Last Game: Saturday, Aug. 15 – Minnesota 92, Las Vegas 87

Olivia Miles collected 23 points and eight assists as the Lynx edged Las Vegas, 92-87, on Saturday evening at Michelob Ultra Arena. Natasha Howard's three-point play highlighted a 9-3 finish to the first quarter that put Minnesota in front 23-19, but the Aces ran off eight unanswered points to jump ahead 33-31 midway through the second. A late jumper from A'ja Wilson tied the halftime score at 48-48, but Napheesa Collier scored the first four points of the third period and Minnesota held the lead the rest of the way, holding Las Vegas scoreless for over four minutes while Nia Coffey's 3-pointer at the 5:46 mark boosted the Lynx' lead to 62-52. Two more treys by Coffey ignited an 8-0 burst to rebuild Minnesota's advantage to 74-64 entering the fourth, only to see the Aces pull within one on a Chelsea Gray jumper with 7:27 remaining. However, Collier responded with back-to-back triples, and after Gray brought Las Vegas to within 90-87 in the waning seconds, Collier sank two free throws to secure the victory. Collier finished with 19 points and Howard added 13 with 11 rebounds for Minnesota, while Wilson led the Aces with 32 points.

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Previous Game: Wednesday, Aug. 12 – Minnesota 85, Portland 81

Napheesa Collier scored 20 points and Kayla McBride provided 19 points and two key defensive plays in the final moments as the Lynx held on to edge Portland, 85-81, on Aug. 12 at Moda Center. Minnesota led 26-23 after one quarter behind 12 points from Collier, then outscored the Fire 23-2 over a six-minute stretch of the second to open a 22-point advantage. Olivia Miles capped the run with a 3-pointer at the 3:00 mark and McBride added a pair of treys to help extend the Lynx' lead to 57-33 at halftime. The margin crested at 64-35 on a Natasha Howard layup early in the third period, but the Fire held Minnesota scoreless for more than six minutes while reeling off 14 unanswered points and narrowed the deficit to 68-51 entering the fourth. The Lynx then endured another drought and Teja Oblak completed a 13-0 start to the quarter that pulled Portland to within 68-64. The Fire got as close as 78-77 with 1:44 left, but McBride responded with a layup and two steals for a 6-0 run that put the game out of reach. Howard netted 14 points and 12 rebounds for Minnesota while Bridget Carleton's 16 points led the Fire.

ROOKIE ROUNDUP: Olivia Miles tallied 14 points, 10 assists and four blocks July 18 vs. Portland, becoming only the fifth player in league history (and first rookie) to pair a point/assist double-double with at least four blocks. 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CRUNCH TIME: Washington took a 58-50 lead into the 4th quarter on June 24 and increased that to 65-53 with 7:56 left, but the Lynx scored on 12 consecutive possessions (capped by Olivia Miles' 3-pointer with 1:07 remaining) to pull ahead 78-74. 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DOUBLING DOWN: Minnesota jumped in front 18-7 five minutes into the Aug. 6 game vs. L.A. but saw the Sparks close with an 8-0 burst over the final 2:40 to win, the Lynx' third loss this season after building a lead of 10+ points. MILES WEEK'S BEST IN WEST: On Tuesday, Olivia Miles was named the WNBA's Western Conference Player of the Week for games played Aug. 10-16, her second weekly honor in 2026 (also June 1-7). Miles averaged 18.0 ppg, 4.5 rpg and 7.5 apg as the Lynx won a pair of road games to improve to 29-7 on the year. She tallied a team-high 23 points and eight assists to lift Minnesota past Las Vegas, 92-87, on Aug. 15, its second victory over the Aces in eight days. Miles is one of three Lynx players this season to earn the weekly award, joining Kayla McBride (July 13-19, Aug. 3-9) and Natasha Howard (June 22-28), and is one of three rookies in franchise history to be named Player of the Week, along with Seimone Augustus and Napheesa Collier.

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TRIPLE CROWN: Kayla McBride tallied a career-high 43 points in the Aug. 9 victory vs. Dallas, sinking a WNBA-record 10 treys in the process. She becomes the fourth Lynx player to score 40+ in a regular season or playoff game, joining Maya Moore (four times), Katie Smith (twice) and Napheesa Collier. 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MILES REPEATS AS TOP ROOKIE: On Aug. 5, Lynx guard Olivia Miles was named the WNBA's Rookie of the Month for July. Miles, who also earned the monthly award in both May and June, led all rookies in scoring (20.8 ppg) and assists (6.0 apg) in nine July starts. Miles scored a season-high 33 points July 13 vs. Phoenix and dealt a then-season-best 10 assists July 18 vs. Portland. She's one of six Lynx players to earn the monthly award, joining Candice Wiggins (June 2008), Maya Moore (July 2011, August 2011), Napheesa Collier (July 2019), Crystal Dangerfield (August 2020, September 2020) and Diamond Miller (July 2023).

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MILESTONE WATCH: The Aug. 9 triumph over Dallas saw Kayla McBride score 43 points to surpass the 6,000 mark for her WNBA career and overtake both Seimone Augustus and Lauren Jackson on the league's all-time leaderboard. In addition, Olivia Miles dished a season-high 13 assists in the contest, becoming the seventh Lynx player (and first rookie) to register a 20+ point/10+ assist game:

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LYNX TRAX: Minnesota beat Las Vegas for the second time in eight days with Saturday's 92-87 decision at Michelob Ultra Arena; the Lynx notched a 98-87 home victory on Aug. 8 and take the season series, 2-1... Minnesota has now won its last six games away from Target Center, the third-longest in-season streak in franchise history; the Lynx are 29-7 overall, three games up on Golden State (25-9) atop the standings... Minnesota built a 29-point, 3rd-quarter lead before hanging on to defeat Portland on Aug. 12, the Lynx' first win at Moda Center in a quarter-century (Aug. 8, 2001)... Minnesota swept its lone back-to-back set of 2026 with the 103-90 win over Dallas on Aug. 9 at Target Center, officially clinching a playoff spot for the 15th time in 16 seasons... Los Angeles notched an 89-82 win over Minnesota on Aug. 6, halting the Lynx' 10-game winning streak – their longest since 2017 and the seventh time in club history they've put together at least 10 consecutive victories... The Lynx began their Target Center stay with a 108-100 win over Indiana on Aug. 2...

MARGINAL INFORMATION: The 104-72 victory July 30 at Toronto was the Lynx' seventh win by 20+ points in 2026; they posted a club-record-tying eight such victories a year ago (80 all-time)... Twelve of their previous 14 contests had been decided by fewer than 10 points... The 111-77 decision June 1 at Phoenix is Minnesota's 2nd-largest road win all-time (111-58 at Las Vegas, Aug. 2, 2025)... Overall, the Lynx are 1st in Net Rating (+10.44), 2nd in Offensive Rating (113.91) and 3rd in Defensive Rating (103.46)... The Aug. 9 win vs. Dallas concluded a month-long stretch that saw the Lynx play nine of 12 at Target Center... Tonight's contest continues a four-game, cross-country road swing that wraps up Friday in Washington; five of Minnesota's final eight games are on the road...

AT THE BREAK: The Lynx headed into All-Star Weekend with an 86-76 win at Seattle on July 22, having begun their two-game stay at Climate Pledge Arena by edging the Storm, 105-102, on July 20... Minnesota completed a sweep of its first four-game homestand with the 101-93 triumph over Portland on July 18... The Lynx rallied for a 96-87 decision over Los Angeles on July 15, their second win vs. the Sparks in 2026... Minnesota wrapped up a three-game season series sweep of Phoenix with a 104-100 decision on July 13; the homestand began with a 90-85 victory over New York on July 11, avenging the Liberty's 99-86 triumph on July 3 at Barclays Center...

THE BOARD REPORT: Minnesota outrebounded Indiana 33-23 on Aug. 2, on the heels of a 36-26 margin July 30 in Toronto... Before that, the Lynx had held the advantage in just three of their previous 13 starts, facing a -1.9 rpg deficit (32.4-34.3) in that stretch... Minnesota outrebounded Chicago 54-28 on May 23, tying the 2nd-largest margin (+26) in franchise history... Combined with the 46-25 edge vs. Toronto two nights earlier, it's the first time in WNBA history any team has posted consecutive games with a margin of +20 or greater... Minnesota's 54 rebounds May 23 at Chicago are a club record for a regulation game... Overall, the Lynx are outrebounding their opponents by an average of +2.1 rpg (34.8-32.7); they rank 3rd in Offensive Reb% (.291) and 5th in Total Reb% (.512)...

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The Lynx rallied for an 86-80 decision on July 8 at Connecticut, gaining a split of the teams' home-and-home set after the Sun claimed a 90-89 victory on July 6... The Lynx notched their second road win vs. Dallas this season with an 85-77 victory on June 28... The Wings shot 37.8% in that contest; since the start of 2011, Minnesota is 201-13 when holding its opponent below 40% FG accuracy (183-9 regular season, 18-4 playoffs)... Minnesota rallied for a 78-76 victory at Washington on June 24, having dropped an 84-79 decision to the Mystics on June 21 at home... The Lynx edged Golden State for the second time in June, winning 81-75 on June 19 at Chase Center (limiting the Valkyries to 35.1% accuracy) after eking out an 87-84 triumph on June 4 at Target Center...

BLACK & WHITE: The Lynx finished Commissioner's Cup play with a 6-1 record after the 99-83 triumph on June 17 in Los Angeles, their 10th consecutive road win against the Sparks... Minnesota won its sixth in a row at Target Center with the 107-74 victory over Portland on June 15... Las Vegas ended the Lynx' eight-game winning streak overall with the 100-97 decision on June 13; the loss was also Minnesota's first on the road this year, having begun 5-0... The Lynx concluded a 3-0 homestand with the 100-76 triumph over Dallas on June 9, and rallied from an early 12-point deficit to beat Seattle, 88-68, on June 6, matching their largest comeback win of the season... Minnesota poured in 111 points June 1 at Phoenix, tying the 5th-highest single-game total in club history...

MAY FLOWERS: The Lynx notched a 79-58 win at Chicago on May 29 to finish the month at 6-2; over the past three seasons, they've compiled a 17-4 May record (5-2 in 2024, 6-0 in 2025)... Minnesota recorded a 96-81 triumph vs. Atlanta on May 27 at Target Center, avenging the Dream's 91-90 win on May 9... The Lynx won 85-75 in their first visit to Chicago this year (May 23), having fallen 86-79 to the Sky on May 17 at Target Center... The early eight-game winning streak began with a 100-72 home victory vs. Toronto on May 21; Minnesota is now 48-2 all-time when scoring 100+, winning the last 42 since a 112-105 home loss to Phoenix on July 13, 2011...

LYNX TRAX: Minnesota completed its 27th season in the WNBA by winning a club-record 34 games and securing the #1 overall seed in the 2025 Playoffs... The 34 wins ties Las Vegas (34-6 in 2023) for the most in a single WNBA season, albeit in four more games... This year marks the sixth time Minnesota has posted the league's best regular season record (27-7 in 2011, 27-7 in 2012, 26-8 in 2013, 28-6 in 2016, 27-7 in 2017)... The Lynx finished four games ahead of Las Vegas and Atlanta, the largest gap between #1 and #2 since Phoenix (29-5) bested Minnesota by four games in 2014... The Lynx secured home-court advantage throughout this year's playoffs with the 94-70 win over Connecticut on Aug. 30... Minnesota opened 2025 with nine consecutive victories before falling 94-84 on June 11 at Seattle; they also put together winning streaks of five (June 27-July 6), four (July 14-25) and six games (July 30-Aug. 16) en route to a 28-5 start that saw their overall lead atop the standings crest at seven... New York halted Minnesota's six-game winning streak with the 85-75 decision on Aug. 19 at Barclays Center; the Lynx began their run of three games in a row vs. the Liberty with an 83-71 road win on Aug. 10 and followed up with an 86-80 win on Aug. 16 at Target Center... Minnesota finished 20-2 at Target Center, drawing an average of 9,957 in those 22 contests – its top per-game home attendance since 2018 (10,036)... The Lynx ended 2025 leading the WNBA in Offensive Rating (109.5), Defensive Rating (97.5), Net Rating (+12.1), 3-Point FG Pct. (.378) and Assists (23.3 per game)...

WRITING IN THE MARGINS: The Lynx eked out an 80-76 win vs. Washington on Aug. 8, slipped past Seattle, 91-87, on Aug. 5, and beat Las Vegas for the third time this season with the 111-58 verdict on Aug. 2... The 53-point spread marks the 2nd-largest winning margin in WNBA history; the Lynx thrashed Indiana, 111-52, on Aug. 18, 2017 at Xcel Energy Center... Minnesota completed a 4-1 homestand with the 100-93 triumph over New York on July 30... Atlanta dealt Minnesota its first regular season home loss of 2025 with the 90-86 decision on July 27, halting the Lynx' franchise-record 14-game Target Center winning streak... Minnesota beat Las Vegas, 109-78, on July 25, and capped its four-game season set vs. Chicago by winning 91-68 on July 22... The Lynx erupted for 102 points in the June 29 win over Connecticut; the 39-point spread is the 4th-largest winning margin in franchise history...
