Last Game: Friday, May 1 – Minnesota 73, Toronto 66

Emma Čechová debuted with 16 points and four blocks, and Olivia Miles added 13 points and six rebounds as the Lynx completed a 3-0 pre-season slate by notching a 73-66 victory over Toronto on May 1 at Target Center. Minnesota limited the Tempo to 27 percent shooting in the opening quarter to pull ahead 18-16, but the second period featured seven lead changes, the final one coming when Elizabeth Balogun's 3-pointer beat the halftime buzzer to give Toronto a 37-36 cushion. The margin grew to five on Temi Fagbenle's layup early in the third period before Čechová and Nia Coffey combined for 12 points to reclaim a 53-52 edge for the Lynx entering the final 10 minutes. Neither team led by more than three points in the fourth quarter until the closing moments, with Kiki Rice's jumper at the 3:24 mark being answered by an Eliška Hamzová 3-pointer that put Minnesota in front to stay at 67-66 and kick-started a 9-0 finish. Miles scored on the Lynx' next possession and a pair of Čechová baskets sealed the win. Kayla McBride tallied 13 points for Minnesota while Balogun topped the Tempo with 12 points and Rice chipped in 10.

Previous Game: Monday, Apr. 27 – Minnesota 88, Nigeria 79

Courtney Williams scored 13 of her 17 points in the first quarter and Olivia Miles added 11 points, five rebounds and five assists as the Lynx notched an 88-79 victory over the Nigerian National Team on Apr. 27 at the T-Mobile Center in Kansas City. Williams' 3-pointer capped a 17-8 start for Minnesota, but Ezinne Kalu and Gabby White rallied Nigeria ahead 42-38 with 2:43 remaining in the second quarter. The Lynx closed the half with an 8-1 burst, highlighted by Jaylyn Sherrod's steal and layup, to reclaim a 46-43 lead. Miles extended the margin to 10 midway through the third period, and after six unanswered by Nigeria whittled the deficit to 63-59 at the 1:31 mark, Eliška Hamzová's triple kicked off a 13-3 surge that put Minnesota in front by 14 with 6:42 remaining in the contest. Nigeria could get no closer than eight the rest of the way, and the Lynx grabbed their largest lead when Reigan Richardson's three-point play made it 87-72 with 1:58 left. Lani White finished with 11 points and Nia Coffey had 10 for Minnesota, while Kalu paced the visitors with 25 points and Gabby White chipped in 16 with seven rebounds.

The Dream took two of three from Minnesota a year ago, with the three games being decided by a total of 10 points. The Lynx have gone 32-14 all-time vs. Atlanta, including 16-5 at Target Center.

First Meeting: Napheesa Collier scored 26 points and the Lynx rallied late to edge Atlanta, 96-92 in overtime, on June 27 at Gateway Center Arena. Kayla McBride netted 18 points for Minnesota while Brionna Jones' 18 points led six double-figure scorers for the Dream.

Second Meeting: Brittney Griner collected 17 of her 22 points in the first half and Jordyn Canada added 18 as Atlanta handed the Lynx their first home loss of the year, 90-86, on July 27 at Target Center. Napheesa Collier finished with 32 points and a season-high seven assists for Minnesota.

Third Meeting: Allisha Gray had 27 points and Atlanta began the fourth period with 12 unanswered points to rally Atlanta past the Lynx, 75-73, on Aug. 21 at Gateway Center Arena. Bridget Carleton's 16 points led Minnesota and Jessica Shepard collected 15 points and 16 rebounds.

COLLIER MONTH'S BEST AGAIN: On Aug. 4, Napheesa Collier was selected as the WNBA's Western Conference Player of the Month for July, her third consecutive monthly honor and the fourth of her career (also August 2024). Collier averaged 23.1 ppg, 6.9 rpg, 3.1 apg, 1.75 spg and 1.92 bpg in 12 games, shooting 55.1% from the floor and 86.8% from the FT line. Meanwhile, the league announced on Aug. 5 that Kayla McBride was selected as the Western Conference Player of the Week for games played July 28-Aug. 3, the first weekly honor of her 12-year career. McBride tallied 24.0 ppg (64.0%), 5.0 apg and 1.50 spg in Minnesota's two victories and set a WNBA record by going 8-for-8 from beyond the arc in the 1st half at Las Vegas on Aug. 2. McBride becomes the 10th player in Lynx history to earn the weekly award, joining Maya Moore (20), Collier (8), Seimone Augustus (7), Sylvia Fowles (6), Rebekkah Brunson (3), Lindsay Whalen (3), Katie Smith (2), Aerial Powers (1) and Candice Wiggins (1).

TRIPLE CROWN: Napheesa Collier poured in 18 of her game-high 34 points in the 3rd quarter of Minnesota's May 16 win at Dallas while Courtney Williams added 25 points, including 15 in the 3rd. It's the first time in WNBA history that teammates have each scored 15+ points in the same quarter. The league's top individual scoring, rebound and assist outings of 2025:

LYNX TRAX: Minnesota completed its 27th season in the WNBA by winning a club-record 34 games and securing the #1 overall seed in the 2025 Playoffs... The 34 wins ties Las Vegas (34-6 in 2023) for the most in a single WNBA season, albeit in four more games... This year marks the sixth time Minnesota has posted the league's best regular season record (27-7 in 2011, 27-7 in 2012, 26-8 in 2013, 28-6 in 2016, 27-7 in 2017)... The Lynx finished four games ahead of Las Vegas and Atlanta, the largest gap between #1 and #2 since Phoenix (29-5) bested Minnesota by four games in 2014... The Lynx secured home-court advantage throughout this year's playoffs with the 94-70 win over Connecticut on Aug. 30... Minnesota opened 2025 with nine consecutive victories before falling 94-84 on June 11 at Seattle; they also put together winning streaks of five (June 27-July 6), four (July 14-25) and six games (July 30-Aug. 16) en route to a 28-5 start that saw their overall lead atop the standings crest at seven... New York halted Minnesota's six-game winning streak with the 85-75 decision on Aug. 19 at Barclays Center; the Lynx began their run of three games in a row vs. the Liberty with an 83-71 road win on Aug. 10 and followed up with an 86-80 win on Aug. 16 at Target Center... Minnesota finished 20-2 at Target Center, drawing an average of 9,957 in those 22 contests – its top per-game home attendance since 2018 (10,036)... The Lynx ended 2025 leading the WNBA in Offensive Rating (109.5), Defensive Rating (97.5), Net Rating (+12.1), 3-Point FG Pct. (.378) and Assists (23.3 per game)...

THE BOARD REPORT: Minnesota outrebounded Seattle 34-24 on Aug. 5, its third consecutive double-digit board advantage... The Lynx piled up a 45-22 margin Aug. 2 in Las Vegas, their largest single-game spread in three years (53-25 vs. Las Vegas, July 3, 2022) and the 12th time in franchise history (fourth in a road game) they've enjoyed an edge of 20+... Minnesota held the upper hand overall in 15 of its final 25 starts (one tie), compiling a +1.9 rpg advantage (34.4-32.5) in that span... By contrast, the Lynx were outrebounded in 13 of their first 19 contests, facing a deficit of -0.5 rpg (33.9-34.4) per night...

WRITING IN THE MARGINS: The Lynx eked out an 80-76 win vs. Washington on Aug. 8, slipped past Seattle, 91-87, on Aug. 5, and beat Las Vegas for the third time this season with the 111-58 verdict on Aug. 2... The 53-point spread marks the 2nd-largest winning margin in WNBA history; the Lynx thrashed Indiana, 111-52, on Aug. 18, 2017 at Xcel Energy Center... Minnesota completed a 4-1 homestand with the 100-93 triumph over New York on July 30... Atlanta dealt Minnesota its first regular season home loss of 2025 with the 90-86 decision on July 27, halting the Lynx' franchise-record 14-game Target Center winning streak... Minnesota beat Las Vegas, 109-78, on July 25, and capped its four-game season set vs. Chicago by winning 91-68 on July 22... The Lynx erupted for 102 points in the June 29 win over Connecticut; the 39-point spread is the 4th-largest winning margin in franchise history...

STONES IN THE ROAD: Washington snapped the Lynx' three-game winning streak with the 68-64 decision on June 24 at CareFirst Arena... Minnesota built an early 14-point cushion, but the Mystics scored the game's final six points to win; it was the largest lead the Lynx had let slip away since last June 27, when Dallas made up a 15-point deficit to beat Minnesota, 94-88... The Lynx completed a sweep of their three-game homestand by downing L.A., 82-66, on June 21; the victory capped a run of nine games in a row vs. Western rivals for the Lynx... Minnesota spotted Las Vegas an early 14-point lead before rallying to win, 76-62, on June 17 at Target Center...

ON TARGET: Minnesota rebounded from the 94-84 loss at Seattle to beat Los Angeles, 101-78, on June 14 at Target Center... Seattle dealt the Lynx their first defeat of 2025 on June 11, halting a season-opening nine-game winning streak... The setback also ended Minnesota's 10-game road winning streak (dating to a 99-88 triumph at Indiana last Sept. 6) that tied the longest such run in club history (Aug. 18, 2011-June 15, 2012)... Minnesota trailed Connecticut 68-53 with 5:00 to play on May 23 but outscored the Sun 23-2 down the stretch to win 76-70... It's just the second time in WNBA history that a team has erased a 15-point deficit in the final 5:00 of regulation to win; the other instance occurred on July 9, 2004, when the Lynx rallied past Phoenix, 61-59, at Target Center...
