HIGHLIGHTS

- Largest Lead: **Los Angeles: 21 Tulsa: 2**
- The Los Angeles Sparks clinched the final playoff spot in the western conference after defeating the Tulsa Shock, 92-73. The appearance will be the Sparks 15th postseason appearance in franchise history – most by a team in WNBA history
- Including tonight's win, the Sparks end with a 9-8 home record. It's the 15th season in franchise history that Los Angeles has ended with a home record above .500. Last season, the Sparks were 7-10 at STAPLES Center
- The Sparks extended its win streak to three consecutive games while the Shock ended a six-game win streak that dated back to August 15
- Los Angeles went 3-0 at home against Tulsa this season, capping the overall 2015 series versus Tulsa, 3-2. The last time the Sparks won a season-series over the Shock was in 2013, 4-1 (2-0 at home)
- It was the first time this season Los Angeles had scored at least 20 points or more in each quarter against an opponent. It was also the fourth time this season Los Angeles scored at least 90 points or more against its opponent.
- The Sparks outscored the Shock in the paint, 50-26, the second time this season Los Angeles has outscored Tulsa in the paint by a margin of 20 points or more
- Los Angeles shot new season-highs in field goal percentage (60.7) and three-point field goal percentage (54.5). It's the ninth time this season the Sparks have shot over 50 percent from the field and the fourth time it has shot over 50 percent from beyond the arc
- The Sparks set a new season-high for first half points with 49, with a buzzer-beater three-pointer from forward Candace Parker
- The Shock outscored the Sparks in bench points, 16 to 6. The Shock's bench outscored the Sparks reserves in all five games of the 2015 season-series against Los Angeles
- This was the second consecutive game in which Parker and forward Nneka Ogumike each scored 20-plus points (Parker – 33, Ogumike – 26). The Sparks are now 5-1 this season when at least two or more players each score 20 points or more. The two combined for a total of 59 points, more points scored than Tulsa's starting five - 57 points
- Parker led all scorers with a new season-high 33 points including a career-high five three-pointers made. This is the second time this season Parker has scored at least 30 points – 31 points at Chicago on July 31
- Guard Odyssey Sims and forward Plenette Pierson led the Shock in scoring with 21 points apiece. It was only the third time this season the Shock featured two 20-plus scorers in the same game
- Sims' 21 points is her fifth 20-point scoring performance this season. Pierson scored 20-plus points for the first time since July and four 20-point performances overall through 27 games played

SERIES NOTES:

- Tonight, Los Angeles enters Philips Arena having lost five consecutive games at Atlanta dating back to the 2010 season. In the two teams' series history, on the road, the Sparks have averaged 78.9 points per game compared to the Dream's 85.4 points through seven games at Atlanta. The Dream have scored 90 or more points in three of the seven meetings at Philips Arena
- This season, Los Angeles is 0-1 against Atlanta after a 76-72 loss at STAPLES Center on July 16. It was the first win at STAPLES Center for Dream head coach Michael Cooper since joining Atlanta's coaching staff in 2014. Overall, Michael Cooper holds a 2-1 record against Los Angeles as the Dream head coach, undefeated at Philips Arena against the Sparks
- Forward Candace Parker will face Atlanta for the first time this season. Last year, Parker averaged 20.5 ppg and 6.5 rpg against the Dream through two games played.
- On July 16 versus Atlanta, forwards Jantel Lavender and Nneka Ogumike were the only Sparks players to score in double-digits (Lavender - 20, Ogumike - 19). Last season against the Dream, Lavender averaged 18.0 ppg while Ogumike averaged 16.5 ppg through two games played
- The Sparks held the Dream to 56 points on May 25, 2008 at Atlanta - it was the first ever contest between both teams. The Dream's 56 points was also the fewest points scored against the Sparks in series history. Since then, Atlanta has scored 60 points or more against Los Angeles in 14 consecutive meetings

- Dream head coach Michael Cooper claimed his first victory at the STAPLES Center since joining Atlanta in 2014
- Atlanta snapped a three game road losing streak that stretched back to a June 14 loss at Connecticut

On Friday, September 11, Los Angeles will end the regular season at Phoenix for the second straight year. This will be the final meeting between the two teams with the Sparks holding a 2-1 season-series advantage over the Mercury. In the third meeting against Phoenix on August 21, forwards Candace Parker and Jantel Lavender each recorded a double-double (Parker - 26 points, 10 rebounds; Lavender - 15 points, 11 rebounds). It was the fifth time this season at least two Sparks players each notched a double-double in the same game. In addition, rookie guard Ana Dabovic led the bench with 12 points to help propel Los Angeles to a 78-68 victory over Phoenix. The last time the Sparks won a season-series against the Mercury was in 2012 (5-0).

SPARK PLUGS

ALL ABOARD

For the 15th time in franchise history, the Los Angeles Sparks will be heading to the WNBA Playoffs - most playoff appearances by any team in the WNBA. The Sparks battled from last place in the west, starting the season 4-14 before turning it around in the second half with a 10-4 record. With two games to go, Los Angeles holds a 14-18 fourth place standing with its potential western conference semi-finals opponent to be the number one seeded Minnesota Lynx. The WNBA Playoffs presented by Boost Mobile will begin September 17 on ABC.

FORMULA OF SUCCESS

Rookie guard Ana Dabovic has started in seven games this season, in which the Sparks are 5-2 when Dabovic is in the starting lineup. Dabovic has helped the Sparks in scoring as she has logged double-digits in six of her seven career starts. In the Sparks last six games, she has started in all of them having averaged 12.7 ppg. Dabovic currently ranks second in the league in scoring with 8.5 ppg through 22 played with the potential to be one of the top rookies heading into the postseason.

BRING THE HEAT, PARKER

On September 6, forward Candace Parker lit up STAPLES Center as she set a season-high 33 points and career-high five three-pointers made to help Los Angeles defeat Tulsa, 92-73. It was Parker's second 30-point game of the season. Aside from Parker, the only Sparks player this season to have scored 30 points or more is guard Kristi Toliver - Toliver has two 30-point performances for the season. In 16 games played this season, Parker leads the team in scoring with 19.4 ppg and has led the Sparks in points in eight games.

PRIME TIME NNEKA

In her two games back since sustaining concussion-like symptoms (six games missed), forward Nneka Ogumike has logged consecutive 20-point performances with a field goal percentage of 77.3. In games which Ogumike has scored 20 points or more for the Sparks, the team has gone 4-2 in the season. So far, Ogumike has notched six 20-point games through 22 played.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN

The Sparks will finish its regular season on the road for the 12th season in franchise history. Los Angeles carries a 5-10 road record with all five of its wins coming after the WNBA All-Star break. In the first half of the season, the Sparks went 0-7 in games away while the second half saw a different team, posting a 5-3 record on the road. In those eight games, Los Angeles has averaged 77.9 ppg while fending off its opponents to only 73.9 ppg. In addition, three of those road wins, the Sparks went 3-0 when committing less turnovers than its opponent - on the road, Los Angeles ranks fourth in the league in turnovers (12.4).

20-POINT FLURRIES

For the first time this season, Los Angeles scored 20 points in each quarter of a game, doing it on September 6 vs. Tulsa. Prior to the game, there were six occasions in which the Sparks had scored 20+ points in three of the four quarters played. Through 32 games played, Los Angeles' best scoring quarter is in the first as they average 19.8 points in the first 10 minutes of play while pouring in 37.4 in the first half compared to 18.1 points in the fourth and 36.4 for the second half.

SCORING OVER OPPONENTS

In the Sparks first 31 games, the team averaged 73.7 ppg while its opponents were outscoring, 74.3 ppg (-0.6 differential). In total points, Los Angeles recorded 2,286 team points compared to an opponent total of 2,302. After the 92-73 win on September 6 versus Tulsa, the Sparks overcame the point deficit and now the team is averaging a 74.3 ppg to 74.2, +0.1 margin of victory against its opponents through 32 games played - the first time this season the Sparks have outscored its opponents in total (2,378 team points to 2,375 by its opponents)

THE SPARKS HOUSE

The Sparks wrapped up the 2015 regular season home schedule on September 6 with a 9-8 record at STAPLES Center. It's the 15th season in franchise history that Los Angeles has ended with a home record above .500. Last season, the Sparks were 7-10 at STAPLES Center. Through 17 home games, the Sparks averaged 75.1 ppg while holding its opponents to 72.7 ppg. The team capped its home court run with a three game win streak that averaged a +9.7 margin of victory. Being at home also sparked a scoring effort of three games that reached 90 points or more including Los Angeles' current season-high of 98 points set on July 3. Lastly, the Sparks went 5-0 when they shot 50 percent or better from the field and 6-0 when exactly four players scored at least 10 points or more in the game.

20-20 VISION

Los Angeles has had six games in which at least two Sparks players have each scored 20 points in the same contest. This season, the Sparks are 5-1 in games when this occurs - the loss was in an overtime game against Phoenix on July 5 with the final score, 94-91. In the five wins with two players scoring at least 20 points, Los Angeles held a sturdy +9.7 margin of victory. On the opposite spectrum this season, the Sparks have allowed only five games in which at least two players of the opposing team each scored 20 points or more in the same game - the Sparks were 1-4 in those games.

RE-ROUTING ITS DESTINATION

In the Sparks first seven road games this season, Los Angeles went 0-7. In its last seven games away, the Sparks carry a 5-2 record. Last season Los Angeles began 3-4 in its first seven road games, but finished strong by winning six of the last 10 away.

SPARK PLUGS

HEY-HO, EIGHT-OH

The Sparks are 10-2 when scoring 80 points or more in a game. In the two games played in September, the Sparks have scored at least 90 points or more in both contests. In the month of August, Los Angeles scored 80+ points on five occasions, all games won. In its last six wins, the Sparks averaged 83.4 points. When the team scored 79 points or less, the Sparks went 4-16 for the season.

WHERE THE ROAD LEADS

Los Angeles has gone 2-9 in its first 11 road games this season. The last time the Sparks started 2-9 on the road was in 2009. Later that season, Los Angeles finished with a 5-1 away record, captured third place in the western conference and advanced all the way to the conference finals. Since then, in the Sparks first 11 road games from 2010 to this season, the team has won only 24 of the 66 played.

DOUBLE THE EFFORT

Through 32 games, Los Angeles leads the league in total double-doubles recorded with 32 (Lavender - 12, Parker - 12, Ogwumike - 6, Johnson - 2). In addition, forwards Jantel Lavender and Candace Parker are rocking the WNBA's double-double scene, as both are the only players in the league with at least 10 double-doubles, to date. Lavender and Parker lead the league with the most double-doubles (12). Through 16 games played, Parker is the only player in the WNBA averaging double-double numbers (19.4 ppg, 10.1 rpg). In addition, Parker was the fastest to reach 10 this season, earning it in her 13th game back. Lavender earned her 10th of the season through 17 games played. Last season, Parker notched only six double-doubles, almost doubling that amount this year with five games still to go. This year, Lavender already tripled what she tallied last season - 4 double-doubles through 34 games played.

CHARITABLE NNEKA

On September 3, forward Nneka Ogwumike set a career-high 14 free-throws made. Her 14 points at the charity stripe tied for second-most in franchise history for free-throws made in a game. This season, Ogwumike is shooting 87 percent (82-95 FT) from the free throw line. Overall, Ogwumike leads the team in free-throws made and attempted.

EFFECTIVE AND TRUE

Guard Kristi Toliver ranks 13th in the league in field goal percentage (.467). However, this statistic does not credit the purity of her shooting. By the numbers, Toliver also ranks in the top ten in 2-point field goal percentage (4th), 3-point field goals made (6th), 3-point field goal percentage (7th) and free-throw percentage (7th). Toliver's ability to shoot the long ball consistently and accurately ranks her first in the league in effective field goal percentage (.561) - measurement that considers the 3-point shot more valuable in the game than 2-point field goals. Taking all aspects of shooting into consideration, Toliver ranks second among league leaders in true shooting percentage (.614) - measures efficiency at shooting the ball overall. If Toliver was not with the Sparks, her 110.8 offensive rating (9th in the WNBA) would surely be missed.

UP & DOWN THE COURT

Forward/center Jantel Lavender ranks in the top ten among league leaders in points (7th), rebounds (5th), blocked shots (8th) and field goal percentage (4th). Lavender's performance is a rare feat this season as she is one of only two players in the league that ranks in the top ten in each of these categories - the other being Phoenix center Brittney Griner. In the 31 games played, Lavender is averaging career-bests in each of these categories (points, rebounds, blocked shots, field goal percentage).

SHOOTER'S TOUCH

The Sparks roster boasts three players who currently are shooting over 50 percent from the field (Hamson, Lavender, Ogwumike). Of those three, both Lavender and Ogwumike qualify and rank in the top ten among league leaders in field goal percentage. Lavender sits in fourth place looking to set a single-season career-best with 52.1 percent shooting. Ogwumike is half way behind her, ranking eighth, shooting 51.2 percent from the field. Their shooting also ranks them in the top ten among league scoring leaders with Ogwumike seventh (16.4 ppg) and Lavender at ninth (14.9 ppg).

BIGS CAN SHOOT TOO

Forward/center Jantel Lavender is currently fifth among league leaders in field goal percentage, shooting 52.1 percent from the field through 32 games this season. In all five of Lavender's seasons, she has averaged at least 50 percent shooting, with her 52.1 field goal percentage shy from a season-best set last year. In her career, Lavender is averaging 51.7 percent from the field, on pace to hold the second-best shooting performance for a career in Sparks history.

GOING UP STRONG

Los Angeles set a season-high 35 free-throws made on September 3. The 35 made freebies was the second-most free-frows made in franchise history - 40 vs Washington, August 3, 1998. This season, Los Angeles leads the WNBA in free-throw percentage (.836, 419-502 FT). Through 32 games played, the Sparks are on pace to set a franchise regular season record in free-throw percentage. The record that stands was set in 2010 when the team shot 82.2 percent from the charity stripe, 503-of-612 free-throws, through 34 games played.

THE FINAL STRETCH

Los Angeles (14-18) has two games remaining in the regular season, urging to continue its play into the postseason. In each of the last five seasons, the Sparks have won at least three of its final five games. Since 2010, Los Angeles is 18-9 when it comes down to the last five of the season. In 2003, the Sparks went 5-0 down the final stretch, finishing the season with a 24-10 record.

SPARK PLUGS

NOT ON FULL THROTTLE

With 32 Sparks games completed, Los Angeles has yet to have all 12 players suited up come game-time. There has been at least one player listed as injured throughout the entire season while guards Ana Dabovic (10 missed games) and Kristi Toliver (6 missed games) were out due to national team commitments. Forward Candace Parker also missed a portion of the season (16 games) to rest from year-round basketball play. In total, five players (Abdi, Beard, Ogwumike, Phillips, Tolo) make up a total of 60 missed games this season for the Sparks – almost double the number of games the team has played to date. The most the Sparks have had available for a game has been 11 players, and that was on August 6 vs. Tulsa. Guard Erin Phillips was out with a knee injury. The least amount of Sparks players dressed and available for game-time was 8, on four separate occasions early on in the season (6/16 vs Minnesota, 6/21 vs Connecticut, 6/26 at Connecticut, 6/28 at New York).

LEADING THE PACK

Through 32 games played, Los Angeles is leading the league in field goal percentage (.450) after starting the season hovering at the bottom of the list. The last time the Sparks led the WNBA in field goal percentage was 2013, as Los Angeles was shooting 47.5 percent from the field while averaging the league's second-best scoring output of 81.9 points per game. Since 2011, the Sparks have finished in the top five every season among WNBA teams in field goal percentage.

DO THE MATH

Forwards Candace Parker and Jantel Lavender have been scoring from all cylinders as of late, giving the Sparks a much needed push. In the Sparks last 16 games, Parker and/or Lavender have scored at least 12 points in each game giving Los Angeles an 11-5 record. When both Parker and Lavender each score 12+ points in a game, the Sparks have went on to win seven of nine games. When either score 12+ points, Los Angeles is only 4-3.

IRON WOMAN

Jantel Lavender holds a 138 consecutive games played streak, second on the all-time list in Sparks history. Prior to Lavender's 138 straight, DeLisha Milton-Jones held the first and second spot in the Sparks record books for most consecutive games played. In her five seasons in the WNBA, Lavender has only missed one game, during her rookie season, due to injury. Lavender's active streak dates back to September 3, 2011 at Phoenix.

TOO CLOSE FOR COMFORT

This season, Los Angeles has had 22 games decided by 10 points or less with a 8-14 record (-2.4 point differential). When games had been decided by 11 points or more, the Sparks went on to win six of 10 (+5.7 point differential). Last season, Los Angeles played in 21 games and went 9-12 in games decided by 10 points or less. In the 13 games decided by 11 points or more last season, the Sparks went 7-6.

APPLE TURNOVERS NEVER TASTED SO GOOD

Through 32 games played, Los Angeles has averaged 13.2 turnovers. However, in its last five games, the Sparks averaged only 9.4 turnovers. In the month of June, the Sparks did not once have less than 10 turnovers in a game, having started 0-7 for the season. Overall, Los Angeles has committed less than 10 turnovers in a game, seven times. The team is 6-1 when turning the ball over less than 10 times.

POST ALL-STAR, ALL-STAR

Since the All-Star break the Sparks have vaulted to the top of the standings in a few categories. In the first half of the season, the Sparks were 11th in points per game (70.1 ppg). Through 16 games played in the second half of the season, Los Angeles ranks fourth in the league in scoring (78.5 ppg). The Sparks field goal percentage also jumped in shooting percentage, 42.5 percent (5th in the league) before the break, to 48.8 percent (league leader) post all-star. In result, the team improved in converting shots - sitting ninth in the WNBA (26.4 fgm per game), to first, in field goals made per game (30.4) through the last 16 games played. So far the team has gone 11-5 (.688) after starting 3-13 (.188) for the season

Through 32 games played, the Sparks lead the WNBA in assists, averaging 18.3 per game. In the last 16 games, the Sparks have averaged more assists than its opponent, averaging 19.7 assists to its opponent's 13.7 assists per game. Los Angeles has also recorded at least 20 assists, 12 times this season, winning seven of those contests. On the road, Los Angeles is second-best among the WNBA in sharing the ball, averaging 18.0 assists through 15 games. The Sparks dished out a season-high 28 assists in the win over the Stars on August 23. The 28 hand-outs came from seven different Sparks players.

IT'S HOW YOU FINISH

Los Angeles rallied back from a 15-point deficit and won on September 3 against Washington. It was the fifth time this season the Sparks were overcame a deficit of 10 points or more. All five games were decided by five points or less with Los Angeles coming away victorious. Close games they were, as the Sparks won by a +2.8-point differential in games when down by 10 points or more and rally back to win.

WESTERN CONFERENCE PLAYER OF THE MONTH

On September 3, the WNBA named forward Candace Parker Western Conference Player of the Month for games played in August. This is Parker's first of the season, fifth of her career. In the month of August, she averaged a double-double of 17.3 points and 10.5 rebounds - only player in the month of August to average a double-double - on top of 6.3 assists, 2.3 steals and 2.0 blocked shots through 12 games played. Her all-around play led the Sparks to an 8-4 record in August, top among western conference teams. Since rejoining the team on July 29, she has helped Los Angeles to a 9-5 record post WNBA All-Star break. Congratulations Candace Parker!

A MONTH FOR THE SPARKS

As a team, the Sparks went 8-4 in the month of August. In those 12 games, the team shot a season-best 47.1 percent from the field to lead the league in field goal percentage for games played in August. Los Angeles averaged 75.6 points per game while holding its opponents to 69.2 points per game (+6.4 point differential). The team also doubled its wins earned compared to the first two months of the season when Los Angeles went 4-14. Since 2010, the Sparks are 36-20 for games played in the month of August.

SPARK PLUGS

SPARKS NATION

On August 30, the Los Angeles Sparks set a new franchise record of 19,076 announced attendance - three seats shy of a sellout capacity crowd. It broke the previous record of 18,997 fans by 79 tickets. The now second-most attendance was set on July 21, 2004 against the Washington Mystics also at STAPLES Center. To date, the Sparks have yet had a capacity sellout game held at the Forum (former arena) or STAPLES Center in franchise history.

LEADING ROLE

The Sparks win on August 30 was only the second time this season that Los Angeles has lead throughout the entire game. The first performance of this caliber was against the Shock on August 6 when the Sparks led the way in all four quarters, held the Shock to a previous Sparks' opponent-low 57 points and finished with a 31-point win. In the game against San Antonio on August 30, the Sparks did not allow a Stars' lead in all 40 minutes and set a new opponent scoring low of 52 points. These dominant performances in August gave the Sparks a 2-0 record when holding the lead for the entirety of the game.

FOR THE WIN!

Rookie guard Ana Dabovic made the game-winning shot with 6.1 seconds left in the fourth quarter to propel Los Angeles to a 81-79 victory over Indiana on August 26. The win extended the Sparks win streak to three straight while it snapped the Fever's six-game win streak. Dabovic's step-back jumper was the first game-winner recorded for the Sparks this season.

WESTERN CONFERENCE PLAYER OF THE WEEK (TEN)

On August 24, 2015, the WNBA named Sparks forward Candace Parker the WNBA Western Conference Player of the Week for games played through August 17 through August 23. This is Parker's first one of the year and 14th career Western Conference Player of the Week award in her eight WNBA seasons. For the week, Parker led the league in scoring (23.7 ppg), rebounding (10.7 rpg), and steals (3.3 spg). She also shared the WNBA lead in assists (6.0 apg, along with Chicago's Courtney Vandersloot) and ranked sixth among Western Conference players in field goal percentage (.509, 28-of-55). Parker began the week with game-highs of 25 points, eight steals, six assists and three blocks, as well as 10 rebounds in a 79-68 home loss in the first meeting against the Indiana Fever this season on Aug. 18. Three days later she led all scorers with 26 points in a 78-68 victory over the Phoenix Mercury in which she also contributed 10 boards, three assists, two steals and a block. Parker closed out the week with a near triple-double in a 90-59 road win over the San Antonio Stars on Aug. 23, as she logged 20 points, 12 rebounds, and nine assists. In all three contests, Parker recorded a double-double.

IT'S A BLOCK PARTY

Los Angeles denied 14 San Antonio shots en route to a Sparks, 90-59, win on August 23. Los Angeles' 14 blocked shots ranked second-most in franchise history for most blocks in a game - one shy of the Sparks franchise record: 15 vs Sacramento on August 28, 2008. In the win at San Antonio on August 23, five Sparks players recorded at least one blocked shot with forward/center Jantel Lavender leading the defensive end with a career-high five blocks. Rookie center Jennifer Hamson came off the bench and also set a career-high four blocked shots.

30-FOR-30

Los Angeles built up a 37-point lead in the second half at San Antonio on August 23 to and finish the game with a 31-point victory. The 37-point lead is the largest lead the Sparks have held this season. The 31-point difference, in favor of the Sparks, also set a new season-high for the largest margin of victory for the Sparks in 2015. It was the first 30-point win this season, and only seventh win in Sparks history by a margin of 30 points or more.

HANDS IN THE COOKIE JAR

Forward Candace Parker dominated on the defensive end against Indiana on August 18, as she set a new franchise record eight steals. The previous Sparks player to hold the record (7) was Armintie Herrington, set at Washington on June 1, 2014. Parker's eight steals are the most in a game by any WNBA player this season. She was two shy of tying the WNBA record (10) held by former Sacramento guard Ticha Penicheiro against San Antonio on July 10, 2003.

A STAT SHEET STUFFER

On Tuesday versus Indiana (August 18), forward Candace Parker finished the game with 25 points, 10 rebounds, six assists and eight steals. The last WNBA player to record at least 25 points, 10 rebounds, five assists and five steals in a game was also Parker, on June 1, 2014 (32 points, 12 rebounds, six assists, six steals). Other than herself, only one other WNBA player has tallied at least 25-10-5-5 in a game, former Phoenix forward Brandy Reed (32 points, 13 rebounds, six assists, seven steals) on June 22, 2000. To put Parker's performance into greater perspective, the last time a NBA player recorded at least 25 points, 10 rebounds, six assists and eight steals in a game was Toronto Raptor's Doug Christie (29 points, 15 rebounds, seven assists, eight steals) on April 2, 1997 - 18 years ago.

WESTERN CONFERENCE PLAYER OF THE WEEK (FOUR)

On July 6, 2015, the WNBA named Sparks forward Nneka Ogumike the WNBA Western Conference Player of the Week for games played June 29 through July 5. This is Ogumike's fourth career Western Conference Player of the Week award in her four WNBA seasons. For the week, she ranked second in the Western Conference in scoring (24.0 ppg), while pacing the West in rebounding (12.3 rpg) and tying for second in steals (1.67 spg). Ogumike opened the week with 27 points, eight rebounds, two assists, and two steals in an 86-81 win over San Antonio (7/2). She then contributed consecutive double-doubles with 19 points, 10 rebounds, and two steals in a 98-95 win over Tulsa (7/3), 26 points, a season-high 19 rebounds, one steal and one blocked shot in an overtime loss against Phoenix (7/5).

DUB NATION

In the home wins over Minnesota on August 4 and Tulsa on August 6, Los Angeles defeated the two teams by 20 points or more, respectively. In both occasions, Los Angeles set marks for its largest margin of victories - +22 vs Minnesota, +27 vs Tulsa. The Sparks are one of three teams this season (Chicago, Indiana) to have won back-to-back games by a margin of 20 or more. In franchise history, Los Angeles has won back-to-back games by 20 points or more six times, most recently on June 15, 2013 vs San Antonio (84-48) and June 21, 2013 vs Minnesota (87-59).

PAINTING THE TOWN PURPLE AND GOLD

In addition to the 20+ point back-to-back home wins, Los Angeles scored a total of 104 points in the paint in the two home games played (50 points vs Minnesota, 8/4; 54 points vs Tulsa, 8/6). Los Angeles outscored its opponents in the paint on both occasions coming away with a victory. The last time a team scored at least fifty points in the paint in back-to-back games and won them both, each by a margin of at least 20 points, was in the WNBA's first season, when the Sparks did it twice - (June 25, 1997 vs Charlotte; June 27, 1997 vs Sacramento) and (July 27, 1997 at Sacramento; July 30, 1997 vs Utah).

DOWN, BUT NOT OUT

The win at San Antonio (8/2) was the largest comeback for the Sparks this season. San Antonio led by as many as 13 during the game, with Los Angeles turning it around at the end to win by two points - 80-78. The previous mark for this season was also set against San Antonio (7/2), as Los Angeles came back from a 12-point deficit to earn its first win of the season. This is only the third time this season that the Sparks have overcome a deficit of 10 or more points.

A NIGHT TO REMEMBER

Sparks guard Kristi Toliver gave Sparks fans a night to remember on July 3rd, as Toliver set the franchise record for most points in a game with 43, surpassing Sparks legend Lisa Leslie's 41 points set against San Antonio (6/25/06). By scoring 40+ points, Toliver also became one of only three players in team history to score 40 points or more in a game. As she accomplished a franchise record, Toliver as well reached a career feat of 2300 total points during the game. Through 191 games played in her career, Toliver has scored a total of 2335 points. Toliver's career night came against a physical Tulsa Shock who entered STAPLES Center with an 8-3 winning record. Toliver's 43 points was also a career-high, surpassing her previous career-high of 30 which was set earlier this season at New York (6/28). In addition, Toliver recorded a career-high in most made three-pointers in a single game (7), tying a franchise record held by former Sparks player Mwadi Mabika (6/18/06). Her 43 points (7-12 3FG) was coupled with a season-high nine assists, giving opportunities to her teammates down the stretch and ultimately edging out the Tulsa Shock in a 98-95 victory at STAPLES Center. This was Toliver's second home game back since her return from international competition.

IN THE NUMBERS

Kristi Toliver's 19 points in the third quarter against Tulsa Shock (7/3) was the second most points scored in any given quarter in the past three seasons. Only three other players have scored 19 points or more in a single quarter, most recent was Atlanta's Shoni Schimmel, 20 points in 2nd quarter against Phoenix (8/13/14). The six-of-seven made three-pointers by the Sparks in the second half alone were from Toliver, shooting 85.7% from deep. This is Toliver's second career 30+ point performance, all done this season, ranking her third all-time in franchise history for most games with 30 or more points - tied with teammate Nneka Ogumike (2). Toliver's 43 points is just the 19th time in WNBA history that a player has scored 40 points or more in a single game in the regular season. Toliver and Chicago Sky's Elena Delle Donne are the only players in the WNBA this season that have recorded a 40+ point game.

WIN, WIN, WIN NO MATTER WHAT

The Los Angeles Sparks began the season 0-7, its worst start in franchise history. Much of the trouble came from a depleted bench due to injury and player absence. The Sparks ended its losing streak with an 86-81 win against San Antonio (7/2) with three Sparks players scoring in double-figures and two of them with 20+ points. Los Angeles shot 50.0% from the field, went 21-of-23 from the free-throw line and tied its lowest turnover performance of the season with 10. The Sparks outmatched the Stars in the paint scoring 50 points down low to the San Antonio's 42, including 12 second chance points to six. Overall, the Sparks were trailing the Stars through three quarters, but were able to close out its opponent for the first time this season setting then-season team-highs in points in the fourth quarter (26), second half (48) and overall game (86) to give coach Agler his first win with the Sparks.

SPARK PLUGS

BACK-TO-BACK FRANCHISE RECORD

In the games against Connecticut (6/21) and at Washington (6/23), Sparks guard Temeka Jonhson recorded two consecutive point-assist double-doubles. Johnson is the first player in franchise history to record a double-double in points and assists in two consecutive games*. The only Sparks player ever to near a back-to-back 10-point and 10-assist performance is current Sparks EVP/GM Penny Toler. During her 1998 Sparks season, Toler recorded an 11-point and 14-assist game against former WNBA team Utah Starzz (8/14/98), and in the following game recorded 15 points and nine assists against former WNBA team Detroit Shock (8/16/98).

(UN)LUCKY NUMBER 7

In the loss at New York (6/28) Los Angeles tied its franchise record for most consecutive losses in a single season (7). The last time the Sparks lost seven straight was in 2007, spanning from June 29 - July 17. The 0-7 start is the worst start in franchise history for Los Angeles, the previous winless record to start the season was 0-3 in 2010.

OT IN CT

The Sparks went into its first overtime game of the season at Connecticut (6/23) losing 80-76 (OT), its second consecutive game decided by five points or less. The last time Los Angeles faced Connecticut in overtime was on June 13, 2008 at STAPLES Center when the Sparks won 98-93 (OT). Including this overtime loss, the Sparks own a 30-19 winning record in games played in overtime. The Sparks finished the 2015 season-series 0-2 against Connecticut, its first winless series against the Sun since the 2011 season. The last time the Sparks lost on the road to the Sun was on 6/28/11, 79-76.

AUSSIE DUO

The Sparks tipped-off the 2015 season at KeyArena, with the country of Australia cheering on Australian natives and Sparks guard Erin Phillips and rookie center Marianna Tolo. The last time two Australians started as teammates in the regular season was Phoenix Mercury's Belinda Snell and Penny Taylor on June 30, 2007 against Houston. What's remarkable about this stat is that Phillips and fellow Aussie, Penny Taylor, both played for the WNBA Champion Phoenix Mercury last season. Despite Phillips ten starts and Taylor's 24, the two NEVER started one game together. In addition to Saturday night's contest, the Storm debuted an Australian duo in Jenny O'Hea and Abby Bishop for the first time to go up against Phillips and Tolo - four Australians to start in the same WNBA game. For the Sparks, the Aussie duo can repeat history once again as the last time Australians started together in the postseason was Detroit's Carla Boyd and Sandy Brondello on August 24, 1999 against Charlotte.

EQUITRUST THE SPARKS

On May 21, the Sparks announced EquiTrust as the marquee sponsor for the 2015 season. Under the agreement, the EquiTrust logo will appear on all Sparks home and road jerseys, throughout STAPLES Center on Sparks home game days, on the step and repeat backdrop, across all social and digital platforms and as the driving force behind the new charitable leadership youth program, Driven2Hoop.

With its announcement, the Sparks are now the eighth team in the WNBA to have a marquee partnership.

Head Coach Brian Agler 1st Season

On January 5, 2015, Brian Agler joined the Los Angeles Sparks as the 12th head coach in franchise history, bringing with him over 30 years of head-coaching experience, including 11 in the WNBA.

Agler comes to the Sparks from Seattle, where he led the Storm to six consecutive playoff appearances (2008-2013) in seven years. He compiled a 136-102 (.571) record during his time in the Pacific Northwest, including his 212th career (WNBA and ABL) victory in 2012. The win on June 1 against the Tulsa Shock moved him past Van Chancellor (211), former coach of the Houston Comets, to become the all-time winningest coach in women's professional basketball history. Agler won

78 games in the ABL and now has 198 WNBA regular season wins (276 total).

In 2010 the Storm captured the league's championship title, its second, with an impressive regular season record of 28-6 and an undefeated playoff record of 7-0. Additionally, Coach Agler was recognized as the WNBA's Coach of the Year. Prior to joining the Storm in 2008, Agler was the head coach and general manager of the expansion team Minnesota Lynx from 1999-2002, where he compiled a 42-54 (.438) record. Before being named the first coach of the expansion Lynx, Agler served as the head coach of the Columbus Quest of the ABL from 1996-1999, compiling an 82-22 record. He led the Quest to back-to-back ABL championships in 1997 and 1998 and was named the ABL Coach of the Year for the 1996-97 season.

Agler completed his third season as an assistant coach for the San Antonio Silver Stars in 2007. Prior to joining San Antonio, he served as an assistant coach with the Phoenix Mercury in 2004 and helped guide the team to a 17-17 record after the Mercury finished with an 8-26 record in 2003.

Agler spent 15 seasons coaching among the collegiate ranks, including 13 seasons as a head coach. He posted an impressive collegiate record of 248-135 (.648 winning percentage). From 1993-96 he served as the head women's basketball coach at Kansas State. In 1998, Agler took over as the head women's coach at the University of Missouri-Kansas City. In five seasons at UMKC, Agler was 85-54 and took the Kangaroos from a 9-16 record in 1988-89 to four straight winning seasons with 17 or more victories. Under his direction, UMKC led the NCAA in scoring defense three consecutive seasons from 1990-93. In 1991, UMKC set an NCAA record, allowing 51.8 points per game.

As the head women's basketball coach at Northeast Oklahoma A&M Junior College from 1984-88, Agler compiled a 124-42 record (.747 winning percentage). In 1985-86, NEO A&M was ranked second nationally and posted a 30-2 record.

Agler attended Wittenberg University in Springfield, Ohio, where he starred on the basketball team for four seasons. He led the Tigers to their only NCAA Division III Championship in basketball as a freshman. He started all 112 games during his college career, leaving the school as the all-time assist leader (481). Agler helped lead his team to a 91-21 record during his four years with the Tigers, and was named most valuable player in the Ohio Athletic Conference and first-team All-America as a senior. In 1995, he was inducted into the Wittenberg Hall of Honor.

In 1980, Agler graduated with a degree in special education and physical education. He received his master's degree in education from Pittsburg State University (Pittsburg, Kansas) in 1985. Agler and his wife Robin, have one son, Bryce, and one daughter, Taylor.

Los Angeles Sparks **64** Minnesota Lynx **72**

Maya Moore scored 20 points, Sylvia Fowles added 15 and nine rebounds and the Minnesota Lynx beat the Los Angeles Sparks 72-64 on Sunday night to snap a two-game losing streak. The Sparks were without four-time WNBA All-Star Alana Beard, who played just 8 minutes before leaving the game with a pulled quadriceps.

With Parker and Beard in the lineup, Los Angeles had won four straight games, including an 83-61 win over the Lynx - Minnesota's worst loss of the season. Nneka Ogwumike led the Sparks with 18 points. Renee Montgomery's driving layup capped a run of 13 straight points in the first quarter to give Minnesota a 20-6 lead and the Lynx held a 37-32 lead at halftime. Los Angeles (7-15) battled back and Kristi Toliver's fourth 3-pointer of the game pulled the Sparks within one with 4:58 left, but Minnesota (16-6) answered with six straight points to push its lead to 65-58.

Los Angeles Sparks **77** Seattle Storm **85**

Crystal Langhorne scored 18 points, including a go-ahead layup with 2:34 remaining, and the Seattle Storm rallied to beat the Los Angeles Sparks 85-77 on Tuesday, spoiling Candace Parker's big night. Parker had 12 points, 10 rebounds and nine assists - narrowly missing the WNBA's sixth triple-double. Margo Dydek, Lisa Leslie, Sheryl Swoopes, Deanna Nolan and Temeka Johnson are the only WNBA players with regular-seasons triple-doubles.

After Langhorne's layup, Jenna O'Hea hit a 3-pointer on Seattle's next possession and Langhorne had a putback to cap the Storm's 7-0 run for an 81-74 lead. After Kristi Toliver hit a 3-pointer to cut Los Angeles' deficit to 81-77, Jewell Loyd hit a fadeaway jumper with the shot clock winding down and O'Hea made two free throws with 24 seconds left. Sue Bird, Jewell Loyd and Kaleena Mosqueda-Lewis added 15 points apiece for Seattle (6-17). Mosqueda-Lewis scored 12 first-half points to set a career-high. Seattle snapped a five-game losing streak and beat Los Angeles for the fourth straight time - including its only two road wins. Jantel Lavender added 22 points and Nneka Ogumike 16 for Los Angeles (7-16). Los Angeles' Alana Beard did not play because of a quadriceps injury suffered Sunday.

SEASON GAME #24. HOME #13 LOS ANGELES SPARKS vs CHICAGO SKY Los Angeles, CA Aug. 16, 2015

Los Angeles Sparks **76** Chicago Sky **64**

Candace Parker scored 21 points and had a career-high 10 assists to lead the Los Angeles Sparks over the Chicago Sky, 76-64 on Sunday. Kristi Toliver added 16 points, Nneka Ogumike 15 and Jantel Lavender 10 for the Sparks (8-16), who bounced back from a discouraging defeat against lowly Seattle in a game they had led by 16. Parker finished just two rebounds short of a triple-double.

The Sparks led 38-35 at halftime, then shot 9 of 12 from the floor in the third quarter to go ahead 61-47. The Sky, the league's highest-scoring team, made just 4 of 16 in the period. The lead reached 21 points in the fourth quarter. League scoring leader Elena Delle Donne had 23 points for Chicago (15-11), but on only 7-of-19 shooting. Cappie Pondexter added 11 points. The Sparks also won at Chicago 88-77 on July 31 to sweep the season series.

Los Angeles Sparks **79** Indiana Fever **68**

Tamika Catchings had 20 points and seven rebounds to help the Indiana Fever beat the Los Angeles Sparks 79-68 on Tuesday night for their seventh win in eight games since the All-Star break. Indiana won at Los Angeles for the first time since 2010, snapping its seven-game losing streak in the series. Briann January added 16 points and Marissa Coleman had 14 for Indiana (15-9). The Fever made 10 3-pointers, led by Coleman's three.

Candace Parker had 25 points, 10 rebounds, six assists and a franchise-record eight steals for Los Angeles (8-17). Ana Dabovic scored 12, all in the first half. Los Angeles went on an 11-0 second-quarter run, with scoring from five different players, to extend its lead to 40-26. The Sparks held the Fever to just 10 points in the second quarter and led 44-30. Parker had 11 points, five rebounds, four assists and five steals in the half. Indiana made 5 of 10 3-pointers in the first half to stay within striking distance. Los Angeles had eight turnovers in the third -after just five in the first half - and was outscored 24-6. Los Angeles made just nine field goals in the second half.

Candace Parker had 26 points and 10 rebounds, and Jantel Lavender added 15 points and 11 rebounds to help the Los Angeles Sparks beat the Phoenix Mercury 78-68 on Friday night for their third road victory. Los Angeles had a 14-point lead early in the fourth quarter before the Mercury went on a 10-2 run to cut it to 63-57. Phoenix got to 69-66 with 2:11 left, but Kristi Toliver made three free throws and, after a Mercury turnover, Parker made a fast-break layup for a 74-66 lead.

Kristi Toliver added 17 points for Los Angeles (9-17). Nneka Ogumike missed her second straight game with concussion-like symptoms. Brittney Griner scored 20 points, Candice Dupree added 15 and DeWanna Bonner 13 for Phoenix (15-11). The Mercury clinched a playoff spot after San Antonio's loss to Minnesota. Before the game, Phoenix presented Los Angeles' Erin Phillips her 2014 WNBA championship ring. She signed with the Sparks during the offseason.

Los Angeles Sparks **90** San Antonio Stars **59**

Jantel Lavender scored 22 points and Candace Parker added 20 to help the Los Angeles Sparks roll to a 90-59 victory over the San Antonio Stars on Sunday. Ana Dabovic had 18 for the Sparks (10-17), who padded their cushion between themselves, idle Seattle (7-20) and the Stars (7-21), for the final playoff berth out of the Western Conference. Lavender blocked a career-high five shots and played in her 132nd consecutive game, second all-time for Los Angeles. Parker had 12 rebounds and nine assists.

The Sparks shot 54 percent from the field and dominated in the paint 52-28. Kayla McBride scored 13 points and Dearica Hamby 10 for the Stars, losers of five straight. Nneka Ogumike, the Sparks' second-leading scorer, sat out for the third straight game with concussion-like symptoms. Parker scored nine points in an 11-2 run for a 28-13 first-quarter lead. The Sparks led 43-24 at halftime and led by as many as 37.

Los Angeles Sparks **81** Indiana Fever **79**

Ana Dabovic scored nine of her 18 points in the fourth quarter, including a go-ahead basket with 6.1 seconds left, and the Los Angeles Sparks beat Indiana 81-79 on Wednesday night, snapping the Fever's six-game winning streak. Marissa Coleman and Briann January made back-to-back 3-pointers for Indiana to tie it at 79 with 28 seconds left. Dabovic hit a pullback jumper and Indiana's Shavonte Zellous missed two free throws with 1.9 remaining.

Candace Parker had 15 points, 10 rebounds and nine assists for Los Angeles (11-17). Tamika Catchings recorded her 95th career double-double with 10 points and 10 rebounds for Indiana (17-10), which fell 1 1/2 games behind New York for the Eastern Conference lead. She had five steals to become the first player in WNBA history to reach the 1,000-career mark.

Los Angeles Sparks **66** Tulsa Shock **76**

Riquna Williams and Odyssey Sims scored 15 points each to lead the Tulsa Shock to their fourth straight victory, 76-66 over the Los Angeles Sparks on Friday night. Williams hit a key 3-pointer as the shot clock expired with 1:27 left to up Tulsa's lead to 73-66 and, on the next possession, the Sparks had a 3-pointer waved off because of a shot-clock violation.

Courtney Paris had her sixth double-double of the season with 12 points and 13 rebounds and Karima Christmas had 11 points as the Shock (14-14) won their ninth home game of the season, the most since moving from Detroit in 2010. They are one win or a Seattle loss from their first playoff appearance in Tulsa. Candace Parker had her seventh straight double-double with 24 points and 11 rebounds. She had 19 points in the second half to help the Sparks (11-18) battle back from a 15-point deficit.

Kristi Toliver scored 15 points for the Sparks and Candace Parker posted her 11th double-double in 14 games with 10 points and 11 rebounds. San Antonio (7-23) pulled within 49-45 on Jia Perkins's jumper with 7:20 left, but Toliver knocked down an 18-footer and Alana Beard converted a layup off a Parker feed to push the lead back to 53-45. Perkins finished with 15 points to lead the Stars. Sophia Young-Malcolm added 11 points and Jayne Appel grabbed 13 rebounds.

Los Angeles Sparks **93** Washington Mystics **91**

Candace Parker posted her 12th double-double in 15 games and Nneke Ogwumike did the same in her first game back after missing seven games to an injury to power Los Angeles to a 93-91 win over the Washington Mystics on Thursday night. Parker finished with 26 points and 11 rebounds while Ogwumike added 24 points and 10 boards as the Sparks overcame a 15-point first-half deficit and earned their fifth win in six games.

Los Angeles (13-18) has won 10 of 15 games since Parker returned from an injury and the Sparks now have a 3 1/2-game lead over Seattle for the fourth Western Conference playoff spot. Washington (16-14) now has lost five of its last six, a streak compounded by a back injury to Kara Lawson, who missed her fourth straight game. Emma Meesseman had 19 points and Ivory Latta added 18 to lead Washington.

Los Angeles Sparks **92** Tulsa Shock **73**

Candace Parker scored a season-high 33 points and Nneke Ogwumike added 26, to help the Los Angeles Sparks clinch the final playoff spot in the Western Conference by beating the Tulsa Shock 92-73 on Sunday. It will be the Sparks' 15th postseason appearance, the most by any WNBA team. Parker, who made a career-high five 3-pointers, added eight rebounds and five assists while Ogwumike finished with nine rebounds and three steals. Jantel Lavender had 10 points, nine rebounds and three blocks for Los Angeles (14-18). Pierson and Odyssey Sims scored 21 apiece for Tulsa, which had its six game win streak snapped.

Ana Dabovic scored all 10 of her points in the fourth as Los Angeles closed the game with an 18-3 run. Los Angeles recorded season-highs for field goals made in a half (21), points in a first half (49), field goal percentage in a half (.618), field goal percentage (.607) and 3-point field goal percentage (.545). The Sparks tied a season high by making 37 field goals. Los Angeles has won three in a row and six of its last seven.
