What about box scores? Some folks like to see the box score from the previous games in Game Notes, while some folks like to peruse all of that season's box scores. Some like to see the box scores from previous meetings between the two teams playing today.

Given all these possibilities, with the exception of 2024 games between the two teams playing today, we have decided not to include any box scores <del>because we are lazy</del> in an effort to rid the planet of unnecessary paper waste. <u>All WNBA box scores (PDFs) are located online and can be</u> <u>downloaded here</u>.

#### ALL SHE DOES IS WIN, WIN, WIN

When Jackie Young turned 25 on September 16, 2022, she had 87 regular season wins to her credit—one off the record for most wins prior to turning 25, <u>held by Lynx legend Maya Moore</u> (88).

Mwadi Mabika held the league mark for wins through her 26th birthday until Jackie Young, at 25 years, 329 days, passed Mabika on Aug. 11, 2023, and now <u>owns the record outright with 121</u>.

Looking ahead to Young's 27th birthday this year, <u>Moore owns the</u> <u>No. 1 slot for wins before turning 27 with 137</u>, and Young will need 3 more victories prior to September 16, 2024, to claim that record outright.

Against Dallas on July 7, A'ja Wilson scored 28 points and surpassed Sophia Young-Malcolm (4,300 points) as the franchise's leading scorer, finishing the game with 4,301 career points. She surpassed Young-Malcolm's franchise rebounding record earlier in the season.

Playing in her 7th season, Wilson now ranks 39th on the WNBA all-time scoring list with 4,325 points. Next up are teammate and No. 38 Tiffany Hayes (4,418) and No. 37 Crystal Langhorne (4,433). Odyssey Sims (39) and Skylar Diggins-Smith (34) did so in a Tulsa 95-93 loss to San Antonio on on July 22, 2014.

# LOOK AT ALL THE PEOPLE HERE TONIGHT

Over the past two seasons, the Aces have been rewriting their home attendance record books, and made WNBA history by becoming the first team in the league to sell out 100% of their home games in a season.

- On July 2, 2024, there were 20,366 in attendance at T-Mobile Arena, which is the fifth-most attended game in WNBA regular season history and the most since 1999.
- The franchise-high 20,366 fans at T-Mobile Arena against Indiana on July 2 eclipsed the previous regular season record of 17,406, set on Sept. 10, 2023, when the Aces played host to the Mercury.
- Ten of the 11 Las Vegas home games played in Michelob ULTRA Arena in 2024 list as the top 10 attendance marks ever for the Aces at MUA.
- After seeing attendance averages hit no higher than 5,606 over their first four seasons in Las Vegas, the Aces upped their average to 9,551 fans per game in 2023, and are on pace to surpass that number in 2024 with an average of 11,211 over their first 12 home games.
- The Aces sold out of their season-ticket memberships in early March and had 7 full sellouts by the third week in April, breaking the Las Vegas record of 6 regular season sellouts set in 2023.
- The attendance mark of **10,424** against New York on June 15 is the largest crowd ever for an Aces game at Michelob ULTRA Arena.
- The Las Vegas Aces have welcomed 10,000 or more fans at 24 home games since arriving in the Valley in 2018—3 of which came in 2022, 9 were in 2023 and 12 (and counting) in 2024.
- On Sept. 13, 2023, the Aces rewrote their playoff attendance record since arriving in Las Vegas with 12,927 fans at T-Mobile Arena for their first game of the First Round against the Sky. The franchise high for a playoff game is 16,012, set Oct. 3, 2008, when the San Antonio Stars hosted the Detroit Shock in the Finals.
- On Oct 8, 2023, against New York, the Aces welcomed the most fans ever to attend a playoff game in Michelob ULTRA Arena (10,300).
- The Aces ranked 1st in the W in attendance in 2023 with the help of 6 sold out games. The Aces also sold out 2 playoff games last season.

On May 21 and 25, A'ja Wilson, Jackie Young and Kelsey Plum became the third trio in WNBA history to each score 20 or more points in back-to-back games.

Previously, Chelsea Gray, Plum and Wilson each scored 20+ on July 25 and 30, 2023; and the Mercury's DeWanna Bonner, Brittney Griner and Diana Taurasi were the first trio to do so on Aug. 12 and 17, 2018.

Wilson has another 20/10 record streak brewing, started 3 games ago on July 5. Should she hit the mark again against Atlanta, she'll tie Charles, Fowles and Johnson for the W's 2nd-longest 20/10 streak.

#### **CENTURY MARK**

The Aces scored 100 or more points in 7 games in 2021 and 2022, and upped that to a WNBA record-setting 11 times in 2023. The WNBA record for most times reaching the century mark in a season was previously 10, set by the 2010 Phoenix Mercury.

This season it took the Aces, who lead the W in scoring at 89.1 ppg, until their 11th game before scoring in triple digits, and they hit triple digits for the second time in their 20th game.

### **RECORD-SETTING NIGHT**

Las Vegas established a new franchise record for points in a quarter with 42 in the second period against Phoenix on June 13 with the help of a WNBA single-quarter record 10 made 3-pointers. They also broke the league mark for most made 3s in a quarter without a miss (10 of 10).

#### **TRIPLE A**

A'ja Wilson established the fanchise record for scoring average in a season as a rookie and now, after resetting the record in 2023, owns 4 of the top 5 season scoring averages in franchise history. She also is the only player in franchise history to average 20+ points in a season on more than one occasion, and is on pace to do so again in 2024.

### **PARIS BOUND (USA VERSION)**

On June 11, 2024. USA Basketball named Chelsea Gray, Kelsey Plum, A'ja Wilson and Jackie Young to the Olyjmpic Team which will represent the US in the Paris Olympics. Gray and Wilson previously earned Olympic gold in Tokyo playing the traditional five-on-five version of the game, while Plum and Young were part of the team that claimed the first Olympic 3x3 gold medal ever awarded.

#### **PARIS BOUND (AZERBAIJAN VERSION)**

Tiffany Hayes became a naturalized Azerbaijani citizen in 2015 in order to play 3x3 hoops for the small nation at the 2015 European Games. Fast forward to 2024. Hayes recently led Azerbaijan to a berth into the <u>3x3</u> <u>Olympic tournament</u>, claiming gold at the first <u>2024 FIBA 3x3 Universality</u> <u>Tournament</u> held April 12-14 in Hong Kong. Hayes was named MVP after averaging a team-high 6.5 ppg (5th best in the tournament).

#### **PARIS BOUND (SPANISH VERSION)**

Aces center Megan Gustafson was officially named to the 2024 Spain Olympic Women's Basketball Team and will represent Spain in Paris later this month. The naturalized Spaniard debuted for the European nation in the 2024 Olympic Qualifying Tournament against Canada, Japan and host Hungary from Feb. 8-11 in Sopron. She averaged a team-high 14.3 points and added 3.3 rebounds to help lead the world's 4th-ranked team to a 2-1 record and its Olympic berth.

#### **BOARD ALLERGIES**

Offensive Rebound Percentages had been declining for years as teams relied more and more on the 3-pointer as a weapon.

From 1997-2003, no team grabbed fewer than 30 percent of available offensive rebounds.

Last season, 9 teams finished below 30 percent, and the 2023 Aces and Mystics now list among the all-time "low 5" in that category. The current low mark this season is held by the Aces at 23.0 and threatening the league record of 23.3%.

The Aces led the W in 2023 with 92.8 ppg, 4.8 bpg, 48.6% shooting from the field, 54.9% from 2-point, 84% from the line, a +12.6 scoring differential, a WNBA-record for offensive efficiency rating at 113.0, 97.7 defensive efficiency rating, 15.3 net rating and 1.85 assist-to-turnover ratio, and a league-low 11.8 turnovers a game. They missed out on leading in all 4 shooting percentage categories after dropping to 37.2% from 3-point range, just behind NY's 37.4%.

#### A'JA THE LOVE BUG

A'ja Wilson poured in a WNBA record-tying 53 points in the Aces 112-100 victory over Atlanta on Aug. 22, 2023. The 53-point outburst also set a new franchise scoring standard—just 11 days after tying the previous franchise-high of 40 points set initially by Kelsey Plum on July 9.

#### **TIPPING BACK 40S**

In scoring 40 points against the Lynx on July 9, 2023, Kelsey Plum not only made 77.8% (14-18 FGs) of her attempts, she set the record for <u>the</u><u>highest single-game shooting percentage when scoring 40 or more points</u>. The previous standard of 77.3% was set by Liz Cambage when she set the WNBA single-game scoring mark of 53 points.

# **HEAD COACH BECKY HAMMON**



Las Vegas Aces President Nikki Fargas announced on December 31, 2021, that the team hired San Antonio Spurs assistant and 6-time WNBA All-Star Becky Hammon as the team's head coach.

Hammon rewarded the Aces less than nine months later with the fanchise's first WNBA Championship.

She repeated that feat in her second season, helping the Aces become the first team to claim back-to-back WNBA titles in more than 20 years.

In her first two years with the Aces, Las Vegas tallied a 60-16 (.789) mark

in the regular season, 16-3 (.842) in playoff games and also captured the 2022 Commissioner's Cup crown.

The seeds for Hammon's hiring were originally sewn when the Aces retired her jersey on September 13, 2021. That ceremony served as the culmination of the franchise's 25th anniversary alumni initiative, which saw the Aces embrace their Utah and San Antonio roots, and celebrate the players who helped build the franchise and the league from the ground up. Las Vegas owner Mark Davis spent time with Hammon and her family that week, and walked away understandably impressed.

Hammon played 16 seasons in the WNBA, including her final eight in San Antonio, where she led the franchise to its first finals appearance in 2008.

On August 5, 2014, Spurs head coach Gregg Popovich hired Hammon as a full-time assistant making her the first woman in NBA history to hold that position.

Since that time, Hammon continued to accumulate coaching 'firsts' in the NBA. On July 3, 2015, she became the first woman to serve as head coach in the NBA's Summer League where she led the Spurs to the league title.

Less than a year later, Hammon became the first woman to be part of an All-Star coaching staff, and on December 30, 2020, following Popovich's ejection in San Antonio's game against Los Angeles, Hammon took over on the bench, becoming the first woman acting head coach in the history of the NBA.

A member of the league's 15th, 20th and 25th anniversary teams, Hammon went undrafted in 1999 following her All-American career at Colorado State. She signed with New York as a free agent that same year, helping the team to WNBA Finals appearances in three of her first four years in the Big Apple.

The Rapid City, South Dakota native earned her first All-Star nod in 2003, and represented New York on the Eastern Conference squad in 2005 and 2006 as well.

Following the 2006 season, New York traded Hammon to San Antonio. In her first year in silver and black, she posted what were then career highs in scoring (18.8 ppg), and assists (5.0) while earning another trip to the WNBA All-Star Game. As a team, the Silver Stars made their first appearance in the postseason since 2002, falling to Phoenix in the Western Conference Finals.

In 2008, Hammon led San Antonio to its first trip to the WNBA Finals where they fell to Detroit. The Silver Stars made the playoffs in each of her seven full seasons with the team, and Hammon once again was named to the All-Star team in 2009 and 2011.

She retired as the franchise leader in assists per game (5.1) and scoring average (15.6), and the WNBA leader in career free throw percentage (89.7).

Hammon, who was inducted into the Naismith Memorial Hall of Fame on Aug. 12, 2023, was inducted into the Women's Basketball Hall of Fame in 2022, the Colorado Sports Hall of Fame in 2015 and the San Antonio Sports Hall of Fame in 2018.
