Napheesa Collier scored 22 of her game-high 26 points in the second half while Courtney Williams netted 17 points and six rebounds to help the Lynx edge Chicago, 92-87, in both teams' preseason finales on Saturday night at Target Center. Consecutive 3-pointers from Rachel Banham staked the Sky to a 17-11 lead and Rebecca Allen's layup in the closing seconds sent Chicago into the second quarter in front 27-25. Diamond Miller ignited a 12-0 burst and Marième Badiane gave Minnesota its largest lead at 44-33 with 5:06 to play before halftime. The Sky narrowed that deficit to 48-42 by intermission, but the Lynx remained ahead through the third period thanks to 13 points from Collier and clung to a 72-69 advantage with 10 minutes left. The lead changed hands on four occasions down the stretch and Haley Van Lith's 3-pointer put the Sky on top 84-82 at the 3:42 mark. However, the Lynx held Chicago without a field goal the rest of the way to claim the victory. Jessica Shepard had 10 points, nine rebounds and nine assists for Minnesota while Banham and Kia Nurse paced the Sky with 14 points apiece and Kamilla Cardoso grabbed eight rebounds.

Previous Game: Tuesday, May 6 – Chicago 74, Minnesota 69

Courtney Vandersloot collected 11 points, five rebounds and four steals, and Chicago reeled off 10 unanswered points in the final two minutes to edge the Lynx, 74-69, on Tuesday night at Wintrust Arena. Consecutive treys from Ariel Atkins and Kia Nurse put the Sky in front 15-8 and Elizabeth Williams capped a 6-0 finish that gave Chicago its largest lead at 24-11 after one quarter. Minnesota responded with an 11-0 burst to open the second period, but the Sky remained in front and Vandersloot beat the halftime buzzer for a 42-36 cushion. The Lynx grabbed their first lead when Bridget Carleton's 3-pointer made it 43-42 early in the third quarter and a late Grace Berger jumper kept Minnesota tie it at 54-54 entering the fourth. Chicago used triples from Rebecca Allen and Rachel Banham to rebuild an eight-point advantage, only to see Alissa Pili's long-distance strike ignite a 10-0 reply over the next two minutes. Another Pili 3-pointer put the Lynx in front 67-64 with 2:13 remaining, but Haley Van Lith put Chicago in front to stay at the 1:31 mark. Alanna Smith led Minnesota with 10 points and nine rebounds while Pili chipped in nine points.

The Lynx have dropped five of their last six trips to College Park Center, the lone success a 90-81 win on Aug. 24, 2023. The 107-67 home loss on July 12, 2023, was Minnesota's largest losing margin of all-time.

First Meeting: Kayla McBride tallied 25 points and Napheesa Collier chipped in 24 points and 14 rebounds to help the Lynx rally past Dallas, 87-76, on June 2 at Target Center. Arike Ogunbowale led the Wings with 21 points and six steals but committed a career-high 10 turnovers.

Second Meeting: Kayla McBride scored 19 points and Natisha Hiedeman added 17 as the Lynx held off Dallas, 90-78, on June 17 at Target Center. Alanna Smith swiped five steals for Minnesota while Monique Billings finished with 15 points, 10 rebounds and nine assists for the Wings.

Third Meeting: Arike Ogunbowale tallied 23 points and nine assists, and Odyssey Sims added 16 of her 18 points in the second half to help Dallas snap its 11-game losing streak with a 94-88 victory over the Lynx on June 27 at College Park Center. Napheesa Collier led Minnesota with 29 points and 11 rebounds.

Fourth Meeting: Arike Ogunbowale scored 25 points and Satou Sabally collected 18 points, eight rebounds and six assists as Dallas posted its third consecutive victory with a 94-76 decision over the Lynx on Aug. 30 at College Park Center. Napheesa Collier finished with 17 points and 10 rebounds for Minnesota, which saw its seven-game winning streak halted.

The Lynx have won 13 of the teams' last 15 meetings overall, beginning with a 96-78 victory on Aug. 31, 2020 in Bradenton. Minnesota has won its last seven trips to L.A., dating to a 77-68 setback on Sept. 8, 2019.

First Meeting: Napheesa Collier tallied 25 points and nine rebounds as the Lynx notched an 86-62 victory over Los Angeles on June 5 at Crypto.com Arena. Bridget Carleton finished with 15 points for Minnesota while Dearica Hamby led the Sparks with 17 points and 11 rebounds.

Second Meeting: Napheesa Collier tallied 30 points and a club-record eight steals while Courtney Williams added her first double-double of the year in the Lynx' 81-76 victory over L.A. on June 14 at Target Center. The Sparks were paced by 19 points and 10 rebounds from Rickea Jackson.

Third Meeting: Bridget Carleton scored 16 points and Dorka Juhász added 15 to help the Lynx roll past Los Angeles, 82-67, on July 9 at Crypto.com Arena. Kayla McBride and Cecilia Zandalasini finished with 11 points apiece for Minnesota. Dearica Hamby led the Sparks with 18 points and eight rebounds while Azurá Stevens chipped in nine points.

Fourth Meeting: Dearica Hamby scored 20 points and Rickea Jackson added 19 points and eight rebounds as Los Angeles stopped the Lynx' seven-game winning streak with a 68-51 victory on Sept. 19 at Target Center. Diamond Miller and Alissa Pili topped Minnesota with eight points apiece while Alanna Smith had six points and eight rebounds.

THE OPENER: The Lynx begin their 27th season tonight, the 10th time they've started on the road and the first time they've played in Dallas in a season opener. Minnesota is 16-10 all-time on Opening Night (4-5 on the road), snapping a three-game slide with last year's 83-70 victory in Seattle. Of the 12 players who finished 2024 on Minnesota's active roster, eight return this year; they had five holdovers a season ago and eight in 2023... The Lynx feature two rookies on this year's roster: 2025 draft choice Anastasiia Olairi Kosu (15th overall) and free agent Marième Badiane... Napheesa Collier again tops the seniority list, entering her seventh season in a Lynx uniform, while Jessica Shepard returns to Minnesota after missing the 2024 season... LYNX TRAX: Minnesota completed its 26th season in the WNBA by winning a franchise-record 30 games and grabbing the #2 seed in the 2024 Playoffs... It's the seventh time the Lynx have won more than 70% of their games in a given season and the first since going 27-7 (.794) in 2017; their prior high win total was 28, set in the 34-game 2016 season (an .824 winning percentage)... The Lynx edged Connecticut, 78-76, on Sept. 17 in Uncasville to secure the #2 seed; they closed the year by winning 14 of their final 16 starts, featuring a pair of seven-game winning streaks... Minnesota began that final road trip with an 88-79 triumph at New York on Sept. 15, and ended the season with five consecutive road wins, matching its longest such run since 2017... Dallas ended Minnesota's seven-game winning streak with the 94-76 verdict on Aug. 30; in the Lynx' prior visit to Arlington (June 27), they saw a six-game run halted by the Wings... The Lynx began that two-game road trip with an 89-76 triumph in Phoenix on Aug. 28... Minnesota handed Indiana a 90-80 setback on Aug. 24; the attendance (19,023) is the largest regular season figure for a home game in Lynx history and ranks fourth overall (19,521 for Game 3 vs. New York on Oct. 16 is now the all-time record)... The Lynx beat Las Vegas for the second time in three nights with a 87-74 win on Aug. 23; they posted a 98-87 triumph on Aug. 21 at Michelob Ultra Arena... Minnesota swept its home-and-home set vs. Washington with the 99-83 triumph in D.C. on Aug. 17, having beaten the Mystics 79-68 on Aug. 15... Minnesota went into the Olympic break with an 86-79 home win vs. Atlanta on July 17... Seattle avoided a sweep of its four-game season series vs. the Lynx by rolling to a 91-63 victory on July 12... Minnesota saw its seven-game home winning streak halted with the 78-73 loss to Connecticut on July 4; it was their longest such run of success since 2021... The Lynx claimed the 2024 Commissioner's Cup with a 94-89 win over New York on June 25... Minnesota concluded a 4-0 homestand with the 73-60 victory over Phoenix on June 22; the Lynx began the homestand with an 81-76 win over L.A. on June 14 and followed with victories over Dallas (90-78 on June 17) and Atlanta (68-55 on June 19)...

CHART TOPPERS: Minnesota shot a season-best 59.4% from the field Aug. 21 at Las Vegas, eclipsing their previous high of 57.8% set on Aug. 17 in D.C.; it's just the second time in franchise history the Lynx have shot 55%+ in consecutive games (also Aug. 22-24, 2013)... Minnesota led the WNBA in three-point accuracy (38.0%) and ranked 3rd in three-pointers made per game (9.50)... Atlanta's 28.8% effort on June 19 was the 16th time in team history the Lynx have posted a sub-30% defensive night... Overall, the Lynx held 15 of 40 teams below 40% this year; Minnesota led the WNBA in defensive FG pct (41.0%) and was 2nd in Defensive Rating (94.9)... The Lynx wrapped up May with a 95-71 triumph over Phoenix on May 31, their largest winning margin since a 102-71 win vs. Las Vegas on July 3, 2022... Connecticut dealt the Lynx their first loss of 2024 on May 23, rallying for an 83-82 OT win... Minnesota began the year with a pair of victories over Seattle, 83-70 on May 14 at Climate Pledge Arena and 102-93 in double-OT on May 17 at Target Center...

MARGINAL INFORMATION: Minnesota's largest lead in the Sept. 8 win at Washington was seven, one of just 10 games this year in which they didn't build a lead of 10+... The Lynx made up an 11-point, 1st-quarter deficit to beat Indiana on Sept. 6, their fourth victory this season in games they trailed by 10+ at some point (June 9 vs. Seattle; June 14 vs. L.A., June 30 at Chicago)... The 28-point loss at Seattle on July 12 was Minnesota's largest of the season and matched its biggest ever vs. the Storm (90-62 on June 19, 2009 at KeyArena)... The Lynx won a league-leading 21 games by double-figure spreads in 2024 (New York 20, Las Vegas 20, Connecticut 15, Seattle 14)... Last season, they finished 4-14 in games decided by 10+; only Phoenix (24) and Seattle (15) suffered more double-digit losses... Minnesota enjoyed a 10-game winning streak a year ago in games decided by six points or fewer...
