NEWS AND NOTES

CHICAGO RECORDS 1ST 100-PT GAME OF SEASON Chicago defeated Connecticut 100-93 Saturday night for the first time of the 2020 season, and for the third time in their last four match-ups.

SKY SHOOTING: Sky's 55.6% shooting vs. Connecticut was their best of the season. When Chicago shoots 50% or better from the field this year they are 3-0.

RAINING FREE-THROWS: Chicago shot 32 free throws in Saturday's game, the most since shooting 38 vs. Las Vegas on June 3, 2018.

- **Cheyenne Parker's** 12 FT at Connecticut were the most by a Sky player since **Diamond DeShields** had 14 attempts vs. Las Vegas on June 3, 2018.
- **Parker's** 12 of 12 FT performance tied her for most free throws in a game without a miss by a player not named Delle Donne, who holds the WNBA record at 19. Fowles also accomplished this on Sept. 11, 2011 at Seattle.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS: The Sky has now defeated all 4 teams that finished in front of them in 2019 (without a loss) –

- Last season, the Sky was 5-8 against the top four teams.

WEATHERING THE STORM: In 2019, Chicago won 2 of 3 games against Seattle. Last season was the first time Sky topped the Storm in the season series since taking 2 of 3 in 2016.

COPPER'S BANNER YEAR: **Kahleah Copper** recorded her second consecutive game of 30+ minutes and a career-high four steals vs. Connecticut on Saturday. She has scored in double-figures 7 of 8 games this year, and is shooting 53.1% from the field. Entering the 2020 season, Copper was shooting 41.5% from the field, and was under 40% each of the last two years.

TAKING CARE OF THE BALL: Chicago is 11th in WNBA in TPG (17.3), and tied for 10th in points off turnovers allowed (20.1). Over the last two games, the Sky have allowed 54 points off turnovers, 28.6% of the points allowed.

PARKER'S SEASON-HIGH: **Cheyenne Parker** poured in a season-high 20 points vs. Connecticut on Thursday. She needs 11 points to reach 1,000 for her career.

DON'T CALL IT A COMEBACK: **Diamond DeShields** had her best offensive game of the year against Connecticut, recording 14 points, on 75% shooting in 18 minutes. In the performance vs. the Suns, DeShields also had seven turnovers, a career-high for the All-Star guard.

FLIPPING THE SCRIPT: Last season, **Gabby Williams'** focus was on becoming a better shooter, and she's done just that. When Williams' shoots 50% or better, the Sky is 5-0.

- ❖ "I feel like I was very hesitant and I would hold onto the ball too long when I would shoot because I was always thinking twice about it," Williams told the Chicago Sun-Times of her past self. "But now I'm not thinking twice so much. It's all one motion versus me kind of pausing in the air or slowing down my shot."
- ❖ "If this is what I want to do, if I want to develop my shot and I want to become a better shooter, I have to be OK with missing," Williams said to the Sun-Times. "The best shooters in the game shoot 40 percent, which means they're missing over half of their shots, so that's just something that I've thought."

LEADING THE BENCH: **Gabby Williams** leads the Sky bench with 9.9 PPG. In Chicago wins, she is averaging 11.6 PPG and 61.1% shooting. In losses, Williams is averaging 5.5 PPG and 25% shooting. She also marked 500 career assists in her last outing vs. Connecticut.

EXCEEDING EXPECTATIONS: After being acquired by Chicago in a trade with Dallas in the 2019-20 offseason, **Azurá Stevens** is averaging career-highs in nearly every category: MPG, FG%, 3FG%, RPG, APG, BPG and PPG. Over the last 2 games, Stevens averaged 6 PPG on 33.3% shooting, 4.5 RPG, and 2.5 SPG. Over the first 5 games, she averaged 14.2 PPG on 56% shooting, 6.6 RPG and 1 SPG.

WNBA ASSIST LEADER: **Courtney Vandersloot** is averaging 8.9 APG. If she finishes the season above 8.0 APG. It will be the 4th straight year she has achieved this average. In the history of the WNBA, only 1 player other than Vandersloot has ever averaged 8.0 assists in a season (Ticha Penichiero, who averaged exactly 8.0 in 2002). Vandersloot has averaged:

- 8.1 – 2017
- 8.6 – 2018
- 9.1 – 2019
- 8.9 – 2020 *so far this season

DOUBLE-DOUBLES & DOUBLE-FIGURES : **Vandersloot's** next double-double will be the 2nd of this season and 32nd of her career (last being vs. Dallas on 8/4). Her next double-figures assists game will be 49th in career (last being vs. Dallas on 8/4). Allie Quigley has scored in double-figures in every game this season.

TAKING ACTION: DeShields joins teammate Gabby Williams as serving as the face and leader of the Sky's #SkyTakesAction campaign for this season. She and Williams worked alongside former Chicago Bears linebacker Sam Acho to develop the campaign in partnership with Athletes for Justice. Through her scoring so far, DeShields has contributed \$550 (55 points). She had a season-high 14 points against Connecticut during Saturday's game and has reached a double-digit scoring total in two of her last four games.

DeShields on how #SkyTakesAction has motivated her: "It's everything. It's literally the reason why I put my jersey, it's the reason why I came out here. There was no way I was going to come out here and just dismiss myself from what's going on in the world right now. So, to have partnered up with Athletes For Justice and my teammates and everybody else, our sponsors to be on board with this, it's all the motivation that any of us needs on game days."

A RETURN TO NORMALCY: After failing to play in at least 33 games for the first time in her career in 2018, Dolson responded in 2019 by starting and appearing in all 34 games. She continued to be one of the most efficient options on the floor for the Sky, as she finished fourth in the league in field goal percentage (51.9%). Dolson also made at least 30 three-point field goals for the second time in three years, shooting 36.1% from distance.

AN ACTIVE LEADER: Dolson will be working with the Brave Space Alliance, which is a black and trans-led organization that supports and educates the LGBTQ community, as part of her work toward social justice this season. She provided t-shirts for the Sky to wear during Saturday's game that read: "Arrest the cops who killed Breonna Taylor."
