Natisha Hiedeman and Napheesa Collier tallied 18 points apiece and the Lynx withstood 25 turnovers to notch an 88-65 victory over Phoenix on Tuesday night at Target Center. Satou Sabally helped the Mercury build a 23-14 late in the opening quarter, but a pair of Karlie Samuelson triples highlighted a run of 14 unanswered points that put Minnesota in front to stay midway through the second. The Lynx widened their lead to 44-35 by halftime thanks to 13 points from Hiedeman and hiked that to double figures on a 3-pointer from Kayla McBride early in the third. Phoenix could get no closer than 12 the rest of the way as Minnesota scored on five consecutive possessions, including treys by Alanna Smith and Samuelson, to carry a 67-49 lead into the fourth. Five points from Collier ignited a 12-0 burst, topped off by McBride's 3-pointer, that gave the Lynx their largest advantage of the night at 83-56 with 4:14 left. Collier added 11 rebounds and five assists for Minnesota, which shot a season-high 58.6% from the floor. The Mercury were paced by Lexi Held's 16 points while Sabally contributed 15 points and eight rebounds.

Previous Game: Sunday, June 1 – Minnesota 86, Golden State 75

Napheesa Collier tallied 24 points and 11 rebounds, Courtney Williams added 20 points, and the Lynx pulled away in the second half to notch an 86-75 victory over Golden State on June 1 at Chase Center. Karlie Samuelson's late triple gave Minnesota a 27-23 lead after one quarter and Bridget Carleton capped an 11-1 burst that extended the margin to 32-24 early in the second. Kate Martin erupted for 14 points during an 18-5 response that gave the Valkyries their largest lead at 42-37, and Golden State remained in front 52-51 at halftime. A Veronica Burton layup at the 6:40 mark of the third period kept the Valkyries within 59-58, but Minnesota outscored Golden State 24-3 in the game's next 11 minutes. Consecutive 3-pointers from Collier and Williams finished the outburst, which ended with the Lynx on top 83-61 with 5:41 remaining in the fourth. Minnesota limited Golden State to 1-for-15 shooting with six turnovers during that game-deciding stretch. Kayla McBride chipped in 16 points and Carleton had a dozen for Minnesota, while Burton topped the Valkyries with 21 points and Martin collected 14.

The season-opening May 16 decision was just Minnesota's second win in its last seven trips to College Park Center. The Lynx are 22-8 overall in the series since the Wings franchise relocated to Dallas in 2016.

First Meeting: Napheesa Collier scored 34 points and Courtney Williams added 25 with nine assists as the Lynx opened 2025 with a 99-84 win over Dallas on May 16 at College Park Center. Jessica Shepard netted 15 points and eight rebounds for Minnesota while Diamond Miller chipped in 13 points. Arike Ogunbowale led the Wings with 16 points and DiJonai Carrington tallied 15.

Second Meeting: Napheesa Collier led all scorers with 28 points and added eight rebounds as the Lynx held off Dallas, 85-81, in their home opener on May 21 at Target Center. Courtney Williams and Alanna Smith had 13 points apiece for Minnesota. Arike Ogunbowale finished with 21 points for the Wings while Paige Bueckers added 12 points and 10 assists.

COLLIER MONTH'S BEST IN WEST: On Wednesday, Napheesa Collier was named the WNBA's Western Conference Player of the Month for May, the second such honor of her career (also August 2024). *Collier averaged 26.8 ppg, 7.8 rpg, 3.0 apg, 2.40 spg and 1.40 bpg in five games*, shooting 52.7% from the floor, 43.8% (7-for-16) from three-point range and 93.9% (31-for-33) from the line. She netted 34 points and four assists May 16 at Dallas and collected 33 points, 11 rebounds, three assists, three blocks and three steals May 23 vs. Connecticut. She's one of six players in Lynx history to earn the monthly award, joining Maya Moore (eight), Sylvia Fowles (four), Seimone Augustus (one), Rebekkah Brunson (one) and Lindsay Whalen (one).

INSIDE THE BOX SCORE: The Lynx finished at 58.6% (34-for-58) from the floor vs. Phoenix on Tuesday, *the 10th-best single-game percentage in franchise history*. Meanwhile, Minnesota limited the Mercury to 38.4% (28-for-73) shooting, its third consecutive sub-40% defensive effort (39.4% at Phoenix, May 30; 36.9% at Golden State, June 1). AWARDS SEASON: On Oct. 16, Napheesa Collier was named to the 2024 All-WNBA First Team for the second consecutive year, becoming the fourth player in Lynx history to earn multiple First Team honors (Katie Smith, Lindsay Whalen, Maya Moore). LYNX TRAX: Minnesota completed its 26th season in the WNBA by winning a franchise-record 30 games and grabbing the #2 seed in the 2024 Playoffs... It's the seventh time the Lynx have won more than 70% of their games in a given regular season and the first since going 27-7 (.794) in 2017; their prior high win total was 28, set in the 34-game 2016 season (an .824 winning percentage)... The Lynx edged Connecticut, 78-76, on Sept. 17 in Uncasville to secure the #2 seed; they closed the year by winning 14 of their final 16 starts, featuring a pair of seven-game winning streaks... Minnesota began that final road trip with an 88-79 triumph at New York on Sept. 15, and ended the season with five consecutive road wins, matching its longest such run since 2017... Dallas ended Minnesota's seven-game winning streak with the 94-76 verdict on Aug. 30; in the Lynx' previous visit to Arlington (June 27), they saw a six-game run halted by the Wings... The Lynx began that two-game road trip with an 89-76 triumph in Phoenix on Aug. 28... Minnesota handed Indiana a 90-80 setback on Aug. 24; the attendance (19,023) is the largest regular season figure for a home game in Lynx history and ranks fourth overall (19,521 for Game 3 vs. New York on Oct. 16 is now the all-time record)... The Lynx beat Las Vegas for the second time in three nights with a 87-74 win on Aug. 23; they posted a 98-87 triumph on Aug. 21 at Michelob Ultra Arena... Minnesota swept its home-and-home set vs. Washington with the 99-83 triumph in D.C. on Aug. 17, having beaten the Mystics 79-68 on Aug. 15... Minnesota went into the Olympic break with an 86-79 home win vs. Atlanta on July 17... Seattle avoided a sweep of its four-game season series vs. the Lynx by rolling to a 91-63 victory on July 12... Minnesota saw its seven-game home winning streak halted with the 78-73 loss to Connecticut on July 4; it was their longest such run of success since 2021... The Lynx claimed the 2024 Commissioner's Cup with a 94-89 win over New York on June 25... Minnesota concluded a 4-0 homestand with the 73-60 victory over Phoenix on June 22...
