The Sky had an impressive scoring trio of their own as Marina Mabrey scored 21, Chennedy Carter added 20 and Angel Reese chipped in 18.

Following the 2024 WNBA All-Star Game, featuring Chelsea Gray, Kelsey Plum, A'ja Wilson and Jackie Young on the USA roster, six Aces will compete in the Olympic Games in Paris. ALL SHE DOES IS WIN, WIN, WIN

When Jackie Young turned 25 on September 16, 2022, she had 87 regular season wins to her credit—one off the record for most wins prior to turning 25, held by Lynx legend Maya Moore (88).

Mwadi Mabika held the league mark for wins through her 26th birthday until Jackie Young, at 25 years, 329 days, passed Mabika on Aug. 11, 2023, and now owns the record outright with 121.

Heading into the 2024 season, Moore owned the No. 1 slot for wins before turning 27 with 137. Young drew even with Moore on July 12, and will claim the record outright with the Aces next victory. Her birthday is Sept. 16, so there will be 14 more games after the Olympic break to increase the record. Moore also holds the record for wins (164) before turning 28, a number within Young's reach before next September.

REBOUND RALLY

A'ja Wilson grabbed a combined 55 rebounds over her past 3 games (20 vs Seattle, 18 vs Atlanta, 17 vs Washington), tying Tina Charles (June 14-19, 1999) for the second-highest 3-game total in WNBA history. Sylvia Fowles (June 1-8, 2012) and Yolanda Griffith (June 14-19, 1999) own the record with 56 apiece.

The record for rebounds over a 4-game stretch is 70, held by Charles (June 18-25, 2010), which Wilson would surpass with 16 caroms against the Sky. Charles (June 18-27, 2010) also holds the record for boards in a 5-game stretch with 86.

THE QUICKENING

On July 10, A'ja Wilson became the 7th person in WNBA history to amass at least 4,000 points, 1,500 rebounds, 400 assists, 400 blocked shots and 200 steals. She was the quickest to do so, having reached the milestone in 210 games.

Through the first 23 games of 2024, Wilson has tallied 4386 points, 1909 rebounds, 460 assists, 245 steals and 407 blocked shots.

It is very conceivable that before the end of the season Wilson also will become the quickest to 4,500 points, 2,000 rebounds 400 assists, 400 blocked shots and 200 steals.

YAWN, JUST ANOTHER 20/10

Wilson started the season by recording 5-straight 20-point, 10-rebound games, which broke the WNBA record of 4-straight 20/10 games, previously held by Sylvia Fowles (2x), Tina Charles and Glory Johnson.

Wilson has another 20/10 record streak brewing after tying her own streak on her 5th 20/10 game in a row against Washington on Aug. 12.

Since the franchise moved to Las Vegas, only one Aces player has logged an average of more than 33 minutes per game (Jackie Young, 33:13 mpg, 2022), although it used to happen with some degree of regularity.

In 2024, however, three Aces are logging at least 33 minutes a game: Kelsey Plum (35:05), whose average ranks 3rd in the W, A'ja Wilson (34:03) and Jackie Young (33:32).

GOOD GAWD!

When Chelsea Gray checked into the June 19 game against Seattle it was her first game played since October 15, 2023, when she injured her left foot in Game 3 of the 2023 WNBA Finals.

She handed out her first assist of the 2024 season 20 seconds later on an Alysha Clark triple for her 1,500th career assist. She now ranks 9th on the WNBA's career assist chart.

Gray also became the 7th player in WNBA history with at least 3,500 points and 1,500 assists, and was the third-fastest to accomplish the feat, doing so in 299 games (Sue Bird, 279; Lindsay Whalen, 294).

Playing in her 7th season, Wilson now ranks 39th on the WNBA all-time scoring list with 4,386 points. Next up are No. 38 Crystal Langhorne (4,433), No. 37 Jia Perkins (4,435) and No. 36 Tiffany Hayes (4,438). If she keeps up her scoring pace, Wilson could break into the top 30 by the end of the season (No. 30 is Chamique Holdsclaw with 4,716 points).

- Over the past two seasons, the Aces have been rewriting their home attendance record books, and **made WNBA history by becoming the first team in the league to sell out 100% of their home games in a season.**
- On July 2, 2024, there were **20,366 in attendance at T-Mobile Arena**, which is the fifth-most attended game in WNBA regular season history and the most since 1999.
 - The **franchise-high 20,366 fans at T-Mobile Arena** against Indiana on July 2 eclipsed the previous regular season record of 17,406, set on Sept. 10, 2023, when the Aces played host to the Mercury.
 - Ten of the 11 Las Vegas home games played in Michelob ULTRA Arena in 2024 list as the top 10 attendance marks ever for the Aces at MUA.
 - After seeing attendance averages hit no higher than 5,606 over their first four seasons in Las Vegas, the Aces upped their average to 9,551 fans per game in 2023, and are on pace to surpass that number in 2024 with **an average of 11,211 over their first 12 home games.**
 - The Aces sold out of their season-ticket memberships in early March and had 7 full sellouts by the third week in April, breaking the Las Vegas record of 6 regular season sellouts set in 2023.

PARIS BOUND (USA VERSION)

On June 11, 2024, USA Basketball named Chelsea Gray, Kelsey Plum, A'ja Wilson and Jackie Young to the Olympic Team which will represent the US in the Paris Olympics. The naturalized Spaniard debuted for the European nation in the 2024 Olympic Qualifying Tournament against Canada, Japan and host Hungary from Feb. 8-11 in Sopron. While it's still early in her WNBA coaching career, not only did Becky Hammon lead the Aces to their first championship during her inaugural season at the helm and follow that up with back-to-back titles in 2023, but she also boasts the highest winning percentage of any coach in WNBA history for those who have coached at least 50 games.

Since 2019, the Aces recorded 4 of the 5 highest defensive rebounds per game averages in WNBA history. The 2024 Aces have moved into the top 5, currently listing 2nd with 29.83 defensive boards a game.

Further, the Aces hold the top 2 marks for most defensive rebounds in a regulation game in WNBA history, with 44 at Seattle on May 20, 2023, and 43 at Los Angeles on July 1, 2022. Phoenix had 47 defensive boards against San Antonio on June 7, 2014, but in a double overtime contest.

The 2023 Aces won a WNBA-record 14 games by 20 or more points and broke several other league records in the process.

QUAD LIFT

A’ja Wilson (22.8), Kelsey Plum (18.7), Jackie Young (17.6) and Chelsea Gray (15.3) finished last year as the first four teammates in WNBA history to average 15 or more points per game in the same season.

A’JA THE LOVE BUG

A’ja Wilson poured in a WNBA record-tying 53 points in the Aces 112-100 victory over Atlanta on Aug. 22, 2023. The 53-point outburst also set a new franchise scoring standard—just 11 days after tying the previous franchise-high of 40 points set initially by Kelsey Plum on July 9.

SHOOTING OFF FIREWORKS

The Aces led the W in 2023 with 92.8 ppg, 4.8 bpg, 48.6% shooting from the field, 54.9% from 2-point, 84% from the line, a +12.6 scoring differential, a WNBA-record for offensive efficiency rating at 113.0, 97.7 defensive efficiency rating, 15.3 net rating and 1.85 assist-to-turnover ratio, and a league-low 11.8 turnovers a game. They missed out on leading in all 4 shooting percentage categories after dropping to 37.2% from 3-point range, just behind NY’s 37.4%.

TOP OF THE PECKING OERDER

Up until 2023, just 7 teams in WNBA history have boasted both the best offense and defense in the same season as measured by Offensive (OER) and Defensive Efficiency Ratings (DER)—points scored and allowed per 100 possessions—and 6 of them had won the title (*). The Aces became the 8th to end the season ranking first for both OER and DER, and the 7th among that list to claim the W crown.

HEAD COACH BECKY HAMMON



Las Vegas Aces President Nikki Fargas announced on December 31, 2021, that the team hired San Antonio Spurs assistant and 6-time WNBA All-Star Becky Hammon as the team's head coach.

Hammon rewarded the Aces less than nine months later with the franchise's first WNBA Championship.

She repeated that feat in her second season, helping the Aces become the first team to claim back-to-back WNBA titles in more than 20 years.

In her first two years with the Aces, Las Vegas tallied a 60-16 (.789) mark

in the regular season, 16-3 (.842) in playoff games and also captured the 2022 Commissioner's Cup crown.

The seeds for Hammon's hiring were originally sewn when the Aces retired her jersey on September 13, 2021. That ceremony served as the culmination of the franchise's 25th anniversary alumni initiative, which saw the Aces embrace their Utah and San Antonio roots, and celebrate the players who helped build the franchise and the league from the ground up. Las Vegas owner Mark Davis spent time with Hammon and her family that week, and walked away understandably impressed.

Hammon played 16 seasons in the WNBA, including her final eight in San Antonio, where she led the franchise to its first finals appearance in 2008.

On August 5, 2014, Spurs head coach Gregg Popovich hired Hammon as a full-time assistant making her the first woman in NBA history to hold that position.

Since that time, Hammon continued to accumulate coaching 'firsts' in the NBA. On July 3, 2015, she became the first woman to serve as head coach in the NBA's Summer League where she led the Spurs to the league title.

Less than a year later, Hammon became the first woman to be part of an All-Star coaching staff, and on December 30, 2020, following Popovich's ejection in San Antonio's game against Los Angeles, Hammon took over on the bench, becoming the first woman acting head coach in the history of the NBA.

A member of the league's 15th, 20th and 25th anniversary teams, Hammon went undrafted in 1999 following her All-American career at Colorado State. She signed with New York as a free agent that same year, helping the team to WNBA Finals appearances in three of her first four years in the Big Apple.

The Rapid City, South Dakota native earned her first All-Star nod in 2003, and represented New York on the Eastern Conference squad in 2005 and 2006 as well.

Following the 2006 season, New York traded Hammon to San Antonio. In her first year in silver and black, she posted what were then career highs in scoring (18.8 ppg), and assists (5.0) while earning another trip to the WNBA All-Star Game. As a team, the Silver Stars made their first appearance in the postseason since 2002, falling to Phoenix in the Western Conference Finals.

In 2008, Hammon led San Antonio to its first trip to the WNBA Finals where they fell to Detroit. The Silver Stars made the playoffs in each of her seven full seasons with the team, and Hammon once again was named to the All-Star team in 2009 and 2011.

She retired as the franchise leader in assists per game (5.1) and scoring average (15.6), and the WNBA leader in career free throw percentage (89.7).

Hammon, who was inducted into the Naismith Memorial Hall of Fame on Aug. 12, 2023, was inducted into the Women's Basketball Hall of Fame in 2022, the Colorado Sports Hall of Fame in 2015 and the San Antonio Sports Hall of Fame in 2018.

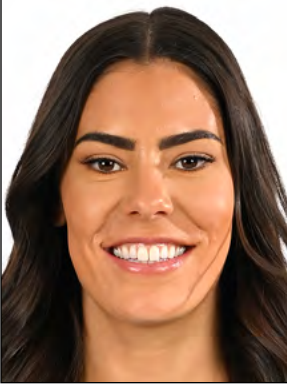
