I WOULD WALK 500 MILES

A'ja Wilson (489) needs just 11 more points to become the first player in 2026 to score at least 500. **Kelsey Mitchell** has the second-most points this season with 467 in 21 games. Having played in 19 games, Wilson also will tie **Tina Charles** (20 games in 2021) as the second-fastest player to 500 points in a season if she does so in her next game played. The record-holder? Wilson, who got her 500th point in her 19th game of 2024.

### THE 700 CLUB

**Jewell Loyd** on July 3, playing in her 389th career game, became **the 9th player in league history with at least 700 made 3s**. She was the 6th-fastest, just 5 games behind **Becky Hammon**, who connected on her 700th 3 in 384 games. **Diana Taurasi** (276) leads the pack. Loyd was the third-youngest, netting her 700th in 32 years and 271 days, trailing Taurasi (31, 8 days) and No. 1 **Kelsey Mitchell** (30, 218 days).

Even more impressive? Of those 9, Loyd is one of just 4 with at least 700 3-pointers, 6,000 points, 1,000 rebounds and 1,000 assists, and was the second-fastest player to hit those milestones.

### GOOD COMPANY

Prior to June 25, only **3 players in the 30 years of league play had amassed at least 4,500 points and 2,000 assists**. That number grew to 4 as **Chelsea Gray**, who scored her 4,500th point on June 2, dished out her 2,000th career assist in the third quarter against Dallas. She tied **Lindsay Whalen** as the second-fastest to the double milestone.

### KEEP DROPPIN THOSE DIMES

To say that **Chelsea Gray** and **Jackie Young** have been dishing out passes at a fast clip would be an understatement. Gray's 7.3 apg ranks 3rd and Young's 6.6 apg is 5th among league leaders.

Should they keep up their current pace, they would not only finish in the top 3 for single-season assists averaged in franchise history, **they would become the first duo in the W to ever average at least 6 assists a game**.

Only once in history have teammates even produced at least 5.5 apg over the course of a season -- **Natasha Cloud** (5.6) and **Kristi Toliver** (6.0) did so in 2019 for Washington.

### ANOTHER FIRST

On June 17 against Phoenix, **A'ja Wilson** and **Jackie Young** became the first duo to each record at least 20 points and 5 steals in a regular season game. Wilson scored 33 points and Young had 21; both were credited with 5 steals apiece.

Fun fact? The rare feat was accomplished once in playoff history ... by a franchise duo, no less. **Adrienne Goodson** (20 points, 5 steals) and **Marie Ferdinand-Harris** (22, 5) did so in **Utah's 83-77 double-overtime loss to Houston** in the 2002 Western Conference Semifinals.

### TOP 10 WINNINGEST

**Sue Bird** leads the WNBA for all-time victories with 333 in her storied career. The top 10 winningest players list is close to including none other than The Point Gawd herself. Winner of 4 WNBA Championships, **Chelsea Gray** has helped her teams win **270 games** throughout her career, which lists No. 9 **among the winningest W players** to ever grace the hardwood. No. 8 is **Tina Thompson**, who won 286 games.

### 3-BALLS LOADING

Chelsea Gray knocked down a **WNBA record-tying 9 3-pointers** on June 11 and followed that up with 6 on June 13, tying the WNBA record for most 3s made in a 2-game span with 15, which had previously been accomplished by **Kayla McBride** (June 7 & 9, 2024) and **Diana Taurasi** (Sept. 1 & 3, 2020) and **Marina Mabrey** tied it on June 25.

### HIGHS IN THE 60'S

In the league's history, **only 4 players have finished a season shooting at least 65%** from the field or better (minimum 5 FGA per game). If **NaLyssa Smith** keeps up the pace, she'll be the 5th to ever do so.

20/10 IN 2026 TIDBITS

A'ja Wilson strung together a 2026 **league-high 4 straight 20/10 double-doubles** from May 31-June 8 before her streak was halted on June 11. She has a total of 9 such double-doubles in 2026, the **most recorded by any other player this season**; the second-most is 4.

HOME IMPROVEMENT

NaLyssa Smith spent time working on her game in the offseason and the result has been a dramatic year-over-year improvement. She bumped her scoring production from 7.6 ppg in 2025 to 11.4 ppg this year, while her playing time has remained relatively steady (23.2 in 2026 vs 21.2 in 2025). Additionally, Smith posted 3 double-doubles over 45 games last year and has posted 1 to date this season. She also flirted with a double-double 3 times last year -- games with at least 9 points and 9 boards -- and already has 6 such games this season.

CAROM CLUB

A'ja Wilson grabbed her 2,500th career rebound at 2:28 in the 3rd quarter of the Aces May 10 win over the Sparks. In doing so, she became the **12th player in WNBA history with at least 5,500 points and 2,500 rebounds**. She was the fastest, 269 games (**Tina Charles**, 301), and youngest at 29 years and 275 days (Charles, 30 years, 184 days). **Breanna Stewart** became No. 13 on May 12 in 295 games, bumping Charles to third fastest.

PASSING LANE

Becky Hammon's 5,841 career points ranked No. 19 on the WNBA's all-time scoring list entering the season. However, **A'ja Wilson** passed that mark on May 17 against Atlanta. After moving ahead of then-No. 18 **Seimone Augustus** (6,005), No. 17 **Lauren Jackson** and **Brittney Griner**, who were tied at the time with 6,007 points, in the second week of June, she's now **No. 15 with 6,208 points** after moving ahead of now-No. 16 **Jewell Loyd** (now with 6,185) on June 23. It is not inconceivable that Wilson could end the season among the top 10 scorers in WNBA history (**Candace Parker** is currently No. 10 with 6,574 points).

NO SUCH THING AS A FREE LUNCH

Normally among the top half of the league's teams in terms of attempts at the charity stripe, and despite scoring a league third-best inside the paint (41.9 per game), the 2026 Aces are struggling to get to the free throw line, and **currently rank 10th** in the W. You'd have to reach back to 2017 (No. 10, 17.4) to find a franchise team that wasn't in the top half of the league in trips to the line. The previous season low for a franchise team was 16.1 free throws attempted by the 2014 San Antonio Stars.

PLAY THAT 45

A'ja Wilson on May 15 against Connecticut became the first person in WNBA history to record multiple 45-point games. She previously tied the league single-game record of 53 points against Atlanta on Aug. 22, 2023.

In connecting on 15 of 18 from the field (with 3 boards, 3 assists, 1 steal and 2 blocks), Wilson was the **most efficient of anyone in league history for 40-point games**. Oh, and she also went 13 of 13 from the line.

ROAD WARRIORS

Entering the 2026 season with an 8-game road winning streak, followed by 4 straight road wins, through its first 6 games Las Vegas owned the longest active road winning streak with 12, dating to July 27, 2025. However, the streak ended at Dallas on May 28, leaving the Aces **tied with the 2000 LA Sparks for the regular season record for consecutive road wins**.

Despite the streak ending, the Aces have fared much better on the road than at home this year, owning a 9-2 record on the road and 6-4 at home.

RARE COMPANY

On May 10 against Los Angeles, **A'ja Wilson** became the **5th player in league history** to amass at least 5,500 points, 500 blocks and 2,500 rebounds. GONE STREAKING

Chelsea Gray – Dished out no less than 6 assists in 17 of the last 18 games and at least 8 in 6 of the past 8 ... Is averaging a career-high-tying 7.3 apg... After making 20 of 35 overall and 8 of 17 from 3-point over a 4-game span, was 2 of 11 overall and 0 of 3 from deep on July 5 ... Missed just 2 free throws this season (31-33 FTs) and has not missed since going 2 of 3 on June 6 (23-23 FTs) ... Scored at least 100 over a 3-game span, which tied the **WNBA record for consecutive 100-point games**, but has hit the century mark just once in the past 8 games, averaging 86.5 ppg during that span

6,000 DEGREES OF SEPARATION

Jewell Loyd, whose first career point came against Los Angeles on June 6, 2015, became the **16th player in WNBA history to score 6,000 career points**. She did so Sept. 9, 2025, against Chicago at 31 years and 339 days, making her the fourth-youngest player in WNBA history to hit that mark. It was the 370th game of her career, which listed as the 10th fastest in W history. There are now 19 players on that list after **Breanna Stewart** hit 6k on May 8, **Brittney Griner** joined the club on May 30 and **A'ja Wilson** did so June 8. Wilson bumped Loyd to the 5th youngest to the mark.

PAINTING THE TOWN RED

Over the first 29 years of WNBA competition, teams finished at or above an average of 40 points in the paint just 14 times, with the **2020 Las Vegas Aces setting the standard of 42.7** points in the paint. And only three seasons saw more than one team hit the 40 PitP mark: **2010** (Atlanta, Phoenix), **2024** (Chicago, Dallas, Seattle) and **2025** (Indiana, Los Angeles).

Through July 6, **6 teams are scoring at least 40 points in the paint**, with the 41.0 ppg by Las Vegas ranking 5th, **thanks to 13.1 from A'ja Wilson, 8.8 from Nalyssa Smith** and 6.5 from Jackie Young.

ROARING 20'S

Over the first 29 seasons in WNBA history, a total of **28 players averaged at least 20 points over the course of a season** (minimum 20 games played). Fifteen of those 28 had multiple seasons averaging at least 20. Only 5 boast of at least 5 seasons of 20 or more points a game. **A'ja Wilson** is one of them. If she keeps up the pace, Wilson could become just the second player over the W's 30-year history with 6 or more 20-point seasons.

Diana Taurasi sits atop the list, having averaged at least 20 points over 7 different seasons. And Wilson could join **Angel McCoughtry, Breanna Stewart** and Taurasi as the only players with four consecutive seasons averaging at least 20 points.

While the 2025 team had one of the lowest ranking since moving to Las Vegas, the Aces over the last 16 games of the 2025 season bumped ahead of the league record set by the 2023 title team. The 2026 Aces once again rank **among the top teams** in OER.

Gray also became the 9th player in WNBA history with at least 4,000 points and 1,500 assists, and at the time **was the 4th-fastest to accomplish the feat**, doing so in 332 games (**Skylar Diggins**, 291; **Sue Bird**, 317; **Lindsay Whalen**, 328) before **Alyssa Thomas** did so in 327 games a week later for No. 10, bumping Gray to 5th fastest. Having won the second-most games in league history **before turning 25** and shattering the record for **most wins before turning 26**, **Jackie Young** last season **set a new standard for W victories before 27 with 145**.

Only 6 players in WNBA history **averaged more than 20 points and fewer than 2.0 turnovers over the course of a season**. A'ja Wilson has accomplished the feat 4 times (2018, 2020, 2023 and 2024), which ranks 2nd behind **Breanna Stewart** (5).

**Elena Delle Donne** and **Lauren Jackson** are 3rd with 3 such seasons apiece and Tina Charles (2016) and **Kelsey Mitchell** (2025) have one apiece. Wilson's 26.9 points a game in 2024 tops the chart and her **1.26 turnovers per game ranks No. 4**.

That list bumps to **39 when upping the turnover average to 2.5 per game**, which was done by three players in 2025 -- **Napheesa Collier** (22.9 ppg, 2.1 TOs), Mitchell (20.2 ppg, 1.8 TOs) and Wilson (23.4 ppg, 2.2 TOs).

Further, there are **18 players in the history of the WNBA** who have amassed at least 5,000 points and 2,000 rebounds. Of those 18, **only 7 have turned it over fewer than 2.0 times per game**. Wilson ranks No. 3.

## LOOK AT ALL THE PEOPLE HERE TONIGHT

Since 2023, the Aces have been rewriting their home attendance record books, and in 2024 made WNBA history by becoming the first team in the league to sell out 100% of their home games in a season. **The Aces sold out their entire season ticket membership inventory for the 2025 season in August 2024—the earliest any team had ever done so.**

- **The Aces sold out 45 straight home games**, dating from Game 2 of the 2023 WNBA Semifinals (Sept. 26, 2023) through Aug. 21, 2025, which includes games at both Michelob ULTRA Arena and T-Mobile Arena. Including last year's playoff games, the Aces are currently on a **56-game sellout streak at Michelob ULTRA Arena**.
- On July 2, 2024, there were **20,366 in attendance at T-Mobile Arena**, which was the fifth-most attended game in WNBA regular season history and the most since 1999.
- The franchise-high 20,366 fans at T-Mobile Arena against Indiana on July 2, 2024, eclipsed the previous regular season record of 17,406, set on Sept. 10, 2023, when the Aces played host to the Mercury.
- Prior to 2025, the top 10 attendance marks for Las Vegas Aces games played at Michelob ULTRA Arena came in 2024.
- After seeing attendance averages hit no higher than 5,606 over their first four seasons in Las Vegas, the Aces upped their average to 9,551 fans per game in 2023, and surpassed that number in 2024 with an average of 11,283 over their 20 regular season home games. The Aces averaged 11,358 in 2025 and **12,250 in 2026**.
- **The Aces sold out of their 2024 season-ticket memberships in early March** and had 7 full sellouts by the third week in April, breaking the Las Vegas record of 6 regular season sellouts set in 2023. The Aces upped that mark and **sold out of their 2025 season-ticket memberships in August 2024**, the earliest for any W team ever.
- The attendance mark of **10,509** against Washington on May 23, 2025, is the largest crowd ever for an Aces game at Michelob ULTRA Arena.
- The Las Vegas Aces have welcomed **10,000 or more fans at 74 home games** since arriving in the Valley in 2018—3 of which came in 2022, 9 were in 2023, 23 in 2024, 29 in 2025 and **10** (and counting) **in 2026**.
- On Sept. 13, 2023, **the Aces rewrote their playoff attendance record** since arriving in Las Vegas with 12,927 fans at T-Mobile Arena for their first game of the First Round against the Sky. The franchise high for a playoff game is 16,012, set Oct. 3, 2008, when the San Antonio Stars hosted the Detroit Shock in the Finals.
- The Aces ranked **1st in the W in attendance in 2023** with the help of 6 sold out games and **3rd in 2024** after 20 sellouts. The Aces also sold out 2 playoff games in 2024.

## HEAD COACH BECKY HAMMON



Las Vegas Aces President Nikki Fargas announced on December 31, 2021, that the team hired San Antonio Spurs assistant and 6-time WNBA All-Star Becky Hammon as the team's head coach.

Hammon rewarded the Aces less than nine months later with the franchise's first WNBA Championship.

She repeated that feat in her second season, helping the Aces become the first team to claim back-to-back WNBA titles in more than 20 years.

While the Aces 3-peat bid fell short in Hammon's third season, the injury-hampered team still advanced to the

WNBA Semifinals and finished fourth in league play.

Season No. 4 for Hammon was one for the history books.

During the 2024-25 offseason, free agency and the expansion draft saw the departure of several key players from the Aces first two championship runs. However, Las Vegas signed several players, key among them was two-time WNBA Champion, two-time Olympic gold medalist and six-time All-Star Jewell Loyd. With the different faces came struggles to gain trust and build chemistry, and the Aces roster saw more changes over the first half of the season. The final addition came on June 30 when the Aces were 8-8.

Over the next 11 games, the Aces went 6-5 before falling to 14-14 with a 53-point loss at home against Minnesota on Aug. 2. Nearly everyone outside the organization wrote off the Aces. Everyone in the inner circle knew the pieces were there, and the team rebounded with a 101-77 win the following day against Golden State. The Aces continued stringing together victories, knocking off defending champion New York and eventual Nos. 3 and 4 Atlanta and Phoenix, and brought a 12-game winning streak into a rematch against Minnesota. The Aces passed the test, 97-87, and won their next three for a season-ending 16-game winning streak to finish an improbable second in the standings. From there, the Aces were pushed to the limit in the first two rounds of the playoffs but never folded before earning a four-game sweep of Phoenix in the Finals for their third title in four years.

In her four years with the Aces, Las Vegas tallied a 77-29 (.726) mark in the regular season, 19-6 (.760) in playoff games and also captured the 2022 Commissioner's Cup crown.

The seeds for Hammon's hiring were originally sewn when the Aces retired her jersey on September 13, 2021. That ceremony served as the culmination of the franchise's 25th anniversary alumni initiative, which saw the Aces embrace their Utah and San Antonio roots, and celebrate the players who helped build the franchise and the league from the ground up. Las Vegas owner Mark Davis spent time with Hammon and her family that week, and walked away understandably impressed.

Hammon played 16 seasons in the WNBA, including her final eight in San Antonio, where she led the franchise to its first finals appearance in 2008.



On August 5, 2014, Spurs head coach Gregg Popovich hired Hammon as a full-time assistant making her the first woman in NBA history to hold that position.

Since that time, Hammon continued to accumulate coaching 'firsts' in the NBA. On July 3, 2015, she became the first woman to serve as head coach in the NBA's Summer League where she led the Spurs to the league title.

Less than a year later, Hammon became the first woman to be part of an All-Star coaching staff, and on December 30, 2020, following Popovich's ejection in San Antonio's game against Los Angeles, Hammon took over on the bench, becoming the first woman acting head coach in the history of the NBA.

A member of the league's 15th, 20th and 25th anniversary teams, Hammon went undrafted in 1999 following her All-American career at Colorado State. She signed with New York as a free agent that same year, helping the team to WNBA Finals appearances in three of her first four years in the Big Apple.

The Rapid City, South Dakota native earned her first All-Star nod in 2003, and represented New York on the Eastern Conference squad in 2005 and 2006 as well.

Following the 2006 season, New York traded Hammon to San Antonio. In her first year in silver and black, she posted what were then career highs in scoring (18.8 ppg), and assists (5.0) while earning another trip to the WNBA All-Star Game. As a team, the Silver Stars made their first appearance in the postseason since 2002, falling to Phoenix in the Western Conference Finals.

In 2008, Hammon led San Antonio to its first trip to the WNBA Finals where they fell to Detroit. The Silver Stars made the playoffs in each of her seven full seasons with the team, and Hammon once again was named to the All-Star team in 2009 and 2011.

She retired as the franchise leader in assists per game (5.1) and scoring average (15.6), and the WNBA leader in career free throw percentage (89.7).

Hammon, who was inducted into the Naismith Memorial Hall of Fame on Aug. 12, 2023, was inducted into the Women's Basketball Hall of Fame in 2022, the Colorado Sports Hall of Fame in 2015 and the San Antonio Sports Hall of Fame in 2018.

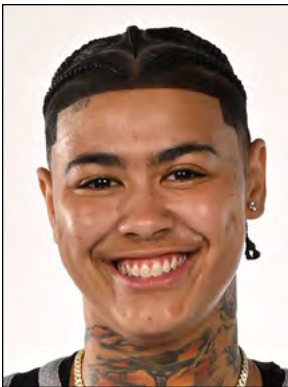

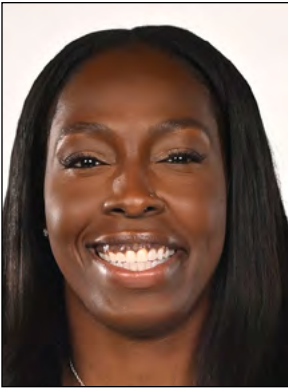

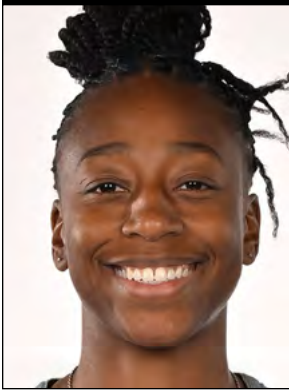

In doing so, she also became just the **4th player in the 30-year history of the league with at least 6,000 points, 2,500 rebounds, 500 assists and 500 blocks**. And of course, she was the fastest and youngest to those marks.

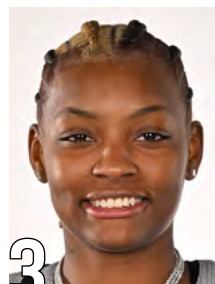
