Finals Notes:

Posted three double-doubles; scored at least 20 points in all four games, including 30-point performances in Games 3 and 4; tallied 21 points, 10 rebounds, 5 assists 1 steal and 2 blocked shots with zero turnovers in Game 1; had 34 points, 14 rebounds, 4 assists and 3 blocked shot in Game 3, in which she hit a turnaround jumper, despite being double-teamed by DeWanna Bonner and Alyssa Thomas, with 2.2 seconds on the clock to give the Aces the 90-88 victory

Playoffs Notes: Led the Aces to a 9-3 mark, averaging 26.8 ppg, 10 rpg, 3.3 apg, 2.1 spg and 2.5 bpg, while shooting 47.8% from the floor.

Posted double-doubles in each of the final 3 games, including 24 points and 16 rebounds in Game 4 to lead the shorthanded Aces to a 70-69 victory and their second championship; tied her Finals career-high with 26 points and grabbed 15 boards in Game 2; posted a 16-point, 11-rebound double-double in Game 3, and had 16 points, 8 rebounds and 3 blocks in Game 1.

Playoffs Notes: Led the Aces to an 8-1 mark, averaging 23.8 ppg, 11.8 rpg and 2.3 bpg while shooting 55.4% from the field

2022 | Chelsea Gray

Posted 19 points, 4 rebounds and 5 assists to help lead the Aces to a 93-83 victory over Chicago in the Commissioner's Cup Finals. In helping lead the Aces to a 9-1 record in CC games to advance to the championship contest, Gray averaged 14.3 ppg, 3.4 rpg and a team-high 6.2 apg, while shooting 52.3% from the field overall, including 34.5% from 3-point range, and 90.5% from the line.

2023 | A'ja Wilson

Regular Season Record: 30-14
(2nd in WNBA)

Statistics: Led the league in blocks per game (2.3) for the fourth season in a row and her fifth overall, while also finishing atop the league leaderboards in steals, which combines the defensive measures of steals and blocks, with 3.9 per game, total steals (156), defensive win shares (3.3) and defensive rating (96.0); also ranked No. 2 in total blocks (92), No. 3 in total steals (64), defensive rebounds (7.9) and defensive rebound percentage (.249), and No. 4 in steals per game (1.6).

Notes: Became the 4th player in league history to take home the award at least three times, joining defensive icons Tamika Catchings (5), Sylvia Fowles (4) and Sheryl Swoopes (3); received 29 of 72 first place votes and earned the co-honor with Minnesota's Alanna Smith.



2023 | A'ja Wilson

Regular Season Record: 34-6
(1st in WNBA)

Statistics: Ranked 1st in the W in defensive win shares (3.5) and defensive efficiency rating (93.2), 1st in block percentage (6.0), 3rd in defensive rebound percentage (26.5) and 13th in steal percentage (2.2) as the Aces boasted the most efficient defense in the league this year (97.7). In more traditional statistics, Wilson led the league in blocked shots (2.23) for the 3rd time in 4 years, while finishing 3rd in defensive rebounds per game (7.5) and 10th in steals per game (1.40).

Notes: Became the 8th player in league history to take home the award multiple times; three-time Western Conference Player of the Month (June, July, August); earned 32 of 60 first place votes; highest vote-getter for the 2023 WNA All-Star Game; led Las Vegas to the most wins in franchise history, upping the mark set in 2022.



2022 | A'ja Wilson

Regular Season Record: 26-10 (1st in WNBA)

Statistics: Led the league in blocks (1.9 bpg), ranked second in defensive rebounds per game (career-high 7.6) and was 12th in steals (1.4 spg). Wilson grabbed at least 10 defensive rebounds in a game nine times. She also recorded seven games with at least four blocks and six games with at least three steals.

Notes: Winner of the 2022 WNBA M'VP award, becoming the 5th player to earn M'VP and Defensive Player of the Year honors in the same season; two-time Western Conference Player of the Month (May, July); garnered 20 of 56 first place votes; highest vote-getter for the 2022 WNBA All-Star Game; led Las Vegas to the most wins in franchise history.
