, 2003).

FAST 50

Becky Hammon became the 2nd-fastest coach in WNBA history to reach 50 wins when the Aces upended the Atlanta Dream, 98-81, on August 2, 2023. It was Hammon's 62nd game as a head coach in the league. Michael Cooper tops the list with 50 wins in his 1st 57 games on the sidelines.

Mwadi Mabika held the league mark for wins through her 26th birthday until Jackie Young, at 25 years, 329 days, passed Mabika on Aug. 11, 2023, and now owns the record outright with 121. Looking ahead to Young's 27th birthday this year, Moore owns the No. 1 slot for wins before turning 27 with 136, and Young will need 14 more victories in 2024, prior to September 16, to claim that record outright.

Of the 237 women who have been a part of WNBA Championship teams (played at least one game in a championship season), just 14 of them have won titles in both their rookie and sophomore seasons in the league, and all but one played for the Houston Comets--Kierstan Bell.

Janeth Arcain, Cynthia Cooper, Tammy Jackson, Sheryl Swoopes, Tina Thompson listed on the 1997-2000 Houston Comets rosters that claimed the first four titles in league history. Monica Lamb and Amaya Valdemoro were rookies in 1998, and won again in 1999 and 2000; Wanda Guyton, Yolanda Moore, Kim Perrot and Tiffany Woosley were rookies in 1997 and won again with the Comets in 1998; Nyree Roberts spent her first two seasons in the W, 1998 and 1999, with Houston and Jennifer Rizzotti's first two years in the league were 1999 and 2000.



ALL SHE DOES IS WIN

While it's still early in her WNBA coaching career, not only did Becky Hammon lead the Aces to the their first championship during her inaugural season at the helm and follow that up with back-to-back titles in 2023, but she also boasts the highest winning percentage of any coach in WNBA history for those who have coached at least 50 games, as well as the highest winning percentage of any WNBA coach, period.

Further, the Aces hold the top 2 marks for <u>most defensive rebounds in a regulation game in WNBA history</u>, with 44 at Seattle on May 20, 2023, and 43 at Los Angeles on July 1, 2022. Phoenix had 47 defensive boards against San Antonio on June 7, 2014, but in a double overtime contest.



HEAD COACH BECKY HAMMON



Las Vegas Aces President Nikki Fargas announced on December 31, 2021, that the team hired San Antonio Spurs assistant and 6-time WNBA All-Star Becky Hammon as the team's head coach.

Hammon rewarded the Aces less than nine months later with the fanchise's first WNBA Championship.

She repeated that feat in her second season, helping the Aces become the first team to claim back-to-back WNBA titles in more than 20 years.

In her first two years with the Aces, Las Vegas tallied a 60-16 (.789) mark

in the regular season, 16-3 (.842) in playoff games and also captured the 2022 Commissioner's Cup crown.

The seeds for Hammon's hiring were originally sewn when the Aces retired her jersey on September 13, 2021. That ceremony served as the culmination of the franchise's 25th anniversary alumni initiative, which saw the Aces embrace their Utah and San Antonio roots, and celebrate the players who helped build the franchise and the league from the ground up. Las Vegas owner Mark Davis spent time with Hammon and her family that week, and walked away understandably impressed.

Hammon played 16 seasons in the WNBA, including her final eight in San Antonio, where she led the franchise to its first finals appearance in 2008.

On August 5, 2014, Spurs head coach Gregg Popovich hired Hammon as a full-time assistant making her the first woman in NBA history to hold that position.

Since that time, Hammon continued to accumulate coaching 'firsts' in the NBA. On July 3, 2015, she became the first woman to serve as head coach in the NBA's Summer League where she led the Spurs to the league title.

Less than a year later, Hammon became the first woman to be part of an All-Star coaching staff, and on December 30, 2020, following Popovich's ejection in San Antonio's game against Los Angeles, Hammon took over on the bench, becoming the first woman acting head coach in the history of the NBA.

Colorado State. She signed with New York as a free agent that same year, helping the team to WNBA Finals appearances in three of her first four years in the Big Apple.

The Rapid City, South Dakota native earned her first All-Star nod in 2003, and represented New York on the Eastern Conference squad in 2005 and 2006 as well.

Following the 2006 season, New York traded Hammon to San Antonio. In her first year in silver and black, she posted what were then career highs in scoring (18.8 ppg), and assists (5.0) while earning another trip to the WNBA All-Star Game. As a team, the Silver Stars made their first appearance in the postseason since 2002, falling to Phoenix in the Western Conference Finals.

In 2008, Hammon led San Antonio to its first trip to the WNBA Finals where they fell to Detroit. The Silver Stars made the playoffs in each of her seven full seasons with the team, and Hammon once again was named to the All-Star team in 2009 and 2011.

She retired as the franchise leader in assists per game (5.1) and scoring average (15.6), and the WNBA leader in career free throw percentage (89.7).

Hammon, who was inducted into the Naismith Memorial Hall of Fame on Aug. 12, 2023, was inducted into the Women's Basketball Hall of Fame in 2022, the Colorado Sports Hall of Fame in 2015 and the San Antonio Sports Hall of Fame in 2018.
