Also helping power the Aces were Jackie Young, who tallied 19 points and 6 assists, and Kelsey Plum, with 15 points and 7 assists. Chevenne Parker-Tyus came off the bench for a team-high 17 points for Atlanta.

NEXT UP

The Aces hit the road for their final tilt versus Phoenix (16-16) on Sept. 1. The Merc are led by a trio of Olympic gold medalists in Kahleah Copper (22.3 ppg), Brittney Griner (18.1) and Diana Taurasi (15.6), and are 3-4 since the Olympic break.

Given all these possibilities, with the exception of 2024 games between the two teams playing today, we have decided not to include any box scores because we are lazy in an effort to rid the planet of unnecessary paper waste. THE ANSWER TO THE ULTIMATE QUESTION OF LIFE

A'ja Wilson scored 42 points against Dallas on Aug. 27, shooting 16 of 22 from the field (.727) and 10 of 13 (.769) from the charity stripe.

- The 42 points marked the 9th time she scored 30 or more points this season, which is tied for 5th most in WNBA history.
- It was the 22nd game of 30 or more points in her career, which are the 8th most in WNBA history.
- The 42 points are the <u>most in a WNBA game this season</u> and <u>2nd-most in franchise history</u>.
- It was her 3rd career game of 40 or more points, the <u>2nd most in WNBA history</u>.
- Wilson's 16 made field goals are the most in a game in the WNBA this season.

CAN'T TOUCH THIS

Entering the 2024 season, there have been 94 different occasions where a player averaged <u>15 or more shots per game</u> while playing in at least 20 games—the very definition of a team's go-to offensive player. Of those 94 instances, <u>60 shot 45 percent or worse from the field</u>. Only 7 times has a player <u>shot better than 50 percent from the field</u>. A'ja would become the first player to do it twice in her career if she continues shooting at her current pace.

Of those who have previously accomplished this feat, most took fewer than 16 shots. Wilson, this year, is taking 19.4 shots per game—more than 2 shots more per game than the next person on the list, Seimone Augustus.

CURRENTLY IN USE

If the world imploded today, A'ja Wilson's 2024 usage rating (the percentage of a team's possessions that a player impacts) of 32.1 would be the 10th highest in league history. None of these players had amazingly efficient offensive seasons. Most of the offensive efficiency ratings (OER) and offensive win shares (OWS) listed are above average to good, but there is nothing great about these performances.

A'ja Wilson's OER and OWS are lapping the field on the chart. She is impacting an ungodly amount of her team's possessions, and continuing to do it at an M'VP level that has never been done before.

GONE STREAKING ...

Kierstan Bell— Injured after the first game of the season (lower right leg), and did not play for 16 straight games before logging 7:25 vs. Washington on July 4, scoring 5 points on 2 for 4 shooting from the field ... Has not played since July 7 (coach's decisions).

Alysha Clark—Has made 5 of her last 9 shots from 3-point range after making 6 of her previous 31 ... Made 9 of her last 16 shots from the floor after going 12 for 46 over her previous 10 games (.261) ... Through June 21 was averaging 8.2 points on 53.9 percent shooting from the field and 46.3 percent from distance, but since, she is averaging 3.9 points on 33.9 percent shooting from the field and 27.5 percent from 3-point range.

Sydney Colson—Missed her last 3 3-pointers after making 6 of her previous 9 ... Averaging 1.0 steals per game over her last 4 games ... Did not play August 25 at Chicago or August 27 at Dallas (coach's decision).

Chelsea Gray—Missed the first 12 games of the season due to injury (lower left leg) ... Went 3 for 5 from 3-point range on August 27 at Dallas after making 2 of her previous 9 shots ... Scored in double figures in back-to-back games for the second time this season on August 25 (11 points) and 27 (15) ... Is 8 for 9 at the free throw line over her last 2 games after going 4 for 6 over her previous 8 games.

Megan Gustafson—Went 0 for 3 from the field at Dallas on August 27, two days after scoring a season-high 13 points at Chicago ... Made 17 of her last 32 shots from the field (.531) over 11 games after making 14 of her previous 35 (.400) ... Has made 8 of her last 16 shots from 3-point range over 10 games after making 4 of her previous 21 ... Went 4 for 4 from the free throw line over the first 2 games of the season, but is 3 for 5 since ... Has started each of the last 2 games after coming off the bench for her first 26 games.

Tiffany Hayes—Has made 53 of her last 96 shots from the field (.552) over 17 games after making 12 of her previous 35 shots (.343) over a 5-game stretch ... Has made 33 of her last 55 shots (.600) over her last 7 games, including 8 of 18 from distance ... Averaging 4.5 points per game over her last 2, after averaging 12.7 points per game over her previous 6 games.

Kate Martin—Is 0 for 1 from 3-point range over her last 5 games after making 8 of her previous15 over 5 games ... Is 21 for 54 from 3-point range this season, but 5 for 22 from inside the arc ... Is 6 for 6 from the free throw line, but hasn't taken one since May 31 ... Hasn't scored in her last 5 games after averaging 4.2 points over her previous 5 games ... Has played fewer than 10 minutes in each of her last 6 games, and fewer than 4 minutes in each of her last 5, after playing more than 10 minutes in 16 of her first 21 games of the year.

Kelsey Plum—Went 3 for 10 from the field at Dallas on August 27 after making 27 of her previous 56 shots (.482) over 4 games ... Has made 1 of her last 10 shots from 3-point range over her last 2 games.

Kiah Stokes—Is 1 for 8 from the field over her last 10 games after making 10 of her previous 18 shots ... Grabbed 10 or more rebounds in 3 of 6 games from June 15-July 2, averaging 8.7 boards per game over that time, but is averaging 2.9 per game over her last 12 games with a high of 7, averaging 1.4 rebounds per game over her last 7 games, and grabbed 3 total rebounds over her last 4 games ... After starting the year by making 4 of her first 5 3-pointers, has missed 23 of her last 25 attempts ... Has been held scoreless in 9 of her last 10 games.

A'ja Wilson—Has scored in double figures in 43 straight regular season games which is the <u>longest active streak in the WNBA</u>, and tied for the <u>17th longest in league history</u> ... Went 16 for 22 from the field at Dallas on August 27 after making 8 of 28 shots at Chicago on August 25 ... Has made 2 of her last 10 from 3-point range over 8 games after making 6 of her previous 10 over 3 games ... Has 3 blocks in each of her last 2 games after not blocking any shots in her previous 2 games ... Has 1 double-digit rebound performance in her last 4 games after grabbing 10 or more boards in each of her previous 8 games.

Jackie Young—Averaging 11.9 points over her last 8 games after averaging 20.8 points over her previous 8 games and 19.1 points over her previous 21 games ... Her 2 points and 3 field goal attempts at Chicago on August 25 are the fewest points she has scored and fewest shot attempts she has registered since August 14, 2022 when she went 1 for 3 with 2 points vs. Seattle ... Has made 3 of her last 13 shots from 3-point range over 3 games after going 6 for 8 on August 21 vs. Minnesota.

AN ACE UP THE SLEEVE

In four of the past five seasons the WNBA 6th Player of the Year Award has been earned by a member of the Aces team, including last year's winner Alysha Clark. The Aces are looking to go five for six with its early-season acquisition Tiffany Hayes. Signed as a free agent on May 31, Hayes is making her case for the award. In 21 games off the bench the 12-year veteran is averaging 8.7 points and 2.0 assists, while connecting on 50% of her shots from the field and 34.7% from 3-point range.

THE QUICKENING

On July 10, A'ja Wilson became the 7th person in WNBA history to amass at least 4,000 points, 1,500 rebounds, 400 assists, 400 blocked shots and 200 steals. She was the quickest to do so, having reached the milestone in 210 games.

Through 219 career games, Wilson has tallied 4,573 points, 1,987 rebounds, 473 assists, 262 steals and 423 blocked shots.

Needing just 13 rebounds to hit the 2,000 carom mark, it is very conceivable that by the end of August Wilson also will become the quickest to 4,500 points, 2,000 rebounds 400 assists, 400 blocked shots and 200 steals. Lisa Leslie currently holds that record, having accomplished the feat in 258 games.

YAWN, JUST ANOTHER 20/10

Wilson started the season by recording 5-straight 20-point, 10-rebound games, which broke the WNBA record of 4-straight 20/10 games, previously held by Sylvia Fowles (twice), Tina Charles and Glory Johnson.

That record has since been wiped out. Wilson tied her own record at Washington on July 14 and ended the <u>W record 8-game streak</u> on Aug. 18 versus Los Angeles.

GOOD GAWD!

When Chelsea Gray checked into the June 19 game against Seattle it was her first game played since October 15, 2023, when she injured her left foot in Game 3 of the 2023 WNBA Finals.

She handed out her first assist of the 2024 season 20 seconds later on an Alysha Clark triple for her 1,500th career assist. She now ranks 9th on the WNBA's career assist chart with 1,583 assists.

Gray also became the 7th player in WNBA history with at least 3,500 points and 1,500 assists, and was the third-fastest to accomplish the feat, doing so in 299 games (Sue Bird, 279; Lindsay Whalen, 294).

XXX

A'ja Wilson has scored 30 or more points in 9 games this season and 22 times in her career. The WNBA record for most 30 point games in a season is 12 by Jewell Loyd in 2023 and Maya Moore in 2014.

Overall, Wilson is ranked 8th for the most 30+ point career games in WNBA history. No. 7 is Tina Charles (23) and No. 6 is Maya Moore (24).

A'JA OF THE MONTH

A'ja Wilson became the first player in WNBA history to average at least 25 points and 10 rebounds in consecutive months, after doing so in May, June and July. She is on pace to do so again in August.

RECORD SETTER

Against Dallas on July 7, A'ja Wilson scored 28 points and surpassed Sophia Young-Malcolm (4,300 points) as the <u>franchise's leading scorer</u>, finishing the game with 4,301 career points. (She surpassed Young-Malcolm's franchise rebounding record earlier in the season.)

Playing in her 7th season, <u>Wilson now ranks 35th on the WNBA all-time scoring list</u> with 4,573 points. Next up is No. 24 Penny Taylor (4,606). If she keeps up her scoring pace, Wilson could break into the top 30 by the end of the season (No. 30 is Kayla McBride with 4,723 points).

MINUTE BY MINUTE

Since the franchise moved to Vegas, only one Aces player has logged an average of more than 33 minutes per game (Jackie Young, 33:13 mpg, 2022), although it used to happen with some degree of regularity.

In 2024, however, three Aces are logging at least 33 minutes a game: Kelsey Plum (34:43), whose average ranks 3rd in the W, A'ja Wilson (34:10) and Jackie Young (33:15).

However, the 2024 Aces struggled to find the bottom of the net to start the season, making just 41.8% of their attempts to rank 7th in the league over their first 9 games. The Aces reversed course and are now shooting 45.1% from the field, which is tops in the W.

On June 13 against Phoenix, A'ja Wilson (32 points) and Jackie Young (34) became the second set of teammates who have each scored 32 or more points in a regulation game—and the first duo who picked up a win while doing so. CENTURY MARK

The Aces scored 100 or more points in 7 games in 2021 and 2022, and upped that to a WNBA record-setting 11 times in 2023. The WNBA record for most times reaching the century mark in a season was previously 10, set by the 2010 Phoenix Mercury.

This season it took the Aces, who lead the W in scoring at 86.9 ppg, until their 11th game before scoring in triple digits, and they hit triple digits for the second time in their 20th game.

BOARD ALLERGIES

Offensive Rebound Percentages had been declining for years as teams relied more and more on the 3-pointer as a weapon.

From 1997-2003, no team grabbed fewer than 30 percent of available offensive rebounds.

A'ja Wilson poured in a WNBA record-tying 53 points in the Aces 112-100 victory over Atlanta on Aug. 22, 2023. The 53-point outburst also set a new franchise scoring standard—just 11 days after tying the previous franchise-high of 40 points set initially by Kelsey Plum on July 9.

While it's still early in her WNBA coaching career, not only did Becky Hammon lead the Aces to the their first championship during her inaugural season at the helm and follow that up with back-to-back titles in 2023, but she also boasts the highest winning percentage of any coach in WNBA history for those who have coached at least 50 games.

LOOK AT ALL THE PEOPLE HERE TONIGHT

Over the past two seasons, the Aces have been rewriting their home attendance record books, and made WNBA history by becoming the first team in the league to sell out 100% of their home games in a season

- On July 2, 2024, there were <u>20,366 in attendance at T-Mobile Arena</u>, which is the fifth-most attended game in WNBA regular season history and the most since 1999.
- The franchise-high 20,366 fans at T-Mobile Arena against Indiana on July 2 eclipsed the previous regular season record of 17,406, set on Sept. 10, 2023, when the Aces played host to the Mercury.
- The top 10 attendance marks for Las Vegas Aces games played at Michelob ULTRA Arena came in 2024.
- After seeing attendance averages hit no higher than 5,606 over their first four seasons in Las Vegas, the Aces upped their average to 9,551 fans per game in 2023, and are on pace to surpass that number in 2024 with an average of 11,004 over their first 15 home games.
- The Aces sold out of their season-ticket memberships in early March and had 7 full sellouts by the third week in April, breaking the Las Vegas record of 6 regular season sellouts set in 2023.
- The attendance mark of **10,424** against New York on June 15 is the largest crowd ever for an Aces game at Michelob ULTRA Arena.
- The Las Vegas Aces have welcomed 10,000 or more fans at 28 home games since arriving in the Valley in 2018—3 of which came in 2022, 9 were in 2023 and 16 (and counting) in 2024.
- On Sept. 13, 2023, the Aces rewrote their playoff attendance record since arriving in Las Vegas with 12,927 fans at T-Mobile Arena for their first game of the First Round against the Sky. The franchise high for a playoff game is 16,012, set Oct. 3, 2008, when the San Antonio Stars hosted the Detroit Shock in the Finals.
- On Oct 8, 2023, against New York, the Aces welcomed the most fans ever to attend a playoff game in Michelob ULTRA Arena (10,300).
- The Aces ranked 1st in the W in attendance in 2023 with the help of 6 sold out games. The Aces also sold out 2 playoff games last season.

HEAD COACH BECKY HAMMON



Las Vegas Aces President Nikki Fargas announced on December 31, 2021, that the team hired San Antonio Spurs assistant and 6-time WNBA All-Star Becky Hammon as the team's head coach.

Hammon rewarded the Aces less than nine months later with the fanchise's first WNBA Championship.

She repeated that feat in her second season, helping the Aces become the first team to claim back-to-back WNBA titles in more than 20 years.

In her first two years with the Aces, Las Vegas tallied a 60-16 (.789) mark

in the regular season, 16-3 (.842) in playoff games and also captured the 2022 Commissioner's Cup crown.

The seeds for Hammon's hiring were originally sewn when the Aces retired her jersey on September 13, 2021. That ceremony served as the culmination of the franchise's 25th anniversary alumni initiative, which saw the Aces embrace their Utah and San Antonio roots, and celebrate the players who helped build the franchise and the league from the ground up. Las Vegas owner Mark Davis spent time with Hammon and her family that week, and walked away understandably impressed.

Hammon played 16 seasons in the WNBA, including her final eight in San Antonio, where she led the franchise to its first finals appearance in 2008.

On August 5, 2014, Spurs head coach Gregg Popovich hired Hammon as a full-time assistant making her the first woman in NBA history to hold that position.

Since that time, Hammon continued to accumulate coaching 'firsts' in the NBA. On July 3, 2015, she became the first woman to serve as head coach in the NBA's Summer League where she led the Spurs to the league title.

Less than a year later, Hammon became the first woman to be part of an All-Star coaching staff, and on December 30, 2020, following Popovich's ejection in San Antonio's game against Los Angeles, Hammon took over on the bench, becoming the first woman acting head coach in the history of the NBA.

A member of the league's 15th, 20th and 25th anniversary teams, Hammon went undrafted in 1999 following her All-American career at Colorado State. She signed with New York as a free agent that same year, helping the team to WNBA Finals appearances in three of her first four years in the Big Apple.



The Rapid City, South Dakota native earned her first All-Star nod in 2003, and represented New York on the Eastern Conference squad in 2005 and 2006 as well.

Following the 2006 season, New York traded Hammon to San Antonio. In her first year in silver and black, she posted what were then career highs in scoring (18.8 ppg), and assists (5.0) while earning another trip to the WNBA All-Star Game. As a team, the Silver Stars made their first appearance in the postseason since 2002, falling to Phoenix in the Western Conference Finals.

In 2008, Hammon led San Antonio to its first trip to the WNBA Finals where they fell to Detroit. The Silver Stars made the playoffs in each of her seven full seasons with the team, and Hammon once again was named to the All-Star team in 2009 and 2011.

She retired as the franchise leader in assists per game (5.1) and scoring average (15.6), and the WNBA leader in career free throw percentage (89.7).

Hammon, who was inducted into the Naismith Memorial Hall of Fame on Aug. 12, 2023, was inducted into the Women's Basketball Hall of Fame in 2022, the Colorado Sports Hall of Fame in 2015 and the San Antonio Sports Hall of Fame in 2018.


