A LOOK BACK: SKY HOME OPENERS

The Sky is 9-5 all-time in season home openers including 6 of the last 7. The Sky has opened once in their history at home against the Sparks, losing 81-64 on 5/22/07 at the UIC Pavilion.

CHICAGO v. LOS ANGELES HISTORY

- ➤ Chicago has an all-time record of 8-24 (.250), the team's worst composite total against any current WNBA franchise (Sky was 3-12 (.200) against the Detroit Shock from 2006–2009 when the team moved to Tulsa, Oklahoma).
- Last season, the Sky was 1-2 against the Sparks, losing both games in L.A. and winning the lone game in Chicago. As a road team, the Sky is 3-12 (.200) against the Sparks.

SKY OVERTAKE ACES 88-86 IN SEASON OPENER

- > Sky finished on with an 11-0 run to wipe out a 9-point Aces' lead with 4:29 remaining. During the final run, the Sky shot 4-8 while holding the Aces to 0-11 from the field and 3 turnovers.
- Chicago shut the Aces out from the 3-point line for the game limiting them to only 5 attempts. In last year's playoff game, the Aces hit 6 three pointers in their win. The last time the Sky shut out a team from the 3 point line was 9/3/15 against the Liberty in NY, a team also coached by Bill Laimbeer. In the team's 15 year history, this was the 5th time the Sky has shut out a team from the three point line.
- ➤ **Courtney Vandersloot**'s 11 assists were the most she ever had in a season opener. Previous high was 8 last season at Minnesota. It was the 46th time in her career she reached double figures in assists.
- > **Azura Stevens** had a strong start of her Sky career scoring 12 points (10 in the first quarter) on 5-8 shooting (including 2-3 from beyond the arc).
- ➤ **Kahleah Copper** continued her strong play against the Aces leading the team with 18 points (15 in the 2nd half). In last season's playoff loss to the Aces, Copper scored 16.
- ➤ **Diamond DeShields** did not start and played only 14:38 in the game (3:36 in 2nd half, none in the 4th quarter) limited by knee discomfort. DeShield's has never missed a game in her 3 year WNBA career.
- > **Gabby Williams** contributed 14 points on 6-8 shooting and 7 rebounds in 25 minutes off the bench. In her last 4 WNBA games, Williams has shot 70.8% from the field (17 for 24) compared to her career 41.3% average in the prior 64 games.

2019 SKY SEASON RECAP

- > Sky improved by 7 games over their 2018 finish (from 13 to 20 wins), tied for tops in the WNBA (with Indiana who also improved by 7 wins this season)
- > This was the third best improvement season to season in Sky team history: 2013 10 game improvement (14 wins to 24 wins) under Pokey Chatman 2007 9 game improvement (5 wins to 14 wins) under Bo Overton* 2019 7 game improvement (13 wins to 20 wins) under James Wade* *- first year coach
 - The Sky made the playoffs for the first time since 2016. They finished 1-1 (beating Phoenix in the first round in Chicago before losing in Las Vegas on a desperation Dearica Hamby three pointer with 5 sec-

- ✓ Moved up to 6th on the WNBA's All-Time Assists lists.

She has been a reliable option off the bench for the Sky in each of the last two seasons, making in an appearance in all 34 games both years. In 2019, she averaged career-highs in minutes per game (19.7) and free throw percentage (84.2%) while reaching a double-digit scoring total on 12 occasions. The Middle Tennessee product scored a career-high 22 points against Connecticut on June 23, and with an expected increase in minutes will have plenty of opportunities to push that total even higher.

STARTING OFF STRONG: Parker finished with the second most min-utes played in the opener against Las Vegas (28:14), trailing only Courtney Vandersloot. The six-year veteran also chipped in for nine points while recording the second-highest plus-minus on the team as well (7).

She also made the WNBA All-Star game for the first time since her rookie season (2011) and was named to the All-WNBA First Team for the first time in her career.

OFF AND PASSING: Vandersloot's 2020 season started where she left off by leading the Sky in assists during the opener against Las Vegas with 11 helpers. It was the 46th time she reached a double-digit assist total in her career. Her apperance in the game also made her the franchise's all-time leader in seasons played (10).
