#SKYTAKESACTION

Chicago Sky players will donate \$10 for every point scored, \$100 for every win, and \$50 for any loss throughout the 2020 WNBA season under a social justice initiative called #SkyTakesAction.

"#SkyTakesAction is about longevity and community," Gabby Williams said. "It's about inspiring others and teaching everyone that it doesn't take much to change someone's life, or improve somebody's situation as long as we work together. Of course, our goal is to raise absolutely as much money as possible for the organizations we've chosen. But it's also about education and changing the norm. Hopefully this will inspire and teach our fans and those who hear us to increase their level of involvement in the community."

Fans have answered Williams' call to show support by raising **\$10,345** in three weeks of fundraising through Athletes For Justice. The Sky as a team has donated **\$12,420** through its total points, nine wins, and four losses this season. The combined total currently is **\$22,765**.

In addition, Sky owner Michael Alter, minority owner John Rogers, and Susan Anderson and Bob Arthur of Magellan Corporation announced on August 12 that they will be matching all player donations for #SkyTakesAction.

"As owners of the Sky, John [Rogers] and I are honored to join our players and support their unprecedented commitment to social justice," said Sky owner Michael Alter. "We could not be more proud of their efforts. We will personally match their contributions to the organizations they have identified to carry out the important work in our communities. We are also thrilled that Bob Arthur and Susan Anderson, long time champions of the Sky, will also be matching the players donations."

Lastly, **Courtney Vandersloot will be donating \$10** for each assist she records to DonorsChoose (an organization that helps cover the cost of classroom supplies for teachers) while **Allie Quigley will contribute \$20 for every 3-point field goal she makes** to the Joliet, Illinois area Salvation Army. Vandersloot has raised **\$2,167** through fan support while donating an additional **\$1,180** through her total assists. Quigley's 3-point total through 13 games is **\$520**, and through fan support has raised **\$1,451**. Both players have already raised more than a fifth of their **\$5000 goal**.

"It's not a secret that public school funding is an ongoing problem," Vandersloot said. "We have teachers all over the country paying millions of dollars out of pocket for supplies in order to provide the proper education to their students. The Chicago Public Schools are no stranger to that. Despite being the 3rd largest district in the nation, the CPS only receives 15% of the state funding. It's not a coincidence that 90% of the CPS students are children of color. I realize the problem will not be solved tomorrow, but I want to be a part of the change TODAY."

"After talking with family and doing a lot of research, I decided to choose the Salvation Army based out of the Chicagoland area," Quigley said. "I was specifically drawn to the great work they are doing in the areas of fighting for justice and empowering the youth. I grew up in Joliet, Illinois and after reflecting the last few months, it's not fair that kids growing up 40 miles north on the south side of Chicago didn't have that same opportunity. I think all children and people deserve an equal chance in this life regardless of race or where they grew up. I want to be a part of this change and I think the Salvation Army is a great partner to help me do that."

SERIES NOTES

- Over the course of the last two seasons, Sky has won four of the six meetings between the two franchises, nearly a fourth of its win total against the Fever.
- No team scored more than 78 points in any of the three meetings between the Fever and Sky last season.
- Sky is 18-36 all-time vs. the Fever. Its 36 losses is the most the Sky has against any franchise.
- This is the first of two games over the next five days between the Fever and Sky.

LAST GAME VS. INDIANA

- The Sky was led by **Stefanie Dolson** and **Allie Quigley**, who scored 38 points total (19 each) on a combined 13-22 (59.1%) shooting.
- Both Chicago and Indiana snatched 40 rebounds, including Indiana's **Teaira McCowan** pulling in 16 on her own.
- **Courtney Vandersloot** recorded 14 assists with nine points on 3-5 (60%) shooting.
- The loss marked Indiana's fifth straight and ninth in its last 10 games at the time.

INDIANA INSIGHTS

- The Fever became just the second team this season to defeat the Seattle Storm this season in its last game, ending Seattle's 9-game winning streak.
- Despite the win, the Fever have lost three of its last five games.
- Indiana is averaging 87 points against in that five-game stretch.

NEWS, NOTES, TALKING POINTS

LASTGAME:The Sky's victory over the New York Liberty marked the first time this season that the team has won three games in a row. Chicago's 101 points was its highest of the season, and the second time it reached the century mark (CT 8/8). The Sky was led by **Azurá Stevens** (team and season-high 25 points), **Courtney Vandersloot** and **Allie Quigley**, both of whom scored 19 points on a combined 16-28 (57.1%) shooting. Chicago's starting five of Vandersloot, Quigley, Stevens, **Kahleah Copper** and **Stefanie Dolson** scored 82 of the team's 101 points.

CONTENDING, NOT PRETENDING:Chicago is 9-4 for the second time in franchise history (2013), which ties it for its best record ever after 13 games. The Sky will need to win four of its next five to keep pace with the 13-5 start that the 2013 team had.

THE HYPE IS REAL (AND FOR A CAUSE): **Courtney Vandersloot** announced on August 12 that she will be donating \$10 for each assist she records this season to DonorsChoose, an organization that helps cover the cost of classroom supplies for teachers across the country. She has contributed \$1,180 through her first 13 games this season, over a fifth of her \$5000 goal. Thursday's game was the fifth consecutive outing that Vandersloot recorded a double-digit scoring total, and was the 51st time she reached a double-digit assists mark in her career. In addition, her 19-point, 10-assist double-double was Vandersloot's fourth this season and 33rd of her career. She has shot better than 50% in nine of 13 games this season, including a 21-32 (65.7%) clip over her last three games. Vandersloot recorded a season-high four steals against the Liberty as well. She has recorded 25 assists in back-to-back games for the 5th time in her career, which is a Sky record.

OFFENSIVE PRODUCTION:Chicago ranks first in field goal percentage (49.9%) and assists per game (21.7), as well as second in points in the paint (39.1) and made 3-pointers (101). It is also third in PPG (87.1) and blocks per game (4.3). **Courtney Vandersloot** leads the WNBA in assists per game (8.7), 40% of the team's average. No other team in the WNBA ranks among the top three in field goal percentage, assists per game and points per game.

TURNOVERS STILL AN ISSUE, BUT IMPROVING:Chicago is 11th in TPG (16.9) and is tied for last in the league in opponent points off turnovers with the New York Liberty (19.8). However, Thursday's game against the Liberty saw the Sky produce its lowest turnover total this season (12). During its three-game winning streak, Chicago is averaging 14.3 turnovers per game, nearly three below its seasonal figure.

COPPER'S IMPROVEMENT & CONSISTENCY: **Kahleah Copper** has been a cornerstone to the Sky's 9-4 start, as she has gone 10 straight games with a double-digit scoring total. She's tied for the team-lead with **Allie Quigley** at 14.3 PPG, nearly double her career average of 7.2 PPG and is shooting 51.7% from the floor, nearly 10 percentage points higher than her career average (42.9%). Copper has shot at least 50% in three consecutive games and in four of her last five, including a 6-12 (50%) clip with 14 points during Thursday's win against New York.

BACK TO NORMAL: **Allie Quigley's** 19-point performance on 7-14 (50%) shooting during Thursday's win against New York marked the 12th time this season she scored 10 points or more. Over the course of her last 10 games, the veteran has averaged 15.4 PPG and is shooting 49.5% (60-121) from the floor and 40.9% (21-52) from beyond the arc. She is tied for the team lead in PPG with **Kahleah Copper** (14.3).

DOLSON'S VALUE:When **Stefanie Dolson** has played this season (six games), Chicago is 5-1. The Sky's average margin of victory in those five wins is just under 13 points (12.6).

WORK PAYING OFF FOR STEVENS: **Azurá Stevens** is averaging career-highs in almost every major statistical category, including minutes (27.3), field goal percentage (50.0%), 3-point field goal percentage (38.5%, shot 11.1% last season), rebounds (5.9), assists (1.5), blocks (1.9, tied for league-lead with Brittney Griner) and points (11.5). She scored her season-high of 25 points during Thursday's win against the Liberty, playing a career-high 36 minutes. Stevens has shot 19-34 (55.8%) from the floor over the course of her last three games, including seven rebounds in back-to-back outings.

Through her scoring so far, DeShields has contributed \$890 (89 points). She has played over 20 minutes off the bench in two of her last three games, including Tuesday's tilt against Las Vegas, scoring 12 points on 5-9 (55.5%) shooting.

DeShields on how #SkyTakesAction has motivated her:

Over the course of her last three outings, Vandersloot has 57 points, 34 assists (36 is the Sky franchise record over three games) and is shooting 62.1% (23-37) from the floor.
