Last Game: Saturday, July 18 – Minnesota 101, Portland 93

Kayla McBride's 24 points led five double-figure scorers as the Lynx won their 20th game of the season and fifth in a row with a 101-93 triumph over Portland on Saturday night at Target Center. Minnesota never trailed, jumping ahead 14-6 on a McBride 3-pointer and retaining a 24-16 advantage after one quarter. The Fire pulled to within five on three occasions in the second period, only to see McBride respond each time, and the Lynx remained in front 47-39 at halftime. Bridget Carleton's long-range strike capped a 7-0 rally that narrowed Minnesota's lead to 53-50 midway through the third, but consecutive treys from Nia Coffey and McBride stemmed the tide and the Lynx finished the quarter with eight unanswered points to carry a 75-60 lead into the fourth. The margin crested at 19 on Olairi Kosu's steal and layup at the 8:48 mark, but Portland countered with a 14-2 surge to get within 83-76 and Emily Engstler's trey sliced the deficit to 95-89 with 1:52 left before the comeback bid ran out of steam. Carleton's 22 points and eight rebounds led the Fire while Sarah Ashlee Barker and Carla Leite added 21 points apiece.

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Previous Game: Wednesday, July 15 – Minnesota 96, Los Angeles 87

Kayla McBride scored 24 points and sank two of Minnesota's six 3-pointers in the fourth quarter as the Lynx ran their winning streak to four with a 96-87 triumph over Los Angeles on Wednesday afternoon at Target Center. The Sparks held Minnesota scoreless for nearly four minutes in jumping to a 13-4 lead and stayed in front into the second quarter, when McBride's three-point play ignited a run of 12 unanswered points that put the Lynx on top 26-20. Rae Burrell keyed a late push that reclaimed a 39-37 lead for L.A. at halftime and Nneka Ogumike's triple reestablished a nine-point cushion at 53-44 midway through the third period. However, Olivia Miles started a 14-0 run that gave Minnesota the lead for good, and after 3-pointers from Ariel Atkins and Ogumike kept the Sparks within 68-67 after three, the Lynx opened the final stanza with a 21-9 burst and grabbed their largest lead when Nia Coffey made it 89-76 with 3:00 remaining. Courtney Williams netted 19 points and Miles contributed 18 with five assists for Minnesota, while Burrell led the Sparks with 24 points and Ogumike tallied 23 points and 12 rebounds.

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MILES REPEATS AS TOP ROOKIE: On July 3, Lynx guard Olivia Miles was named the WNBA's Rookie of the Month for June. Miles, who also earned the monthly award in May, led all rookies in scoring (21.2 ppg) and assists (5.6 apg) in 11 June starts while shooting 55.0% from the floor. Miles scored 31 points at L on June 17 and dealt a season-best 10 assists June 1 at Phoenix. She's one of six Lynx players to earn the monthly award, joining Candice Wiggins (June 2008), Maya Moore (July 2011, August 2011), Napheesa Collier (July 2019), Crystal Dangerfield (August 2020, September 2020) and Diamond Miller (July 2023).

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DOUBLING DOWN: Washington erased a 10-point, 3rd-quarter deficit to slip past Minnesota, 84-79, on June 21 at Target Center, the Lynx' second loss this season after building a lead of 10+ points. 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LYNX TRAX: Minnesota completed a sweep of its four-game homestand with Saturday's 101-93 win over Portland, improving to 20-6 on the season and maintaining its one-game lead on Golden State (19-7) atop the standings... The Lynx rallied for a 96-87 victory over Los Angeles on July 15, their second win vs. the Sparks this year and the 19th in their last 21 meetings... Minnesota wrapped up a season sweep of its three-game series vs. Phoenix with a 104-100 win on July 13; the homestand began with a 90-85 victory over New York on July 11, avenging the Liberty's 99-86 triumph on July 3 at Barclays Center... The Lynx rallied for an 86-80 win on July 8 at Connecticut, gaining a split of the teams' home-and-home set after the Sun claimed a 90-89 victory on July 6... The Lynx improved to 3-0 vs. Dallas this season with an 85-77 road victory on June 28... The Wings shot just 37.8% from the floor; since the start of 2011, Minnesota is 201-13 when holding its opponent below 40% FG accuracy (183-9 regular season, 18-4 playoffs)... Minnesota rallied for a 78-76 victory at Washington on June 24, having dropped an 84-79 decision to the Mystics on June 21 at home... The Lynx edged Golden State for the second time in June, winning 81-75 on June 19 at Chase Center after eking out an 87-84 win on June 4...

BLACK & WHITE: The Lynx finished Commissioner's Cup play with a 6-1 record after the 99-83 triumph on June 17 in Los Angeles, their 10th consecutive road win against the Sparks... Minnesota won its sixth in a row at Target Center with the 107-74 victory over Portland on June 15... Las Vegas ended the Lynx' eight-game winning streak overall with the 100-97 decision on June 13; the loss was also Minnesota's first on the road this year, having begun 5-0... The Lynx concluded a 3-0 homestand with the 100-76 triumph over Dallas on June 9, and rallied from an early 12-point deficit to beat Seattle, 88-68, on June 6, matching their largest comeback win of the season... Minnesota poured in 111 points June 1 at Phoenix, tying the 5th-highest single-game total in club history...

MAY FLOWERS: The Lynx notched a 79-58 win at Chicago on May 29 to finish the month at 6-2; over the past three seasons, they've compiled a 17-4 May record (5-2 in 2024, 6-0 in 2025)... Minnesota recorded a 96-81 triumph vs. Atlanta on May 27 at Target Center, avenging the Dream's 91-90 win on May 9... The Lynx won 85-75 in their first visit to Chicago this year (May 23), having fallen 86-79 to the Sky on May 17 at Target Center... The recent eight-game winning streak began with a 100-72 home victory vs. Toronto on May 21; Minnesota is now 43-2 all-time when scoring 100+, winning the last 37 since a 112-105 home loss to Phoenix on July 13, 2011...

THE BOARD REPORT: Minnesota outrebounded Chicago 54-28 on May 23, tying the 2nd-largest margin (+26) in franchise history... On the heels of the 46-25 advantage vs. Toronto two nights earlier, it's the first time in WNBA history any team has posted consecutive games with a rebounding margin of +20 or greater... Minnesota's 54 total rebounds May 23 at Chicago are a franchise record for a regulation contest (the Lynx were credited with 55 in a double-OT game vs. Phoenix on July 12, 2022) while the 41 defensive rebounds tie the single-game record set previously vs. Dallas on July 9, 2016... On the season, Minnesota is outrebounding its opponents by an average of +3.0 rpg (35.5-32.5); the Lynx are 3rd in Offensive Reb% (.289) and 5th in Total Reb% (.515)...

WRITING IN THE MARGINS: Ten of Minnesota's last 11 games have been decided by fewer than 10 points... The 107-74 triumph vs. Portland on June 15 was the Lynx' sixth win by 20+ points in 2026; they posted a club-record-tying eight such victories a year ago (79 all-time)... The 34-point decision June 1 at Phoenix represents Minnesota's 2nd-largest road win all-time (111-58 at Las Vegas, Aug. 2, 2025)... Overall, the Lynx stand 1st in Net Rating (+10.44), 2nd in Offensive Rating (112.05) and 2nd in Defensive Rating (101.61)... The July 8 visit to Uncasville wrapped up a three-week stretch in which the Lynx played six of eight on the road, while the July 11 win vs. New York opened a month-long run that sees nine of 12 played at Target Center (through Aug. 9 vs. Dallas)...

LYNX TRAX: Minnesota completed its 27th season in the WNBA by winning a club-record 34 games and securing the #1 overall seed in the 2025 Playoffs... The 34 wins ties Las Vegas (34-6 in 2023) for the most in a single WNBA season, albeit in four more games... This year marks the sixth time Minnesota has posted the league's best regular season record (27-7 in 2011, 27-7 in 2012, 26-8 in 2013, 28-6 in 2016, 27-7 in 2017)... The Lynx finished four games ahead of Las Vegas and Atlanta, the largest gap between #1 and #2 since Phoenix (29-5) bested Minnesota by four games in 2014... The Lynx secured home-court advantage throughout this year's playoffs with the 94-70 win over Connecticut on Aug. 30... Minnesota opened 2025 with nine consecutive victories before falling 94-84 on June 11 at Seattle; they also put together winning streaks of five (June 27-July 6), four (July 14-25) and six games (July 30-Aug. 16) en route to a 28-5 start that saw their overall lead atop the standings crest at seven... New York halted Minnesota's six-game winning streak with the 85-75 decision on Aug. 19 at Barclays Center; the Lynx began their run of three games in a row vs. the Liberty with an 83-71 road win on Aug. 10 and followed up with an 86-80 win on Aug. 16 at Target Center... Minnesota finished 20-2 at Target Center, drawing an average of 9,957 in those 22 contests – its top per-game home attendance since 2018 (10,036)... The Lynx ended 2025 leading the WNBA in Offensive Rating (109.5), Defensive Rating (97.5), Net Rating (+12.1), 3-Point FG Pct. (.378) and Assists (23.3 per game)...

WRITING IN THE MARGINS: The Lynx eked out an 80-76 win vs. Washington on Aug. 8, slipped past Seattle, 91-87, on Aug. 5, and beat Las Vegas for the third time this season with the 111-58 verdict on Aug. 2... The 53-point spread marks the 2nd-largest winning margin in WNBA history; the Lynx thrashed Indiana, 111-52, on Aug. 18, 2017 at Xcel Energy Center... Minnesota completed a 4-1 homestand with the 100-93 triumph over New York on July 30... Atlanta dealt Minnesota its first regular season home loss of 2025 with the 90-86 decision on July 27, halting the Lynx' franchise-record 14-game Target Center winning streak... Minnesota beat Las Vegas, 109-78, on July 25, and capped its four-game season set vs. Chicago by winning 91-68 on July 22... The Lynx erupted for 102 points in the June 29 win over Connecticut; the 39-point spread is the 4th-largest winning margin in franchise history...
