Last Game: Sunday, Aug. 9 – Minnesota 103, Dallas 90

Kayla McBride erupted for a career-high 43 points – hitting a WNBA-record 10 3-pointers – and Olivia Miles added 20 points and a season-high 13 assists as the Lynx completed a sweep of their four-game season series vs. Dallas with a 103-90 victory on Sunday afternoon at Target Center. The Wings led by two after one quarter and extended that to 29-21 when Aziaha James capped a 12-0 surge early in the second. However, McBride tallied 15 points in less than four minutes and Miles' last-second triple put Minnesota on top 47-45 at halftime. The Lynx built an eight-point cushion early in the third period, only to see Dallas rally to tie it at 66-66 on Paige Bueckers' jumper at the 3:26 mark. Treys from Miles and Napheesa Collier bookended a 10-2 finish to the quarter that rebuilt a 76-68 lead for Minnesota, and McBride drilled three more 3-pointers in a two-minute flurry that stretched the Lynx' advantage to 89-75 with 5:08 left. Dallas could get no closer than 10 down the stretch and McBride hit her 10th and final 3-pointer with 2:23 remaining. The Wings were led by 23 points from Bueckers while James chipped in 19.

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Previous Game: Saturday, Aug. 8 – Minnesota 98, Las Vegas 87

Olivia Miles led all scorers with 26 points and Napheesa Collier added 22 (including a career-best five 3-pointers) in the Lynx' 98-87 victory over Las Vegas on Saturday afternoon at Target Center. Kayla McBride drilled four triples in the first quarter and Miles beat the buzzer from near midcourt to give Minnesota a 28-25 lead after 10 minutes. Jackie Young pulled the Aces to within a point in the final minute of the second, but Miles answered with another long-range strike to send the Lynx into halftime with a 49-45 cushion. Back-to-back 3-pointers from Courtney Williams and Dorka Juhász punctuated a 13-3 surge that stretched Minnesota's lead to 66-55 with 3:49 left in the third period, but Dana Evans narrowed the Aces' deficit to 75-70 early in the fourth. However, the Lynx outscored Las Vegas 13-4 over the next three minutes and grabbed their largest lead when Miles made it 88-74 with 4:43 remaining. The Aces cut that margin in half going into the final moments before layups by Collier and Miles sealed the verdict. Natasha Howard collected 17 points and eight rebounds for Minnesota while Young led the Aces with 23 points.

The 33-point spread on June 15 is Minnesota's second-largest winning margin this year. The Lynx went 6-3 against the first incarnation of the Fire franchise (2000-2002), splitting four games at Moda Center.

First Meeting: Natasha Howard's 18 points topped a WNBA-record-tying seven players in double figures as the Lynx rolled a 107-74 victory over Portland on June 15 at Target Center. Courtney Williams had 16 points and Nia Coffey put in 15 with three steals and three blocks for Minnesota. The Fire were led by 10 points apiece from Carla Leite and Frieda Bühner.

Second Meeting: Kayla McBride tallied 24 points as the Lynx won their fifth game in a row with a 101-93 triumph over Portland on July 18 at Target Center. Bridget Carleton's 22 points and eight rebounds led the Fire while Sarah Ashlee Barker and Carla Leite added 21 points apiece.

The road defeat last Sept. 4 halted Minnesota's six-game series winning streak vs. the Aces. The Lynx' 111-58 decision last Aug. 2 in Las Vegas is the largest winning margin in a road game in WNBA history.

First Meeting: A'ja Wilson collected 24 points and 10 rebounds, Chelsea Gray added 23 points, and Las Vegas built a 15-point lead before hanging on to edge the Lynx, 100-97, on June 13 at Michelob Ultra Arena. Olivia Miles led Minnesota with 29 points while Natasha Howard tallied 22.

Second Meeting: Olivia Miles led all scorers with 26 points and Napheesa Collier added 22 in the Lynx' 98-87 win over Las Vegas on Aug. 8 at Target Center. Natasha Howard collected 17 points and eight rebounds for Minnesota while Jackie Young led the Aces with 23 points.

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CRUNCH TIME: Washington took a 58-50 lead into the 4th quarter on June 24 and increased that to 65-53 with 7:56 left, but the Lynx scored on 12 consecutive possessions (capped by Olivia Miles' 3-pointer with 1:07 remaining) to pull ahead 78-74. 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DOUBLING DOWN: Minnesota jumped in front 18-7 five minutes into the Aug. 6 game vs. L.A. but saw the Sparks close with an 8-0 burst over the final 2:40 to win, the Lynx' third loss this season after building a lead of 10+ points. McBRIDE WEEK'S BEST IN WEST: On Tuesday, Kayla McBride was named the WNBA's Western Conference Player of the Week for games played Aug. 3-9, her second weekly honor in 2026 (July 21) and the third of her career (Aug. 5, 2025). McBride averaged 24.3 ppg as Minnesota went 2-1 for the week, shooting 54.3% from the floor and 56.7% from three-point distance. *She erupted for a career-high 43 points Aug. 9 vs. Dallas*, setting a WNBA record by hitting 10 3-pointers and tying Minnesota's franchise single-game mark with 16 made field goals. She's one of three Lynx players this season to earn the weekly award, joining Olivia Miles (June 1-7) and Natasha Howard (June 22-28), and is one of 12 Player of the Week winners overall in franchise history.

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TRIPLE CROWN: Kayla McBride tallied a career-high 43 points in Sunday's 103-90 win vs. Dallas, *sinking a WNBA-record 10 treys in the process*. She becomes the fourth Lynx player to score 40+ in a regular season or playoff game, joining Maya Moore (four times), Katie Smith (twice) and Napheesa Collier. 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MILES REPEATS AS TOP ROOKIE: Last Wednesday, Lynx guard Olivia Miles was named the WNBA's Rookie of the Month for July. Miles, who also earned the monthly award in both May and June, led all rookies in scoring (20.8 ppg) and assists (6.0 apg) in nine July starts. *Miles scored a season-high 33 points July 13 vs. Phoenix and dealt a season-best 10 assists July 18 vs. Portland*. She's one of six Lynx players to earn the monthly award, joining Candice Wiggins (June 2008), Maya Moore (July 2011, August 2011), Napheesa Collier (July 2019), Crystal Dangerfield (August 2020, September 2020) and Diamond Miller (July 2023).

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MILESTONE WATCH: Sunday's 103-90 win over Dallas saw Kayla McBride score 43 points to surpass the 6,000 mark for her WNBA career and overtake both Seimone Augustus and Lauren Jackson on the league's all-time leaderboard. In addition, Olivia Miles dished a season-high 13 assists in the contest, becoming the seventh Lynx player (and first rookie) to register a 20+ point/10+ assist game:

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LYNX TRAX: Minnesota swept its lone back-to-back set of 2026 with Sunday's 103-90 victory over Dallas at Target Center, completing a 3-1 homestand overall; they began the weekend by downing Las Vegas, 98-87, on Saturday afternoon... The Lynx improve to 27-7 overall, three games ahead of Golden State (23-9) and 4.5 ahead of Las Vegas (22-11) atop the standings; they'll visit the Aces on Saturday to conclude that three-game season series... Los Angeles notched an 89-82 win over Minnesota on Aug. 6, halting the Lynx' 10-game winning streak – their longest since 2017 and the seventh time in franchise history they've put together at least 10 consecutive victories... The Lynx began their Target Center stay with a 108-100 win over Indiana on Aug. 2... Minnesota went 9-2 in July, capped by the 104-72 win July 30 at Toronto, its second victory over the Tempo in three nights (100-93 on July 28 at Target Center)...

MARGINAL INFORMATION: The 104-72 victory July 30 at Toronto was the Lynx' seventh win by 20+ points in 2026; they posted a club-record-tying eight such victories a year ago (80 all-time)... Twelve of their previous 14 contests had been decided by fewer than 10 points... The 111-77 decision June 1 at Phoenix is Minnesota's 2nd-largest road win all-time (111-58 at Las Vegas, Aug. 2, 2025)... Overall, the Lynx are 1st in Net Rating (+10.64), 2nd in Offensive Rating (114.01) and 3rd in Defensive Rating (103.37)... Sunday's win vs. Dallas concluded a month-long stretch that saw the Lynx play nine of 12 at Target Center... Tonight's contest kicks off a four-game, cross-country road swing that wraps up Aug. 21 in Washington; seven of Minnesota's final 10 games will be on the road...

AT THE BREAK: The Lynx headed into All-Star Weekend with an 86-76 win at Seattle on July 22, having begun their two-game stay at Climate Pledge Arena by edging the Storm, 105-102, on July 20... Minnesota completed a sweep of its first four-game homestand with the 101-93 triumph over Portland on July 18... The Lynx rallied for a 96-87 decision over Los Angeles on July 15, their second win vs. the Sparks in 2026... Minnesota wrapped up a three-game season series sweep of Phoenix with a 104-100 decision on July 13; the homestand began with a 90-85 victory over New York on July 11, avenging the Liberty's 99-86 triumph on July 3 at Barclays Center...

THE BOARD REPORT: Minnesota outrebounded Indiana 33-23 on Aug. 2, on the heels of a 36-26 margin July 30 in Toronto... Before that, the Lynx had held the advantage in just three of their previous 13 starts, facing a -1.9 rpg deficit (32.4-34.3) in that stretch... Minnesota outrebounded Chicago 54-28 on May 23, tying the 2nd-largest margin (+26) in franchise history... Combined with the 46-25 edge vs. Toronto two nights earlier, it's the first time in WNBA history any team has posted consecutive games with a margin of +20 or greater... Minnesota's 54 rebounds May 23 at Chicago are a club record for a regulation game... Overall, the Lynx are outrebounding their opponents by an average of +2.3 rpg (34.9-32.6); they rank 3rd in Offensive Reb% (.294) and 4th in Total Reb% (.514)...

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The Lynx rallied for an 86-80 decision on July 8 at Connecticut, gaining a split of the teams' home-and-home set after the Sun claimed a 90-89 victory on July 6... The Lynx notched their second road win vs. Dallas this season with an 85-77 victory on June 28... The Wings shot 37.8% in that contest; since the start of 2011, Minnesota is 201-13 when holding its opponent below 40% FG accuracy (183-9 regular season, 18-4 playoffs)... Minnesota rallied for a 78-76 victory at Washington on June 24, having dropped an 84-79 decision to the Mystics on June 21 at home... The Lynx edged Golden State for the second time in June, winning 81-75 on June 19 at Chase Center (limiting the Valkyries to 35.1% accuracy) after eking out an 87-84 triumph on June 4 at Target Center...

BLACK & WHITE: The Lynx finished Commissioner's Cup play with a 6-1 record after the 99-83 triumph on June 17 in Los Angeles, their 10th consecutive road win against the Sparks... Minnesota won its sixth in a row at Target Center with the 107-74 victory over Portland on June 15... Las Vegas ended the Lynx' eight-game winning streak overall with the 100-97 decision on June 13; the loss was also Minnesota's first on the road this year, having begun 5-0... The Lynx concluded a 3-0 homestand with the 100-76 triumph over Dallas on June 9, and rallied from an early 12-point deficit to beat Seattle, 88-68, on June 6, matching their largest comeback win of the season... Minnesota poured in 111 points June 1 at Phoenix, tying the 5th-highest single-game total in club history...

MAY FLOWERS: The Lynx notched a 79-58 win at Chicago on May 29 to finish the month at 6-2; over the past three seasons, they've compiled a 17-4 May record (5-2 in 2024, 6-0 in 2025)... Minnesota recorded a 96-81 triumph vs. Atlanta on May 27 at Target Center, avenging the Dream's 91-90 win on May 9... The Lynx won 85-75 in their first visit to Chicago this year (May 23), having fallen 86-79 to the Sky on May 17 at Target Center... The early eight-game winning streak began with a 100-72 home victory vs. Toronto on May 21; Minnesota is now 48-2 all-time when scoring 100+, winning the last 42 since a 112-105 home loss to Phoenix on July 13, 2011...

LYNX TRAX: Minnesota completed its 27th season in the WNBA by winning a club-record 34 games and securing the #1 overall seed in the 2025 Playoffs... The 34 wins ties Las Vegas (34-6 in 2023) for the most in a single WNBA season, albeit in four more games... This year marks the sixth time Minnesota has posted the league's best regular season record (27-7 in 2011, 27-7 in 2012, 26-8 in 2013, 28-6 in 2016, 27-7 in 2017)... The Lynx finished four games ahead of Las Vegas and Atlanta, the largest gap between #1 and #2 since Phoenix (29-5) bested Minnesota by four games in 2014... The Lynx secured home-court advantage throughout this year's playoffs with the 94-70 win over Connecticut on Aug. 30... Minnesota opened 2025 with nine consecutive victories before falling 94-84 on June 11 at Seattle; they also put together winning streaks of five (June 27-July 6), four (July 14-25) and six games (July 30-Aug. 16) en route to a 28-5 start that saw their overall lead atop the standings crest at seven... New York halted Minnesota's six-game winning streak with the 85-75 decision on Aug. 19 at Barclays Center; the Lynx began their run of three games in a row vs. the Liberty with an 83-71 road win on Aug. 10 and followed up with an 86-80 win on Aug. 16 at Target Center... Minnesota finished 20-2 at Target Center, drawing an average of 9,957 in those 22 contests – its top per-game home attendance since 2018 (10,036)... The Lynx ended 2025 leading the WNBA in Offensive Rating (109.5), Defensive Rating (97.5), Net Rating (+12.1), 3-Point FG Pct. (.378) and Assists (23.3 per game)...

WRITING IN THE MARGINS: The Lynx eked out an 80-76 win vs. Washington on Aug. 8, slipped past Seattle, 91-87, on Aug. 5, and beat Las Vegas for the third time this season with the 111-58 verdict on Aug. 2... The 53-point spread marks the 2nd-largest winning margin in WNBA history; the Lynx thrashed Indiana, 111-52, on Aug. 18, 2017 at Xcel Energy Center... Minnesota completed a 4-1 homestand with the 100-93 triumph over New York on July 30... Atlanta dealt Minnesota its first regular season home loss of 2025 with the 90-86 decision on July 27, halting the Lynx' franchise-record 14-game Target Center winning streak... Minnesota beat Las Vegas, 109-78, on July 25, and capped its four-game season set vs. Chicago by winning 91-68 on July 22... The Lynx erupted for 102 points in the June 29 win over Connecticut; the 39-point spread is the 4th-largest winning margin in franchise history...
