The Sparks cap off the fourth of July weekend against the reigning WNBA Champions Phoenix Mercury on Sunday, July 5 at STAPLES Center. This is the first of four meetings between the two teams this season. The Mercury and its returning center Brittney Griner reunite with former Phoenix guard, Sparks Erin Phillips after sweeping Los Angeles 0-5 in the 2014 season-series. As a Mercury, Phillips led the WNBA in three-point percentage (.449, min. 35 made). In the last win against Phoenix (9/15/13), all five Sparks starters scored in double-figures while 10 out of 11 Sparks players recorded at least one basket. In the game, Los Angeles held Phoenix to 34.5% shooting with no Mercury player scoring in double-figures.

SPARK PLUGS

EQUITRUST THE SPARKS

On May 21, the Sparks announced EquiTrust as the marquee sponsor for the 2015 season. Under the agreement, the EquiTrust logo will appear on all Sparks home and road jerseys, throughout STAPLES Center on Sparks home game days, on the step and repeat backdrop, across all social and digital platforms and as the driving force behind the new charitable leadership youth program, Driven2Hoop.

With its announcement, the Sparks are now the eighth team in the WNBA to have a marquee partnership.

FOURTH OF JULY WEEKEND

Los Angeles begins the month of July with its first back-to-back pair of home games featuring the San Antonio Stars (7/2) and Tulsa Shock (7/3). The Sparks conclude its three-game home stand against the Phoenix Mercury (7/5).

In tonight's game, the Tulsa Shock visit Los Angeles without its leading scorer Skylar Diggins as she was ruled out for the season due to a recent injury. This season, Tulsa ranks top five in points, rebounds, offensive rebounds and three-point percentage with a WNBA record 8-3, second-best in the Western Conference. On Sunday, the Phoenix Mercury cap off the weekend bringing WNBA All-Star center Brittney Griner to STAPLES Center. Griner scored 14 points, grabbed 11 rebounds and blocked two shots in her season debut at Minnesota (6/27) since missing seven games due to suspension.

WIN, WIN, WIN NO MATTER WHAT

The Los Angeles Sparks began the season 0-7, its worst start in franchise history. Much of the trouble came from a depleted bench due to injury and player absence. The Sparks ended its losing streak with an 86-81 win against San Antonio (7/2) with three Sparks players scoring in double-figures and two of them with 20+ points. Los Angeles shot 50.0% from the field, went 21-of-23 from the free-throw line and tied its lowest turnover performance of the season with 10. The Sparks outmatched the Stars in the paint scoring 50 points down low to the San Antonio's 42, including 12 second chance points to six. Overall, the Sparks were trailing the Stars through three quarters, but were able to close out its opponent for the first time this season setting season team-highs in points in the fourth quarter (26), second half (48) and overall game (86) to give coach Agler his first win with the Sparks.

BIRTHDAY CELEBRATION

Nneka Ogumike and Marianna Tolo celebrated their birthday the right way on Thursday night with an 86-81 win over San Antonio (7/2), the Sparks first victory of the season. In the win, Ogumike recorded a season-high/game-high 27 points (11-20 FG) with eight rebounds, two assists and a season-high two steals in 33 minutes played. Tolo contributed six points (4-6 FT), with a couple free-throws and a layup coming in the closing minutes of the fourth quarter.

RACK EM UP

Temeka Johnson added another milestone to her long list achieved in 2015, reaching 2502 total career points in 301 games played in the win against San Antonio (7/2). In the fourth quarter, Johnson hit a three-pointer from the right wing surpassing the 2500 career point mark for the 11 year veteran. In the game prior to San Antonio (at NYL, 6/28), Johnson set another career mark when she stepped on the court at Madison Square Garden and played 31 minutes marking her 300th career game. As she finished up the three-game road trip at New York (6/28), Johnson then accomplished another high mark in her career. Johnson tallied 1305 total career assists surpassing the 1300th assist milestone. She currently ranks 10th all-time in assists (1310), only 27 assists behind former Charlotte Sting/Houston Comet Dawn Staley (1337). Earlier in the season, Johnson became the first Sparks player in franchise history to record back-to-back games with a double-double in points and assists (15pts, 10 asts - vs Connecticut (6/21); 17pts, 10asts - at Washington (6/23).

RETURN OF THE GUARDS

Sparks guards Erin Phillips and Kristi Toliver returned to STAPLES Center helping the Sparks win its first game of the 2015 season. In the Sparks 86-81 victory, Phillips and Toliver combined for 22 points (5-5 FT), five assists and three steals. Phillips had missed the last four games due to right knee sprain injury before returning to the starting lineup against San Antonio (7/2). Phillips did not travel with the team on its last road trip, but Toliver made her season debut at New York (6/28) after completing her international play. Toliver returned to the WNBA court pouring in a career-high 30 points in 36 minutes.

SPARK PLUGS

SHOCKING RESEMBLANCE

Last season, the Sparks averaged 84.0 points (.485 FG), 31.8 rebounds and 17.5 assists against the Tulsa Shock in the four game season-series. The two teams split its season-series (2-2) with the Sparks winning a game at home and on the road, and the Shock doing the same. The Shock averaged similar numbers of 82.8 points, 36.0 rebounds and 16.3 assists through the four games. Each team had three players averaging in double-figure scoring with Sparks forward Candace Parker and Shock guard Skylar Diggins leading their respective team with 21.3 points per game. This Friday, the two teams will meet without its 2014 season-series leading scorers, Diggins and Parker. Diggins recently suffered a season-ending injury while Parker is resting from international competition.

LAIN LACY

Sparks forward Jennifer Lacy joined Los Angeles in 2015 after coming from a five season stint with the Tulsa Shock. In 150 games played for the Shock, Lacy averaged 5.6 points (.347 3FG), 2.2 rebounds, 0.7 assists and 16.2 minutes per game. Through eight games this season, Lacy is averaging 6.3 points (.308 3FG), 3.1 rebounds, 0.7 assists in 24.5 minutes per game. Lacy's numbers as a Sparks player is an improvement of her overall career of 5.0 points, 2.3 rebounds, 0.6 assists in 15.2 minutes per game. Her arrival to Los Angeles was welcomed with open arms by her father, former Major League Baseball Champion Los Angeles Dodgers Lee Lacy. In Los Angeles fashion, the Sparks attended a Dodgers game with Jennifer Lacy participating in the ceremonial opening pitch with her father Lee Lacy in attendance.

ONE FOR RECORD BOOKS

Sparks head coach Brian Agler became the all-time winningest coach in women's professional basketball history with the win on June 1, 2012 against the Tulsa Shock. Coach Agler led his former team the Seattle Storm to a 76-58 victory over the Tulsa Shock (6/1/12) earning his 212th career win, passing former Houston Comets head coach Van Chancellor (211 wins). With the 2015 season underway, Agler owns a career total of 263 wins, 78 wins in the ABL and 185 wins in the WNBA.

NNEKA IS ELECTRIC

Through the four games against Tulsa in 2014, Ogwumike averaged 19 points, 6.3 rebounds in 29 minutes played per game. In the last meeting against the Tulsa Shock (8/5/14), Sparks forward Nneka Ogwumike had a breakout performance in STAPLES Center setting career-highs in points (35), field goals made (12) and free-throws made (11). Oguwmike set another career-high against Tulsa on August 2, 2013, recording four blocked shots to go along with 17 points and a game-high 11 rebounds. In her three seasons in the WNBA, Ogwumike averages 14.1 points, 5.9 rebounds, 1.0 assists and 1.14 blocks per game through 14 games against the Tulsa Shock.

(UN)LUCKY NUMBER 7

In the loss at New York (6/28) Los Angeles tied its franchise record for most consecutive losses in a single season (7). The last time the Sparks lost seven straight was in 2007, spanning from June 29 - July 17. The 0-7 start is the worst start in franchise history for Los Angeles, the previous winless record to start the season was 0-3 in 2010.

30 FOR 30

Sparks guard Kristi Toliver returned from her EuroBasket stint and made her season debut at New York (6/28). In her first game back this season, Toliver set a career-high 30 points (9-15 FG, 3-5 3FG, 9-9 FT) in 36 minutes played. It was the first 30-point performance by a Sparks this season. Toliver became only the seventh player in franchise history to record a 30-point game.

PUT THE TEAM ON MY BACK

Kristi Toliver's 30-point performance contributed to the Sparks' overall 70 points in the loss at New York (6/28). Through 36 minutes played, Toliver scored 42.8% of the Sparks points, only one player in the league this season has done that feat, Chicago Sky's Elena Delle Donne. In her first game this season, Toliver went 9-of-15 from the field while going 3-of-5 from behind the arc and a perfect 9-of-9 from the charity stripe. It was the most attempted free-throws in a single-game by a Sparks player this season. The last time a Sparks scored at least 40.0% of the team's points was Toliver herself last season on August 12, 2014 at Minnesota which she had 29 of the Sparks' 71 points (Toliver's 29 pts - 40.8% of the team's total points).

STARTED FROM THE BOTTOM

Through eight games, Sparks guard Temeka Johnson currently leads the WNBA in assists per game (6.3). Johnson started the season coming off the bench, but in the last five games as a starter, she is averaging 9.0 ppg, 7.0 apg compared to off-the-bench when she averaged 3.7 ppg and 5.0 apg. In New York (6/28) Johnson recorded her 1300th career assist in her 300th career game played. Johnson recorded a back-to-back double-double performance in points and assists this season, first in franchise history. In the first meeting against Connecticut (6/21), Johnson earned her first start of the year recording 15 points and 10 assists, both previous season-highs. In the following game at Washington (6/23), Johnson set a new season-high 17 points and tied a season-high 10 assists.

STAT LINE OF THE WEEK: MINUTE MADE!

Through four games played, Nneka is leading the team in minutes (37.5 mpg) since returning from an early season ankle injury with improving number game-to-game. Ogwumike is averaging near double-double numbers with 16.3 points and 9.3 rebounds per game. Ogwumike earned a season-high 27 points to lead the Sparks to its first win of the season (vs SAN, 7/2). It was her first 20+ point performance of the season. She had a breakout performance on the boards in New York where she pulled in 16 total rebounds, 14 defensive. Ogwumike's 16 was a season-high for herself and the team overall, while her 14 defensive rebounds became a career-high.

SPARK PLUGS

LET JAN-TEL THE WAY

In her role this season, Lavender has emerged a leader and a dominant force for the Sparks. Through eight games played and started, she leads the team in rebounds (10.1 rpg) and is third-best in points (15.8 mpg) and minutes played (35.9 mpg). Lavender is the ONLY player in the league to average a double-double AND holds the team's individual highs in offensive rebounds (4, twice) and blocks (3, at WAS 6/23). In all eight games, Lavender has scored in double-figures. Against San Antonio (7/2), she earned her fifth double-double of the season.

OT IN CT

The Sparks went into its first overtime game of the season at Connecticut (6/23) losing 80-76 (OT), its second consecutive game decided by five points or less. The last time Los Angeles faced Connecticut in overtime was on June 13, 2008 at STAPLES Center when the Sparks won 98-93 (OT). Including this overtime loss, the Sparks own a 30-19 winning record in games played in overtime. The Sparks finished the 2015 season-series 0-2 against Connecticut, its first winless series against the Sun since the 2011 season. The last time the Sparks lost on the road to the Sun was on 6/28/11, 79-76.

CAN I GET A DOUBLE-DOUBLE

Sparks forward/center Jantel Lavender has already tallied five double-doubles over eight games this season, ranking first, tying with Chicago's Elena Delle Donne among all players in the league in most double-doubles (pts-rebs) in 2015. While tallying five double-doubles, she is the ONLY WNBA player averaging a double-double, with 15.8 ppg and 10.1 rpg through eight games played

BACK-TO-BACK FRANCHISE RECORD

In the games against Connecticut (6/21) and at Washington (6/23), Sparks guard Temeka Johnson recorded two consecutive point-assist double-doubles. SECOND CHANCES

The Los Angeles Sparks shutout the Washington Mystics in the second-chance category with an 11-0 points scored advantage in the loss (6/23). Much of that contribution came from the battle of the boards with the Sparks grabbing 11 offensive rebounds to the Mystics five. Five Sparks had two or more offensive boards including a game-high three offensive rebounds by Jennifer Lacy.

A HELPING HAND TO 400

Sparks guard Erin Phillips has filled the stat sheet in the first three games of the season earning multiple 10+ point, 5+ assist and 5+ rebound performances. Phillips has contributed defensively recording a total of three steals and one block in the three games. In the last game, Phillips recorded four assists surpassing 400 career assists in 188 games played rounding out her total to 401. The seven year pro is averaging nine points, four rebounds and five assists in 2015, a stat line that supercedes her career numbers of 6.6 ppg, 2.4 rpg and 2.1 apg.

ACHIEVEMENT UNLOCKED

Veteran Sparks guard/forward Alana Beard began the 2015 season eclipsing 4,000 total career points on a jump shot against Seattle (6/6). The 11-year pro out of Duke enters her 12th WNBA season ranked 23rd among league scoring leaders with 4013 points through 293 games played. Starting her fourth season with LA, 885 of those total points were netted as a Spark. As she continues to climb the scoring charts, she will need 225 points to surpass Yolanda Griffith to move into the 22nd spot.

The Sparks tipped-off the 2015 season at KeyArena, with the country of Australia cheering on Australian natives and Sparks guard Erin Phillips and rookie center Marianna Tolo. The last time two Australians started as teammates in the regular season was Phoenix Mercury's Belinda Snell and Penny Taylor on June 30, 2007 against Houston. What's remarkable about this stat is that Phillips and fellow Aussie, Penny Taylor, both played for the WNBA Champion Phoenix Mercury last season. Despite Phillips ten starts and Taylor's 24, the two NEVER started one game together. In addition to Saturday night's contest, the Storm debuted an Australian duo in Jenny O'Hea and Abby Bishop for the first time to go up against Phillips and Tolo - four Australians to start in the same WNBA game. For the Sparks, the Aussie duo can repeat history once again as the last time Australians started together in the postseason was Detroit's Carla Boyd and Sandy Brondello on August 24, 1999 against Charlotte.

Head Coach Brian Agler 1st Season

On January 5, 2015, Brian Agler joined the Los Angeles Sparks as the 12th head coach in franchise history, bringing with him over 30 years of head-coaching experience, including 11 in the WNBA.

Agler comes to the Sparks from Seattle, where he led the Storm to six consecutive playoff appearances (2008-2013) in seven years. He compiled a 136-102 (.571) record during his time in the Pacific Northwest, including his 212th career (WNBA and ABL) victory in 2012. The win on June 1 against the Tulsa Shock moved him past Van Chancellor (211), former coach of the Houston Comets, to become the all-time winningest coach in women's professional basketball history. Agler won 78 games in the ABL and now has 184 WNBA wins (262 total).

In 2010 the Storm captured the league's championship title, its second, with an impressive regular season record of 28-6 and an undefeated playoff record of 7-0. Additionally, Coach Agler was recognized as the WNBA's Coach of the Year. Prior to joining the Storm in 2008, Agler was the head coach and general manager of the expansion team Minnesota Lynx from 1999-2002, where he compiled a 42-54 (.438) record. Before being named the first coach of the expansion Lynx, Agler served as the head coach of the Columbus Quest of the ABL from 1996-1999, compiling an 82-22 record. He led the Quest to back-to-back ABL championships in 1997 and 1998 and was named the ABL Coach of the Year for the 1996-97 season.

Agler completed his third season as an assistant coach for the San Antonio Silver Stars in 2007. Prior to joining San Antonio, he served as an assistant coach with the Phoenix Mercury in 2004 and helped guide the team to a 17-17 record after the Mercury finished with an 8-26 record in 2003.

Agler spent 15 seasons coaching among the collegiate ranks, including 13 seasons as a head coach. He posted an impressive collegiate record of 248-135 (.648 winning percentage). From 1993-96 he served as the head women's basketball coach at Kansas State. In 1998, Agler took over as the head women's coach at the University of Missouri-Kansas City. In five seasons at UMKC, Agler was 85-54 and took the Kangaroos from a 9-16 record in 1988-89 to four straight winning seasons with 17 or more victories. Under his direction, UMKC led the NCAA in scoring defense three consecutive seasons from 1990-93. In 1991, UMKC set an NCAA record, allowing 51.8 points per game.

As the head women's basketball coach at Northeast Oklahoma A&M Junior College from 1984-88, Agler compiled a 124-42 record (.747 winning percentage). In 1985-86, NEO A&M was ranked second nationally and posted a 30-2 record.

Agler attended Wittenberg University in Springfield, Ohio, where he starred on the basketball team for four seasons. He led the Tigers to their only NCAA Division III Championship in basketball as a freshman. He started all 112 games during his college career, leaving the school as the all-time assist leader (481). Agler helped lead his team to a 91-21 record during his four years with the Tigers, and was named most valuable player in the Ohio Athletic Conference and first-team All-America as a senior. In 1995, he was inducted into the Wittenberg Hall of Honor.

In 1980, Agler graduated with a degree in special education and physical education. He received his master's degree in education from Pittsburg State University (Pittsburg, Kansas) in 1985. Agler and his wife Robin, have one son, Bryce, and one daughter, Taylor.

Guard Temeka Johnson reached 2500 total career points, surpassing the mark on a three-pointer in the fourth quarter to give her a total of 2502 career points. The Stars were without center Jayne Appel and forward Alex Montgomery, giving rookie forward Dearica Hamby ample playing time notching a team-high 19 points with eight rebounds and one assist.
