The Sparks are set to hit the road once again after a one-game home stand, where they will take on a San Antonio team that they defeated on four of five occasions in 2015. In their most recent meeting, a 60-52 victory by the Sparks, Jantel Lavender led all scorers with 24 points, and Candace Parker recorded a double-double with 10 points and 11 rebounds. The Sparks outscored San Antonio by an average score of 75.8 to 68.0 last year, including Los Angeles' largest margin of victory of the season on August 23, a 90-59 romp. San Antonio and Los Angeles are scheduled to meet four times over the course of the 2016 season, with two games slated for each team's home court.

SPARK PLUGS

STRONG OUT OF THE GATES

At 5-0, Los Angeles is off to its best start in 13 seasons, when the Sparks began the 2003 campaign 9-0. That season, LA finished with a 24-10 record and reached the 2003 WNBA Finals where the team fell in three games to the Detroit Shock. In 2001, Los Angeles had the same 9-0 start to the season, finishing the season 28-4 en route to its second WNBA title. Los Angeles has come out strong through the first four games, leading the league in scoring offense (88.4 ppg) and defense (71.4 ppg), while ranking second in shooting percentage (.477), trailing only the 5-0 Minnesota Lynx who are shooting .480 for the season.

SHORT-LIVED HOMESTAND

After spending 10 days on the road in four different cities, the Sparks return home for just one game against the San Antonio Stars. The Stars and Sparks will have a quick turnaround, playing in Texas two days later. Last season, Los Angeles won four of five meetings between the two teams, although none of the games were a part of a back-to-back. San Antonio currently sits at 1-3, winning their most recent game by a score of 79-78 over the Chicago Sky. Los Angeles will have their first multi-game homestand from June 14 through June 21 where the Sparks will play three consecutive home games.

THREE-POINT BARRAGE

Los Angeles might be a stranger to rain, but the Sparks know how to change the weather. Shooting 35.7% from beyond the arc, the Sparks currently lead the league in three-point shooting. Led by rainmakers Kristi Toliver (.455/5th) and Candace Parker (.429/8th) who rank in the top-10 of qualified shooters (at least one made three-pointer per game) while Nneka Ogumike (.667) ranks highly but has only three attempts from three-point range.

ATOP THE LEADERBOARD

With the league's best scoring offense, it is expected that you will find multiple Sparks on the statistical leaderboard in the early-going of the 2016 season. **Candace Parker** currently sits at 4th in points per game with her mark of 20.8, while teammate **Nneka Ogumike** isn't far behind with 15.6 points per game, good for 14th in the league. **Kristi Toliver** also finds herself in the top 20, sitting at 20th in the league with 13.4 points per game. Los Angeles is the only team with three top-20 scorers in the league, showing the Sparks emphasis on offensive efficiency. **Ogumike** (62.8%) and **Alana Beard** (53.1%) also both rank in the top-11 of the WNBA, shooting some of the highest percentages in the league. In regards to the three-point shot, **Toliver** (45.5%) and **Parker** (42.9%) each sit in the top-10 from behind the arc. Not only are **Toliver** and **Parker** scoring at a high level, but the two Sparks' veterans are sharing the ball as well as anybody, both ranking in the top-20 of assists with 4.8 and 4.0 assists, respectively. While the Sparks are statistically one of the lowest-rebounding teams in the WNBA, **Ogumike** currently brings in 8.8 boards per contest, good for fourth in the league.

EARLY-SEASON EXCELLENCE

One player does not dictate an entire team's success or failures, but Candace Parker's performance in the early-going of the 2016 season is one of the main reason the Sparks find themselves at 5-0. The two-time MVP earned Western Conference Player of the Week Honors for her performance on the week of 5/23 through 5/29. For the week, Parker averaged 24.0 points, 6.5 rebounds and 3.5 assists. As strong as her performance was to close out the month of May, Parker's regular season numbers are even higher. Through five games of the 2016 season, Parker is averaging 20.8 points per game to go along with 7.8 rebounds and 4.0 assists. As one of the supreme talents in the WNBA, Parker has put herself squarely in the MVP discussion with her early-season success.

PICK-POCKETING AT ITS FINEST

While the offense has stolen the headlines so far, the Sparks also have assembled the league's best scoring defense in 2016, allowing just 71.4 points per game through five contests. One reason for that is their league-best 11.2 steals per game, which is almost two steals more than the closest competition. **Alana Beard** has led the charge on defense with her 16 steals through five games, which ranks second in the WNBA. **Candace Parker** has continued to show her defensive prowess as well, recording 1.6 steals per game in 2016.

NEW MEMBER OF THE 200 WIN CLUB

Sparks head coach Brian Agler earned his 200th career WNBA victory on May 20 with the Sparks win over Washington. Agler currently sits at sixth in WNBA history with 203 career victories after his team's win on May 26 against the Connecticut Sun. Agler ranks fourth among coaches with at least 150 wins with a .517 winning percentage spanning over 13 seasons in the league. He began his professional coaching career in the American Basketball League, recording 82 victories in three seasons with the Columbus Quest, winning two championships in that time. His combined 280 victories are the most among professional women's basketball head coaches. With an abundance of talent coupled with several key veteran players on this year's Sparks roster, Agler figures to see that total grow considerably throughout the season.

FAMILY TIES

Not only did the Connecticut Sun feature a former Sparks coach, Curt Miller, on the sideline, but the Sun also have Chiney Ogumike on its roster, the younger sister of Sparks forward **Nneka Ogumike**. After missing the 2015 season to injury, Nneka and Chiney were able to go head-to-head for the first time in 2016 in the Sparks' 77-72 victory. The two sisters dominated the boards, with Nneka recording an 11-point, 11-rebound performance while Chiney scored five points and brought in a team-high nine rebounds for the game. **Nneka** and Chiney played together for two years at Stanford, where both sisters went on to well-decorated collegiate careers on the basketball court.

SPARK PLUGS

THERE'S NO PLACE LIKE...THE ROAD?

After only one home game to begin the 2016 campaign, the Los Angeles Sparks recently wrapped up a 10-day road trip that took them to Washington D.C., New York, Chicago and Connecticut. The four-game stretch is the Sparks second-longest of the season, with Los Angeles due to make a five-game road trip in July, spanning 12 days before the league begins its Olympic Break. Last year, the Sparks went just 5-12 away from home, a mark that has already been greatly improved in 2016 with a current 4-0 record away from Staples Center.

SEASON-OPENING RECORD

The Los Angeles Sparks got the 2016 season started on an extremely positive note, defeating the Seattle Storm by a score of 96-66. The 30-point margin of victory is the franchise's largest in a season-opening game, as Los Angeles shot a scorching 54.5% from the floor, including 40.0% from three-point range. Los Angeles took advantage of 24 Storm turnovers, turning those miscues into 30 points. After failing to defeat Seattle in four attempts last season, the Sparks were able to overcome their Western Conference foes and protect their home court in the process. After breaking the 90-point barrier only three times in 2015, the Sparks offense easily broke that barrier with a 51-point first half, punctuated by 31 points in the final quarter. The Sparks continued their impressive pace with another 30-point victory over Washington on May 20, the first time in franchise history that the team has opened up the regular

season with two victories by that wide of a margin.

HISTORICAL MATCHUP

While every regular season game is important in the WNBA, some matchups carry more weight than others, including Los Angeles' recent trip to New York. The Sparks and Liberty hold a special place in WNBA history, as the two teams took part in the league's inaugural regular season game in 1997. Current Sparks Executive Vice President and General Manager Penny Toler made the first basket in WNBA history, knocking down a jumper to put the league's first points on the board. Their May 21 matchup was the first of three between these cross-country rivals this season.

20 YEARS OF MEMORIES

2016 marks the 20th year since the WNBA's inception, and the league continues to grow in popularity with each new season. While the league started with eight teams in 1997, the WNBA has since grown to include 12 teams in 11 states. Los Angeles is one of three original franchises (NY, Phoenix, LA) remaining from the league's inaugural season. The league has seen eight different franchises earn championships over the 20-year span, including two from the Los Angeles Sparks. The now defunct Houston Comets hold the record with four WNBA championships, winning each of the league's first four titles before the franchise folded in 2008.

HEAD COACH BRIAN AGLER (2nd Season)

On January 5, 2015, Brian Agler joined the Los Angeles Sparks as the 12th head coach in franchise history, bringing with him over 30 years of head-coaching experience, including 11 in the WNBA.

In his first season with LA and 12th in the WNBA, Agler led the Sparks to a league-best 15th postseason appearance, finishing 4th in the Western Conference standings (14-20). The all-time winningest coach in women's professional basketball history, Agler enters the 2016 season two wins shy of 200 career WNBA (198) regular season wins to go along with his 78 wins in the ABL.

Agler came to the Sparks from Seattle, where he led the Storm to six consecutive playoff appearances (2008-2013) in seven years. He compiled a 136-102 (.571) record during his time in the Pacific Northwest, including his 212th career (WNBA and ABL) victory in 2012. The win on June 1 against the Tulsa Shock moved him past Van Chancellor (211), former coach of the Houston Comets, to become the all-time winningest coach in women's professional basketball.

In 2010 the Storm captured the league's championship title, its second, with an impressive regular season record of 28-6 and an undefeated playoff record of 7-0. Additionally, Coach Agler was recognized as the WNBA's Coach of the Year. Prior to joining the Storm in 2008, Agler was the head coach and general manager of the expansion team Minnesota Lynx from 1999-2002, where he compiled a 42-54 (.438) record. Before being named the first coach of the expansion Lynx, Agler served as the head coach of the Columbus Quest of the ABL from 1996-1999, compiling an 82-22 record. He led the Quest to back-to-back ABL championships in 1997 and 1998 and was named the ABL Coach of the Year for the 1996-97 season.

Agler completed his third season as an assistant coach for the San Antonio Silver Stars in 2007. Prior to joining San Antonio, he served as an assistant coach with the Phoenix Mercury in 2004 and helped guide the team to a 17-17 record after the Mercury finished with an 8-26 record in 2003.

Agler spent 15 seasons coaching among the collegiate ranks, including 13 seasons as a head coach. He posted an impressive collegiate record of 248-135 (.648 winning percentage). From 1993-96 he served as the head women's basketball coach at Kansas State. In 1998, Agler took over as the head women's coach at the University of Missouri-Kansas City. In five seasons at UMKC, Agler was 85-54 and took the Kangaroos from a 9-16 record in 1988-89 to four straight winning seasons with 17 or more victories.

As the head women's basketball coach at Northeast Oklahoma A&M Junior College from 1984-88, Agler compiled a 124-42 record (.747 winning percentage). In 1985-86, NEO A&M was ranked second nationally and posted a 30-2 record.

Agler attended Wittenberg University in Springfield, Ohio, where he starred on the basketball team for four seasons. He led the Tigers to their only NCAA Division III Championship in basketball as a freshman. He started all 112 games during his college career, leaving the school as the all-time assist leader (481). Agler helped lead his team to a 91-21 record during his four years with the Tigers, and was named most valuable player in the Ohio Athletic Conference and first-team All-America as a senior. In 1995, he was inducted into the Wittenberg Hall of Honor.

ASSISTANT COACH AMBER STOCKS (2nd Season)

Amber Stocks joined the Los Angeles Sparks coaching staff on April 14, 2015, bringing with her 13 years of coaching experience both in the WNBA and at the collegiate level.

A veteran women's collegiate basketball coach and analyst, Stocks joins Los Angeles for her first coaching stint in the WNBA. Most recently she served the past year as a men's and women's basketball analyst for ESPN3 and Big East Digital Network. Prior to moving to the television side, she was the program director and head coach of the Tucson HEAT Basketball Association in Arizona (2009-2013).

Stocks served as an assistant women's basketball coach at Xavier University from 2002-2009. During her years with Xavier, she helped put together six 20-win seasons and six national postseason appearances, including four NCAA Tournaments. Prior to joining Xavier in 2002, Stocks spent two seasons as women's director of basketball operations for the University of Tennessee, working closely with then Lady Vols head coach Pat Summitt on the daily operations of the program. She was part of the staff that helped lead Tennessee to two regular season SEC Championships and advanced to the 2002 Final Four.

Stocks is also a certified strength and conditioning coach, overseeing strength and conditioning at the University of Notre Dame (1999-2000) and serving on the staff for the University of Cincinnati and Xavier (1998 – 1999) during her undergraduate careers.

She attended the University of Cincinnati where she was a four-time Bearcat Scholar honoree, three-time Defensive Player Award recipient and helped lead the Bearcats to a Conference USA Championship. She graduated from UC in 1999 with a bachelor's degree in health promotion and education.

ASSISTANT COACH TONYA EDWARDS (1st Season)

Tonya Edwards enters her first season as an assistant coach with the Sparks, bringing 18 years of coaching experience to her first coaching stint in the WNBA.

Edwards is reunited with head coach Brian Agler whom she played for in both the ABL (Columbus Quest) and the WNBA (Minnesota Lynx). Drafted in 1999 by Agler, then head coach of the Lynx, she was named a WNBA All-Star as a rookie, and went on to play five seasons in the league with Minnesota, Phoenix, and Charlotte before finishing her playing career overseas.

Most recently, Edwards served as the head coach of Alcorn State University (2008-15), where she led the Lady Braves to the SWAC Championship game in 2012 and was named 2010-11 SWAC Coach of the Year. Prior to Alcorn State, Edwards served as an assistant coach at the University of Detroit-Mercy (2006-08), the Chicago Blaze (2005) of the National Women's Basketball League and two seasons at Mott Community College (1990-92).

Her coaching career began at her alma mater, Northwestern Community High School, where she earned a 78-23 record in four seasons (1991-94), winning a state title in 1993 while subsequently being named the Michigan High School Coach of the Year.

Edwards attended the University of Tennessee (1986-1990), where she won two national championships with the Lady Vols (1987, 1989) and was named most valuable player in the 1987 NCAA Tournament. She finished her career with 1,309 points and was inducted into the UT Hall of Fame in 2006.
