Given all these possibilities, with the exception of 2024 games between the two teams playing today, we have decided not to include any box scores because we are lazy in an effort to rid the planet of unnecessary paper waste. GOOD GAWD!

Chelsea Gray checked into the June 19 game against Seattle with 1:41 to play in the first quarter. It was her first game played since October 15, 2023, when she injured her left foot in Game 3 of the 2023 WNBA Finals.

She handed out her first assist of the 2024 season 20 seconds later on an Alysha Clark triple. That was also the 1,500th assist of Gray's career. She now has 1,506 and is the 9th player in WNBA history with at least 1,500 assists.

Further, Gray (3,684 points, 1,506 assists) became the 7th player in WNBA history with at least 3,500 points and 1,500 assists, and <u>was the third-fastest to accomplish the feat</u>, doing so in 299 games (Sue Bird, 279; Lindsay Whalen, 294).

CAROM CHALLENGE

A'ja Wilson is challenging the league record for <u>defensive rebounds per game</u>, averaging 9.143 per contest. Candace Parker holds the record for defensive boards per game at 8.938 in 2015 with the Sparks.

In 2022 the Aces allowed a WNBA-record 9.1 opponent made 3s per game. The 2024 Aces are allowing opponents to make 9.1 3-pointers per game so far in 2024, which is the second-most in the W. The Mercury (10.0 opponent made 3s) also are on pace to eclipse the record.

M'ST 4K

A'ja Wilson scored her 4,000th career point in her 198th career game on June 9 against Los Angeles. Only three players in league history have scored 4,000 points in fewer than 200 games. Wilson, who was 27 years and 306 days old on June 9, also became the fourth-youngest to hit the 4K mark.

PARIS BOUND (USA VERSION)

On June 11 it was announced that Chelsea Gray, Kelsey Plum, A'ja Wilson and Jackie Young would become two-time Olympians later this summer. USA Basketball named the four Aces All-Stars and WNBA champions as members of the USA National Team that will represent our country at the 2024 Olympics in Paris. Gray and Wilson previously earned Olympic gold in Tokyo playing the traditional five-on-five version of the game, while Plum and Young were part of the team that claimed the first Olympic 3x3 gold medal ever awarded.

PARIS BOUND (AZERBAIJAN VERSION)

Tiffany Hayes became a naturalized Azerbaijani citizen in 2015 in order to play 3x3 hoops for the small nation at the 2015 European Games. Fast forward to 2024. Hayes recently led Azerbaijan to a berth into the 3x3 Olympic tournament, claiming gold at the first 2024 FIBA 3x3 Universality Tournament held April 12-14 in Hong Kong. Hayes was named MVP after averaging a team-high 6.5 ppg (5th best in the tournament). Sidelined by injury in her team's lone loss of the tournament, Hayes returned to tally 8 points and 11 rebounds in the semifinal and 6 points and 3 assists in the final.

20/20/20 VISION

On May 21 and 25, A'ja Wilson, Jackie Young and Kelsey Plum became the third trio in WNBA history to each score 20 or more points in back-to-back games. Previously, Chelsea Gray, Plum and Wilson each scored 20+ on July 25 and 30, 2023; and the Mercury's DeWanna Bonner, Brittney Griner and Diana Taurasi were the first trio to do so on Aug. 12 and 17, 2018.

RECORD-SETTING NIGHT

Las Vegas established a new franchise record for points in a quarter with 42 in the second period against Phoenix on June 13 with the help of a WNBA single-quarter record 10 made 3-pointers. They also broke the league mark for most made 3s in a quarter without a miss (10 of 10).

CONNECTION TROUBLES

The Aces finished among the top 3 teams in the league for shooting percentage over the past 4 seasons, including an all-time league third-best 48.6% last season. However, the Aces struggled to find the bottom of the net to start the season, shooting below 45% in 7 of their first 9 games, but but are beginning to move the needle in the right direction, hitting for 45% or better in 4 of their last 5 games.

MINUTE BY MINUTE

Since the franchise moved to Las Vegas, only one Aces player has logged an average of more than 33 minutes per game (Jackie Young, 33:13 mpg, 2022), although it used to happen with some degree of regularity.

In 2024, Kelsey Plum, who is playing the second-most amount of minutes in the league (36:01), could challenge Jennifer Azzi's franchise record of 37:44 minutes per game.

RECORD WATCH

A'ja Wilson is on pace to raise the franchise career scoring record ahead of the All-Star/Olympic break. Sophia Young-Malcolm scored an even 4,300 points in her 9 years in San Antonio and Wilson should have that record midway through her 6th season in Las Vegas. It also is one of the few franchise scoring records not yet owned by Wilson. She has the records most games with 15+ points (159), 20+ points (117), 25+ points (49), 30+ points (17), 35+ points (8) and 40+ points (2).

CENTURY MARK

The Aces scored 100 or more points in 7 games in 2021 and 2022, and upped that to a WNBA record-setting 11 times in 2023. The WNBA record for most times reaching the century mark in a season was previously 10, set by the 2010 Phoenix Mercury.

This season it took the Aces, who rank second in the W in scoring at 87.2 ppg, until their 11th game before scoring in triple digits.

RAREFIED AIR

Only 5 players in the history of the league have produced 60 or more games with 20+ points and 10+ rebounds (regular season and playoff games combined). One of the two active players on the list is A'ja Wilson, who started the season with 5-straight 20/10 games, and has achieved a 20/10 game in a league-best 30% of her career outings.

Over the past two seasons, the Aces have been rewriting their home attendance record books, and made WNBA history by becoming the first team in the league to sell out 100% of their home games in a season

- The 8 Las Vegas home games played in 2024 are the top 8 attendance marks ever for the Aces at Michelob ULTRA Arena.
- After seeing attendance averages hit no higher than 5,606 over their first four seasons in Las Vegas, the Aces upped their average to 9,551 fans per game in 2023, and are on pace to surpass that number in 2024 with an average of 10,379 over their first 8 games.
- The Aces sold out of their season-ticket memberships in early March and had 7 full sellouts by the third week in April, breaking the Las Vegas record of 6 regular season sellouts set in 2023.
- The attendance mark of **10,424** against New York on June 15 is the largest crowd ever for an Aces game at Michelob ULTRA Arena.
- The Las Vegas Aces welcomed 10,000 or more fans at 20 home games since arriving in the Valley in 2018—3 of which came in 2022, 9 were in 2023 and 8 (and counting) in 2024.
- They listed a franchise-high 17,406 fans at T-Mobile Arena in their final 2023 regular season game against the Mercury on Sept. 10, eclipsing the previous regular season record of 15,657, set on Aug. 4,1998, when the Utah Starzz played host to the Houston Comets.
- Three nights later, the Aces rewrote their playoff attendance record since arriving in Las Vegas with 12,927 fans at T-Mobile Arena for their first game of the First Round against the Sky. The franchise high for a playoff game is 16,012, set Oct. 3, 2008, when the San Antonio Stars hosted the Detroit Shock in the Finals.

The Aces led the W in 2023 with 92.8 ppg, 4.8 bpg, 48.6% shooting from the field, 54.9% from 2-point, 84% from the line, a +12.6 scoring differential, a WNBA-record for offensive efficiency rating at 113.0, 97.7 defensive efficiency rating, 15.3 net rating and 1.85 assist-to-turnover ratio, and a league-low 11.8 turnovers a game. They missed out on leading in all 4 shooting percentage categories after dropping to 37.2% from 3-point range, just behind NY's 37.4%.

On Sept. 26, 2023, against Dallas in the WNBA Semifinals, A'ja Wilson became the first player in league history to score 1,000 points in a single year when combining regular season and postseason points.

A'JA THE LOVE BUG

A'ja Wilson poured in a WNBA record-tying 53 points in the Aces 112-100 victory over Atlanta on Aug. 22, 2023. The 53-point outburst also set a new franchise scoring standard—just 11 days after tying the previous franchise-high of 40 points set initially by Kelsey Plum on July 9.

TESTING, TESTING, 1, 2 3?

In scoring 40 points (17-25 FGs, 0-1 3PTs, 6-7 FTs) against Washington on Aug. 11, 2023, A'ja Wilson not only tied the franchise record set by Kelsey Plum earlier in the season, she also broke her own WNBA record for most points scored in a game without hitting a 3-pointer.

Wilson's 17 made field goals are the second most in a game in WNBA history (18, Lauren Jackson, Seattle at Washington, July 24, 2007) and the most in franchise history. Her 17 made 2-pointers tied Lauren Jackson's WNBA record for most made 2s in a game (Seattle vs. Los Angeles, Aug. 6, 2003).



HEAD COACH BECKY HAMMON



Las Vegas Aces President Nikki Fargas announced on December 31, 2021, that the team hired San Antonio Spurs assistant and 6-time WNBA All-Star Becky Hammon as the team's head coach.

Hammon rewarded the Aces less than nine months later with the fanchise's first WNBA Championship.

She repeated that feat in her second season, helping the Aces become the first team to claim back-to-back WNBA titles in more than 20 years.

In her first two years with the Aces, Las Vegas tallied a 60-16 (.789) mark

in the regular season, 16-3 (.842) in playoff games and also captured the 2022 Commissioner's Cup crown.

The seeds for Hammon's hiring were originally sewn when the Aces retired her jersey on September 13, 2021. That ceremony served as the culmination of the franchise's 25th anniversary alumni initiative, which saw the Aces embrace their Utah and San Antonio roots, and celebrate the players who helped build the franchise and the league from the ground up. Las Vegas owner Mark Davis spent time with Hammon and her family that week, and walked away understandably impressed.

Hammon played 16 seasons in the WNBA, including her final eight in San Antonio, where she led the franchise to its first finals appearance in 2008.

On August 5, 2014, Spurs head coach Gregg Popovich hired Hammon as a full-time assistant making her the first woman in NBA history to hold that position.

Since that time, Hammon continued to accumulate coaching 'firsts' in the NBA. On July 3, 2015, she became the first woman to serve as head coach in the NBA's Summer League where she led the Spurs to the league title.

Less than a year later, Hammon became the first woman to be part of an All-Star coaching staff, and on December 30, 2020, following Popovich's ejection in San Antonio's game against Los Angeles, Hammon took over on the bench, becoming the first woman acting head coach in the history of the NBA.

A member of the league's 15th, 20th and 25th anniversary teams, Hammon went undrafted in 1999 following her All-American career at Colorado State. She signed with New York as a free agent that same year, helping the team to WNBA Finals appearances in three of her first four years in the Big Apple.



The Rapid City, South Dakota native earned her first All-Star nod in 2003, and represented New York on the Eastern Conference squad in 2005 and 2006 as well.

Following the 2006 season, New York traded Hammon to San Antonio. In her first year in silver and black, she posted what were then career highs in scoring (18.8 ppg), and assists (5.0) while earning another trip to the WNBA All-Star Game. As a team, the Silver Stars made their first appearance in the postseason since 2002, falling to Phoenix in the Western Conference Finals.

In 2008, Hammon led San Antonio to its first trip to the WNBA Finals where they fell to Detroit. The Silver Stars made the playoffs in each of her seven full seasons with the team, and Hammon once again was named to the All-Star team in 2009 and 2011.

She retired as the franchise leader in assists per game (5.1) and scoring average (15.6), and the WNBA leader in career free throw percentage (89.7).

Hammon, who was inducted into the Naismith Memorial Hall of Fame on Aug. 12, 2023, was inducted into the Women's Basketball Hall of Fame in 2022, the Colorado Sports Hall of Fame in 2015 and the San Antonio Sports Hall of Fame in 2018.




