#SKYTAKESACTION

Chicago Sky players will donate **\$10** for every point scored, **\$100** for every win, and **\$50** for any loss throughout the 2020 WNBA season under a social justice initiative called **#SkyTakesAction**.

"#SkyTakesAction is about longevity and community," Gabby Williams said. "It's about inspiring others and teaching everyone that it doesn't take much to change someone's life, or improve somebody's situation as long as we work together. Of course, our goal is to raise absolutely as much money as possible for the organizations we've chosen. But it's also about education and changing the norm. Hopefully this will inspire and teach our fans and those who hear us to increase their level of involvement in the community."

Fans have answered Williams' call to show support by raising **\$10,740** in five weeks of fundraising through Athletes For Justice. The Sky as a team has donated **\$15,170** through its total points, 10 wins and six losses this season. The combined total currently is **\$26,450**.

In addition, Sky owner Michael Alter, minority owner John Rogers, and Susan Anderson and Bob Arthur of Magellan Corporation announced on August 12 that they will be matching all player donations for #SkyTakesAction.

"As owners of the Sky, John [Rogers] and I are honored to join our players and support their unprecedented commitment to social justice," said Sky owner Michael Alter. "We could not be more proud of their efforts. We will personally match their contributions to the organizations they have identified to carry out the important work in our communities. We are also thrilled that Bob Arthur and Susan Anderson, long time champions of the Sky, will also be matching the players donations."

Lastly, **Courtney Vandersloot will be donating \$10** for each assist she records to DonorsChoose (an organization that helps cover the cost of classroom supplies for teachers) while **Allie Quigley will contribute \$20 for every 3-point field goal she makes** to the Joliet, Illinois area Salvation Army. Vandersloot has raised **\$2,447** through fan support while donating an additional **\$1,400** through her total assists. Quigley's 3-point total through 16 games is **\$640**, and through fan support has raised **\$1,607**. Both players have already raised more than 40% of their **\$5000 goal**.

"It's not a secret that public school funding is an ongoing problem," Vandersloot said. "We have teachers all over the country paying millions of dollars out of pocket for supplies in order to provide the proper education to their students. The Chicago Public Schools are no stranger to that. Despite being the 3rd largest district in the nation, the CPS only receives 15% of the state funding. It's not a coincidence that 90% of the CPS students are children of color. I realize the problem will not be solved tomorrow, but I want to be a part of the change TODAY."

"After talking with family and doing a lot of research, I decided to choose the Salvation Army based out of the Chicagoland area," Quigley said. "I was specifically drawn to the great work they are doing in the areas of fighting for justice and empowering the youth. I grew up in Joliet, Illinois and after reflecting the last few months, it's not fair that kids growing up 40 miles north on the south side of Chicago didn't have that same opportunity. I think all children and people deserve an equal chance in this life regardless of race or where they grew up. I want to be a part of this change and I think the Salvation Army is a great partner to help me do that."

SERIES NOTES

- The Storm has won five of the last seven games in the series, dating back to 2018.
- Storm last swept season series with Sky in 2018 (three wins).
- Sky is 13-20 all-time vs. the Storm. The only team in the Western Conference that it has an all-time winning record against is the Las Vegas Aces (19-16).
- This is the second and final meeting of the 2020 regular season between the Sky and Storm.

LAST GAME VS. SEATTLE

- The Sky scored just 71 points, its lowest scoring total of the season. It was the first time this season Chicago had been held to 80 points or fewer (now two times, 8/14 vs. Connecticut, 74 points).
- **Kahleah Copper** recorded her 100th career assist off her first helper of the evening.
- Chicago scored as many points in the third quarter (28) as it did in the first half.
- The win marked Seattle's fifth in a row at the time.

SEATTLE NOTES

- The Storm has lost two of its last three games, with an average margin of defeat of seven points.
- Seattle is averaging 81.7 PPG in this stretch, five points below its seasonal figure (86.7).
- **Breanna Stewart** is shooting just 40.3% (25-62) from the floor over her last three games, more than eight percentage points lower than her seasonal clip (48.6%).

NEWS, NOTES, TALKING POINTS

LAST GAME : The Sky's loss to the New York Liberty ended its winning streak at four games. It was the team's first defeat against New York since 2018. Chicago was led by **Allie Quigley**, who tied her career-high with 29 points, 22 of which came in the second half. The Sky led by as many as 16, but New York was able to storm back and regain the momentum for the rest of the game.

STILL HERE: Despite the loss, Chicago remains to be on pace for its best start in franchise history. If the Sky wins its next three games, it will match the 13-5 record the 2013 team that finished with 24-10.

AN OFF GAME, BY ONLY HER STANDARDS: **Courtney Vandersloot** announced on August 12 that she will be donating \$10 for each assist she records this season to DonorsChoose, an organization that helps cover the cost of classroom supplies for teachers across the country. She has contributed \$1,360 through 15 games this season, over a fifth of her \$5,000 goal. Her combined total with fan donations is \$3,727. Tuesday's game was the sixth consecutive outing that Vandersloot recorded a double-digit scoring total (15 points). She has shot better than 50% in 10 of 16 games this season. Vandersloot has recorded 45 assists over the course of her last four games, and also leads the league in assists per game (8.7). She was named as the Eastern Conference Player of the Week for the second time in the last three weeks on August 24 (Week of August 17).

OFFENSIVE PRODUCTION: Chicago ranks first in field goal percentage (49.5%) and assists per game (21.3, tied with Seattle). It ranks second in points per game (87.9), trailing only the Las Vegas Aces (88.5). The Sky also ranks third in the league in 3-pointers made (118), 3-point percentage (37.1%) and blocks per game (3.9). No other team in the WNBA ranks among the top three in points per game, field goal percentage and assists.

TAKING BETTER CARE OF THE BALL: The Sky committed a season-low nine turnovers during Tuesday's game against the Liberty. It was the first time all season it had a single digit turnover total. Over the course of its last three games, Chicago is averaging just 11 turnovers per game, well below its season average of 16.1. Chicago is still among the bottom half of teams in the league in TPG (16.1, 9th) and is ninth in opponent points off turnovers (18.6).

SHE'S IMPROVED, HASN'T SHE?: **Kahleah Copper** has been a cornerstone to the Sky's 10-5 start, as she has gone 12 straight games with a double-digit scoring total. She's averaging 15.1 PPG, more than double her career average of 7.2 PPG and is shooting 50.6% from the floor, just under eight percentage points higher than her career average (42.9%). Copper has shot at least 50% in five of her last seven games, and played over 30 minutes for the second straight occasion on Tuesday (31).

THE ALLIE WE KNOW: **Allie Quigley's** 29-point performance (tied for her career-high) on 9-22 (41%) shooting during Tuesday's game against New York marked the 14th time this season she scored 10 points or more. She's scored at least 14 points in six of her last seven games. Quigley is shooting a career-high from the free throw line (23-25, 92%, minimum 10 attempts), having not missed from there since August 8 against Connecticut.

DOLSON'S VALUE: When **Stefanie Dolson** has played this season (eight games), Chicago is 6-2. The Sky's average margin of victory in those six wins is 12.3. Dolson has made at least one 3-pointer in five straight games, and shot a perfect 4-4 from the field during Tuesday's game against New York.

HEBARD'S ELITE SHOOTING: **Ruthy Hebard** currently ranks second in the WNBA in field goal percentage (minimum 10 attempts), with a 62.5% clip from the floor during her first 15 career games. She has shot better than 50% in eight consecutive games.

- Reached a double-digit assist total for 50th time in her career
- 15 assists was her season-high and tied for her career-high (she's done it 3 times)
- Recorded her 32nd career double-double (15 points, 15 assists), third this season
- Became first player in WNBA history to have a 15+ point, 15+ assist, 5 rebound game

August 20, New York Liberty

- 10 assists gave her 25 over the last two games, the 5th time in her career she posted at least 25 assists in back-to-back games (Sky record)
- Posted a season-high four steals
- 19 points, 10 assists led to her 33rd career double-double, fourth this season

Through her scoring so far, DeShields has contributed \$890 (89 points). She picked up her second career DNP on Tuesday when she sat out against the New York Liberty. DeShields played 81 consecutive games since being drafted by the Sky in 2018 prior to missing the game against Indiana on 8/22.

DeShields on how #SkyTakesAction has motivated her:

"It's everything. It's literally the reason why I put my jersey, it's the reason why I came out here. There was no way I was going to come out here and just dismiss myself from what's going on in the world right now. So, to have partnered up with Athletes For Justice and my teammates and everybody else, our sponsors to be on board with this, it's all the motivation that any of us needs on game days."

And so, I mean it motivates me definitely a little bit extra because like that could have been my dad. George Floyd could've been my dad. Breonna Taylor could have been my sister. It could have been me. It could have been some of my teammates, like it's just this is real life right now, and it's a lot to take in but I mean I'm proud of our team for the awareness that we're raising and the stuff that we're doing."

We're tired of seeing images of people who look like us, who look like our brothers, who look like my little brother. I worry about everything that he does. So it's not hard for it to not distract me from basketball, because I'm a person before I'm a basketball player. And that's how we all feel."
