A LITTLE HISTORY LESSON

Over the past two seasons each team has ended the other's championship dreams, making this a much-anticipated opening game by Aces and Liberty fans alike.

Against all odds, with two starters injured and in boots on the bench and Candace Parker sidelined for the second half of the season, the Aces prevailed over the Liberty in the 2023 WNBA Finals in winning back-to-back W crowns. Last season, however, the tables were turned after New York advanced past Las Vegas in the 2023 WNBA Semifinals and went on to win it all.

But that's all in the past. While the Aces and Liberty still have much of the star power they've had the past two years, as with many teams in the league, both teams have new looks to showcase in 2025.

Las Vegas, which lost almost 28 points per game in Tiffany Hayes (9.5 ppg) and Kelsey Plum (17.8 ppg), brought in Jewell Loyd, who averaged 19.7 ppg last year after leading the league with 24.7 ppg in 2023. Also new to the Aces are Dana Evans (7.2 ppg in 2024) and Tiffany Mitchell, who missed much of 2024 due to illness and owns a career average of 8.8 ppg, as well as rookies Liz Kitley and Aaliyah Nye.

These newcomers will complement the Aces returning top scorers and playmakers, including reigning league M'VP A'ja Wilson (26.9 ppg, 11.9 rpg, 2.6 bpg), Jackie Young (15.8 ppg, 5.3 apg) and Chelsea Gray (8.6 ppg, 4.9 apg).

On the other side of the court, New York returns its top three scoring threats in Breanna Stewart (20.4 ppg, 8.5 rpg, 3.5 apg), Sabrina Ionescu (18.2 ppg, 6.2 apg) and Jonquel Jones (14.2 ppg, 9.0 rpg), but lost its No. 4 scorer Betnijah Laney-Hamilton (11.8 ppg, 4.2 rpg, 3.3 apg) to injury in the offseason.

Joining the Liberty roster this year are guard Natasha Cloud (11.5 ppg, 6.9 apg) from Phoenix and forward Isabelle Harrison (6.5 ppg, 3.9 rpg) from Chicago. New York also re-signed French sharpshooter and Olympic silver medalist Marine Johannes (7.1 ppg, 1.7 apg in 2023), who previously played three seasons with New York in 2019, 2022 and 2023.

The Liberty also lost a couple key players in starting guard Courtney Vandersloot (6.4 ppg, 4.8 apg) and key reserve Kayla Thornton (5.5 ppg).

In 2024, the Aces ranked first in points per game (86.4 ppg), defensive rebounds (28.5 drpg) and second in field goal percentage (.454), free throw percentage (.828) and blocks per game (5.0 bpg).

New York held the best regular season record at 32-8 and was second in the league behind the Aces in points per game at 85.6 ppg in 2024.

The teams will face each other twice more this season. The Aces return to New York on July 8 and will host the Liberty in Las Vegas on Aug. 13. Both games are scheduled to be broadcast nationally on ESPN.

OFF TO A GOOD (PRE) START

The Las Vegas Aces went 2-0 in preseason play in, defeating the Wings 112-78 in South Bend, Indiana, on May 2 and the Mercury 85-84 in Las Vegas on May 6.

Against Dallas, Fighting Irish alumni Jackie Young and Jewell Loyd shined in their return to South Bend. Young recorded a game-high 28 points in 29 minutes, while Loyd chipped in 10 points in her Aces preseason debut.

Reigning 2024 WNBA MVP A'ja Wilson tallied the next high score with 19 points in 21 minutes. All five starters recorded at least three assists in the matchup, with Young leading the way with a game-high nine. The Aces 112 points ranked as the second-highest production in the entire WNBA preseason.

Over the two games, Wilson led the team averaging 16.5 points, 6.5 rebound and 3.0 assists in 22 minutes. Veteran guard Chelsea Gray also averaged 11.5 points, 4.5 assists and 4.0 rebounds in 21.7 minutes. Rookie guard Aaliyah Nye was a big contributing factor in both games, averaging 11.0 points on 46.2% shooting from 3-point range. Against Dallas, Nye led the bench production with 17 points while going 5-for-8 from beyond the arc.

WELCOME TO THE FAMILY

Over the offseason the Aces said farewell to some teammates and welcomed some anew. The team saw the departure of Alysha Clark, Sydney Colson, Tiffany Hayes and Kelsey Plum, and welcomed Crystal Bradford. Dana Evans, Jewell Loyd, Tiffany Mitchell and Cheyenne Parker-Tyus. Additionally, rookies Liz Kitley and Aaliyah are suiting up in the W for the first time in 2025.

- Evans joins the Aces after four seasons with Chicago, where she was named to the 2021 WNBA All-Rookie Team and recently played overseas for Besiktas in Istanbul, Turkey this past offseason
- Kelly, a rookie hailing from Texas, spent her first four collegiate seasons with North Carolina before transferring to Oregon as a grad transfer. She started all games for the Ducks in 2024-25 and was named all-Big Ten honorable mention and to the preseason watch lists for the Nancy Lieberman Award (nation's top point guard) and Naismith Player of the Year
- Kitley was drafted by the Aces in 2024, but the three-time ACC player of the year spent the past year rehabbing from a torn ACL suffered during Virginia Tech's final regular season game in 2024.
- Loyd signed with the Aces on Feb. 1, 2025, in a trade with Seattle and Los Angeles. She spent 10 years with the Storm from 2015-24, where she won two WNBA Championships (2018, 2020) and is a three-time All-WNBA selection.
- Mitchell, a nine-year WNBA veteran, appeared in 24 games with Connecticut in 2024. She averaged 4.9 points, 1.5 rebounds and 0.6 assists per game, but missed the last 16 regular season and postseason games recovering from sepsis and six abdominal abscesses.
- Nye was the Aces 13th overall pick in the 2025 draft from Alabama. As a senior, Nye started all 33 games, averaging 33.4 minutes per game for the Crimson Tide. She ranked fourth in the NCAA for made 3-pointers (109) and finished with 1,739 career points
- Parker-Tyus joins the Aces after spending the past five seasons with Atlanta. The 2023 WNBA All-Star started 11 of 25 games in 2024 while posting 9.2 ppg and 4.8 rpg prior to suffering a left ankle injury on Aug. 18. Pregnant with her second child, she will miss the first part of the season.

A'ONE NIGHT CELEBRATION

A'ja Wilson celebrated the release of her Nike "Pink A'ura" A'One shoe ahead of the shoe launch on May 6. The first 8,000 fans through the doors at Michelob ULTRA Arena received an A'One t-shirt. Additionally, activations on the concourse included an A'One/Nike photo opportunity, an A'One custom cheer sign station, an A'One towel giveaway by the A'One concourse activation and the first 500 fans wearing A'One shoes received A'One shoelery. NEVER BEEN DONE BEFORE

A'ja Wilson wrapped her 2024 season as the first player in WNBA or NBA history to lead the league in total points, rebounds and blocked shots in a single season (blocks became an official NBA stat in 1973-74).

Only 3 times in WNBA history has the same player led in 2 of the 3 categories (including Wilson with rebounds and blocked shots in 2022).

AND THE EMMY GOES TO ...

The Las Vegas Aces received four regional Emmy nominations from the National Academy of Television Arts & Sciences – Pacific Southwest Chapter, for content produced during the 2024 season.

The award winners will be announced during a ceremony on June 21, at The Westin Gaslamp in San Diego, California.

The four segments and shows nominated include 'Aces vs. Everybody–The Story of the 2023 Season in the Documentary category; 'In the Paint,' the 30-minute weekly program produced by the Aces is up for an Emmy in the category of Sports Program–Live or Post-Produced; in the Sports Story–Short Form or Long Form Content category, the feature on Chelsea Gray's journey through surgery and rehabilitation 'Back to Form–Part One' received a nomination; the fourth was the Las Vegas Aces Intro Video in the Sports Open/Tease category.

MOVIN' ON UP

Jewell Loyd ranks No. 21 [on the WNBA all-time scoring list](#) with 5,536 points, behind No. 20 Katie Douglas (5,563). A'ja Wilson is 10 back at No. 31 (4,782), behind No. 30 Skylar Diggins (4,822).

Wilson, however, enters the 2025 season [ranked first for scoring average](#) (minimum 2,000 points) with a career average of 21.066 points per game, while Loyd's 16.93 ppg sits at No. 14.

Chelsea Gray is [No. 8 on the all-time W assist list](#) with 1,631 dimes and needs just three to pull even with No. 7 Candace Parker. Next on the list is No. 6 Becky Hammon with 1,708.

Loyd has 25 games of 30 or more points in her career and Wilson has 24, which are the [fifth- and sixth-most in WNBA history](#).

SCORING CHAMPS

Since 2020 the Aces have topped the league's scoring charts, including averaging 92.8 points in 2023, the second-highest scoring output in league history. In fact, the past five seasons are the top five scoring years in franchise history, which should come as no surprise with A'ja Wilson finishing among the top six in the league each of those years -- including a league-record 26.9 ppg in 2024.

While preseason action doesn't always foretell what's to come in the regular season, the Aces showed they have plenty of scoring to again vie for the top of the charts after averaging 98.5 ppg in their two exhibitions.

She hit the mark against Dallas in the 2023 WNBA Semifinals (9/26/2023). Breanna Stewart got to 1,000 points after that date, and Wilson bumped it up a notch in 2024.

THE ANSWER TO THE ULTIMATE QUESTION OF LIFE

Starting with a 42-point outburst at Dallas on Aug. 27, 2024, and directly followed by 26-, 41- and 30-point games, Wilson scored a WNBA record-tying 139 points over that 4-game span. Maya Moore also tallied 139 over 4 consecutive games from July 10-22, 2014.

- A’ja Wilson scored 30 or more points 11 times in 2024, which is **the 3rd most in WNBA regular season history**. Jewell Loyd (2023) and Maya Moore (2014) share the top spot with 12 each.
- The 42 scored versus Dallas and 41 points two days later were the **top two marks in a WNBA game last season** and **2nd- and 3rd-most in franchise history**.
- Wilson now has 4 career game of 40 or more points, tied with Breanna Stewart and Diana Taurasi for **1st in WNBA history**.
- Wilson’s 16 made field goals in each of her 40-point games are the **most in a game in the WNBA last season**.
- Not only did Wilson average 34.8 ppg from Aug. 27 - Sept. 3, 2024, she averaged 13.3 rpg, 3.0 apg, 1.3 spg, 3.0 bpg with just 3 turnovers.

NEVER GONNA GIVE YOU UP

Only 5 players in WNBA history have **averaged more than 20 points and fewer than 2.0 turnovers over the course of a season**. A’ja Wilson has now accomplished the feat 4 times (2018, 2020, 2023 and 2024), which ranks 2nd behind Breanna Stewart (5). Elena Delle Donne and Lauren Jackson are 3rd with 3 such seasons apiece and Tina Charles joined the list in 2016. Wilson’s 26.9 points a game tops the chart and her **1.26 turnovers per game ranks No. 4**.

CAN’T TOUCH THIS

Entering the 2025 season, there had been 104 different occasions where a player averaged **15 or more shots per game** while playing in at least 20 games—the very definition of a team’s go-to offensive player.

Of those 104 instances, **65 shot 45% or worse from the field**. Only 7 times has a player **shot better than 50% from the field**. Wilson became the first player to do it twice in her career after first doing so in 2023.

Of those who have previously accomplished this feat, most took fewer than 16 shots. Wilson in 2024 took 19.6 shots per game—more than 2 shots more per game than the next person on the list, Seimone Augustus.

THE QUICKENING

On July 10, 2024, A’ja Wilson became the **7th person in WNBA history** to amass at least 4,000 points, 1,500 rebounds, 400 assists, 400 blocked shots and 200 steals (Tina Charles became the 8th on the list four days later). Wilson was the quickest to do so, having reached the milestone in 210 games. Candace Parker previously held the record for the fastest to those marks in 229 games.

On Aug. 30, 2024, in her 220th career game, Wilson became the fastest player in league history to compile 4,500 points, 2,000 rebounds, 400 assists, 400 blocked shots and 200 steals, **shattering the previous record held by Lisa Leslie**, who took 258 games to hit all 5 milestones.

Further, Wilson is the **second-youngest player to grab 2,000 rebounds** (28 years, 22 days), and the fourth-fastest to do so in terms of number of games played (220). Charles holds the record for the quickest (196 games) and youngest (26 years, 278 days).

A’JA DOUBLES THE MONTHS

Wilson became the first player in WNBA history to average at least 25 points and 10 rebounds in two consecutive months, after doing so in May and June 2024. She then upped the streak to 5, through September.

Since the franchise moved to Vegas, only one Aces player has logged an average of more than 33 minutes per game (Jackie Young, 33:13 mpg, 2022), although it used to happen with some degree of regularity.

In 2024, however, three Aces logged at least 33 minutes a game: A’ja Wilson (34:25), Kelsey Plum (34:00) and Jackie Young (33:13).



CURRENTLY IN USE

A'ja Wilson's 2024 usage rating (the percentage of a team's possessions that a player impacts) of 32.16 was the **9th highest in league history**. None of the 8 players ahead of her had amazingly efficient offensive seasons. Most of the offensive efficiency ratings (OER) and offensive win shares (OWS) listed are above average to good, but there is nothing great about these performances.

A'ja Wilson's OER and OWS **lapped the field on the chart**. She impacted an undogly amount of her team's possessions, and did it at an M'VP level that had never been seen before.

LOOK AT ALL THE PEOPLE HERE TONIGHT

Over the past two seasons, the Aces have been rewriting their home attendance record books, and made WNBA history by becoming the first team in the league to sell out 100% of their home games in a season. The Aces have already sold out their entire season ticket membership inventory for the 2025 season—the earliest any team had ever done so.

- **The Aces have sold out 25 straight home games**, dating to Game 1 of the 2023 WNBA Finals.
- On July 2, 2024, there were **20,366 in attendance at T-Mobile Arena**, which is the fifth-most attended game in WNBA regular season history and the most since 1999.
- The franchise-high 20,366 fans at T-Mobile Arena against Indiana on July 2 eclipsed the previous regular season record of 17,406, set on Sept. 10, 2023, when the Aces played host to the Mercury.
- The top 10 attendance marks for Las Vegas Aces games played at Michelob ULTRA Arena came in 2024.
- After seeing attendance averages hit no higher than 5,606 over their first four seasons in Las Vegas, the Aces upped their average to 9,551 fans per game in 2023, and surpassed that number in 2024 with an average of 11,283 over their 20 regular season home games.
- **The Aces sold out of their 2024 season-ticket memberships in early March** and had 7 full sellouts by the third week in April, breaking the Las Vegas record of 6 regular season sellouts set in 2023.
- The Aces **sold out of their 2025 season-ticket memberships in August 2024**, the earliest any W team had ever done so.
- The attendance mark of 10,431 against Connecticut on Sept. 15 is the largest crowd ever for an Aces game at Michelob ULTRA Arena.
- The Las Vegas Aces have welcomed **10,000 or more fans at 35** home games since arriving in the Valley in 2018—3 of which came in 2022, 9 were in 2023 and 23 in 2024.
- On Sept. 13, 2023, the Aces rewrote their playoff attendance record since arriving in Las Vegas with 12,927 fans at T-Mobile Arena for their first game of the First Round against the Sky. The franchise high for a playoff game is 16,012, set Oct. 3, 2008, when the San Antonio Stars hosted the Detroit Shock in the Finals.
- On Oct 8, 2023, against New York, the Aces welcomed the **most fans ever to attend a playoff game in Michelob ULTRA Arena (10,300)**.
- The Aces ranked **1st in the W in attendance in 2023** with the help of 6 sold out games and **3rd in 2024** after 20 sellouts. The Aces also sold out 2 playoff games last season.

HEAD COACH BECKY HAMMON



Las Vegas Aces President Nikki Fargas announced on December 31, 2021, that the team hired San Antonio Spurs assistant and 6-time WNBA All-Star Becky Hammon as the team's head coach.

Hammon rewarded the Aces less than nine months later with the franchise's first WNBA Championship.

She repeated that feat in her second season, helping the Aces become the first team to claim back-to-back WNBA titles in more than 20 years.

While the Aces 3-peat bid fell short in Hammon's third season, the injury-hampered team still advanced to the

WNBA Semifinals and finished fourth in league play.

In her first three years with the Aces, Las Vegas tallied a 77-29 (.726) mark in the regular season, 19-6 (.760) in playoff games and also captured the 2022 Commissioner's Cup crown.

The seeds for Hammon's hiring were originally sewn when the Aces retired her jersey on September 13, 2021. That ceremony served as the culmination of the franchise's 25th anniversary alumni initiative, which saw the Aces embrace their Utah and San Antonio roots, and celebrate the players who helped build the franchise and the league from the ground up. Las Vegas owner Mark Davis spent time with Hammon and her family that week, and walked away understandably impressed.

Hammon played 16 seasons in the WNBA, including her final eight in San Antonio, where she led the franchise to its first finals appearance in 2008.

On August 5, 2014, Spurs head coach Gregg Popovich hired Hammon as a full-time assistant making her the first woman in NBA history to hold that position.

Since that time, Hammon continued to accumulate coaching 'firsts' in the NBA. On July 3, 2015, she became the first woman to serve as head coach in the NBA's Summer League where she led the Spurs to the league title.

Less than a year later, Hammon became the first woman to be part of an All-Star coaching staff, and on December 30, 2020, following Popovich's ejection in San Antonio's game against Los Angeles, Hammon took over on the bench, becoming the first woman acting head coach in the history of the NBA.

A member of the league's 15th, 20th and 25th anniversary teams, Hammon went undrafted in 1999 following her All-American career at Colorado State. She signed with New York as a free agent that same year, helping the team to WNBA Finals appearances in three of her first four years in the Big Apple.

The Rapid City, South Dakota native earned her first All-Star nod in 2003,

and represented New York on the Eastern Conference squad in 2005 and 2006 as well.

Following the 2006 season, New York traded Hammon to San Antonio. In her first year in silver and black, she posted what were then career highs in scoring (18.8 ppg), and assists (5.0) while earning another trip to the WNBA All-Star Game. As a team, the Silver Stars made their first appearance in the postseason since 2002, falling to Phoenix in the Western Conference Finals.

In 2008, Hammon led San Antonio to its first trip to the WNBA Finals where they fell to Detroit. The Silver Stars made the playoffs in each of her seven full seasons with the team, and Hammon once again was named to the All-Star team in 2009 and 2011.

She retired as the franchise leader in assists per game (5.1) and scoring average (15.6), and the WNBA leader in career free throw percentage (89.7).

Hammon, who was inducted into the Naismith Memorial Hall of Fame on Aug. 12, 2023, was inducted into the Women's Basketball Hall of Fame in 2022, the Colorado Sports Hall of Fame in 2015 and the San Antonio Sports Hall of Fame in 2018.

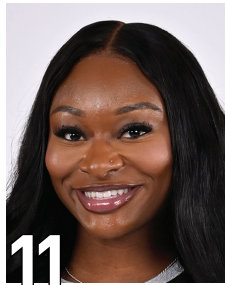

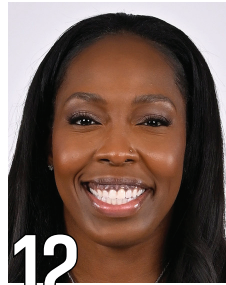

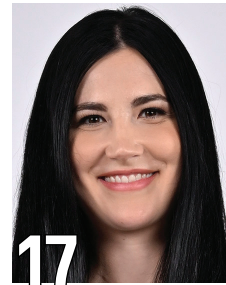
