NEWS AND NOTES

SKY FALLS TO STORM 89-71: The Sky scored a season-low 71 points against the Seattle Storm on Monday night. It was the first time this season Chicago did not eclipse an 80-point total (previous low of 81 against Minnesota on July 30). Despite the team's struggles offensively, the Sky still had five players post a double-digit scoring total: Quigley (13), Parker (12), Copper (11), Hebard (11), and Stevens (10).

TAKING CARE OF THE BALL: The Sky has committed more than 20 turnovers in each of the last 3 games, The last time a Sky team has done this was 7/13/12, 8/17/12 & 8/19/12 (games 1 and 2 of the streak broken up by WNBA Olympic break. In fact, the team ran off 5 straight games of 20 or more turnovers (also 7/6/12 and 7/7/12). Other than these 2 streaks, the Sky has never committed 20 turnovers in more than 2 games in a row in their history.

DIGGING A HOLE: In the last two Sky losses, opponents ran off large first quarter leads that the Sky were never able to overcome.

- vs. Phoenix on August 6, the Mercury went on a 24-2 run over the last 4:12 of the 1st guarter to take a 32-18 lead. The Sky fought back to cut the lead to 1 in the 3rd quarter, but ran out of gas.
- vs. Seattle on Aug. 10, the Storm outscored the Sky 30-11 over the last 7 minutes of the 1st quarter to take a 33-18 lead. They expanded the lead to 21 during the 3rd before the Sky cut it to 9 with 13-1 run, but again could get no closer.

ROOKIE RUTHY'S BREAKOUT PERFORMANCE: First-round draft pick Ruthy Hebard had a breakout game vs. Seattle on Monday night, scoring 11 points on 5-8 shooting and recording 5 rebounds. She went 4-4 from the field with 4 rebounds over 5:48 of the 3rd quarter. Hebard's 11 points and 5 rebounds were the most by a Sky rookie in a game since 2018.

SKY SCORING: The 71 points scored by the Sky against Seattle was their lowest output of the season and the lowest from a James Wade-coached Chicago team since June 21, 2019, 33 games ago.

For Chicago's 5 wins, the Sky is averaging – 90.8 PPG 50.4 FG% 9.6 3PT FGM

For their 3 losses, the Sky is averaging – 44.8% FG% 79.3 PPG **7.3 3PT FGM**

SKY DEFENSE: Chicago currently ranks second to last in the WNBA in opponent FG% (46.9%) and last in opponent 3FG% (39.9%). The Sky ranks third to last in opponent PPG (86.3) and is last in the league in opponent points off turnovers per game (20.8)

CHEYENNE PARKER: Cheyenne Parker has scored in double-figures in 6 of team's 8 games. She has shot 50% or better from the field in six of the team's 8 games. Her 6 3-point FGM this season ties her career high set in 2018. She has hit 6 of 13 attempts this season. In 2018, she made 6 three-point FG in 19 attempts.

WNBA ASSIST LEADER: Courtney Vandersloot is averaging 8.9 APG. If she finishes the season above 8.0 APG. It will be the 4th straight year she has achieved this average.
