RETURN FROM THE WORLD CUP

Chelsea Gray and **Jackie Young** returned from the 2026 World Cup in golden style, after having helped the U.S. claim another gold medal. Both players started all 6 games in the USA's undefeated run. Young averaged team second-bests of 12.3 ppg and 3.2 apg, while Gray contributed 5.7 ppg and 2.7 apg. **Steph Talbot** and Australia finished with a 3-2 record and advanced to the quarterfinals as Talbot averaged team-highs of 13.8 ppg, 8.6 rpg, 4.4 apg and 1.4 spg. Playing for Japan, **Mai Yamamoto** averaged 8.0 ppg and 1.8 apg for the team that finished with a 2-2 slate and in 12th place after bowing out in the quarterfinals play-in game.

Young's performance led to a spot on the World Cup All-Star Five and Talbot listed on the All-World Cup second team.

MONEY LINE

Chelsea Gray and **Jackie Young** have been money this season at the free throw line. Gray ranks No. 1 in the league with a 93.7% accuracy and Young is No. 2 at 93.4%. Gray, who has hit 59 of 63 overall, made 25 in a row from June 21-July 20 and Young, who has connected on 127 of 136 this season, made 33 consecutive free throws from June 17-July 22.

1'000 POINT CLUB

A'ja Wilson in 2024 became the first player in WNBA history to score 1'000 points in a single season and owns four of the top seven single-season scoring records in league history. With three games to play, Wilson is 9 points from reaching the mark again this year and her 991 points would rank No. 3 all-time if the season ended today. Additionally, Wilson remains the fastest to 1'000 points, having done so in her first 37 games of 2024.

GET OUT YOUR BROOMS

A'ja Wilson earned all four available Western Conference Player of the Month honors this season and in doing so, became the first WNBA player to sweep in multiple seasons since the award launched in 2010.

Her first season sweep came in the 2020 'wubble' season. The only other players to do so were all Eastern Conference winners, **Tina Charles** in 2016 and **Elena Delle Donne** in 2019.

Wilson has now claimed each of the last 5 and 12 of the last 18 Western Conference Player of the Month awards. Further, Wilson is one shy of the record of 6 consecutive monthly honors she claimed from June 2023 through July 2024.

DIFFERENCE MAKERS

It seems obvious when watching them on the court how **Chelsea Gray**, **A'ja Wilson** and **Jackie Young** impact a game. And stats don't lie. Among players with at least 200 career WNBA games, Young ranks second, Wilson third and Gray seventh for all-time +/-.

2026 BIRTHDAY CURSE?

The Aces are 0-4 on players' birthdays this year, losing to Dallas on June 15 (**Steph Talbot**), Indiana on July 5 (**Brianna Turner**), Chicago on Aug. 1 (**Dana Evans**) and Minnesota on Aug. 8 (**NaLyssa Smith**, **A'ja Wilson**).

The Aces did not play Aug. 22, **Cheyenne Parker-Tyus**' birthday and did not play on Sept. 16, **Jackie Young**'s. However, there are two others whose birthdays could fall on playoff dates for a couple opportunities to break the curse - **Chelsea Gray**, Oct. 8, and **Mai Yamamoto**, Oct. 23.

MOVING UP THE LINE

A'ja Wilson entered the 2026 season ranked No. 21 on the league's all-time scoring list with 5,719 points. She has since passed retired players **Angel McCoughtry** (5,797), **Becky Hammon** (5,841), **Seimone Augustus** (6,005), **Lauren Jackson** (6,007), **Lisa Leslie** (6,263), **Sylvia Fowles** (6,415), **Katie Smith** (6,452) and **Candace Parker** (6,574), and current players **Brittney Griner** and **Jewell Loyd**. She's now **No. 11 with 6,710 points**. No. 10 is **Sue Bird**'s 6,803 points, meaning that Wilson needs 93 more points to break into the top 10.

10TH CENTURY

The Aces have scored at least 100 points 12 times this season, which ranks No. 1 in franchise history, passing the 11 recorded by the 2023 Aces championship squad. It's also the second-most of any team this year to score 100 or more, trailing Indiana's 20.

Additionally, the franchise has a total of 63 games hitting the century mark, all of which were recorded after the move to Las Vegas, which lists second all-time among W franchises, behind the 68 recorded by Phoenix through the years.



TABLE FOR TWO

A'ja Wilson hit yet another set of markers on Aug. 8 -- and was again the youngest and fastest to do so in becoming just the second player in WNBA history with at least **6,500 points, 2,500 rebounds, 700 assists, 300 steals and 500 blocked shots**. **Candace Parker** hit the quintuple milestone in her 403rd career game, and closed her career with 410 games under her belt. Wilson hit the quad milestone in 297 games.

Even more impressive? If you were to remove steals and assists from the equation, the **6,500-point, 2,500-rebound, 500-block club** also features just Parker and Wilson.

The **list stands at 9 when factoring in only 6,500 points and 2,500 rebounds**.

KEEP DROPPIN THOSE DIMES

To say that **Chelsea Gray** and **Jackie Young** have been dishing out passes at a fast clip would be an understatement. Gray's 6.8 apg ranks 4th and Young's 6.6 apg is 5th among league leaders.

Should they keep up their current pace, they would not only finish among the top 5 for single-season assists averaged in franchise history, **they would become the first duo in the W to ever average at least 6 assists a game**. Only once in history have teammates even produced at least 5.5 apg over the course of a season -- **Natasha Cloud** (5.6) and **Kristi Toliver** (6.0) did so in 2019 for Washington.

TOP 10 WINNINGEST IN THE W

Sue Bird leads the WNBA for all-time regular season victories with 333 in her storied career. The top 10 winningest players list includes none other than The Point Guard herself. Winner of 4 WNBA Championships, **Chelsea Gray** has **helped teams win 283 games** throughout her career, which lists No. 9 **among the winningest W players** to ever grace the hardwood. No. 8 is **Tina Thompson**, who won 286 games, who Gray could draw even with should the Aces win out their remaining 3 games.

MILESTONE ACHIEVED NO. 2

On Aug. 1 at Chicago, **Jackie Young** became the 26th player in W history with at least 3,500 points, 1,000 rebounds, 1,000 assists and 300 steals, tying **Tamika Catchings** (272 games) as the **third-fastest to the mark**, and trailing just **Diana Taurasi** (246) and **Candace Parker** (261). Chelsea Gray -- Dropped from shooting 39.7% from 3 before all-star and 30.2% in the 14 games since ... Likewise, her assists dropped from 7.3 apg before the midseason break to 5.8 apg after ... Jewell Loyd on July 3, playing in her 389th career game, became **the 9th player in league history with at least 700 made 3s**. CAN'T TOUCH THIS

Over the course of 30 seasons, there have been 117 different occasions where a player averaged **15 or more shots per game** while playing in at least 20 games--the very definition of a team's go-to offensive player.

Of those 117 instances, **70 shot 45% or worse from the field**. **Only 12 times has a player who has averaged at least 15 attempts per game shot better than 50% from the field**. The only person who has had more than one such season is Wilson, who is well on her way to achieving the accomplishment for a 4th straight year.

This year, there are 7 players who saw action in the bulk of their team's games who are averaging more than 15 FGA per game, only **5 of whom are turning the ball over fewer than 3 times per game** and **just 4 who are shooting 45% or better from the field**. Wilson leads in both attempts per game AND field goal percentage.

Most of the offensive efficiency ratings (OER) and offensive win shares (OWS) listed are above average to good, but there is nothing great about these performances. However, **A'ja Wilson's** OER and OWS **laps the field on the chart**. She has impacted an ungodly amount of her team's possessions, and is doing so at an M'VP level that boggles the mind.

PAINTING THE TOWN RED

Over the first 29 years of the WNBA, teams finished at or above an average of 40 points in the paint just 14 times, with the **2020 Las Vegas Aces setting the standard of 42.7** points in the paint. And only three seasons saw more than one team hit the 40 PitP mark: **2010** (Atlanta, Phoenix), **2024** (Chicago, Dallas, Seattle) and **2025** (Indiana, Los Angeles).

Currently, **5 teams are scoring at least 40 points in the paint**, after the Aces fell below 40 on Aug. 13 and now sit at 39.5, **despite a league-high 12.4 from A'ja Wilson, 9.0 from NaLyssa Smith** and 7.2 from Jackie Young.

Further, the Aces' paint production has dropped since the All-Star break - they were scoring 41.2 in the paint in the 26 games ahead of the midseason classic and **just 36.7 in the 15 games since**.

CAROM CLUB

A'ja Wilson grabbed her 2,500th career rebound at 2:28 in the 3rd quarter of the Aces May 10 win over the Sparks. In doing so, she became the **12th player in WNBA history with at least 5,500 points and 2,500 rebounds**. She was the fastest, 269 games (**Tina Charles**, 301), and youngest at 29 years and 275 days (Charles, 30 years, 184 days). **Breanna Stewart** became No. 13 on May 12 in 295 games, bumping Charles to third fastest

PLAY THAT 45

A'ja Wilson on May 15 against Connecticut became the first person in WNBA history to record **multiple 45-point games**. She previously tied the league single-game record of 53 points against Atlanta on Aug. 22, 2023.

In connecting on 15 of 18 from the field (with 3 boards, 3 assists, 1 steal and 2 blocks), Wilson was the **most efficient of anyone in league history for 40-point games**. She also made an extremely efficient 13 of 13 from the line.

GOOD GAWD!

Point Gawd **Chelsea Gray**, who is known for her magician-like no-look passes, ranks **7th on the WNBA's career assist chart** with 2,140 assists (**Lindsay Whalen** is No. 5 with 2,348).

Gray also became the 9th player in WNBA history with at least 4,000 points and 1,500 assists, and at the time **was the 4th-fastest to accomplish the feat**, doing so in 332 games (**Skylar Diggins**, 291; **Sue Bird**, 317; **Lindsay Whalen**, 328) before **Alyssa Thomas** did so in 327 games a week later for No. 10, bumping Gray to 5th fastest.

NO SUCH THING AS A FREE LUNCH

Normally among the top half of the league's teams in terms of attempts at the charity stripe, and despite scoring almost 40 per game inside the paint, the 2026 Aces are struggling to get to the free throw line, and **currently rank 9th** in the W. You'd have to reach back to 2017 (No. 10, 17.4) to find a franchise team that wasn't in the top half of the league in trips to the line. The previous season low for a franchise team was 16.1 free throws attempted by the 2014 San Antonio Stars.

Jewell Loyd, whose first career point came against Los Angeles on June 6, 2015, became the **16th player in WNBA history to score 6,000 career points**. She did so Sept. 9, 2025, against Chicago at 31 years and 339 days, making her the fourth-youngest player in WNBA history to hit that mark. It was the 370th game of her career, which listed as the 10th fastest in W history. There are now 20 players on that list and when **A'ja Wilson** was added on June 8, she bumped Loyd to the 5th youngest to the mark.

ROARING 20'S

Seventeen of those 28 had multiple seasons averaging at least 20. Only 5 boast of at least 5 seasons of 20 or more points a game. **A'ja Wilson** is one of them.

Breanna Stewart and **Wilson** will become just the second and third players over the W's 30-year history with 6 or more 20-point seasons. **Diana Taurasi** sits atop the list, having averaged at least 20 points over 7 different seasons.

Further, **Wilson** will join **Angel McCoughtry**, **Stewart** and **Taurasi** as the only players with four consecutive seasons averaging at least 20 points.

LOOK AT ALL THE PEOPLE HERE TONIGHT

Since 2023, the Aces have been rewriting their home attendance record books, and in 2024 made WNBA history by becoming the first team in the league to sell out 100% of their home games in a season. **The Aces sold out their entire season ticket membership inventory for the 2025 season in August 2024—the earliest any team had ever done so.**

- **The Aces sold out 45 straight home games**, dating from Game 2 of the 2023 WNBA Semifinals (Sept. 26, 2023) through Aug. 21, 2025, which includes games at both Michelob ULTRA Arena and T-Mobile Arena. Including last year's playoff games, the Aces are currently on a **66-game sellout streak at Michelob ULTRA Arena**.
- On July 2, 2024, there were **20,366 in attendance at T-Mobile Arena**, which, at the time, was the fifth-most attended game in WNBA regular season history and the most since 1999.
- The franchise-high 20,366 fans at T-Mobile Arena against Indiana on July 2, 2024, eclipsed the previous regular season record of 17,406, set on Sept. 10, 2023, when the Aces played host to the Mercury.
- After seeing attendance averages hit no higher than 5,606 over their first four seasons in Las Vegas, the Aces upped their average to 9,551 fans per game in 2023, and surpassed that number in 2024 with an average of 11,283 over their 20 regular season home games. The Aces averaged 11,358 in 2025 and **11,294 in 2026**.
- **The Aces sold out of their 2024 season-ticket memberships in early March** and had 7 full sellouts by the third week in April, breaking the Las Vegas record of 6 regular season sellouts set in 2023. The Aces upped that mark and **sold out of their 2025 season-ticket memberships in August 2024**, the earliest for any W team ever.
- The attendance mark of **10,513** against Indiana on July 12, 2026, is the largest crowd ever for an Aces game at Michelob ULTRA Arena.
- The Las Vegas Aces have welcomed **10,000 or more fans at 84 home games** since arriving in the Valley in 2018—3 of which came in 2022, 9 were in 2023, 23 in 2024, 29 in 2025 and **20 (and counting) in 2026**.

Having won the second-most games in league history before turning 25 and shattering the record for most wins before turning 26, Jackie Young last season set a new standard for W victories before 27 with 145.

Heading into 2025, Maya Moore held the record for wins (164) before turning 28. Young passed that on Aug. 13 and upped the ante to 176.

After tying Moore's former record of 185 victories before age 29 on June 11, Young moved alone in the top spot on June 13 and owns the record of 203 victories before her 29th birthday on September 16.

On Aug. 25, 2025, against Chicago, Chelsea Gray notched her 250th WNBA victory and Jewell Loyd reached her 200th. Gray became the 15th player with at least 250 career wins and Loyd was the 49th to 200. On June 28, 2026, also against Chicago, A'ja Wilson joined the 200-win club and became the 56th WNBA player to the double century victory mark.

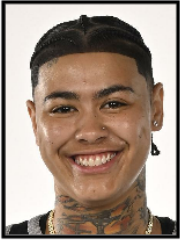
