Combining both regular season and postseason points, on Sept. 26, 2023, A'ja Wilson became the first player in league history to score 1,000 points in a single year and finished with 1,126 points. Breanna Stewart (1,103) joined Wilson on the list ahead of the Finals.

Having scored 956 points, Wilson is on track to become the first W player to score 1,000 in a single season, needing just 44 more points to hit that mark over her last 4 games.

THE ANSWER TO THE ULTIMATE QUESTION OF LIFE

Starting with a 42-point outburst at Dallas on Aug. 27 and directly followed by 26-, 41- and 30-point games, A'ja Wilson scored a WNBA record-tying 139 points over that 4-game span. Maya Moore tallied 139 from July 10-22, 2014.

JUST THE FACTS, A'JACK

- A'ja Wilson has scored 30 or more points 11 times this season, which is the 3rd most in WNBA regular season history. Jewell Loyd (2023) and Maya Moore (2014) share the top spot.
- Wilson has 24 games of 30 or more points in her career, which are tied with Maya Moore for 6th most in WNBA history. No. 5 is Jewell Loyd (25).
- The 42 scored versus Dallas and 41 points two days later are the top two marks in a WNBA game this season and 2nd- and 3rd-most in franchise history.
- Wilson now has 4 career game of 40 or more points, tied with Breanna Stewart and Diana Taurasi for 1st in WNBA history.
- Wilson's 16 made field goals in each of her 40-point games are the most in a game in the WNBA this season.
- Not only did Wilson average 34.8 ppg from Aug. 27 - Sept. 3, she averaged 13.3 rpg, 3.0 apg, 1.3 spg, 3.0 bpg with just 3 turnovers.

CAN'T TOUCH THIS

Entering the 2024 season, there had been 94 different occasions where a player averaged 15 or more shots per game while playing in at least 20 games—the very definition of a team's go-to offensive player.

Of those 94 instances, 60 shot 45 percent or worse from the field. Only 6 times has a player shot better than 50 percent from the field. Wilson would become the first player to do it twice in her career if she continues shooting at her current pace.

Of those who have previously accomplished this feat, most took fewer than 16 shots. Wilson, this year, is taking 19.5 shots per game—more than 2 shots more per game than the next person on the list, Seimone Augustus.

Most of the offensive efficiency ratings (OER) and offensive win shares (OWS) listed are above average to good, but there is nothing great about these performances.

A'ja Wilson's OER and OWS are lapping the field on the chart. She is impacting an ungodly amount of her team's possessions, and continuing to do it at an M'VP level that has never been done before.

Only 5 players in WNBA history have averaged more than 20 points and fewer than 2.0 turnovers over the course of a season.

A'ja Wilson has accomplished the feat 3 times (2018, 2020 and 2023) in the past, tied with Elena Delle Donne and Lauren Jackson for 2nd. Breanna Stewart is on pace for her 5th such season, and Tina Charles joined the list in 2016.

Wilson's 27.3 points a game tops the chart and her 1.31 turnovers per game ranks No. 5.

THE QUICKENING

On July 10, A'ja Wilson became the 7th person in WNBA history to amass at least 4,000 points, 1,500 rebounds, 400 assists, 400 blocked shots and 200 steals. She was the quickest to do so, having reached the milestone in 210 games. Candace Parker previously did so in 229 games.

On August 30, in her 220th career game, Wilson became the fastest player in league history to compile 4,500 points, 2,000 rebounds, 400 assists, 400 blocked shots and 200 steals, shattering the previous record held by Lisa Leslie, who took 258 games to hit all 5 milestones.

Further, Wilson is the second-youngest player to grab 2,000 rebounds (28 years, 22 days), and the fourth-fastest to do so in terms of number of games played (220). Tina Charles holds the record for the quickest (196 games) and youngest (26 years, 278 days).

YAWN, JUST ANOTHER 20/10

Wilson started the season by recording 5-straight 20-point, 10-rebound games, which broke the WNBA record of 4-straight 20/10 games, previously held by Sylvia Fowles (twice), Tina Charles and Glory Johnson.

That record has since been wiped out by none other than Wilson herself when she upped the W record streak to 8 games.

GOOD GAWD!

When Chelsea Gray checked into the June 19 game against Seattle it was her first game played since October 15, 2023, when she injured her left foot in Game 3 of the 2023 WNBA Finals.

She handed out her first assist of the 2024 season 20 seconds later on an Alysha Clark triple for her 1,500th career assist. She now ranks 9th on the WNBA's career assist chart with 1,617 assists. Candace Parker is 8th with 1,634.

Gray also became the 7th player in WNBA history with at least 3,500 points and 1,500 assists, and was the third-fastest to accomplish the feat, doing so in 299 games (Sue Bird, 279; Lindsay Whalen, 294).

RECORD SETTER

Against Dallas on July 7, A’ja Wilson scored 28 points and surpassed Sophia Young-Malcolm (4,300 points) as the franchise's leading scorer, finishing the game with 4,301 career points. (She surpassed Young-Malcolm's franchise rebounding record earlier in the season.)

Playing in her 7th season, Wilson now ranks 32nd on the WNBA all-time scoring list with 4,717 points. Next up are No. 31 Alana Beard (4,740) and No. 30 Skylar Diggins-Smith (4,751).

Las Vegas' bench averaged a league-record 35.0 points per game in 2020. Only 7 other teams in WNBA history averaged more than 30 points per game from their reserves. Two years later, in the Aces' first championship season, the bench averaged a league-low 12.9 points. En route to their second championship the 2024 reserves averaged 13.5 points a game, again the fewest in the league.

The Aces bench in 2024 is scoring 14.8 points a game, which sits as the 3rd-fewest in the league.

Having won the second-most games in league history before turning 25 and shattering the record for most wins before turning 26, Jackie Young this season set her sights on the most W victories before age 27. She captured that mark with win No. 138 over the Sparks on Aug. 18, and has two more chances to raise the bar until she turns 27 on September 16.

The Aces scored 100 or more points in 7 games in 2021 and 2022, and upped that to a WNBA record-setting 11 times in 2023. The WNBA record for most times reaching the century mark in a season was previously 10, set by the 2010 Phoenix Mercury.

This season it took the Aces, who lead the W in scoring at 86.4 ppg, until their 11th game before scoring in triple digits, and they hit triple digits for just the second time in their 20th game.

HEAD COACH BECKY HAMMON



Las Vegas Aces President Nikki Fargas announced on December 31, 2021, that the team hired San Antonio Spurs assistant and 6-time WNBA All-Star Becky Hammon as the team's head coach.

Hammon rewarded the Aces less than nine months later with the franchise's first WNBA Championship.

She repeated that feat in her second season, helping the Aces become the first team to claim back-to-back WNBA titles in more than 20 years.

In her first two years with the Aces, Las Vegas tallied a 60-16 (.789) mark

in the regular season, 16-3 (.842) in playoff games and also captured the 2022 Commissioner's Cup crown.

The seeds for Hammon's hiring were originally sewn when the Aces retired her jersey on September 13, 2021. That ceremony served as the culmination of the franchise's 25th anniversary alumni initiative, which saw the Aces embrace their Utah and San Antonio roots, and celebrate the players who helped build the franchise and the league from the ground up. Las Vegas owner Mark Davis spent time with Hammon and her family that week, and walked away understandably impressed.

Hammon played 16 seasons in the WNBA, including her final eight in San Antonio, where she led the franchise to its first finals appearance in 2008.

On August 5, 2014, Spurs head coach Gregg Popovich hired Hammon as a full-time assistant making her the first woman in NBA history to hold that position.

Since that time, Hammon continued to accumulate coaching 'firsts' in the NBA. On July 3, 2015, she became the first woman to serve as head coach in the NBA's Summer League where she led the Spurs to the league title.

Less than a year later, Hammon became the first woman to be part of an All-Star coaching staff, and on December 30, 2020, following Popovich's ejection in San Antonio's game against Los Angeles, Hammon took over on the bench, becoming the first woman acting head coach in the history of the NBA.

A member of the league's 15th, 20th and 25th anniversary teams, Hammon went undrafted in 1999 following her All-American career at Colorado State. She signed with New York as a free agent that same year, helping the team to WNBA Finals appearances in three of her first four years in the Big Apple.

The Rapid City, South Dakota native earned her first All-Star nod in 2003, and represented New York on the Eastern Conference squad in 2005 and 2006 as well.

Following the 2006 season, New York traded Hammon to San Antonio. In her first year in silver and black, she posted what were then career highs in scoring (18.8 ppg), and assists (5.0) while earning another trip to the WNBA All-Star Game. As a team, the Silver Stars made their first appearance in the postseason since 2002, falling to Phoenix in the Western Conference Finals.

In 2008, Hammon led San Antonio to its first trip to the WNBA Finals where they fell to Detroit. The Silver Stars made the playoffs in each of her seven full seasons with the team, and Hammon once again was named to the All-Star team in 2009 and 2011.

She retired as the franchise leader in assists per game (5.1) and scoring average (15.6), and the WNBA leader in career free throw percentage (89.7).

Hammon, who was inducted into the Naismith Memorial Hall of Fame on Aug. 12, 2023, was inducted into the Women's Basketball Hall of Fame in 2022, the Colorado Sports Hall of Fame in 2015 and the San Antonio Sports Hall of Fame in 2018.
