## Last Time They Met: DAL 87, LVA 106 (8/17/25)

The Dallas Wings fell at the Las Vegas Aces 106-87 on Sunday afternoon at Michelob ULTRA Arena despite a career-high 23 points from Maddy Siegrist. The Wings struggled from three, going just 3-17, while the Aces made 18 triples and scored 23 points off 13 Dallas turnovers to pull away. Siegrist added six rebounds, two blocks and two steals, matching her career high in steals. Paige Bueckers joined Siegrist in double figures with 18 points, stretching her double-digit scoring streak to 28 games, while adding five rebounds and four assists.

### First Quarter: Dallas 27, Las Vegas 31

Dallas featured a starting lineup of Grace Berger, Paige Bueckers, Maddy Siegrist, Haley Jones and Luisa Geiselsöder. The Wings were without Li Yueru, Arike Ogunbowale and Ty Harris due to injuries.

The first 10 minutes saw six ties and four lead changes with Siegrist tying for the game high with nine points off 4-5 shooting, including 1-2 from three. The Wings assisted on eight of 11 makes with Geiselsöder posting a team-high three assists. Both teams had a hot-shooting quarter, with Dallas making 55 percent of its attempts from the field and Las Vegas making 62.5 percent. A'ja Wilson and Kierstan Bell each had nine points for the Aces.

### Second Quarter: Dallas 17, Las Vegas 24

Las Vegas opened the second on a 10-4 run to take a 10-point lead, 41-31, with 7:12 left in the first half. The Wings struggled from three, going 0-3, while the Aces drained a trio of triples. Bueckers had a team-high seven points in the quarter to bring her total to 11 in the first half. Siegrist matched Bueckers for the team high with 11 points while Aziha James added four in the quarter towards her seven in the first half.

### Third Quarter: Dallas 22, Las Vegas 26

The Wings kept the Aces off the scoreboard until 7:45 when Wilson made 1-of-2 free-throws. Las Vegas missed its first four attempts from the field and was held without a field goal until 5:15 left in the quarter, with its first six points all coming from the free-throw line. After the cold start, the Aces made seven of their next 10 attempts from the field to grow their advantage back to double-digits. Siegrist had eight points in the third to lead the Wings, while Wilson added 14 for Las Vegas towards her game high 32. .

### Fourth Quarter: Dallas 21, Las Vegas 25

The Wings got no closer than 12 in the fourth as a 7-0 Aces run at the midway point brought the deficit to 19 at 93-74. The Wings' struggles from deep continued, going 0-6 while Las Vegas knocked down 5-of-10 from three. Myisha Hines-Allen led Dallas in scoring in the fourth with five points on 2-2 shooting.

On the afternoon, Dallas shot 48.7 percent from the field, making 38 field goals for the second consecutive game – marking just the second time in franchise history the Wings made 38+ field goals in back-to-back contests. Dallas attempted just nine free-throws, going 8-9, while Las Vegas was 20-23. The Aces shot 50-percent from the field (34-68) and nearly 53 percent from three (18-34). The 18 triples were the most by a Wings opponent in franchise history and the second-highest total by any team in WNBA history.

Dallas outrebounded Las Vegas 37-28 and held the advantage in points in the paint (58-32), second chance points (20-6) and fast break points (14-3). Wilson led the Aces with a game-high 34 points, while Chelsea Gray dished a game-best 14 assists.

## Matchup Storylines and Key Notes

**Preseason History...** The Wings and Aces have faced off in preseason competition five times since the 2015 season, with the Wings holding a 3-2 record. In their most recent preseason battle, Dallas fell to Las Vegas 112-78, on May 2, 2025 at Purcell Pavilion on the University of Notre Dame's campus. The contest marked a homecoming for a trio of Notre Dame players including Wings guard Arike Ogunbowale (2015-19) and Aces guards Jewell Loyd (2012-15) and Jackie Young (2016-19). JJ Quinerly led the way for the Wings in her unofficial WNBA debut, notching 16 points, two rebounds, two assists, two steals and one block in the effort. Paige Bueckers and Aziaha James each added 10 points in the first preseason game of their professional careers.

**Strong First Showing...** Dallas took home the 95-80 win in their first preseason game of 2026 on the road against the Indiana Fever on Thursday, April 30. Reigning WNBA Rookie of the Year Paige Bueckers picked up where she left off, leading the Wings with 20 points, two rebounds, three assists and one steal in 20 minutes of action. Fourth-year forward Maddy Siegrist added a double-double, notching 18 points, 11 rebounds, one steal and one block on the night, while sophomore guard Aziaha James was a strong presence coming off the bench, scoring 17 points, three rebounds, four assists and one steal.

**Season One Under Jose Fernandez...** Head Coach Jose Fernandez unofficially kicked-off his inaugural season at the helm of the Wings in the team's April 30 preseason match up in Indiana. Fernandez was hired on October 27, 2025, and brings nearly 35 years of coaching experience to Dallas, with the last 25 years spent as head coach of the University of South Florida women's basketball team. He earned nearly 500 career wins at USF while guiding more than 100 players into professional basketball careers worldwide. Under Fernandez, South Florida has had seven WNBA Draft selections, including current active players Courtney Williams of the Minnesota Lynx, Kitja Laksa of the Toronto Tempo and Wings forward Dulcy Fankam Mendjiadeu.

**Franchise All-Time Leading Scorer Returns...** Highlighting the Wings' 2026 free agency success was the re-signing of eighth-year veteran guard Arike Ogunbowale. Originally selected fifth overall by the Wings in the 2019 WNBA Draft, Ogunbowale has spent her entire WNBA career in Dallas and has established herself as one of the most accomplished players in franchise and league history. She enters the 2026 season as the Wings' all-time leader in points, field goals made, three-pointers made and free throws made, while sitting just 42 assists and 50 steals away from becoming the franchise's all-time leader in those categories as well. Ogunbowale's résumé is among the most decorated in the WNBA. She is a four-time WNBA All-Star (2021–2024) and a two-time All-Star Game MVP (2021, 2024). Her league honors also include All-WNBA First Team (2020), All-WNBA Second Team (2021, 2024), and WNBA All-Rookie Team (2019).

**First Look at the People's Princess...** Entering the WNBA Draft with another transformative opportunity holding the No. 1 pick for the second straight year, the Dallas Wings selected sharpshooting guard Azzi Fudd out of the University of Connecticut. Accolades poured in for Fudd during her final season in Storrs, claiming All-America honors from the Associated Press, USBWA and Wooden Award. She was the 2026 BIG EAST Scholar-Athlete of the Year and All-BIG EAST First Team member, while also earning NCAA Fort Worth Regional 1 All-Region Team recognition, leading the Huskies to their 25th trip to the Final Four. The 2025 NCAA National Champion averaged a career-high 17.7 points per game on personal-best shooting percentages (.489/.455/.955) during her senior campaign.

**New Season, New Faces...** 2026 WNBA Free Agency brought a plethora of new signings for the franchise, including key pieces that will bring veteran leadership, defensive prowess and strong paint presences. Experienced forwards Alanna Smith and Jessica Shepard join the Wings this season after helping lead Minnesota to a league-best 34-10 regular season record. Smith was named 2025 WNBA Co-Defensive Player of the Year and WNBA All-Defensive First Team, while Shepard shot a WNBA-best 63.8-percent from the field. Additionally, Dallas added three-time WNBA Champion Alysha Clark and veteran point-guards Lindsay Allen and Odyssey Sims to the roster in early April.

**Year 2 for Paige Bueckers...** Fresh off a Rookie of the Year performance in her inaugural WNBA season, Paige Bueckers looks to build on that success as she heads into her sophomore campaign. In addition to Rookie of the Year, she was also named a WNBA All-Star, All-WNBA Second Team selection, and to multiple Associated Press All-Rookie and All-WNBA teams. She averaged 19.2 points, 5.4 assists, and 1.6 steals per game, finishing top-nine league-wide in scoring, assists, and steals. Her efficiency stood out, posting a league-best 20.3 efficiency rating among guards, highlighted by a record-setting 44-point performance and a 30-game double-digit scoring streak. Along the way, she rewrote the Dallas Wings' rookie record book and became just the 10th rookie ever to start a WNBA All-Star Game.

# Jose Fernandez

## Head Coach

Jose Fernandez enters his first season as the Head Coach of the Dallas Wings.

A veteran leader, Fernandez brings nearly 35 years of coaching experience to Dallas, with the last 25 years spent as head coach of the University of South Florida women's basketball team. Fernandez helped build the Bulls into one of the most consistently successful programs in the nation.

A proven winner and established leader in player development, Fernandez earned nearly 500 career wins at USF while guiding more than 100 players into professional basketball careers

worldwide. Under Fernandez, South Florida has had seven WNBA Draft selections, including current active players Courtney Williams of the Minnesota Lynx and Kitja Laksa of the Phoenix Mercury. In total, nearly 30 of Fernandez's former players are actively playing professionally in 2025-26.

Fernandez was hired as USF's Head Coach on Nov. 14, 2000, and would become the program's all-time winningest coach. Fernandez led the Bulls to 19 or more wins in 14 consecutive seasons and 19 post-season berths, including 10 NCAA Tournament appearances. Over the previous four seasons, he guided USF to two AAC Regular Season Championships and two AAC Tournament Championships.

Fernandez has recruited and coached 58 all-conference players, two Associated Press Honorable Mention All-Americans, three members of the USF Athletics Hall of Fame, two conference Players of the Year, one AAC Defensive Player of the Year, five conference Freshmen of the Year, two AAC Newcomers of the Year, two AAC Sixth Players of the Year, and four conference Most Improved Players.

Highly respected in the industry, the Miami native was a finalist for the 2021 WBCA Division I National Coach of the Year, a two-time American Athletic Conference Coach of the Year and is the current President of the Women's Basketball Coaches Association (WBCA).

Fernandez has also been active in international basketball. He has won two gold medals with USA Basketball's U18 and U19 National Teams, serving as an assistant coach. At USF, Fernandez has recruited and coached players from over 22 different countries.

Prior to his time at South Florida, Fernandez served as a men's basketball assistant coach at Miami-Dade College (1991-92) and Miami Sunset High School (1992-94), before becoming an assistant at Barry University (1994-96). After coaching girls' basketball at Lourdes Academy from 1996-99, Fernandez served as the top assistant for Barry's women's team from 1999-00.

Jose and his wife Tonya are proud parents to five daughters, Sydney, Alex, Taylor, Brianna, and Brooke, and have eight rescue dogs.
