MOVING UP THE LINE

No. 14 **A'ja Wilson** (6,307) is nearing another step on the all-time scoring ladder and not too far behind is No. 16 **Jewell Loyd** (6,219). Wilson needs 109 points to pass No. 13 **Sylvia Fowles** (6,415) and Loyd needs 45 to pass No. 15 **Lisa Leslie** (6,263).

ICED OUT

Including the July 20 game at Toronto, when her lone free throw attempt came on an and-1, **A'ja Wilson** played just 14 career games, out of 290, with no more than 1 free throws attempted. Among all-time players, Wilson averages a second-most 6.703 free throw attempts per game, trailing just Cynthia Cooper, who averaged 7.016 per game in her career.

8TH CENTURY

The Aces have scored at least 100 points 8 times this season, which ranks second for any franchise season, trailing the 11 times the 2023 championship squad reached the century mark. It's also the second-most of any team this season to score 100 or more, behind Indiana's 10.

WELCOME TO THE FAMILY!

The Aces have made some midseason acquisitions, signing 6-4 guard/forward **Justine Pissott** and 5-4 guard **Mai Yamamoto** to regular contracts, and 5-8 guard **Ta'Niya Latson** to a development contract between July 7-17.

Pissott, who had been on a development contract with Indiana, netted 5 3-pointers and put up 17 points in her rookie debut on July 11. The former Vanderbilt player is the only one of the three to suit up for the Aces thus far as Latson, who came to the Aces via the Sparks and South Carolina, has not been activated and Japan National Team member Yamamoto is not yet with the team.

STREAKING ALONG ...

To say that **Chelsea Gray** and **Jackie Young** have been money at the line the past few weeks would be an understatement.

Gray had not missed a free throw since hitting 2 of 3 from the line against Golden State on June 21 -- her last miss came with 57.4 seconds left in the 3rd quarter on the front end of 2 attempts. After making 25 straight, she missed her 4th of 4 from the stripe against Toronto.

Young has been perfect at the charity stripe since she was fouled attempting a 3-pointer and missed the last attempt on 3 of 3 from the line at Phoenix on June 17 at 5:58 in the first quarter. She has not missed in her ensuing 28 attempts.

MILESTONE ALERT!

Jackie Young needs 4 more steals to become the 26th player in W history with at least 3,500 points, 1,000 rebounds, 1,000 assists and 300 steals. Having played in 268 games, she could become the third-fastest to the mark, trailing just **Diana Taurasi** (246 games) and **Candace Parker** (261). The current third-fastest is **Tamika Catchings**, who did it in 272 games. Young, who will be 28 years and 307 days old on Monday, will become the youngest player to the quad milestone -- Taurasi is the current leader after doing so at age 29 and 47 days.

I WOULD WALK 500 MILES

Against Portland on July 9, **A'ja Wilson** became the first player in 2026 to score at least 500 points and did so in 20 games, tying **Tina Charles** (20 games in 2021) as the second-fastest to score 500 points in a season. The record-holder? Wilson, who got her 500th point in her 19th game of 2024. The second-fastest this season was **Marina Mabrey**, who took 24 games to reach 500 points.

THE 700 CLUB

Jewell Loyd on July 3, playing in her 389th career game, became the 9th player in league history with at least 700 made 3s. She was the 6th-fastest, just 5 games behind **Becky Hammon**, who connected on her 700th 3 in 384 games. **Diana Taurasi** (276) leads the pack. Loyd was the third-youngest, netting her 700th in 32 years and 271 days, trailing Taurasi (31, 8 days) and No. 1 **Kelsey Mitchell** (30, 218 days).

Even more impressive? Of those 9, Loyd is one of just 4 with at least 700 3-pointers, 6,000 points, 1,000 rebounds and 1,000 assists, and was the second-fastest player to hit those milestones.

She tied **Lindsay Whalen** as the second-fastest to the double milestone. The duo was bumped to No. 3 after **Alyssa Thomas** hit the mark on July 13 in 381 games.

To say that **Chelsea Gray** and **Jackie Young** have been dishing out passes at a fast clip would be an understatement. Gray's 7.4 apg ranks 4th and Young's 6.8 apg is 5th among league leaders.

Should they keep up their current pace, they would not only finish in the top 3 for single-season assists averaged in franchise history, they would become the first duo in the W to ever average at least 6 assists a game.

Only once in history have teammates even produced at least 5.5 apg over the course of a season -- **Natasha Cloud** (5.6) and **Kristi Toliver** (6.0) did so in 2019 for Washington.

ANOTHER FIRST

On June 17 against Phoenix, **A'ja Wilson** and **Jackie Young** became the first duo to each record at least 20 points and 5 steals in a regular season game. Wilson scored 33 points and Young had 21; both were credited with 5 steals apiece.

Fun fact? The rare feat was accomplished once in playoff history ... by a franchise duo, no less. **Adrienne Goodson** (20 points, 5 steals) and **Marie Ferdinand-Harris** (22, 5) did so in **Utah's 83-77 double-overtime loss to Houston** in the 2002 Western Conference Semifinals.

TOP 10 WINNINGEST IN THE W

Sue Bird leads the WNBA for all-time victories with 333 in her storied career. The top 10 winningest players list is close to including none other than The Point Guard herself. Winner of 4 WNBA Championships, **Chelsea Gray** has helped her teams win **273 games** throughout her career, which lists No. 9 **among the winningest W players** to ever grace the hardwood. No. 8 is **Tina Thompson**, who won 286 games.

HIGHS IN THE 60'S

In the league's history, **only 4 players have finished a season shooting at least 65%** from the field or better (minimum 5 FGA per game). If **Nalyssa Smith** keeps up the pace, she'll be the 5th to ever do so.

A'ja Wilson grabbed her 2,500th career rebound at 2:28 in the 3rd quarter of the Aces May 10 win over the Sparks. In doing so, she became the **12th player in WNBA history with at least 5,500 points and 2,500 rebounds**. She was the fastest, 269 games (**Tina Charles**, 301), and youngest at 29 years and 275 days (Charles, 30 years, 184 days). **Breanna Stewart** became No. 13 on May 12 in 295 games, bumping Charles to third fastest.

GONE STREAKING

Chelsea Gray – Dished out no less than 6 assists in all but 2 games and at least 8 assists in 7 of the past 12 ... Is averaging a career-high-tying 7.4 apg... PASSING LANE

A'ja Wilson entered the 2021 season ranked No. 21 on the league's all-time scoring list with 5,719 points. She has since passed retired players **Angel McCoughtry** (5,797), **Becky Hammon** (5,841), **Seimone Augustus** (6,005), **Lauren Jackson** (6,007) and **Lisa Leslie** (6,263), and current players **Brittney Griner** and **Jewell Loyd**.

She's now **No. 14 with 6,307 points**. Next up are No. 13 **Sylvia Fowles** (6,415) and No. 12 **Katie Smith** (6,452). **Breanna Stewart's** 6,454 points lists No. 11. It is not inconceivable that Wilson could end the season among the top 10 scorers in WNBA history (**Candace Parker** is currently No. 10 with 6,574 points).



NO SUCH THING AS A FREE LUNCH

Normally among the top half of the league's teams in terms of attempts at the charity stripe, and despite scoring a league third-best inside the paint (41.9 per game), the 2026 Aces are struggling to get to the free throw line, and **currently rank 10th** in the W. You'd have to reach back to 2017 (No. 10, 17.4) to find a franchise team that wasn't in the top half of the league in trips to the line. The previous season low for a franchise team was 16.1 free throws attempted by the 2014 San Antonio Stars.

ROAD WARRIORS

Entering the 2026 season with an 8-game road winning streak, followed by 4 straight road wins, through its first 6 games Las Vegas owned the longest active road winning streak with 12, dating to July 27, 2025. However, the streak ended at Dallas on May 28, leaving the Aces **tied with the 2000 LA Sparks for the regular season record for consecutive road wins**.

Despite the streak ending, the Aces have fared much better on the road than at home this year, owning a 11-2 record on the road and 7-5 at home.

PLAY THAT 45

A'ja Wilson on May 15 against Connecticut became the first person in WNBA history to record multiple 45-point games. She previously tied the league single-game record of 53 points against Atlanta on Aug. 22, 2023.

In connecting on 15 of 18 from the field (with 3 boards, 3 assists, 1 steal and 2 blocks), Wilson was the **most efficient of anyone in league history for 40-point games**. She also made an extremely efficient 13 of 13 from the line.

On May 10 against Los Angeles, **A'ja Wilson** became **the 5th player in league history** to amass at least 5,500 points, 500 blocks and 2,500 rebounds. 6,000 DEGREES OF SEPARATION

Jewell Loyd, whose first career point came against Los Angeles on June 6, 2015, became the **16th player in WNBA history to score 6,000 career points**. She did so Sept. 9, 2025, against Chicago at 31 years and 339 days, making her the fourth-youngest player in WNBA history to hit that mark. It was the 370th game of her career, which listed as the 10th fastest in W history. There are now 19 players on that list after **Breanna Stewart** hit 6k on May 8, **Brittney Griner** joined the club on May 30 and **A'ja Wilson** did so June 8. Wilson bumped Loyd to the 5th youngest to the mark.

PAINTING THE TOWN RED

Over the first 29 years of WNBA competition, teams finished at or above an average of 40 points in the paint just 14 times, with the **2020 Las Vegas Aces setting the standard of 42.7** points in the paint. And only three seasons saw more than one team hit the 40 PitP mark: **2010** (Atlanta, Phoenix), **2024** (Chicago, Dallas, Seattle) and **2025** (Indiana, Los Angeles).

Currently, **6 teams are scoring at least 40 points in the paint**, with the 41.3 ppg by Las Vegas ranking 5th, **thanks to a league-high 13.1 from A'ja Wilson, 9.4 from Nalyssa Smith** and 6.3 from Jackie Young.

ROARING 20'S

Over the first 29 seasons in WNBA history, a total of **28 players averaged at least 20 points over the course of a season** (minimum 20 games played). Fifteen of those 28 had multiple seasons averaging at least 20. Only 5 boast of at least 5 seasons of 20 or more points a game. **A'ja Wilson** is one of them. If she keeps up the pace, Wilson could become just the second player over the W's 30-year history with 6 or more 20-point seasons. **Breanna Stewart** could join Wilson as she's also in the middle of her 6th such season.

Diana Taurasi sits atop the list, having averaged at least 20 points over 7 different seasons. Further, Wilson could join **Angel McCoughtry**, Stewart and Taurasi as the only players with four consecutive seasons averaging at least 20 points.

LOOK AT ALL THE PEOPLE HERE TONIGHT

Since 2023, the Aces have been rewriting their home attendance record books, and in 2024 made WNBA history by becoming the first team in the league to sell out 100% of their home games in a season. **The Aces sold out their entire season ticket membership inventory for the 2025 season in August 2024—the earliest any team had ever done so.**

- **The Aces sold out 45 straight home games**, dating from Game 2 of the 2023 WNBA Semifinals (Sept. 26, 2023) through Aug. 21, 2025, which includes games at both Michelob ULTRA Arena and T-Mobile Arena. Including last year's playoff games, the Aces are currently on a **58-game sellout streak at Michelob ULTRA Arena**.
- On July 2, 2024, there were **20,366 in attendance at T-Mobile Arena**, which, at the time, was the fifth-most attended game in WNBA regular season history and the most since 1999.
- The franchise-high 20,366 fans at T-Mobile Arena against Indiana on July 2, 2024, eclipsed the previous regular season record of 17,406, set on Sept. 10, 2023, when the Aces played host to the Mercury.
- Prior to 2025, the top 10 attendance marks for Las Vegas Aces games played at Michelob ULTRA Arena came in 2024.
- After seeing attendance averages hit no higher than 5,606 over their first four seasons in Las Vegas, the Aces upped their average to 9,551 fans per game in 2023, and surpassed that number in 2024 with an average of 11,283 over their 20 regular season home games. The Aces averaged 11,358 in 2025 and **11,945 in 2026**.
- The Aces sold out of their 2024 season-ticket memberships in early March and had 7 full sellouts by the third week in April, breaking the Las Vegas record of 6 regular season sellouts set in 2023. The Aces upped that mark and **sold out of their 2025 season-ticket memberships in August 2024**, the earliest for any W team ever.
- The attendance mark of **10,513** against Indiana on July 12, 2026, is the largest crowd ever for an Aces game at Michelob ULTRA Arena.
- The Las Vegas Aces have welcomed **10,000 or more fans at 76 home games** since arriving in the Valley in 2018—3 of which came in 2022, 9 were in 2023, 23 in 2024, 29 in 2025 and **12 (and counting) in 2026**.
- On Sept. 13, 2023, **the Aces rewrote their playoff attendance record** since arriving in Las Vegas with 12,927 fans at T-Mobile Arena for their first game of the First Round against the Sky. The franchise high for a playoff game is 16,012, set Oct. 3, 2008, when the San Antonio Stars hosted the Detroit Shock in the Finals.

Only 6 players in WNBA history averaged more than 20 points and fewer than 2.0 turnovers over the course of a season. A'ja Wilson has accomplished the feat 4 times (2018, 2020, 2023 and 2024), which ranks 2nd behind **Breanna Stewart** (5).

Elena Delle Donne and **Lauren Jackson** are 3rd with 3 such seasons apiece and **Tina Charles** (2016) and **Kelsey Mitchell** (2025) have one apiece. Wilson's 26.9 points a game in 2024 tops the chart and her 1.26 turnovers per game ranks No. 4.

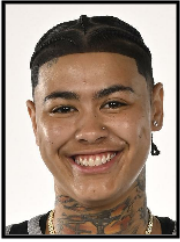

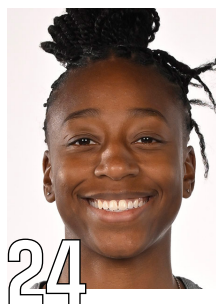

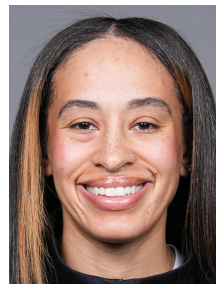
