On what Seattle did to disrupt the team:

"I think it was more us. They're [Seattle] a good team but I just don't think we came out with an energy that is equal to playing in a basketball game."

On Diamond DeShields:

I think it's important for us to really come together and step up because we were down. Like, we're down right now, and she's a big part of it. A big part of it being on the court and a big part of it off the court just giving us energy and just everything so it really sucks that she's gone."

"I think she'll bring a body for sure. Just bring energy. I think she's a great player. Great rebounder, great player offensively. I think she'll just compliment our culture and just compliment us on the court. It will be great to start getting her in the flow with us and great to have another person here."

On the Sky finding rhythm late:

"Yeah, I think we have bits and pieces of us trying to find the rhythm and stuff and hopefully next game, we can come out and do that throughout the whole game."

On the team relying on each other going forward:

"I think we're fighting for a lot more than just us. It's a big loss of course losing two great players, D [Diamond DeShields] and Z [Azurá Stevens]. Things are going on around us in the outside world, we want to keep fighting, keep using our platform for people like Jacob Blake, Breonna Taylor, those people who have it worse than us. That's what she's been doing and also just practicing working on my shot, being able to expand my range so I can hit those shots when I'm left open."

On Stephanie Mavunga joining the team soon:

"Losing Z [Azurá Stevens] and Diamond [DeShields] from the bubble is a big blow for us. We understand from their perspective, they got to get themselves healthy. But it hurts, it's hard. But we've kind of like you said had people in and out with injuries all season. We've been able to have people step up in big ways. So we will look to continue that. We also lost Jantel [Lavender] in a trade and although she's not here, that's a blow for us too. She's an important part of this team, with bodies and stuff. We needed someone that could be here and so we're anxious for Stephanie to get here and help us. She's a good player and I think she'll fit in really well with us. So, like I said, we're anxious and I know that she will blend in easily. The transition will be smooth, because we play an easy style that's easy to pick up on. She's made for the style of play that we play, her game is."

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
