Pack the Park – The Dallas Wings (0-0) tip off the season at home against the Atlanta Dream (0-0) on Saturday, May 20 at 12 p.m. CT at College Park Center with the game nationally televised on ABC.

Talk of the Town – Arike Ogunbowale will start her fifth season with the Dallas Wings following a 2022 season that saw her finish tied for third in the WNBA in scoring and become a WNBA All-Star for the second time in her career. Ogunbowale averaged 19.7 points, 3.3 rebounds and 3.6 assists in her fourth season.

Ogunbowale became the third-quickest player to reach 1,000 career points in WNBA history and then the third-fastest player to reach 1,500 at the New York Liberty on 7/5/21.

Against the Phoenix Mercury on 6/17/22, Ogunbowale became the fifth-fastest player in WNBA history to reach 2000 points (102 games). Her 12 30-point games are also the most in the WNBA since she entered the league in 2019.

New Kids on the Block – The game will feature the debut of two top draft picks: the Dallas Wings' Maddy Siegrist (Villanova, 3rd overall) and the Atlanta Dream's Haley Jones (Stanford, 6th overall). After leading the NCAA in scoring (29.2 ppg) in the 2022-23 season, Siegrist will take the court for the first time as a professional. Siegrist played 19 minutes in the Wings' two preseason games and scored seven points. Jones played 41:30 in the Dream's two preseason games where she scored a combined 9 points and provided 7 assists (6 vs. Washington).

Preseason Prep – The preseason saw the Wings beat the Chicago Sky 75-70 on May 5th at home and fall to the Indiana Fever 90-83 in Indianapolis on May 13. . Teaira McCowan led the Wings with 17 points against the Sky and also tied for the team lead with eight rebounds and rejected three shots. Natasha Howard represented the second "big" to score in double digits with 11 points in her first game in a Wings uniform, while also tying for the team lead with eight rebounds. Arike Ogunbowale joined the duo in double digits with ten points of her own.

Satou Sabally finished the game in Indiana with 18 points, a team-leading nine rebounds and was perfect from the free throw line, accounting for 7 of the team's 16 free throws. Arike Ogunbowale recorded 18 points alongside Sabally. Two other Wings' players reached double figures as Natasha Howard chipped in with 11 points, five rebounds and three assists, while center Teaira McCowan recorded 14 points and four rebounds. All five starters recorded three assists on the day and as a team the Wings finished with 18 assists on 29 made field goals.

Makin’ Moves – The Dallas Wings acquired All-Star guard Diamond DeShields, two-time All-Star forward Natascha Howard and 2020 WNBA Rookie of the Year guard Crystal Dangerfield prior to the 2023 season. The trio brings a combined 16 years of experience to the Wings.

DeShields, a 2018 All-WNBA Rookie Team member and 2021 WNBA Champion with the Sky, is entering her sixth season in the league. In 2022, her only season with the Phoenix Mercury, DeShields averaged nearly 14 points and four rebounds. For her career, she has posted an average of 13 points and four rebounds per game. In 2019 with Chicago, DeShields started all 34 games for the team, averaging over 16 points and five rebounds. She led the Sky in scoring and finished eighth overall in the WNBA on her way to an All-WNBA Second Team selection. The third overall pick by the Sky in 2018, DeShields totaled over 14 points and nearly five rebounds per game in her first campaign in the league and was named a member of the 2018 WNBA All-Rookie Team.

Dangerfield, acquired via trade with the New York Liberty on January 16, is entering her fourth season in the WNBA. She won the 2020 WNBA Rookie of the Year Award after averaging 16.2 points and nearly four assists for the Minnesota Lynx. In three seasons, Dangerfield has appeared in 85 games and averaged nearly nine points and three assists.

Howard, a three-time WNBA Champion (2017, 2018, 2020), two-time WNBA All-Star (2019, 2022), two-time WNBA All-Defensive Team selection (2018, 2019), the 2019 WNBA Defensive Player of the Year and the 2018 WNBA Most Improved Player, joins the Wings following an All-Star season with the Liberty. Howard started 35 games in 2022 and averaged 15.1 points, 7.3 rebounds and 2.3 assists. Howard, who will enter her 10th WNBA season in 2023, has made playoff appearances in each of her nine seasons, totaling 48 in her career. Howard was drafted fifth overall by the Indiana Fever in 2014. Her career has included stops in Indiana, Minnesota, Seattle and New York.

About the Cup:

HEAD COACH

Latricia Trammell joins the Wings after spending the previous four seasons with the Los Angeles Sparks. Tasked primarily with overseeing the defense, Trammell was part of a staff that led a top-three defensive net rating for three consecutive years from 2019 to 2021. Over the past four seasons, Los Angeles also saw four players named to the WNBA All-Defensive teams, including the 2020 WNBA Defensive Player of the Year in Candace Parker. Prior to her stint in LA, Trammell spent one season as an assistant coach with the San Antonio Stars in 2017.

With almost 30 years of coaching experience, Trammell has amassed a career head coaching record of 255-131 (.661) between the collegiate and high school ranks. Trammell spent three seasons at the helm of Oklahoma City

University where the team won back-to-back NAIA National Championships in 2014 and 2015. Trammell was named NAIA Coach of the Year both seasons. Trammell recorded a record of 85-10 over the course of her time at OKCU.

Prior to her time at Oklahoma City, she spent five seasons at Western State (Colo.) University and ranks third all-time in wins in the history of the program. Overall, she totaled a 150-86 (.664) collegiate coaching record. Prior to joining the collegiate ranks, Trammell spent six years coaching high school girls' basketball in Texas and Oklahoma, tallying a 105-45 (.700) record.

The Claremore, Okla. native was a prep star at Seminole High School, setting a state record for most points in a single game (46) and recording 15 games of 40 or more points enroute to multiple all-conference, all-region and all-state honors.

field goals in a single game. Siegrist was named the 2023 Katrina McClain Award winner, as the best power forward in the country. The former Wildcat, who also won the Big East Freshman of the Year in 2019, averaged 24.3 points and 9.3 rebounds throughout her four-year career where she started 116 of the 119 games she appeared in and also recorded 55 double-doubles in her four-year career.
