A 5TH ACE UP THE SLEEVE?

In four of the past five seasons the WNBA 6th Player of the Year Award has been earned by a member of the Aces team, including last year's winner Alysha Clark. The Aces are looking to go five for six with its early-season acquisition Tiffany Hayes. Signed as a free agent on May 31, Hayes is making her case for the award. The 12-year veteran is averaging 8.8 points while connecting on 48.4 percent of her shots from the field and 34.7 percent from 3-point range.

CALCIUM EFFICIENT

A'ja Wilson had her record for consecutive games scoring 20 or more points snapped at 20 when Washington held her to 11 points on June 29.

THEY'RE EIGHTEEN AND WE LIKE IT

A season after being among the first four teammates to average 15 or more points per game in the same season, Kelsey Plum (18.2 ppg), A'ja Wilson (26.9) and Jackie Young (17.9) are looking to become the first three teammates to each average more than 18 points per game in the same year.

REBOUND RALLY

A'ja Wilson grabbed a combined 55 rebounds over a 3-game span just ahead of the Olympic break (20 vs Seattle, 18 vs Atlanta, 17 vs Washington), tying Tina Charles (June 14-19, 1999) for the second-highest 3-game total in WNBA history. Sylvia Fowles (June 1-8, 2012) and Yolanda Griffith (June 14-19, 1999) own the record with 56 apiece.

Wilson then missed tying the record for rebounds over a 4-game stretch by 1 board in the final game ahead of the break (14 vs Chicago) for a combined 69 caroms over that span. Charles holds the record for rebounds over a 4-game stretch with 70 (June 18-25, 2010).

THE OUICKENING

On July 10, A'ja Wilson became the <u>7th person in WNBA history</u> to amass at least 4,000 points, 1,500 rebounds, 400 assists, 400 blocked shots and 200 steals. She was the quickest to do so, having reached the milestone in 210 games.

Through 216 career games, Wilson has tallied 4,487 points, 1,956 rebounds, 466 assists, 259 steals and 417 blocked shots.

If she remains on pace, it is very conceivable that by the end of August Wilson also will become the quickest to 4,500 points, 2,000 rebounds 400 assists, 400 blocked shots and 200 steals. Lisa Leslie currently holds that record, having accomplished the feat in 258 games.

CAROM CHALLENGE

A'ja Wilson is threatening to set a new standard for the league's record for <u>defensive rebounds per game</u>, currently owned by Jonquel Jones.

YAWN, JUST ANOTHER 20/10

Wilson started the season by recording 5-straight 20-point, 10-rebound games, which broke the WNBA record of 4-straight 20/10 games, previously held by Sylvia Fowles (twice), Tina Charles and Glory Johnson.

That record has been left in the past. Wilson tied her own record at Washington on July 14 and upped it to an 8-game streak on Aug. 18 versus Los Angeles.

GOOD GAWD!

When Chelsea Gray checked into the June 19 game against Seattle it was her first game played since October 15, 2023, when she injured her left foot in Game 3 of the 2023 WNBA Finals.

She handed out her first assist of the 2024 season 20 seconds later on an Alysha Clark triple for her 1,500th career assist. She now ranks 9th on the WNBA's career assist chart with 1,562 assists.

Gray also became the 7th player in WNBA history with at least 3,500 points and 1,500 assists, and <u>was the third-fastest to accomplish the feat</u>, doing so in 299 games (Sue Bird, 279; Lindsay Whalen, 294).

A'JA OF THE MONTH

A'ja Wilson became the first player in WNBA history to average at least 25 points and 10 rebounds in consecutive months, after doing so in May, June and July. She could do so again in August.

OLYMPICS RECAP (USA VERSION)

Chelsea Gray, Kelsey Plum, A'ja Wilson and Jackie Young now have two Olympic gold medals apiece after helping lead the USA to a 2024 Olympic gold medal finish in Paris. Posting an unblemished 6-0 record, the U.S. defeated France 67-66 in the Aug. 11 gold medal game. It marked the second five-on-five gold for Gray and Wilson, while Plum and Young became the first two athletes with Olympic golds in 3x3 and five-on-five. Additionally, FIBA's staff listed Wilson as the M'VP.

Wilson averaged a team-leading 18.7 points, 10.2 rebounds and 2.7 blocks per game, which ranked 3rd, 2nd and 1st among all competitors, respectively. Wilson also finished 3rd in the field for field goal percentage (.592) and 6th for 2-point percentage (.600).

Gray's 5.2 assists per game led the USA and ranked 8th among the Olympic field.

Further, Wilson posted 4 double-doubles, the most by any player in Paris, and equaling the most double-doubles for a U.S. team member since 2000 when Yolanda Griffith posted 4. Wilson now has 6 double-doubles over two Olympiads, tying Lisa Leslie as second-most in U.S. history. Griffith and Katrina McClain tallied a total of 7 each during their Olympic appearances.

Wilson's points and rebounds averages are the second-most for an American after Leslie posted 19.5 ppg in 1996 and McClain grabbed 10.4 rpg in 1988. Wilson also tied Leslie for most 20+ point games over an Olympic career (6).

OLYMPICS RECAP (SPANISH VERSION)

Megan Gustafson, who helped Spain earn its Olympic berth, led Spain in Paris to a 5th place finish—Spain's best showing on the world stage since its bronze medal campaign at the 2018 World Cup and one place better than the 6th place the nation garnered at the 2020 Olympics.

Spain was eliminated in a <u>79-66 quarterfinal loss to Belgium</u>, ending its Olympic run with a 3-1 record. Gustafson capped her Olympic campaign averaging team-highs of 18.0 points, 9.3 rebounds and 1.8 steals per game, while posting the highest efficiency (23.0) of any player on her squad

Through the quarterfinals when Spain bowed out, Gustafson ranked 6th among the 12-team field for scoring and field goal percentage (.577), 3rd for rebounding and 2-point field goal percentage (.667), 4th for defensive rebounds per game (6.3) and 5th for offensive rebounds per game (3.0).

OLYMPICS RECAP (AZERBAIJAN VERSION)

Tiffany Hayes led Azerbaijan to its berth into the <u>3x3 Olympic tournament</u> and led the nation again in Paris where Azerbaijan finished the tournament with a 2-5 record and in 7th place among the 8-team field. AZE's two victories came against eventual bronze medalist USA and 6th place finisher China.

Despite not advancing to the medal round, Hayes finished as the tournament's leading scorer (7.7 ppg), rebounder (6.3 rpg) and defensive rebounder (5.3 def rpg). She also led in statistics unique to the 3×3 game, including highlights per game (3.7) and drives per game (2.4), while finishing 2nd in player value (63.8).

WHAT A DIFFERENCE A GRAY MAKES

Chelsea Gray missed the first 12 games of the season, during which time the Aces posted a 6-6 record. Since her return, the Aces are 11-4.

LOOK AT ALL THE PEOPLE HERE TONIGHT

Over the past two seasons, the Aces have been rewriting their home attendance record books, and made WNBA history by becoming the first team in the league to sell out 100% of their home games in a season

- On July 2, 2024, there were 20,366 in attendance at T-Mobile Arena, which is the fifth-most attended game in WNBA regular season history and the most since 1999.
- The franchise-high 20,366 fans at T-Mobile Arena against Indiana on July 2 eclipsed the previous regular season record of 17,406, set on Sept. 10, 2023, when the Aces played host to the Mercury.
- The top 10 attendance marks for Las Vegas Aces games played at Michelob ULTRA Arena came in 2024.
- After seeing attendance averages hit no higher than 5,606 over their first four seasons in Las Vegas, the Aces upped their average to 9,551 fans per game in 2023, and are on pace to surpass that number in 2024 with an average of 11,004 over their first 15 home games.
- The Aces sold out of their season-ticket memberships in early March and had 7 full sellouts by the third week in April, breaking the Las Vegas record of 6 regular season sellouts set in 2023.
- The attendance mark of **10,424** against New York on June 15 is the largest crowd ever for an Aces game at Michelob ULTRA Arena.
- The Las Vegas Aces have welcomed 10,000 or more fans at 28 home games since arriving in the Valley in 2018—3 of which came in 2022, 9 were in 2023 and 16 (and counting) in 2024.
- On Sept. 13, 2023, the Aces rewrote their playoff attendance record since arriving in Las Vegas with 12,927 fans at T-Mobile Arena for their first game of the First Round against the Sky. The franchise high for a playoff game is 16,012, set Oct. 3, 2008, when the San Antonio Stars hosted the Detroit Shock in the Finals.
- On Oct 8, 2023, against New York, the Aces welcomed the most fans ever to attend a playoff game in Michelob ULTRA Arena (10,300).
- The Aces ranked 1st in the W in attendance in 2023 with the help of 6 sold out games. The Aces also sold out 2 playoff games last season.

Las Vegas established a new franchise record for points in a quarter with 42 in the second period against Phoenix on June 13 with the help of a WNBA single-quarter record 10 made 3-pointers. They also broke the league mark for most made 3s in a quarter without a miss (10 of 10).

SILENT BUT DEADLY ASSASSIN

Jackie Young may be quiet off the court, but she is a deadly assassin on it. She connected on a league second-best 44.9% of her 3-pointers in 2023, and now ranks No. 2 in league history for highest 3-point percentage in a season when attempting at least 150 from distance. The record is 45.28 percent set by Maya Moore in 2013.

Las Vegas' bench averaged a league-record 35.0 points per game in 2020. Only 7 other teams in WNBA history averaged more than 30 points per game from their reserves.

Two years later, in the Aces' first championship season, the bench averaged a league-low 12.9 points. En route to their second championship the 2024 reserves averaged 13.5 points a game, again the fewest in the league.

The Aces bench in 2024 is scoring <u>15.1 points a game, in early July they were scoring the 3rd fewewst and the Aces bench sits as the 7th-most in the league.</u>

ALL SHE DOES IS WIN, WIN, WIN

Having won the second-most games in league history before turning 25 and shattering the record for most wins before turning 26, Jackie Young this season set her sights on the most W victories before age 27. She captured that mark with win No. 138 over the Sparks on Aug. 18, and will look to raise the bar over the next 12 games until she turns 28 on September 16.

CENTURY MARK

The Aces scored 100 or more points in 7 games in 2021 and 2022, and upped that to a WNBA record-setting 11 times in 2023. The WNBA record for most times reaching the century mark in a season was previously 10, set by the 2010 Phoenix Mercury.

This season it took the Aces, who lead the W in scoring at 88.7 ppg, until their 11th game before scoring in triple digits, and they hit triple digits for the second time in their 20th game.

OUAD LIFT

A'ja Wilson (22.8), Kelsey Plum (18.7), Jackie Young (17.6) and Chelsea Gray (15.3) finished last year as the first four teammates in WNBA history to average 15 or more points per game in the same season.

A'JA THE LOVE BUG

A'ja Wilson poured in a WNBA record-tying 53 points in the Aces 112-100 victory over Atlanta on Aug. 22, 2023. The 53-point outburst also set a new franchise scoring standard—just 11 days after tying the previous franchise-high of 40 points set initially by Kelsey Plum on July 9.

BOARD ALLERGIES

Offensive Rebound Percentages had been declining for years as teams relied more and more on the 3-pointer as a weapon.

From 1997-2003, no team grabbed fewer than 30 percent of available offensive rebounds.

Last season, 9 teams finished below 30 percent, and the 2023 Aces and Mystics now list among the all-time "low 5" in that category. The current low mark this season is held by the Aces, which would surpass the league record low of 23.3% set by Los Angeles in 2021.

HEAD COACH BECKY HAMMON



Las Vegas Aces President Nikki Fargas announced on December 31, 2021, that the team hired San Antonio Spurs assistant and 6-time WNBA All-Star Becky Hammon as the team's head coach.

Hammon rewarded the Aces less than nine months later with the fanchise's first WNBA Championship.

She repeated that feat in her second season, helping the Aces become the first team to claim back-to-back WNBA titles in more than 20 years.

In her first two years with the Aces, Las Vegas tallied a 60-16 (.789) mark

in the regular season, 16-3 (.842) in playoff games and also captured the 2022 Commissioner's Cup crown.

The seeds for Hammon's hiring were originally sewn when the Aces retired her jersey on September 13, 2021. That ceremony served as the culmination of the franchise's 25th anniversary alumni initiative, which saw the Aces embrace their Utah and San Antonio roots, and celebrate the players who helped build the franchise and the league from the ground up. Las Vegas owner Mark Davis spent time with Hammon and her family that week, and walked away understandably impressed.

Hammon played 16 seasons in the WNBA, including her final eight in San Antonio, where she led the franchise to its first finals appearance in 2008.

On August 5, 2014, Spurs head coach Gregg Popovich hired Hammon as a full-time assistant making her the first woman in NBA history to hold that position.

Since that time, Hammon continued to accumulate coaching 'firsts' in the NBA. On July 3, 2015, she became the first woman to serve as head coach in the NBA's Summer League where she led the Spurs to the league title.

Less than a year later, Hammon became the first woman to be part of an All-Star coaching staff, and on December 30, 2020, following Popovich's ejection in San Antonio's game against Los Angeles, Hammon took over on the bench, becoming the first woman acting head coach in the history of the NBA.

A member of the league's 15th, 20th and 25th anniversary teams, Hammon went undrafted in 1999 following her All-American career at Colorado State. She signed with New York as a free agent that same year, helping the team to WNBA Finals appearances in three of her first four years in the Big Apple.



The Rapid City, South Dakota native earned her first All-Star nod in 2003, and represented New York on the Eastern Conference squad in 2005 and 2006 as well.

Following the 2006 season, New York traded Hammon to San Antonio. In her first year in silver and black, she posted what were then career highs in scoring (18.8 ppg), and assists (5.0) while earning another trip to the WNBA All-Star Game. As a team, the Silver Stars made their first appearance in the postseason since 2002, falling to Phoenix in the Western Conference Finals.

In 2008, Hammon led San Antonio to its first trip to the WNBA Finals where they fell to Detroit. The Silver Stars made the playoffs in each of her seven full seasons with the team, and Hammon once again was named to the All-Star team in 2009 and 2011.

She retired as the franchise leader in assists per game (5.1) and scoring average (15.6), and the WNBA leader in career free throw percentage (89.7).

Hammon, who was inducted into the Naismith Memorial Hall of Fame on Aug. 12, 2023, was inducted into the Women's Basketball Hall of Fame in 2022, the Colorado Sports Hall of Fame in 2015 and the San Antonio Sports Hall of Fame in 2018.


