CHICAGO FALLS TO MINNESOTA 83-81



- ❖ Minnesota went on a 12-4 run late in the second quarter, where its lead was extended to seven.
- ❖ About halfway through the fourth quarter, Minnesota pushed its lead to eight during a 6-0 run.
- ❖ Sky cut Minnesota's lead to 2 after Allie Quigley's three (83-81) while on a 17-7 run late in the 4th.
- ❖ After falling behind by 12 points in the 4th quarter (76-64 with 3:26 remaining), Chicago outscored Minnesota 17-7 the rest of the way.
- ❖ Cheyenne Parker scored 7 points and had 2 rebounds, a block and a steal during the comeback attempt.
- ❖ The Sky had 3 attempts to tie in the last 6.9 seconds, but none fell.
- ❖ Chicago was led in scoring by Parker, Azura Stevens and Courtney Vandersloot who totaled 16 points each.

KEY STATS

- Chicago out-rebounded Minnesota 11-4 during the first seven minutes of the game.
- Neither team had a player register more than nine points in the first half.
- There were 8 lead changes and five ties in the game. Minnesota's biggest lead was 12 (74-62).
- Minnesota outscored Chicago 36 to 28 in the paint.
- The Sky had 10 team rebounds while the Lynx had 3.
- Overall, Minnesota had 35 total rebounds to Chicago's 33.

NOTABLE MOMENTS

- Vandersloot passed legend Becky Hammon for 5th on WNBA's All-Time Assists list (1,705).
- Ironically, the 10-year veteran was held to zero assists in the first half for the first time since June 25, 2017 against the Washington Mystics.
- Vandersloot also led the Sky in scoring in the first half with nine points.
- Azurá Stevens recorded her 1st double-double as a member of the Sky (and 1st of career).
- Cheyenne Parker recorded her 7th career double-double tonight.
- Parker grabbed six rebounds in just under seven minutes of play during the first quarter, and was the only player in the 1st half on Chicago with a positive plus-minus (4).
- Parker and Stevens accounted for 15 of the team's 20 rebounds in the first half.
- Between the end of the first half and five minutes through the third quarter, Vandersloot and Stevens accounted for 15 of the Sky's 20 points in that timeframe.
- Throughout the first three quarters, Stevens shot an efficient six for eight (75%) from the floor. She and Vandersloot recorded half (27) of the Sky's points (54) through three quarters.

AZURA STEVENS' SCORING STREAK CONTINUES

- ❖ Led Chicago in scoring for 2nd consecutive game
- ❖ Has reached double-figures for each of her three games as a member of the Sky.
 - Reached double-figures only once with Dallas 2019 while she battled injuries.
 - Reached double figures in 17 of 34 games in her rookie year of 2018 with Dallas.
- ❖ Shooting 60.6% from the field and 61.5% from beyond the arc in 2020.
- ❖ Stevens' career totals entering the season were 41.8% from the field and 29.9% from beyond the arc.
- ❖ Recorded her career double-double vs. Lynx on Thursday.
- ❖ Her 11 total rebounds and 9 defensive rebounds vs. Lynx were both career-highs.
 - It was the 1st time in her career she reached double figures in rebounding.

COURTNEY VANDERSLOOT #5 ON WNBA ALL-TIME ASSISTS LIST

- ❖ Scored season high 16 points vs Lynx, but held to season low 4 assists.
- ❖ Averaging 8.3 APG, which would be good enough to win the assist title every year in the WNBA that she did not win the crown.
- ❖ Moved into 5th place all-time in assists vs Lynx passing Becky Hammon. Ahead of her are:
 - Diana Taurasi (1,872)
 - Lindsay Whalen (2,345)
 - Ticha Penichiero (2,599)
 - Sue Bird (2,841).
- ❖ Her 4 assists were her lowest in a game since July 10, 2019 when she also 4 assists vs. the Lynx.

KAHLEAH COPPER

- ❖ Game vs Lynx was her first game of the season not in double figures
- ❖ Has shot 50% or better from the field in all 3 games this season.
- ❖ Shooting 52.6% from the field in 2020, but only 20% (2-10) from beyond the 3 point arc.

STEFANIE DOLSON

- ❖ Has missed the last 2 Sky games after playing in all 34 in 2019

DIAMOND DESHIELDS

- ❖ Still limited by knee issues
- ❖ Has yet to reach double figures scoring in a game this season after doing so in 30 of the 34 games last season including the last 24 in a row.
- ❖ Has yet to hit a 3 point FG this season (0-6). Had 50 three pointers last season.
- ❖ Averaging only 20.7 MPG.
- ❖ In 2019, DeShields became only 6th member of Sky to play over 1,000 minutes in a season (1027).

GABBY WILLIAMS

- ❖ After shooting 62.5% from the field and 57.1% from three for the first two games, shot 20% from the field and 0% from three against the Lynx,
- ❖ Her 6 missed three pointers were the most attempts in a game in her career

A VETERAN VOICE: She is one of only five players on the Sky's roster to have played at least five seasons. While with the Las Vegas Aces in 2019, the Texas A&M product led/tied the team in assists twice and posted a career-high 17 points against the Washington Mystics on July 13.

INSPIRING CHANGE: Colson is also a member of the newly-formed WNBA Social Justice Council, where she and other players will help serve as representatives for helping create meaningful conversations about race, LGBTQ support, gun control, voting rights and other relevant social issues in the United States.

GREAT EXPECTATIONS: DeShields enters her third season in the WNBA with a tremendous amount of hype surrounding her. She followed up an impressive rookie campaign in 2018 with making the WNBA All-Star team, winning the WNBA All-Star Skills Challenge and being named to the All-WNBA Second Team.

TAKING ACTION: DeShields joins teammate Gabby Williams as serving as the face and leader of the Sky's #SkyTakeAction campaign for this season. She and Williams worked alongside former Chicago Bears linebacker Sam Acho to develop the campaign in partnership with Athletes for Justice. The Sky will donate \$10 for every point scored, \$100 for every win and \$50 for any loss to the campaign. Through her scoring so far, DeShields has contributed \$220 (22 points).

A RETURN TO NORMALCY: After failing to play in at least 33 games for the first time in her career in 2018, Dolson responded in 2019 by starting and appearing in all 34 games. She continued to be one of the most efficient options on the floor for the Sky, as she finished fourth in the league in field goal percentage (51.9%). Dolson also made at least 30 three-point field goals for the second time in three years, shooting 36.1% from distance.

AN ACTIVE LEADER: Dolson will be working with the Brave Space Alliance, which is a black and trans-led organization that supports and educates the LGBTQ community, as part of her work toward social justice this season. She has contributed \$80 (8 points) toward the #SkyTakesAction campaign thus far.

DUCK DYNASTY: Hebard is one of two rookies on the Sky's roster this season. She joins the organization after being selected with the No. 8 overall pick in the 2020 WNBA Draft. Born in Chicago, she finished as the all-time leader in career field-goal percentage (65.1%) at Oregon and in the Pac-12 conference. Her 2,368 career points is second in program history, behind Ionescu.

THE WAIT IS OVER: Hebard made her official WNBA debut early in the second half during the opener against Las Vegas. She played just under seven and a half minutes, scoring four points and shooting 40% from the floor. Over the course of her first three career games, Hebard has contributed \$80 (8 points) to #SkyTakesAction.

She followed up her strong season debut with another impressive performance, scoring 12 points on four of five shooting while again leading the team in plus-minus (33). Parker has contributed \$370 (37 points) to the #SkyTakesAction campaign this season. Despite the Sky losing to Minnesota on July 30, Parker produced another strong outing with her seventh career double-double off a 16-point, 10-rebound performance.

Parker on the #SkyTakesAction campaign:

"The fact that we are doing something, and we're taking action as a team, as a program, representing the Chicago Sky I think it's really dope that we are taking initiative and trying to just raise awareness and get other people to take action. KEEPING THE FOOT ON THE GAS: Vandersloot's 2019 was full of records. The 10-year veteran's 300 assist total was the most ever in a single-season for any WNBA player (breaking her own record of 258) and she also became the first player in league history to reach 300 assists in a season. Vandersloot won her third WNBA Peak Performer Award for assists, reaching a double-digit total in that category in 12 of the 33 games in which she appeared. She also made the WNBA All-Star game for the first time since her rookie season (2011) and was named to the All-WNBA First Team for the first time in her career.

RECORDS SET, AGAIN: Vandersloot's 2020 season started where she left off by leading the Sky in assists during the opener against Las Vegas with 11 helpers. Her appearance in the game also made her the franchise's all-time leader in seasons played (10). Vandersloot followed her strong performance in the opener by recording her 30th career double-double against the Sparks-she currently leads the WNBA in double-doubles with assists. On July 30 against Minnesota, Vandersloot passed Becky Hammon for fifth all-time on the WNBA's assist list. She has contributed \$350 (35 points) to the #SkyTakesAction campaign throughout the course of the first three games this season.
