The Sparks take on the Tulsa Shock for the second home game in the second of five nights in Los Angeles on Friday, July 3 at STAPLES Center. The Western Conference leafer, Tulsa travels to Los Angeles without guard Skylar Diggins who did not make the trip due to a knee injury. This is the first of five meetings between the two teams this season. Since moving to Tulsa in 2010, the Shock has battled the Sparks 22 times. Of those meetings, 16 have been decided by 10 points or less, including four overtime decisions - all won by the Sparks. The last win against Tulsa was on June 28, 2014 in an overtime victory on the road. The Sparks recovered in overtime with a Toliver three and a pair of free-throws after giving up a 15-point lead in the second half.

## SPARK PLUGS

### EQUITRUST THE SPARKS

On May 21, the Sparks announced EquiTrust as the marquee sponsor for the 2015 season. Under the agreement, the EquiTrust logo will appear on all Sparks home and road jerseys, throughout STAPLES Center on Sparks home game days, on the step and repeat backdrop, across all social and digital platforms and as the driving force behind the new charitable leadership youth program, Driven2Hoop.

With its announcement, the Sparks are now the eighth team in the WNBA to have a marquee partnership.

### FOURTH OF JULY WEEKEND

Los Angeles begins the month of July with its first back-to-back pair of home games featuring the San Antonio Stars (7/2) and Tulsa Shock (7/3). The Sparks conclude its three-game home stand against the Phoenix Mercury (7/5).

The Stars are averaging 67.0 points with an 0-3 record on the road. The Sparks are 38-29 all-time against the Stars, home record of 23-11. In the following day, the number one seed Tulsa Shock take on the Sparks for its first of five meetings this season. This season, Tulsa ranks top five in points, rebounds, offensive rebounds and three-point percentage with a WNBA best 8-1 record. The Phoenix Mercury cap off the weekend bringing WNBA All-Star center Brittney Griner to STAPLES Center. Griner scored 14 points, grabbed 11 rebounds and blocked two shots in her season debut at Minnesota (6/27) since missing seven games due to suspension.

### AT THE HELM

Entering Thursday's contest, San Antonio's head coach Dan Hughes holds the record for most games coached in WNBA history (464). Hughes is second all-time for most WNBA wins as a coach (224-240, .483). Four spots below is Sparks head coach Brian Agler. He ranks sixth all-time for the most wins (184-176, .511) in WNBA history. Agler has 360 career WNBA games under his belt through seven games this season and is six wins shy of typing with Atlanta Dream head coach, Michael Cooper, who ranks fifth with 296 career WNBA games.

### SAN ANTONIO/LOS ANGELES CONNECTIONS

Sparks head coach Brian Agler reunites with San Antonio's head coach Dan Hughes as the two worked together in San Antonio for the former Silver Stars. An assistant coach to Dan Hughes, Brian Agler completed his third season with the Silver Stars in 2007 where he helped San Antonio to its first playoff berth since the franchise relocated from Utah in 2003. Agler left San Antonio to lead the charge as Seattle's head coach for seven seasons before joining Los Angeles this season.

### (UN)LUCKY NUMBER 7

In the loss at New York (6/28) Los Angeles tied its franchise record for most consecutive losses in a single season (7). The last time the Sparks lost seven straight was in 2007, spanning from June 29 - July 17. The 0-7 start is the worst start in franchise history for Los Angeles, the previous winless record to start the season was 0-3 in 2010.

### 30 FOR 30

Sparks guard Kristi Toliver returned from her EuroBasket stint and made her season debut at New York (6/28). In her first game back this season, Toliver set a career-high 30 points (9-15 FG, 3-5 3FG, 9-9 FT) in 36 minutes played. It was the first 30-point performance by a Sparks this season. Toliver became only the seventh player in franchise history to record a 30-point game.

### PUT THE TEAM ON MY BACK

Kristi Toliver's 30-point performance contributed to the Sparks' overall 70 points in the loss at New York (6/28). Through 36 minutes played, Toliver scored 42.8% of the Sparks points, only one player in the league this season has done that feat, Chicago Sky's Elena Delle Donne. In her first game this season, Toliver went 9-of-15 from the field while going 3-of-5 from behind the arc and a perfect 9-of-9 from the charity stripe. It was the most attempted free-throws in a single-game by a Sparks player this season. The last time a Sparks scored at least 40.0% of the team's points was Toliver herself last season on August 12, 2014 at Minnesota which she had 29 of the Sparks' 71 points (Toliver's 29 pts - 40.8% of the team's total points).



## SPARK PLUGS

### JOHNSON LEAVING HER MARK

In the Sparks final game of the three-game road trip, Johnson set another career mark when she stepped on the court and played 31 minutes marking her 300th career game. As she finished up the three-game road trip at New York (6/28), Johnson then accomplished another high mark in her career. In the loss at New York, Johnson tallied 1305 total career assists surpassing the 1300th assist milestone. She currently ranks 10th all-time in assists (1305), only 32 assists behind former Charlotte Sting/Houston Comet Dawn Staley (1337). Earlier in the season, Johnson became the first Sparks player in franchise history to record a back-to-back double-double in points and assists.

### STARTED FROM THE BOTTOM

Through seven games, Sparks guard Temeka Johnson currently leads the WNBA in assists per game (6.4). Johnson started the season coming off the bench, but in the last four games as a starter, she is averaging 10.0 ppg, 7.5 apg compared to off-the-bench when she averaged 3.7 ppg and 5.0 apg. In New York (6/28) Johnson recorded her 1300th career assist in her 300th career game played. Johnson recorded a back-to-back double-double performance in points and assists this season, first in franchise history. In the first meeting against Connecticut (6/21), Johnson earned her first start of the year recording 15 points and 10 assists, both previous season-highs. In the following game at Washington (6/23), Johnson set a new season-high 17 points and tied a season-high 10 assists.

### STAT LINE OF THE WEEK: MINUTE MADE!

Through three games played, Nneka is leading the team in minutes (38.8 mpg) since returning from an early season ankle injury with improving number game-to-game. Ogwumike is averaging near double-double numbers with 12.7 points and 9.7 rebounds per game. She had a breakout performance on the boards in New York where she pulled in 16 total rebounds, 14 defensive. Ogwumike's 16 was a season-high for herself and the team overall, while her 14 defensive rebounds became a career-high.

### LET JAN-TEL THE WAY

In her role this season, Lavender has emerged a leader and a dominant force for the Sparks. Through seven games played and started, she leads the team in rebounds (10.1 rpg) and blocks (0.5 bpg), and is second-best in points (15.0 mpg) and minutes played (36.2 mpg). Lavender is the ONLY player in the league to average a double-double AND holds the team's individual highs in offensive rebounds (4, twice) and blocks (3, at WAS 6/23). In all seven games, Lavender has scored in double-figures. At Connecticut (6/26), she earned her fourth double-double of the season.

### NEXT FIVE UP

In Sunday's loss at New York (6/28) Sparks head coach Brian Agler had a different starting five for the seventh consecutive game, 10 different players. With the continued injury woes, the Sparks found revival with the return of veteran guard Kristi Toliver. In the last three games, the starting five has averaged 60.0 points compared to the first four starting lineups of the season with 47.25 points per game. Overall, the Sparks have eclipsed the 70-point mark against its opponents in its last three games. Through the first four games, the Sparks single-game team-high in scoring was 68 points against Connecticut (6/21). In those four games, Los Angeles averaged 58.8 points per game. In the last three games, the team has averaged 75.3 points - league leader Chicago Sky (85.4 ppg, through 10 games).

### OT IN CT

The Sparks went into its first overtime game of the season at Connecticut (6/23) losing 80-76 (OT), its second consecutive game decided by five points or less. The last time Los Angeles faced Connecticut in overtime was on June 13, 2008 at STAPLES Center when the Sparks won 98-93 (OT). Including this overtime loss, the Sparks own a 30-19 winning record in games played in overtime. The Sparks finished the 2015 season-series 0-2 against Connecticut, its first winless series against the Sun since the 2011 season. The last time the Sparks lost on the road to the Sun was on 6/28/11, 79-76.

### EIGHT IS ENOUGH

The Sparks have been plagued with injury frustrations that began in the preseason with Nneka Ogwumike's injury and has since seen injuries to guard/forward Alana Beard, Erin Phillips, Farhiya Abdi and most recently, Andrea Hoover. Both Hoover and Abdi are listed day-to-day as the team restructures game-to-game. While Nneka returned at Washington (6/23) the Sparks are still left with eight dressed players. Despite the short bench, the team leads the league in holding opponents to only 30.86 rebounds per game, while ranking sixth in rebounds (33.29 rpg) and assists (15.71 apg). In addition, the Sparks rank third in the league in free-throw percentage (.825) and fourth in defensive rebounds per game (25.86).

### CAN I GET A DOUBLE-DOUBLE

Sparks forward/center Jantel Lavender has already tallied four double-doubles over seven games this season, ranking second below Chicago's Elena Delle Donne among all players in the league in most double-doubles (pts-rebs) in 2015. While tallying four double-doubles, she is the ONLY WNBA player averaging a double-double, with 15.0 ppg and 10.1 rpg through seven games played

### BACK-TO-BACK FRANCHISE RECORD

In the games against Connecticut (6/21) and at Washington (6/23), Sparks guard Temeka Johnson recorded two consecutive point-assist double-doubles. Johnson is the first player in franchise history to record a double-double in points and assists in two consecutive games. The only Sparks player ever to near a back-to-back 10-point and 10-assist performance is current Sparks EVP/GM Penny Toler. During her 1998 Sparks season, Toler recorded an 11-point and 14 assist game against former WNBA team Utah Starzz (8/14/98), and in the following game recorded 15 points and nine assists against former WNBA team Detroit Shock (8/16/98).

### ROOKIES CAN PLAY TOO

Forward Marianna Tolo has started six of seven games this season, marking the first Sparks player to do so since Nneka Ogumike in 2012. Tolo's starting role rank her among WNBA rookie leaders in rebounds per game, field goal percentage and minutes played per game.

### A HELPING HAND TO 400

Sparks guard Erin Phillips has filled the stat sheet in the first three games of the season earning multiple 10+ point, 5+ assist and 5+ rebound performances. Phillips has contributed defensively recording a total of three steals and one block in the three games. In the last game, Phillips recorded four assists surpassing 400 career assists in 188 games played rounding out her total to 401. The seven year pro is averaging nine points, four rebounds and five assists in 2015, a stat line that supercedes her career numbers of 6.6 ppg, 2.4 rpg and 2.1 apg.

### ACHIEVEMENT UNLOCKED

Veteran Sparks guard/forward Alana Beard began the 2015 season eclipsing 4,000 total career points on a jump shot against Seattle (6/6). The 11-year pro out of Duke enters her 12th WNBA season ranked 23rd among league scoring leaders with 4013 points through 293 games played. Starting her fourth season with LA, 885 of those total points were netted as a Spark. As she continues to climb the scoring charts, she will need 225 points to surpass Yolanda Griffith to move into the 22nd spot.

### AUSSIE DUO

The Sparks tipped-off the 2015 season at KeyArena, with the country of Australia cheering on Australian natives and Sparks guard Erin Phillips and rookie center Marianna Tolo. The last time two Australians started as teammates in the regular season was Phoenix Mercury's Belinda Snell and Penny Taylor on June 30, 2007 against Houston. What's remarkable about this stat is that Phillips and fellow Aussie, Penny Taylor, both played for the WNBA Champion Phoenix Mercury last season. Despite Phillips ten starts and Taylor's 24, the two NEVER started one game together. In addition to Saturday night's contest, the Storm debuted an Australian duo in Jenny O'Hea and Abby Bishop for the first time to go up against Phillips and Tolo - four Australians to start in the same WNBA game. For the Sparks, the Aussie duo can repeat history once again as the last time Australians started together in the postseason was Detroit's Carla Boyd and Sandy Brondello on August 24, 1999 against Charlotte.

## **Head Coach Brian Agler 1st Season**

On January 5, 2015, Brian Agler joined the Los Angeles Sparks as the 12th head coach in franchise history, bringing with him over 30 years of head-coaching experience, including 11 in the WNBA.

Agler comes to the Sparks from Seattle, where he led the Storm to six consecutive playoff appearances (2008-2013) in seven years. He compiled a 136-102 (.571) record during his time in the Pacific Northwest, including his 212th career (WNBA and ABL) victory in 2012. The win on June 1 against the Tulsa Shock moved him past Van Chancellor (211), former coach of the Houston Comets, to become the all-time winningest coach in women's professional basketball history. Agler won 78 games in the ABL and now has 184 WNBA wins (262 total).

In 2010 the Storm captured the league's championship title, its second, with an impressive regular season record of 28-6 and an undefeated playoff record of 7-0. Additionally, Coach Agler was recognized as the WNBA's Coach of the Year. Prior to joining the Storm in 2008, Agler was the head coach and general manager of the expansion team Minnesota Lynx from 1999-2002, where he compiled a 42-54 (.438) record. Before being named the first coach of the expansion Lynx, Agler served as the head coach of the Columbus Quest of the ABL from 1996-1999, compiling an 82-22 record. He led the Quest to back-to-back ABL championships in 1997 and 1998 and was named the ABL Coach of the Year for the 1996-97 season.

Agler completed his third season as an assistant coach for the San Antonio Silver Stars in 2007. Prior to joining San Antonio, he served as an assistant coach with the Phoenix Mercury in 2004 and helped guide the team to a 17-17 record after the Mercury finished with an 8-26 record in 2003.

Agler spent 15 seasons coaching among the collegiate ranks, including 13 seasons as a head coach. He posted an impressive collegiate record of 248-135 (.648 winning percentage). From 1993-96 he served as the head women's basketball coach at Kansas State. In 1998, Agler took over as the head women's coach at the University of Missouri-Kansas City. In five seasons at UMKC, Agler was 85-54 and took the Kangaroos from a 9-16 record in 1988-89 to four straight winning seasons with 17 or more victories. Under his direction, UMKC led the NCAA in scoring defense three consecutive seasons from 1990-93. In 1991, UMKC set an NCAA record, allowing 51.8 points per game.

As the head women's basketball coach at Northeast Oklahoma A&M Junior College from 1984-88, Agler compiled a 124-42 record (.747 winning percentage). In 1985-86, NEO A&M was ranked second nationally and posted a 30-2 record.

Agler attended Wittenberg University in Springfield, Ohio, where he starred on the basketball team for four seasons. He led the Tigers to their only NCAA Division III Championship in basketball as a freshman. He started all 112 games during his college career, leaving the school as the all-time assist leader (481). Agler helped lead his team to a 91-21 record during his four years with the Tigers, and was named most valuable player in the Ohio Athletic Conference and first-team All-America as a senior. In 1995, he was inducted into the Wittenberg Hall of Honor.

In 1980, Agler graduated with a degree in special education and physical education. He received his master's degree in education from Pittsburg State University (Pittsburg, Kansas) in 1985. Agler and his wife Robin, have one son, Bryce, and one daughter, Taylor.
