MOVING UP THE LINE

A'ja Wilson entered the 2026 season ranked No. 21 on the league's all-time scoring list with 5,719 points. She has since passed retired players **Angel McCoughtry** (5,797), **Becky Hammon** (5,841), **Seimone Augustus** (6,005), **Lauren Jackson** (6,007), **Lisa Leslie** (6,263), **Sylvia Fowles** (6,415) and **Katie Smith** (6,452) and current players **Brittney Griner** and **Jewell Loyd**.

She's now **No. 12 with 6,507 points**. Next up is No. 11 **Candace Parker** (6,574). **Breanna Stewart's** 6,668 points lists No. 10 and Sue Bird's **6,803** is No. 9.

2026 BIRTHDAY CURSE?

The Aces are 0-4 on players' birthdays this year, losing to Dallas on June 15 (**Steph Talbot**), Indiana on July 5 (**Brianna Turner**), Chicago on Aug. 1 (**Dana Evans**) and Minnesota on Aug. 8 (**NaLyssa Smith**, **A'ja Wilson**).

The Aces do not play Aug. 22, **Cheyenne Parker-Tyus'** birthday or Sept. 16, **Jackie Young's**. However, there are two others whose birthdays could fall on playoff dates for a couple opportunities to break the curse - **Chelsea Gray**, Oct. 8, and **Mai Yamamoto**, Oct. 23.

MONEY LINE

Chelsea Gray and **Jackie Young** have been money this season at the free throw line. Gray ranks No. 2 in the league with a 93% accuracy and Young is No. 3 at 92.9%.

Gray, who has hit 53 of 57 overall, made 25 in a row from June 21-July 20 and Young, who has connected on 91 of 98 this season, made 33 consecutive free throws from June 17-July 22.

TABLE FOR TWO

A'ja Wilson hit yet another set of markers on Aug. 8 -- and was again the youngest and fastest to do so in becoming just the second player in WNBA history with at least **6,500 points, 2,500 rebounds, 700 assists, 300 steals and 500 blocked shots**. **Candace Parker** hit the quintuple milestone in her 403rd career game, and closed her career with 410 games under her belt. Wilson hit the quad milestone in 297 games.

Even more impressive? If you were to remove steals and assists from the equation, the **6,500-point, 2,500-rebound, 500-block club** also features just Parker and Wilson.

The list stands at 9 when factoring in only 6,500 points and 2,500 rebounds. And none of them did so in fewer than 300 games -- **Breanna Stewart** hit the double milestone the quickest of them all in 317 games earlier this season, and also was the youngest at 31 years and 327 days, but Wilson got it 20 games fewer and on her 30th birthday.

On Aug. 1 at Chicago, **Jackie Young** became the 26th player in W history with at least 3,500 points, 1,000 rebounds, 1,000 assists and 300 steals, tying **Tamika Catchings** (272 games) as the **third-fastest to the mark**, and trailing just **Diana Taurasi** (246) and **Candace Parker** (261). Young, who was 28 years and 319 days old on Aug. 1, became the youngest player to the quad milestone -- Taurasi was the previous youngest at 29 and 47 days.

10TH CENTURY

The Aces have **scored at least 100 points 10 times this season**, which ranks second for any franchise season, trailing the 11 times the 2023 championship squad reached the century mark. It's also the third most of any team this season to score 100 or more, behind Indiana's 14 and Minnesota's 11.

Additionally, the franchise has posted a total of 61 games hitting the century mark, all of which were recorded after the move to Las Vegas, which lists **second all-time among W franchises**, behind the 67 recorded by Phoenix through the years.

TOP 10 WINNINGEST IN THE W

Sue Bird leads the WNBA for all-time regular season victories with 333 in her storied career. The top 10 winningest players list is close to including none other than The Point Gawd herself. Winner of 4 WNBA Championships, **Chelsea Gray** has **helped teams win 277 games** throughout her career, which lists No. 9 **among the winningest W players** to ever grace the hardwood. No. 8 is **Tina Thompson**, who won 286 games.



I WOULD WALK 500 MILES

Against Portland on July 9, **A'ja Wilson** become the first player in 2026 to score at least 500 points and did so in 20 games, tying **Tina Charles** (20 games in 2021) as the second-fastest to score 500 in a season. The record-holder? Wilson, who in 2024 got her 500th point in her 19th game. The second-fastest this season was **Marina Mabrey**, who took 24 games to reach 500 points.

THE 700 CLUB

Jewell Loyd on July 3, playing in her 389th career game, became **the 9th player in league history with at least 700 made 3s**. She was the 6th-fastest, just 5 games behind **Becky Hammon**, who connected on her 700th 3 in 384 games. **Diana Taurasi** (276) leads the pack. Loyd was the third-youngest, netting her 700th in 32 years and 271 days, trailing Taurasi (31, 8 days) and No. 1 **Kelsey Mitchell** (30, 218 days).

Even more impressive? Of those 9, Loyd is one of just 4 with at least 700 3-pointers, 6,000 points, 1,000 rebounds and 1,000 assists, and was the second-fastest player to hit those milestones.

GOOD COMPANY

Prior to June 25, only **3 players in the 30 years of league play had amassed at least 4,500 points and 2,000 assists**. That number grew to 4 as **Chelsea Gray**, who scored her 4,500th point on June 2, dished out her 2,000th career assist in the third quarter against Dallas. She tied **Lindsay Whalen** as the second-fastest to the double milestone. The duo was bumped to No. 3 after **Alyssa Thomas** hit the mark on July 13 in 381 games.

KEEP DROPPIN THOSE DIMES

To say that **Chelsea Gray** and **Jackie Young** have been dishing out passes at a fast clip would be an understatement. Gray's 7.1 apg ranks 4th and Young's 6.7 apg is 5th among league leaders.

Should they keep up their current pace, they would not only finish in the top 3 for single-season assists averaged in franchise history, **they would become the first duo in the W to ever average at least 6 assists a game**.

Only once in history have teammates even produced at least 5.5 apg over the course of a season -- **Natasha Cloud** (5.6) and **Kristi Toliver** (6.0) did so in 2019 for Washington.

ANOTHER FIRST

On June 17 against Phoenix, **A'ja Wilson** and **Jackie Young** became the first duo to each record at least 20 points and 5 steals in a regular season game. Wilson scored 33 points and Young had 21; both were credited with 5 steals apiece.

Fun fact? The rare feat was accomplished once in playoff history ... by a franchise duo, no less. **Adrienne Goodson** (20 points, 5 steals) and **Marie Ferdinand-Harris** (22, 5) did so in **Utah's 83-77 double-overtime loss to Houston** in the 2002 Western Conference Semifinals.

GONE STREAKING

Chelsea Gray – Dished out no less than 6 assists in all but 3 games ... Is averaging a career second-best 7.1 apg... Has dished out **at least 4 assists in each of the past 20 games**, the longest active streak in the W ... Made 25 consecutive free throws from June 21- July 20 ... Was 1 of 9 from deep over a 2-game span before shooting 4 of 10 her past 2 games... Missed just 4 free throws this season (53-57 FTs)... Has never made at least 3 treys in more than 9 games in a single season (9 in 2023 and 2017), but has done so on 10 occasions in 2026 ... CAN'T TOUCH THIS

Over the course of 30 seasons, there have been 117 different occasions where a player averaged **15 or more shots per game** while playing in at least 20 games—the very definition of a team's go-to offensive player.

Of those 117 instances, **70 shot 45% or worse from the field. Only 12 times has a player who has averaged at least 15 attempts per game shot better than 50% from the field.** The only person who has had more than one such season is Wilson, who is well on her way to achieving the accomplishment for a 4th straight year.

This year, there are **7 players who saw action in the bulk of their team's games who are averaging more than 15 field goal attempts a game.** Only 4 of them are shooting 45% or better from the field. Wilson leads in both attempts per game AND field goal percentage.

IN USE

A'ja Wilson's 2026 usage rating (the percentage of a team's possessions that a player impacts) of 33.13 is currently the **6th highest in league history.**

None of the 5 players ahead of her had amazingly efficient offensive seasons. Most of the offensive efficiency ratings (OER) and offensive win shares (OWS) listed are above average to good, but there is nothing great about these performances. However, **A'ja Wilson's** OER and OWS **laps the field on the chart.** She has impacted an ungodly amount of her team's possessions, and did it at an M'VP level that has never been seen before.

HOME IMPROVEMENT

Nalyssa Smith spent time working on her game in the offseason and the result has been a dramatic year-over-year improvement. A'ja Wilson grabbed her 2,500th career rebound at 2:28 in the 3rd quarter of the Aces May 10 win over the Sparks. In doing so, she became the **12th player in WNBA history with at least 5,500 points and 2,500 rebounds.** She was the fastest, 269 games (**Tina Charles**, 301), and youngest at 29 years and 275 days (Charles, 30 years, 184 days). **Breanna Stewart** became No. 13 on May 12 in 295 games, bumping Charles to third fastest.

NO SUCH THING AS A FREE LUNCH

Normally among the top half of the league's teams in terms of attempts at the charity stripe, and despite scoring more than 40 per game inside the paint, the 2026 Aces are struggling to get to the free throw line, and **currently rank 10th** in the W. You'd have to reach back to 2017 (No. 10, 17.4) to find a franchise team that wasn't in the top half of the league in trips to the line. The previous season low for a franchise team was 16.1 free throws attempted by the 2014 San Antonio Stars.

ROAD WARRIORS

Entering the 2026 season with an 8-game road winning streak, followed by 4 straight road wins, through its first 6 games Las Vegas owned the longest active road winning streak with 12, dating to July 27, 2025. However, the streak ended at Dallas on May 28, leaving the Aces **tied with the 2000 LA Sparks for the regular season record for consecutive road wins.**

Despite the streak ending early in the season, the Aces have still fared slightly better on the road than at home this year, owning a 13-6 (.684) record on the road and 9-5 (.643) at home, but looking to improve on that during this home stand.

PICK UP THE PACE

The Aces played at one of the fastest paces in the league since moving to Las Vegas as measured by possessions per 40 minutes. The Aces in 2025 played at their slowest pace since arriving in the Entertainment and Sports Capital of the World, and **are among the lower half this year.**

6,000 DEGREES OF SEPARATION

Jewell Loyd, whose first career point came against Los Angeles on June 6, 2015, became the **16th player in WNBA history to score 6,000 career points**. She did so Sept. 9, 2025, against Chicago at 31 years and 339 days, making her the fourth-youngest player in WNBA history to hit that mark. It was the 370th game of her career, which listed as the 10th fastest in W history. There are now 19 players on that list after **Breanna Stewart** hit 6k on May 8, **Brittney Griner** joined the club on May 30 and **A'ja Wilson** did so June 8. Wilson bumped Loyd to the 5th youngest to the mark.

PAINTING THE TOWN RED

Over the first 29 years of the WNBA, teams finished at or above an average of 40 points in the paint just 14 times, with the **2020 Las Vegas Aces setting the standard of 42.7** points in the paint. And only three seasons saw more than one team hit the 40 PitP mark: **2010** (Atlanta, Phoenix), **2024** (Chicago, Dallas, Seattle) and **2025** (Indiana, Los Angeles).

Currently, **7 teams are scoring at least 40 points in the paint**, with the 40.8 ppg by Las Vegas ranking 5th, **despite a league-high 13.0 from A'ja Wilson, 9.2 from Nalyssa Smith** and 7.1 from Jackie Young.

ROARING 20'S

Over the first 29 seasons in WNBA history, a total of **28 players averaged at least 20 points over the course of a season** (minimum 20 games played), with 3 players poised to add to that list at the end of the season. Fifteen of those 28 had multiple seasons averaging at least 20. Only 5 boast of at least 5 seasons of 20 or more points a game. **A'ja Wilson** is one of them. Unless they suddenly stop scoring, **Breanna Stewart** and Wilson will become just the second and third players over the W's 30-year history with 6 or more 20-point seasons. **Diana Taurasi** sits atop the list, having averaged at least 20 points over 7 different seasons.

Further, Wilson could join **Angel McCoughtry**, Stewart and Taurasi as the only players with four **consecutive seasons** averaging at least 20 points.

Point Gawd **Chelsea Gray**, who is known for her magician-like no-look passes, ranks **6th on the WNBA's career assist chart** with 2,098 assists (**Lindsay Whalen** is No. 5 with 2,348).

Gray also became the 9th player in WNBA history with at least 4,000 points and 1,500 assists, and at the time **was the 4th-fastest to accomplish the feat**, doing so in 332 games (**Skylar Diggins**, 291; **Sue Bird**, 317; **Lindsay Whalen**, 328) before **Alyssa Thomas** did so in 327 games a week later for No. 10, bumping Gray to 5th fastest.

With the win on May 31, **Becky Hammon** became the **second-fastest coach in WNBA history to reach 150 victories**, including playoffs. Hammon coached her 205th game on May 31 and only trails behind **Van Chancellor**, who had win No. 150 in 198 games.

LOOK AT ALL THE PEOPLE HERE TONIGHT

Since 2023, the Aces have been rewriting their home attendance record books, and in 2024 made WNBA history by becoming the first team in the league to sell out 100% of their home games in a season. **The Aces sold out their entire season ticket membership inventory for the 2025 season in August 2024—the earliest any team had ever done so.**

- **The Aces sold out 45 straight home games**, dating from Game 2 of the 2023 WNBA Semifinals (Sept. 26, 2023) through Aug. 21, 2025, which includes games at both Michelob ULTRA Arena and T-Mobile Arena. Including last year's playoff games, the Aces are currently on a **60-game sellout streak at Michelob ULTRA Arena**.
- On July 2, 2024, there were **20,366 in attendance at T-Mobile Arena**, which, at the time, was the fifth-most attended game in WNBA regular season history and the most since 1999.
- The franchise-high 20,366 fans at T-Mobile Arena against Indiana on July 2, 2024, eclipsed the previous regular season record of 17,406, set on Sept. 10, 2023, when the Aces played host to the Mercury.
- Prior to 2025, the top 10 attendance marks for Las Vegas Aces games played at Michelob ULTRA Arena came in 2024.
- After seeing attendance averages hit no higher than 5,606 over their first four seasons in Las Vegas, the Aces upped their average to 9,551 fans per game in 2023, and surpassed that number in 2024 with an average of 11,283 over their 20 regular season home games. The Aces averaged 11,358 in 2025 and **11,720 in 2026**.
- The **Aces sold out of their 2024 season-ticket memberships in early March** and had 7 full sellouts by the third week in April, breaking the Las Vegas record of 6 regular season sellouts set in 2023. The Aces upped that mark and **sold out of their 2025 season-ticket memberships in August 2024**, the earliest for any W team ever.
- The attendance mark of **10,513** against Indiana on July 12, 2026, is the largest crowd ever for an Aces game at Michelob ULTRA Arena.
- The Las Vegas Aces have welcomed **10,000 or more fans at 78 home games** since arriving in the Valley in 2018—3 of which came in 2022, 9 were in 2023, 23 in 2024, 29 in 2025 and **14 (and counting) in 2026**.

Including the July 20 game at Toronto, when her lone free throw attempt came on an and-1, **A'ja Wilson** played just 14 career games, out of then-290, with no more than 1 free throws attempted. Among all-time players, Wilson averages a **second-most 6.8 free throw attempts per game**, trailing just Cynthia Cooper, who averaged 7.0 per game in her career.

Only 6 players in WNBA history **averaged more than 20 points and fewer than 2.0 turnovers over the course of a season**. **A'ja Wilson** has accomplished the feat 4 times (2018, 2020, 2023 and 2024), which ranks 2nd behind **Breanna Stewart** (5).

Elena Delle Donne and **Lauren Jackson** are 3rd with 3 such seasons apiece and Tina Charles (2016) and **Kelsey Mitchell** (2025) have one apiece. Wilson's 26.9 points a game in 2024 tops the chart and her **1.26 turnovers per game ranks No. 4**.

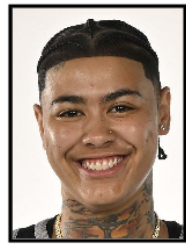
