PLAYOFF NOTES

SWEEPING AWAY

Not including the 1997 WNBA Finals, which wasn't a series but a single, winner-take-all game, there have now been 11 sweeps in WNBA Finals history. The Las Vegas Aces in 2025 became the first to do so in the expanded best-of-seven series. It also was the first Finals sweep since the 2020 Storm went 3-0 against the Aces for that year's title.

#WINNING, POSTSEASON EDITION

Since moving to Las Vegas, the franchise owns the highest playoff winning percentage than any other team in the league. The three-time champs have won 63.6% (35-20) of their postseason games since relocating to the Sports & Entertainment Capital of the World in 2018.

GAME 3 CURSE LIFTED

2025 marks the 5th WNBA Finals appearance for the franchise, after it also advanced in 2008, 2020, 2022 and 2023, with the Aces winning it all the last two trips to the Finals. Prior to Oct. 8, the Aces were 0-4 in Finals Game 3s. Curse broken.

DUB/DUBS THE HARD WAY

In Finals Game 2, **Chelsea Gray** notched her second points/assists double-double in a WNBA Finals game, the second most ever recorded in Finals play. Alyssa Thomas tops the list with 4. Gray first recorded one in the 2023 WNBA Finals with 14 points and 11 rebounds in the 104-74 victory over New York on Oct. 11, 2023. Looking at points/assists double-doubles in playoff games, Gray has a total of 5, which ranks No. 4. Thomas is No. 1 with 14.

CHARITY STRIKE STREAKING

Jackie Young made 35 free throw attempts in playoff action from Sept. 23 through Oct. 10. It was the longest streak for a single playoff run in league history, eclipsing the previous record of 32, recorded four times (DeWanna Bonner, 2020; Elena Delle Donne, 2014 and 2018; Diana Taurasi, 2016).

FIRST UP

In Game 1 against Phoenix, **Dana Evans**, who was 5 of 6 from 3-point, became the 1st player in WNBA Finals history with at least 5 3-pointers and 4 steals in a Finals game, and 4th to do so in any playoff game.

20/10 GAMES

A'ja Wilson (90) lists second, behind Tina Charles (109), on the WNBA's all-time regular season list for 20/10 points/rebounds double-doubles.

In playoff games, however, she sits atop that list with 17 such double-doubles, including in the Finals with her 21-point, 10-rebound performance in Game 1, 28-point, 14-rebound outing in Game 2 and 34-point and 14-rebounding performance in Game 3. No. 2 on the list are a pair of legends, Tamika Catchings and Candace Parker, who had 12 apiece in their playoff careers.

30 FOR 30

A'ja Wilson, who had 33 points at the end of regulation, and **Jackie Young**, 28 points through four quarters of play, became the first teammates in WNBA history to score 30 points in the same playoff game after Wilson finished with 35 (13-27 FGs) and Young posted 32 (10-20 FGs) against Indiana on Sept. 30. Further, with her third 30-point game in the 2025 playoffs, **Wilson tied her own league record for a single postseason run** after also scoring 30 or more 3 times in 2023. By the time the trophy was hoisted, Wilson's record bumped the record to 5 games with at least 30 points in a single playoff run.

LAS VEGAS ACES IN THE PLAYOFFS

Since moving to Las Vegas in 2018, the team is 35-20 (.636) in the playoffs and have won 18 games by 10 or more points, 6 by at least 20 and 2 by more than 30. Further, the Aces own the most playoff victories in the league since the team relocated to the Sports & Entertainment Capital of the World. Connecticut is No. 2 with 23 victories since 2018, Seattle has 17, and New York and Phoenix round out the top five with 16 apiece.

The franchise is 45-43 overall in playoff games and has reached the WNBA Finals five times -- 2008, 2020, 2022, 2023 and 2025.

COACHING #WINS

Las Vegas Aces head coach Becky Hammon now ranks No. 5 for all-time WNBA postseason coaching victories with 28, trailing No. 4 Mike Thibault, who produced 34 playoff wins.

Among the top 10 in all-time WNBA postseason coaching wins, Hammon ranks at the top of the list for winning percentage with an unmatched 75.7%, ahead of No. 2 Michael Cooper (.628) and No. 3 Cheryl Reeve (.627).

Hammon also owns the highest Finals winning percentage (minimum 5 Finals games coached) after going 10-2 (.833) in the Finals.

EARLY RETURNS

In securing her 20th playoff victory on Sept. 14, Becky Hammon became the second-fastest coach in W history to reach 20 playoff wins, doing so in her 26th postseason game. Cheryl Reeve tops the list after getting her 20th in 25 games. Michael Cooper (27), Van Chancellor (30) and John Whisenant (31) round out the top 5.

Hammon also lists as the second-fastest to her 25th playoff victory, doing so in 34 games. Reeve tops the list after picking up her 25th win in 33 games. Cooper (37), Bill Laimbeer (41) and Sandy Brondello (46) round out the top 5.

M & D ... ANOTHER MILESTONE CHECKED OFF

Ahead of Finals Game 1, only 3 athletes in WNBA history had scored at least 1,000 points and hauled in at least 500 rebounds in the postseason: DeWanna Bonner, Tamika Catchings and Candace Parker. A'ja Wilson became the 4th to do so. Having notched the double milestone in 52 games and age 29 years and 56 days, Wilson became the youngest and fastest to the mark. Parker previously did it in the fewest games (56) and also was the youngest (35 years, 177 days).

YOUNGER, FASTER ... AGAIN

A'ja Wilson hit another historic quintuple milestone on Sept. 23 in becoming the 3rd player in W playoff history with at least 900 points, 450 rebounds, 100 blocks, 100 assists and 50 steals, behind Lisa Leslie and Candace Parker. Cue the broken record: Wilson was the youngest (29 years, 46 days) and fastest (48 games) to do so. Leslie hit the quintuple milestone in 52 games and Parker was 36 years and 126 days old when she did so.

GOOD GAWD!

Against Indiana in Game 1 of the semis, the Point Gawd Chelsea Gray became just the second player in WNBA playoff history with 800 points and 300 assists. She joined an exclusive club that, at the time, listed Lindsay Whalen as its lone member.

Much like Wilson had done throughout the season, Gray was the youngest and fastest to the mark until Alyssa Thomas added her name to the group on Sept 23 and is now the fastest to the mark (52 games). Whalen hit her double milestone at 35 years and 128 days in her 75th playoff game. Gray was 32 years and 348 days in her 57th playoff game.

Gray surpassed 200 career postseason rebounds against Phoenix in Game 2 and now has 207. She is just the 3rd player in league history to record at least 800 points, 300 assists and 200 rebounds in postseason play.

THE 300

Prior to Sept. 18, only 13 players in WNBA history had made 300 field goals in the postseason. Chelsea Gray became No. 14 in her 56th playoff contest.

GONE STREAKING

The Aces strung together the second-longest winning streak in league history with 17 straight victories from Aug. 3 through Sept. 14. The 2001 Los Angeles Sparks won 18 in a row from June 26-August 11 and the 2002 and 2003 Sparks combined to win 18 straight from August 9, 2002 through June 14, 2003. The Aces, who closed the regular season with 16 straight wins and picked up No. 17 in the playoffs, will be gunning for the 2001 Sparks regular season record when they open play in 2026.

700/200 CLUB

On Oct. 10, the deciding Game 4 of the Finals, Jackie Young became the 9th player in WNBA history to score at least 700 points and dish out at least 200 assists in postseason play. In doing so at 28 years and 24 days, Young became the ... ahh, youngest player in W history to hit those marks, bumping ahead of teammate Chelsea Gray's previous high-water mark of 31 years and 7 days. Young now has 722 points and 205 assists in 55 playoff games.

CENTURY CLUB

The Las Vegas Aces on Sept. 28 scored 100 points in a playoff game for the fifth time in franchise history after recording 107 against Indiana. Previously the Aces scored 117 against Phoenix (8/20/2022), 110 against Seattle (9/4/2022), 104 against NY (10/11/2023) and 102 against Seattle (9/14/2025) in the playoffs.

38-SPECIAL

A'ja Wilson tied her career playoff high with 38 points in the deciding quarterfinals Game 3 against Seattle, marking the 5th-most points scored ever in a WNBA playoff game. Wilson's first 38 game came in the 2023 first round against Chicago. The W's top scoring output of 42 points was produced on three occasions, first by Angel McCoughtry (9/7/2010) and followed by Breanna Stewart (9/6/2022) and Napheesa Collier (9/25/2024).

TAKING STOCK

Over 12 playoff games in 2025, A'ja Wilson compiled 25 steals and 30 blocked shots for a combined total of 55 stocks. Over her 55 career playoff games, Wilson's 189 total stocks ranks No. 5 among all-time WNBA postseason leaders.

In the first 25 games this season, Jewell Loyd averaged 10.4 points on 36.3% shooting from the field and 35.4% behind the arc. After asking to come off the bench, Loyd bumped those numbers to 12.1 ppg, 42.3% from the field and 40.9% from 3-point over her final 19 games as a reserve.

HOW MANY GAMES?

Nalyssa Smith, who started the season playing for Dallas, which had a front-loaded schedule, before joining the Aces, played 45 games between the two clubs -- the most games in a single season in WNBA history.

Jewell Loyd, whose first career point came against Los Angeles on June 6, 2015, became the 16th player in WNBA history to score 6,000 career points. She did so Sept. 9 against Chicago at 31 years and 339 days, making her the third-youngest player in WNBA history to hit that mark. It was the 370th game of her career, which lists as the 9th fastest in W history.

Diana Taurasi holds the record for the youngest and quickest to the milestone at 291 games when she was 31 years and 61 days old.

NEEDLE IN A HAYSTACK

The Las Vegas Aces on Aug. 21 gave up zero points off turnovers for the first time in franchise history. It also was just the 16th occurrence since the W tipped in 1997, which is about a **0.002%** chance of happening in any game.

The Aces finished 2025 ranked No. 4 for turnovers per game (13.0) and No. 3 for **opponents points off turnovers** (13.9), numbers that improved to 11.7 (No. 2) turnovers and 11.0 (No.1) opponents points off turnovers over the Aces 16-0 season-ending run.

CENTURY WIN

On July 27 against Dallas, Becky Hammon **became the third-fastest and 18th overall W coach to win 100 W games**.

JUST THE (M'VP & D'POY) FACTS, JACK

A'ja Wilson led the Aces during their historic turnaround with a league-best 19-3 slate since the midseason break, which includes a franchise-record 16-game regular season winning streak. In addition to breaking records almost every game, Wilson tallied beyond M'VP stat lines: 23.4 ppg on 50.5% field goal shooting, 10.2 rpg, 3.1 apg, 2.3 bpg and 1.6 spg. She finished the season as **the only player in the history of the league to average at least 20 points, 10 rebounds, 2 assists, 2 blocks and 1 steal per game** – a feat she first accomplished in 2024.

A'ja Wilson in 2025 ...

- Led the league in scoring (23.4 pg) and blocked shots (2.3 bpg) and ranked second in rebounds (10.2 rpg.).
- Set the **WNBA season record for 30-point games** (13).
- Recorded a league-high 10 30-point 4x4 games in 2025** (making a mark in points, rebounds, assists, steals and blocks) and is the only one to post one such game with zero turnovers this year. She has accomplished the 30-point 4x4 mark a league-high 24 times in her career (3 times with zero turnovers).
- Over the Aces 16-game winning streak, averaged 26.1 ppg, 12.0 rpg, 2.6 apg, 1.6 spg and 2.3 bpg, hit 52.7% of her shots from the field, 59.3% from deep and 88.9% from the line; posted 10 double-doubles, and improved offensive efficiency rating to 116.0 (from 110.6 on the season) and defensive efficiency to 94.7 (from 98.8 on the season)

FAN FAVORITES

The Las Vegas Aces were on a WNBA record 45 game home sellout streak, which included three games at T-Mobile Arena, but had its overall sellout streak halted at T-Mobile Arena against Minnesota on Sept. 4. However, the Aces still have a running streak, having sold out 49 consecutive games at Michelob ULTRA Arena, including 2025 playoff games.

The Aces previously made W ticketing history in March 2024 when they announced 15 sellouts along with the fact that season-ticket memberships were sold out ahead of the season, the earliest any team had ever done so. They made history again when all 2025 season-ticket memberships were sold out by August 2024. (see page 10 for more)

FREE MONEY

A'ja Wilson made all 11 of her attempts from the line on Aug. 14, the 8th time in her career she's been perfect at the line with 10 or more attempts, which **ranks tied for No. 4 with Skylar Diggins and Lindsay Whalen in WNBA history** for 10 or more made with no misses. **Jewell Loyd** has 4 such games, and is tied with 5 others, including **Becky Hammon**, for No. 15. **Jackie Young** has 3 such games—2 of which were accomplished in 2025—and is tied with 13 others at No. 20. No. 1 is **Diana Taurasi** with 19.

THAT'S OFFENSIVE

The Aces have had one of the best offenses in the W since moving to Vegas. In 3 of the past 4 seasons they finished 1st in OER, including a league-record 113.0 OER in 2023. **While this year's team had one of the lowest ranking since moving to Las Vegas**, the Aces over the last 16 games of the season bumped ahead of the league record set by the 2023 title team.

NEVER GONNA GIVE YOU UP

Only 6 players in WNBA history averaged more than 20 points and fewer than 2.0 turnovers over the course of a season. A'ja Wilson has accomplished the feat 4 times (2018, 2020, 2023 and 2024), which ranks 2nd behind Breanna Stewart (5).

Elena Delle Donne and Lauren Jackson are 3rd with 3 such seasons apiece and Tina Charles (2016) and Kelsey Mitchell (2025) have one apiece. Wilson's 26.9 points a game in 2024 tops the chart and her 1.26 turnovers per game ranks No. 4.

That list bumps to 16 players when upping the turnover average to 2.5 per game, which was done by just three players in 2025 -- Napheesa Collier (22.9 ppg, 2.1 TOs), Kelsey Mitchell (20.2 ppg, 1.8 TOs) and Wilson (23.4 ppg, 2.2 TOs).

LOOK AT ALL THE PEOPLE HERE TONIGHT

Since 2023, the Aces have been rewriting their home attendance record books, and in 2024 made WNBA history by becoming the first team in the league to sell out 100% of their home games in a season. **The Aces sold out their entire season ticket membership inventory for the 2025 season last August—the earliest any team had ever done so.**

- **The Aces sold out 45 straight home games**, dating from Game 2 of the 2023 WNBA Semifinals (Sept. 26, 2023) through Aug. 21, 2025, and including this year's playoff games, will enter 2026 on a **49-game sellout streak at Michelob ULTRA Arena**.
- On July 2, 2024, there were **20,366 in attendance at T-Mobile Arena**, which was the fifth-most attended game in WNBA regular season history and the most since 1999.
- The franchise-high 20,366 fans at T-Mobile Arena against Indiana on July 2, 2024, eclipsed the previous regular season record of 17,406, set on Sept. 10, 2023, when the Aces played host to the Mercury.
- Prior to this season, the top 10 attendance marks for Las Vegas Aces games played at Michelob ULTRA Arena came in 2024. However, eight of the games at MUA in 2025 jumped into the MUA top 10 list and the top 6 attended games at MUA came this year.
- After seeing attendance averages hit no higher than 5,606 over their first four seasons in Las Vegas, the Aces upped their average to 9,551 fans per game in 2023, and surpassed that number in 2024 with an average of 11,283 over their 20 regular season home games. The Aces are averaging 11,358 in 2025.
- The Aces sold out of their 2024 season-ticket memberships in early March and had 7 full sellouts by the third week in April, breaking the Las Vegas record of 6 regular season sellouts set in 2023.
- The Aces upped that mark and sold out of their 2025 season-ticket memberships in August 2024, the earliest for any W team ever.
- The attendance mark of **10,509** against Washington on May 23, 2025, is the largest crowd ever for an Aces game at Michelob ULTRA Arena.
- The Las Vegas Aces have welcomed **10,000 or more fans at 64 home games** since arriving in the Valley in 2018—3 of which came in 2022, 9 were in 2023, 23 in 2024 and 29 (and counting) in 2025.
- On Sept. 13, 2023, the Aces rewrote their playoff attendance record since arriving in Las Vegas with 12,927 fans at T-Mobile Arena for their first game of the First Round against the Sky. The franchise high for a playoff game is 16,012, set Oct. 3, 2008, when the San Antonio Stars hosted the Detroit Shock in the Finals.
- On Oct 8, 2023, against New York, the Aces welcomed the **most fans ever to attend a playoff game in Michelob ULTRA Arena (10,300)**. That mark has since been eclipsed.

CAN'T TOUCH THIS

Entering the 2025 season, there had been 104 different occasions where a player averaged **15 or more shots per game** while playing in at least 20 games—the very definition of a team's go-to offensive player.

Of those 104 instances, **65 shot 45% or worse from the field**. Only 7 times had a player **shot better than 50% from the field**. Wilson became the first player to do it twice in her career after first doing so in 2023.

Of those who have previously accomplished this feat, most took fewer than 16 shots. Wilson in 2024 took 19.6 shots per game—more than 2 shots more per game than the next person on the list, Seimone Augustus.

In 2025, **6 players who saw action in the bulk of their team's games averaged more than 15 field goal attempts a game**, only 3 of them are shot 45% or better from the field. Wilson is No. 1 for attempts per game and No. 2 for field goal percentage.

HEAD COACH BECKY HAMMON



Las Vegas Aces President Nikki Fargas announced on December 31, 2021, that the team hired San Antonio Spurs assistant and 6-time WNBA All-Star Becky Hammon as the team's head coach.

Hammon rewarded the Aces less than nine months later with the franchise's first WNBA Championship.

She repeated that feat in her second season, helping the Aces become the first team to claim back-to-back WNBA titles in more than 20 years.

While the Aces 3-peat bid fell short in Hammon's third season, the injury-hampered team still advanced to the

WNBA Semifinals and finished fourth in league play.

Season No. 4 for Hammon was one for the history books.

During the 2024-25 offseason, free agency and the expansion draft saw the departure of several key players from the Aces first two championship runs. However, Las Vegas signed several players, key among them was two-time WNBA Champion, two-time Olympic gold medalist and six-time All-Star Jewell Loyd. With the different faces came struggles to gain trust and build chemistry, and the Aces roster saw more changes over the first half of the season. The final addition came on June 30 when the Aces were 8-8.

Over the next 11 games, the Aces went 6-5 before falling to 14-14 with a 53-point loss at home against Minnesota on Aug. 2. Nearly everyone outside the organization wrote off the Aces. Everyone in the inner circle knew the pieces were there, and the team rebounded with a 101-77 win the following day against Golden State. The Aces continued stringing together victories, knocking off defending champion New York and eventual Nos. 3 and 4 Atlanta and Phoenix, and brought a 12-game winning streak into a rematch against Minnesota. The Aces passed the test, 97-87, and won their next three for a season-ending 16-game winning streak to finish an improbable second in the standings. From there, the Aces were pushed to the limit in the first two rounds of the playoffs but never folded before earning a four-game sweep of Phoenix in the Finals for their third title in four years.

In her four years with the Aces, Las Vegas tallied a 77-29 (.726) mark in the regular season, 19-6 (.760) in playoff games and also captured the 2022 Commissioner's Cup crown.

The seeds for Hammon's hiring were originally sewn when the Aces retired her jersey on September 13, 2021. That ceremony served as the culmination of the franchise's 25th anniversary alumni initiative, which saw the Aces embrace their Utah and San Antonio roots, and celebrate the players who helped build the franchise and the league from the ground up. Las Vegas owner Mark Davis spent time with Hammon and her family that week, and walked away understandably impressed.

Hammon played 16 seasons in the WNBA, including her final eight in San Antonio, where she led the franchise to its first finals appearance in 2008.



On August 5, 2014, Spurs head coach Gregg Popovich hired Hammon as a full-time assistant making her the first woman in NBA history to hold that position.

Since that time, Hammon continued to accumulate coaching 'firsts' in the NBA. On July 3, 2015, she became the first woman to serve as head coach in the NBA's Summer League where she led the Spurs to the league title.

Less than a year later, Hammon became the first woman to be part of an All-Star coaching staff, and on December 30, 2020, following Popovich's ejection in San Antonio's game against Los Angeles, Hammon took over on the bench, becoming the first woman acting head coach in the history of the NBA.

A member of the league's 15th, 20th and 25th anniversary teams, Hammon went undrafted in 1999 following her All-American career at Colorado State. She signed with New York as a free agent that same year, helping the team to WNBA Finals appearances in three of her first four years in the Big Apple.

The Rapid City, South Dakota native earned her first All-Star nod in 2003, and represented New York on the Eastern Conference squad in 2005 and 2006 as well.

Following the 2006 season, New York traded Hammon to San Antonio. In her first year in silver and black, she posted what were then career highs in scoring (18.8 ppg), and assists (5.0) while earning another trip to the WNBA All-Star Game. As a team, the Silver Stars made their first appearance in the postseason since 2002, falling to Phoenix in the Western Conference Finals.

In 2008, Hammon led San Antonio to its first trip to the WNBA Finals where they fell to Detroit. The Silver Stars made the playoffs in each of her seven full seasons with the team, and Hammon once again was named to the All-Star team in 2009 and 2011.

She retired as the franchise leader in assists per game (5.1) and scoring average (15.6), and the WNBA leader in career free throw percentage (89.7).

Hammon, who was inducted into the Naismith Memorial Hall of Fame on Aug. 12, 2023, was inducted into the Women's Basketball Hall of Fame in 2022, the Colorado Sports Hall of Fame in 2015 and the San Antonio Sports Hall of Fame in 2018.






