COMMISSIONER'S CUP TIME

Today's game marks the second Commissioner's Cup game for the Aces, who are 1-0 so far in CC games. The in-season 'tournament' eventually pits the Eastern and Western Conferences against each other and runs from June 1-17. Launched in 2021, the Aces won it in 2022 and advanced to the CC Finals in 2023.

LUCKY NO. 8

Chelsea Gray needs 10 more points to become the <u>8th player in WNBA</u><u>history</u> to tally at least 4,000 points, 1,000 rebounds and 1,500 assists. If she does so June 7, she will also be the second-fastest (332 games) and second-youngest (32 years, 242 days) to ever reach the milestone. Lindsay Whalen holds both No. 1 slots after achieving the mark in her 326th game at 31 years and 114 days. Alyssa Thomas needs just 35 points to reach the mark and with 324 games played, could end up as second-fastest, but third-youngest.

NECK AND NECK

A'ja Wilson (4,919) and Skylar Diggins (4,956) are neck and neck to become the **27th player in WNBA history to score 5,000 or more points**.

However, Wilson (233 games, 28 years and 303 days on June 7, 2025) could reach the goal in the fewest games played and could be the second youngest to achieve the feat (Diggins is almost 35 and has played in 300 games as of June 6, 2025).

Breanna Stewart, who scored her 5,000th career point in 242 games, is currently the fastest to the mark and Lauren Jackson (28 years, 96 days) and Diana Taurasi (29 years, 34 days) hold the top two youngest spots.

30/10 IN 2025 & BEYOND

Only **three 30/10 double-doubles** have been recorded in 2025. A'ja Wilson has posted two of those three.

With 18 (and counting) Wilson also has recorded the <u>most double-</u> <u>doubles with 30+ points in league history</u>. Tina Charles and Breanna Stewart have 15 apiece.

PAY TO PLAY

Over her 233-game WNBA career, A'ja Wilson has missed out on a trip to the free throw line just 5 times. The first came in her 145th game on Aug. 4, 2022; in 2023 she experienced a void in free throw attempts on June 18 and Aug. 24; in 2024 her lone non-free throw attempt game was on July 4 and her 5th career game not stepping to the line was against Seattle on June 1, 2025.

THE QUICKENING CONTINUES

Lisa Leslie and Candace Parker hold the league record for fastest to compile **5,000 points**, **1,500 rebounds**, **500 assists**, **400 blocked shots** and **200 steals**, having done so in 287 games. Parker was the youngest to achieve that milestone, at 32 years and 108 days.

At 28 years and 303 days (age on June 7) and needing 81 points to reach 5,000, A'ja Wilson is on the verge of shattering those records to become the youngest and fastest to the milestone.

Wilson, however, is <u>ranked first for scoring average</u> (minimum 2,000 points) with a career average of 21.112 points per game, while Loyd's 16.808 ppg sits at No. 16.

Through the 2024 season, only 5 players in WNBA history <u>averaged more</u> than 20 points and fewer than 2.0 turnovers over the course of a season. A'ja Wilson has now accomplished the feat 4 times (2018, 2020, 2023 and 2024), which ranks 2nd behind Breanna Stewart (5). A'ja Wilson's 2024 usage rating (the percentage of a team's possessions that a player impacts) of 32.16 was the <u>9th highest in league history</u>. None of the 8 players ahead of her had amazingly efficient offensive seasons. Most of the offensive efficiency ratings (OER) and offensive win shares (OWS) listed are above average to good, but there is nothing great about these performances.

A'ja Wilson's OER and OWS <u>lapped the field on the chart</u>. She impacted an ungodly amount of her team's possessions, and did it at an M'VP level that had never been seen before.

LOOK AT ALL THE PEOPLE HERE TONIGHT

Over the past two seasons, the Aces have been rewriting their home attendance record books, and in 2024 made WNBA history by becoming the first team in the league to sell out 100% of their home games in a season. The Aces sold out their entire season ticket membership inventory for the 2025 season last August—the earliest any team had ever done so.

- The Aces have sold out 28 straight home games, dating to Game 1 of the 2023 WNBA Finals.
- On July 2, 2024, there were 20,366 in attendance at T-Mobile Arena, which was the fifth-most attended game in WNBA regular season history and the most since 1999.
- The franchise-high 20,366 fans at T-Mobile Arena against Indiana on July 2 eclipsed the previous regular season record of 17,406, set on Sept. 10, 2023, when the Aces played host to the Mercury.
- Prior to this season, the top 10 attendance marks for Las Vegas Aces games played at Michelob ULTRA Arena came in 2024. However, the first two games at MUA in 2025 have jumped to the top of the MUA list.
- After seeing attendance averages hit no higher than 5,606 over their first four seasons in Las Vegas, the Aces upped their average to 9,551 fans per game in 2023, and surpassed that number in 2024 with an average of 11,283 over their 20 regular season home games.
- The Aces sold out of their 2024 season-ticket memberships in early March and had 7 full sellouts by the third week in April, breaking the Las Vegas record of 6 regular season sellouts set in 2023.
- The Aces sold out of their 2025 season-ticket memberships in August 2024, the earliest any W team had ever done so.
- The attendance mark of 10,431 against Connecticut on Sept. 15 is the largest crowd ever for an Aces game at Michelob ULTRA Arena.
- The Las Vegas Aces have welcomed 10,000 or more fans at 35 home games since arriving in the Valley in 2018—3 of which came in 2022, 9 were in 2023 and 23 in 2024.
- On Sept. 13, 2023, the Aces rewrote their playoff attendance record since arriving in Las Vegas with 12,927 fans at T-Mobile Arena for their first game of the First Round against the Sky. The franchise high for a playoff game is 16,012, set Oct. 3, 2008, when the San Antonio Stars hosted the Detroit Shock in the Finals.
- On Oct 8, 2023, against New York, the Aces welcomed the most fans ever to attend a playoff game in Michelob ULTRA Arena (10,300). That mark has since been eclipsed numerous times.
- The Aces ranked **1st in the W in attendance in 2023** with the help of 6 sold out games and **3rd in 2024** after 20 sellouts. The Aces also sold out 2 playoff games in 2024.

HEAD COACH BECKY HAMMON



Las Vegas Aces President Nikki Fargas announced on December 31, 2021, that the team hired San Antonio Spurs assistant and 6-time WNBA All-Star Becky Hammon as the team's head coach.

Hammon rewarded the Aces less than nine months later with the fanchise's first WNBA Championship.

She repeated that feat in her second season, helping the Aces become the first team to claim back-to-back WNBA titles in more than 20 years.

While the Aces 3-peat bid fell short in Hammon's third season, the injuryhampered team still advanced to the

WNBA Semifinals and finished fourth in league play.

In her first three years with the Aces, Las Vegas tallied a 77-29 (.726) mark in the regular season, 19-6 (.760) in playoff games and also captured the 2022 Commissioner's Cup crown.

The seeds for Hammon's hiring were originally sewn when the Aces retired her jersey on September 13, 2021. That ceremony served as the culmination of the franchise's 25th anniversary alumni initiative, which saw the Aces embrace their Utah and San Antonio roots, and celebrate the players who helped build the franchise and the league from the ground up. Las Vegas owner Mark Davis spent time with Hammon and her family that week, and walked away understandably impressed.

Hammon played 16 seasons in the WNBA, including her final eight in San Antonio, where she led the franchise to its first finals appearance in 2008.

On August 5, 2014, Spurs head coach Gregg Popovich hired Hammon as a full-time assistant making her the first woman in NBA history to hold that position.

Since that time, Hammon continued to accumulate coaching 'firsts' in the NBA. On July 3, 2015, she became the first woman to serve as head coach in the NBA's Summer League where she led the Spurs to the league title.

Less than a year later, Hammon became the first woman to be part of an All-Star coaching staff, and on December 30, 2020, following Popovich's ejection in San Antonio's game against Los Angeles, Hammon took over on the bench, becoming the first woman acting head coach in the history of the NBA.

A member of the league's 15th, 20th and 25th anniversary teams, Hammon went undrafted in 1999 following her All-American career at Colorado State. She signed with New York as a free agent that same year, helping the team to WNBA Finals appearances in three of her first four years in the Big Apple.

The Rapid City, South Dakota native earned her first All-Star nod in 2003, and represented New York on the Eastern Conference squad in 2005 and 2006 as well.

Following the 2006 season, New York traded Hammon to San Antonio. In her first year in silver and black, she posted what were then career highs in scoring (18.8 ppg), and assists (5.0) while earning another trip to the WNBA All-Star Game. As a team, the Silver Stars made their first appearance in the postseason since 2002, falling to Phoenix in the Western Conference Finals.

In 2008, Hammon led San Antonio to its first trip to the WNBA Finals where they fell to Detroit. The Silver Stars made the playoffs in each of her seven full seasons with the team, and Hammon once again was named to the All-Star team in 2009 and 2011.

She retired as the franchise leader in assists per game (5.1) and scoring average (15.6), and the WNBA leader in career free throw percentage (89.7).

Hammon, who was inducted into the Naismith Memorial Hall of Fame on Aug. 12, 2023, was inducted into the Women's Basketball Hall of Fame in 2022, the Colorado Sports Hall of Fame in 2015 and the San Antonio Sports Hall of Fame in 2018.
