## **KEY RUNS**

- The Sky opened the first three and half minutes of the game on an 11-0 run.
- Dallas answered toward the end of the first frame with a 20-8 run, ending the first quarter with a one-point lead.
- After two consecutive quarters of back-and-forth play, the Sky opened the 4th quarter on a 9-3 run that put its lead to 7 (74-67).

#### **KEY STATS**

- Dallas' bench outscored Chicago's 20-0 in the first quarter. It continued its strong performance in the opening half by scoring 33 of the Wings' 42 points, outscoring the Sky's bench 33-5.
- The Sky's starters shot 57.6% (15-26) from the floor in the first half, scoring 38 of the Sky's 43 points. While the Wings' initial five posted a 13.3% field goal percentage in the first and second quarter, scoring only nine of the team's 42 points.
- Chicago's 44 points in the paint bested Dallas' total of 26.
- Dallas produced 18 points off turnovers compared to the Sky only recording eight.

# **CHICAGO NOTES**

- WNBA veteran Sydney Colson made her Sky and 2020 season debut tonight.
- Azurá Stevens faced the team that drafted her in Dallas (2018) for the first time since being traded to Chicago in the offseason.
- Stevens posted her 2nd career double-double off a 15-point, 10-rebound outing. It was her 2nd double-double in the last 3 games.
- Cheyenne Parker and Azurá Stevens and Kahleah Copper accounted for 28 of the Sky's 43 first half points. The aforementioned three players shot a combined 68.8% from the floor (11-16) in the first half.
- The Sky's starting five had a collective plus-minus of 56 and shot just under 53% (27-51) from the floor.
- Allie Quigley, Stevens and Parker each recorded 15 points, tying for the team-high tonight. It was the third consecutive game where Parker led or tied for the lead in scoring for the Sky.

## **DALLAS NOTES**

- Former Chicago players **Astou Ndour** and **Katie Lou Samuelson** played in their first game vs. the Sky since being traded to Dallas in the 2019-20 offseason.
- The Wings' bench scored all 20 of their points in the first quarter.
- 2020 No. 2 overall pick Satou Sabally remained perfect from the free throw line this season (21-21), going five for five in tonight's game.
- Arike Ogunbowale recorded at least 20 points for the third time this season and the second consecutive game.
